### Bert Hassell Hops Off for Sweden in "Greater Rockford" Today

#### COCHRANE, ONT. IS FIRST STOP ON LONG TRIP

Parker Cramer, Co-Pilot, Is Radio Operator and Navigator

#### BIG PLANE HAS PRETTY TAKE-OFF

Crashed in First Try On Rising Short Time Ago

COCHRANE, Ont., Aug. 16.—(P)—Bert Hassell and Parker Cramer landed here at 3:30 o'clock this afternoon, completing the first lap of their flight from Rockford, Ill., to Stockholm, Sweden. They left Rockford early this morning, and will spend the night here before continuing.

ROCKFORD, Ill., Aug. 16.—(P)—Bert Hassell took off at 6:40 a. m. central standard time, on the first leg of a proposed flight to Stockholm, Sweden.

From Rockford, course of the plane was northeast across Canada to Cochrane, Ont., and thence to Mt. Evans, Colorado, total distance from Rockford to Mt. Evans was 2,100 miles. The pilots planned to make a shorter hop from Mt. Evans to Reykjavik, Iceland, where a base was ready for additional fuel and oil. Between Reykjavik and the Swedish coast, their last hop, lies a great expanse of open sea.

Carry Rubber Boat  
The big plane was stocked with ample food supplies. Besides food, the pilots carried a collapsible rubber boat, an axe, a rifle, hiking outfits and first aid kits.

A radio was included among the plane's equipment and the pilots planned to keep in communication with radio stations throughout their flight.

The pilots made a perfect hop off from the Rockford airport, circling over the field until the big plane had made an altitude of about 1,000 feet when it was nosed northeastward toward Cochrane, Ont., where Hassell planned to make his first stop and spend the night.

An 8-Hour Hop  
The pilots were scheduled to reach Cochrane in about eight hours, stopping over there to refuel and tune up the plane for a second hop to Greenland tomorrow.

Both Hassell and Cramer expressed confidence of success as they climbed into the "Greater Rockford" and waved good-bys. They were not daunted by the accident which halted their first attempt three weeks ago when their plane, heavily loaded for one hop to Greenland was unable to make altitude and crashed in a corn field shortly after leaving Rockford.

The hop from Cochrane to Greenland is about 1,900 miles, much of it over water. From Greenland the fliers plan another hop to Iceland and then a final jump to Stockholm.

Long Flying Record  
ROCKFORD, Aug. 16.—(P)—Since 1913, Bert Hassell, pilot of the Greater Rockford on its flight to Stockholm, Sweden, has been an airplane pilot. He took up flying before the world war, and became an instructor at Chanute field. He was commissioned a second lieutenant in 1918, and served in the army air corps as a teacher throughout the war.

Hassell is married and the father of three children.

Parker "Shorty" Cramer, co-pilot, navigator and radio operator of the Greater Rockford, was born a Hoosier at Lafayette, Ind., the seat of Purdue university. He is 32 years old. He took up flying as a livelihood and during the war was an instructor at Kelly and Brooks field in Texas and a test pilot at Scott field at Belleville, Ill.

Cramer is a bachelor. His mother, Mrs. Fannie Cramer, resides at Clarion, Pa.

### THE SENATORIAL RACE

(An Editorial)

Tom Connally must be hoping that the run-off campaign will come to a close at once. The way that Senator Earle B. Mayfield is showing up the record of Connally is an indication that thousands of votes are being changed daily in behalf of the senator.

Mayfield has not equivocated one bit in relating his stand on public questions, and Connally has been woefully weak in making adequate response. Although Connally has attempted to fasten "power trust" support behind Mayfield, the senator has shown that his opponent is the one who really has large utility men working in his behalf, and has named the workers.

Connally has attempted to discredit Mayfield because the senator conscientiously voted to put the power trust investigation in the hands of the Federal Trade Commission instead of the senate. Approximately 22 Democratic senators voted like Senator Mayfield, including Joe T. Robinson, nominee for vice president. We wonder why Connally is not denouncing Senator Robinson for his vote upon this issue.

The representative has made a great plea for honesty in office. Connally began his race about three months before Congress adjourned. Mayfield challenges him to return to the people the \$2,000 in salary, which he drew while campaigning during the time Congress was in session.

