by the Shamrock Petroleum company, the controlling interest of which is owned by C. H. Clark. Mr. Clark expressed the opinion that this well would make one o fthe best in the field when it was spudded in.



ROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 9

A resolution proposing an amendment to Article 7, of the Constitution of the State of Texas by changing Section 3, eliminating the provision authorizing the Legislature to an appropriation therefor.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section 2. Article 7, of the Constitution be so changed as to read as follows: (creating new Section.)

"Section 3. One-fourth of the revenue derived from the State Occupation taxes and poil taxes of one dollar on every inhabitant of the State, between the ages of twenty-one and sixty years, shall be set apart annually for the benefit of the public free schools; and in addition thereto, there shall be levied and collected an annual ad valorem State tax of such an amount not to exceed thirty-five cents on the one hundred (\$100.00 dollars valuation, as with the available school funds arising from all other sources, will be sufficient to maintain and support the public schools of this State for a period of than six months in each year, and it shall be the duty of the State Board of Education to set aside a sufficient amount out of the said use of children attending the public free schools fo this State; provided, however, that should the limit of taxation herein named be sufficient the deficit may be met by appropriation from the general funds of the State and the Legislature may also provide formation of school districts for the by general laws; and all such school districts may embrace parts of two or more counties, and the Legislature shall be authorized to pass laws for the assessment and collection of taxes in all said districts and for the management and control of the public school or schools of such districts, whether such districts are composed of territory wholly within a county or in parts of two or more counties, and the Legislature may authorize an additional ad valorem tax to be levied and cellected within all school districts heretofore formed or hereafter formed, for the further maintenance of public free schools, and for the erection and equipment of school buildings therein; provided that a majority of the qualified property tax paying voters of the district voting at an election to be held for that purpose shall vote such tax not to exweed in any one year one (\$1.00) dollar on the hundred dollars valuation of the property subject to taxation in such district, but the limitation upon the amount of school tax herein authorized shall not apply to





Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas by amending Section 33 and Section 40 of the Constitution of Texas so as to. permit officers of the National Guard Reserve, and the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States, and enlisted men of the National Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Organized Reserves of the United States to hold public ofice in Texas.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section 33 of article 16 of the Constitution of the time to time provide for by law. State of Texas be amended so as to read as follows:

The accounting officers of this State shall neither draw nor pay a warrant upon the Treasury in favor of any person, for salary or compensation as agent, officer or appointee, who holds at the same time any office or position of honor, trust or profit, under this State or the United States; except as prescribed in this Constitution. Provided, that his restriction as to the drawing and paying of warrants upon the Treasury shall not apply to offcers of the National Guard of Texas, the National Guard Reserve, the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States, nor to enlisted men of the National Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Organized Reserves of the United States.'
