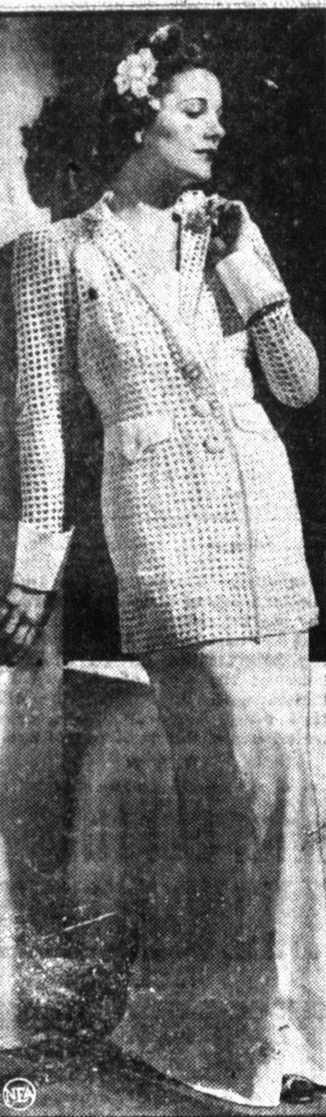

TIP-OFF. The British treasury department has "requested" English investors not to make further investments in the United States. General opinion is that the British government is cooperating with President Roosevelt who fears that possible sudden withdrawal of foreign funds may hurt our market structure.

Another reason, according to Dutch contacts, is the fear that a decrease in the price of gold is expected. The British government always played fair with its banking and investment trusts. Its recent "request" is aiding its own investment element.

THEATERS. According to Magnus Andersen, accountant for the Federal Communications Commission, there is sufficient data on hand to order another reduction in long distance telephone rates.

ASSURED. The price of crude oil will continue to rise. The statement is attributed to Harold L. Ickes, secretary of the interior, who based his remark on prospective market demands.

DEER. In recent months Deere & Company has been experiencing steadily rising profits. The trade reports a favorable sales outlook for the farm machinery industry.

COCOA. The cocoa market is being dominated by speculative liquidation. The African crop has been pretty well sold out. Remaining supplies are being offered at a 1 cent per pound premium.

SPECULATIVE. In its enthusiasm for railroad shares the public has forced Baltimore and Ohio common up to new highs for the month. This despite the large capitalization.

SIX-CENT OIL TAX IS PUSHED FOR PASSAGE

OIL PRODUCTION TAX WOULD BE MORE THAN DOUBLED

AUSTIN, March 2 (AP)—A bill which would more than double the present oil production tax today awaited final passage by the House of Representatives with the possibility of reaching the Senate before the end of the week.

Revenue from the increased tax would be allotted as follows: One-half to old age pensions, one-fourth to schools and one-fourth to the general fund.

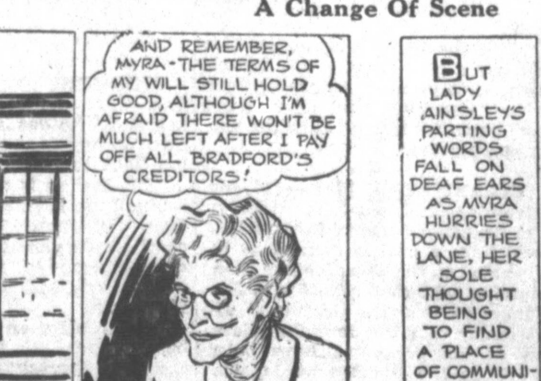

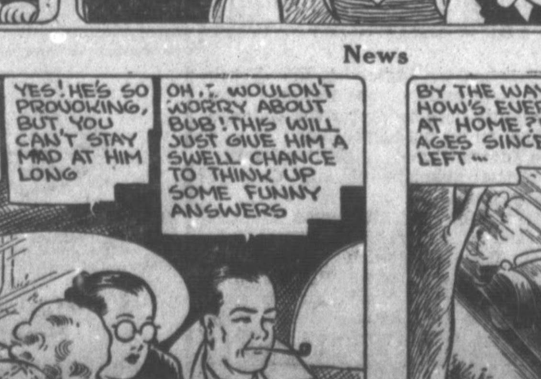

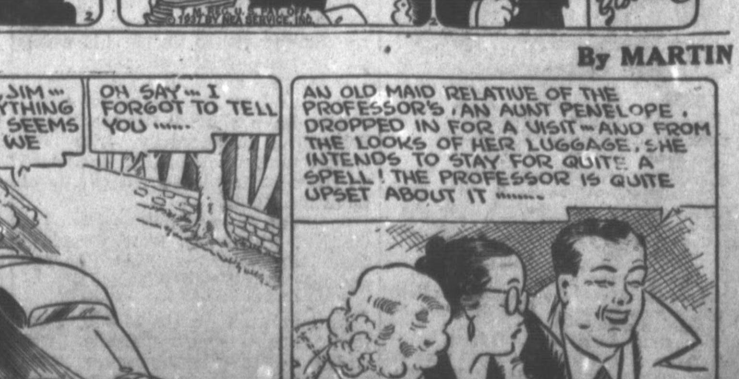