Mayfield has always had the endorsement of labor because he has been fair in his dealings. Connally voted against the child labor amendment, which was sponsored both by organized labor and the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

The senator's opponent has made a bitter attack in charging that Mayfield was not the author of the famous cotton classification law. Connally will have to shut up on this issue or lose tens of thousands of votes. Mayfield says: "If I am not the author of the law, I have deceived the Democrats of Texas. If I am the author of this law, then Connally has deceived the Democrats of our state by charging in every speech he made during the first primary that I am not the author of the law. I now agree to retire from the senatorial race if I am not the author of the cotton classification law, provided Mr. Connally will agree to retire from the senatorial contest if I am the author of this law. I am willing to leave it to the secretary of agriculture, whose duty it is to administer the law, to say who is its author. I call upon Mr. Connally to say if he will accept my proposition."

Senator Mayfield should be renominated, for he has made a good senator. His seniority will be of outstanding importance to the party. He announced before the Houston convention that he would support the nominee for president just as Mr. Connally has done. Those opposing Smith cannot vote for senator without voting for a candidate that has pledged him his support.

### TOOMBS WILL NOT GO BACK WITHOUT FIGHT

Request From Missouri to Illinois for Fugitive is Prepared

### NEW BUSINESS IS ABANDONED

Big Firm's Income Is Million Dollars Month

ST. LOUIS, Aug. 16.—(P)—Stratton Shartel, attorney-general of Missouri, today announced he had instructed two assistants to prepare an information against Dr. E. F. Morgenstern of Chicago, vice-president of the International Life Insurance company, making a charge similar to that in a warrant issued yesterday against Roy C. Toombs, president.

ST. LOUIS, Aug. 16.—(P)—Fight to extradite Roy C. Toombs, president of the International Life Insurance company, today upon the advice of a Chicago company from Illinois to Missouri, that Toombs had agreed to submit to arrest but would fight extradition from Illinois on charges of grand larceny of \$104,000 in bonds from the company.

A warrant for Toombs was issued yesterday and circuit attorney Edward S. Baker announced a petition for extradition would be sent to Gov. Sam Baker of Missouri, and a request would be sent to Gov. Len Small of Illinois to have Toombs brought to St. Louis.

Toombs was released yesterday in Chicago from a \$40,000 bond which he gave after arrest there on a general request from St. Louis authorities Saturday night.

Work is Suspended  
Meantime, work of the company which has been suspended since an investigation of its condition by insurance commissioners from eight states was begun, will again go on, they say, the orders of E. F. Wilson, who was appointed receiver of the company. It is said no new business will be written but routine matters will be taken care of by the 300 employees of the firm here.

CHICAGO, Aug. 16.—(P)—The Tribune today published an interview with Roy C. Toombs in which he explained some of the affairs of the International Life Insurance company, of which he is president, and the investment firm of Toombs and Daily, of which he is a partner.

Both companies are under receivership proceedings, following reported shortages.

Has Huge Income  
"This is a powerful insurance company," he said. "It has an income of \$1,000,000 a month. Toombs and Daily authorized me to borrow \$7,000,000 to buy control of the International company when one of our clients couldn't go through with the deal. I was getting rid of a lot of the assets of the insurance company, which weren't earning enough and I was substituting Toombs and Daily bonds for them. I was advised to discontinue that, and I did."

Toombs failed to substitute other securities for the Toombs and Daily bonds he said, when the International's board of directors refused to send \$7,000,000 in securities to him.

Other officials of Toombs and Daily have denied that Toombs had their authority to use the concern's securities.

### BIG COMPANIES ARE BIDDING FOR COURTHOUSE JOB

Bids are being opened this afternoon by the county commissioners, in session at the court house, for the erection of the new Gray county courthouse recently authorized. Plans allow for a four-story building, stone, 90 feet wide by 120 feet long.

Several of the largest contracting companies of the state are represented and the commissioners expect to have a difficult job letting the contract. The contract for the erection of the jail will not be let until the building is nearly completed.

Another contract to be let this afternoon is for the grading of the Bigger road for paving, a distance of six miles.

