## Victims fear rapist could win parole <br> By DEE DEE Staff Writer

Victims of convicted rapist Bernard John Koelzer fear that if he i
paroled he'll return to Pampa paroled, hem.

The sexual assault victims, whose names have been withheld by authorities to protect their identities, cuntacted Thle Pampa Nerres to
say the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCI) that Kocelzer is eligible for parole on Jan. 17, 20012. The TDCI parole boord is to conside
Koelzer's case' six months prior to the date he's eligible for release. "He threatened to kill us," one victimm said "If he's paroled, he"
going to come back to Pampa, I know. He has family here." Koelzer, then 27, pleaded guilty to aggravated sexual assault and
burglary of a habitation in 223rd District Court on Mav 22, 1995, District Judge Lee Waters sentenced him to 30 years in state prison

reported rape of a 28 -year-old woman at gunpoint at an oilfield site
near Lefors three days earlier near effors three days earlier.
The second offense, burglary of habitation with intent to commit
sexual assault, oncurred in lily sexual assault, occurred in July 1994 and involved a 24 vear-old
woman. Koelyer was free on $\$ 20,0(0)$ bond at the time of the incident, according to newspaper reports.
Court records show that in 1993, the woman had accompanied Koelzer to the oilfield site, believing, she had been hired to assist him.