### Sidewalks Map in Preparation to Be Sent to Washington

K. S. Gaylor, assistant postmaster, and George W. Briggs, secretary-manager of the Chamber of Commerce, are planning a map of the city showing the sidewalks and pavement to be sent to the postmaster general in an effort to get city mail delivery for Pampa.

With the exception of a few breaks, Foster and Francis avenues east and west are well equipped with sidewalks, but other streets are not as well adapted for mail delivery.

Street numbering and naming is being considered by the city commission and action will be taken immediately. A company from Amarillo is anxious to secure the contract and will appear before the city commission at its next session.

Before any action on city delivery can be taken, the city street numbering and naming ordinance will have to be passed. Then action will be taken at once by the commission.

### JUDGE EWING DECIDES ISSUES OF RESIDENCE

Finds Question Pertinent Only to Office After Election

### APPEAL FILED BY W. ALLEN

Strong Legal Array at Hearing in Miami Court

MIAMI, Aug. 16.—(Special)—Judge W. R. Ewing in 31st district court here today sustained a general demurrer to Walter Allen's petition for an injunction to restrain Democratic chairman of counties of this judicial district from entering the name of Clifford Braly on the ballots as a candidate for district attorney.

As a result of this decision, Mr. Braly and Mr. Allen will enter the run-off for the office. Otherwise, should Mr. Braly's name have been barred, there would have been no run-off and the plaintiff in the suit would have taken office automatically, assuming that the Republican candidate had no chance for election.

Judge Ewing held that under the statutes the only question of residence relates to the district attorneyship after election, and that prior residence was not the issue. He gave the opinion however, in the discussion, that District Attorney Braly is now a resident of the district.

Notice of appeal to the Amarillo Court of Civil Appeals was given; but a decision will not be available until after the second primary. In the petition for an injunction the recent official vote for district attorney of the 31st district was cited as follows: Braly 4,334, Alleg 2,983, Wortman 2,754.

Allen was represented by Judge H. E. Hoover and E. J. Pickens of Canadian and Jack Allen of Perryton. Braly's attorneys, J. H. Amesworth of Stimpert, James Spiller of Panhandle, and S. D. Stennis of Pampa.

### Get Oil Company Tests Looks Good For 250 Barrels

Shot at both pays, the Get Oil company's No. 1 Skidmore in the southeast corner of the southwest quarter of section 164, block 3, has been cleaned out for 250-barrel well, according to a report received here this afternoon. The well is bottomed at 3,176 feet. It is flowed by 3,000,000 feet of gas.

The well is an offset to the Empire Gas and Fuel company's No. 2 Bender, in the same section, making about 20 barrels a day and cleaning out to drill deeper. The Get test picked up a lower gas than in the Empire test which is thought to be the reason for the increased production.

This is the company's first test in Gray county, but plans to drill more wells are being considered.

An unconfirmed report received here this morning from Alameda stated that the Purple Sage Oil company's No. 2 Johnson in section 1, three miles northwest of Alameda, had shot oil over the top of the derrick after a 110-quart shot had been used yesterday afternoon.

The hole is being cleaned out today and the well spraying heavily. Joy reigns in Alameda over the development, as oil men believe a good producer will be the result after the hole is cleaned out.

This is the best sign of production in that territory.

#### Gas Bootlegger Is Worrying State

AUSTIN, Aug. 16—(AP)—The gasoline bootlegger has become one of the worries of the state comptroller's department, which collects the state's gasoline tax.

Comptroller S. H. Terrell says that the fuel is "bootlegged" into Texas from the adjacent states of Oklahoma, Arkansas and Louisiana, and sold without payment of the tax. This is possible because the state under the present system, is confined largely to bookkeeping checks on the wholesale gasoline supply source, which either pay the tax or indicate such buying concerns as may assume the tax themselves.

This when a tank truck of gasoline is run across Red River into Texas from Oklahoma and sold, the comptroller's department has no means of getting the tax. So the "bootleg" gasoline escapes taxes in both states and is sold to dealers near the line. They in turn, can undersell their competitors, who buy from wholesale concerns subject to regular reports to the comptroller's department.
