LAKE SUCCESS, Oct. 10. (AP)-Despite a Russian boycott threat, the United Nations went ahead today with creation of a "watchwar minister, said "of course we sion to put Iraqi troops into dog" commission in the tur-cannot disclose the movements of Trans-Jordan to support the east-bulent Balkans.

The blunt Soviet announcement of non-cooperation, delivered to the assembly's 57-nation political committee by Deputy Foreign Minister Andrei Y. Vishinsky in angry tones yesterday, was followed quickly by similar statements from Poland, Yugoslavia, the Soviet Ukraine, White Russia and Czecho*slovakia*.

Vishinsky's statement came i the midst of another violent attack on the United States-sponsored Balkans commission and left delegates momentarily stunned. How-

Luxembourg calmly called for the debate on commission membership to continue. Premier Paul-Henri Spaak of Belgium and U. S. Delegate Herschel V. Johnson then remarked tartly that the Soviet decision was to be regretted but there was no cause to turn back. Moscow's move means that the Soviet bloc of countries will not take part in the election to the commission nor in its work. Further, most observers interpreted the step to mean that any group sent to the Balkans by the U. N. would never get a foot on the soil of Albania, Yugoslavia or Bulgaria, the three countries accused in a security council commission's report of fomenting unrest on Greece's northern borders.

# **Exemption Votes Declared** Invalid

Judge Cecil C. Collings of 70th district court ruled shortly before S p. m. Friday that the proposal for increasing the tax rate of the Big Spring Independent school district, voted on Sept. 9, had carried, as a result of elimination of ballots ruled invalid in a contest suit.

His ruling was that the bond issue voted on at the same time had failed.

The court's ruling came as a result of the opinion that some two-score "over-age" exemption ballots were invalid. This was an issue that had been argued by parties in the litigation.

Tabulation of these contested "exemption" votes showed nine for the tax increase and 29 against; six for the bond issue and 38 against.


Ruling of these votes as invalid changes the Sept. 9 total sufficiently to make the tax rate stand approved.

George T. Thomas, county attorney who represented contestees in the litigation, gave notice of appeal from the decision. The case would go to the 11th district appellate court.

Outcome of litigation involving the Big Spring school tax-bond election results depends upon a ruling as to the constitutionality of a state law affecting "over-age" exemptions. This became apparent at noon Friday after a check and

re-check of ballots admitted in the 70th district court to be invalid left the results of the Sept. 9 referendum exactly as they were when the returns were originally canvassed.

**Bloc To Backfire** 

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10. -Four Senators, including the veteran Tom Connally (D-Tex), expressed belief today that open formation of a nine-nation communist bloc by Soviet Russia will backfire.

Connally, ranking minority member and former chairman of the Senate foreign relations committee, told a reporter the move should "stiffen" opposition both in Europe and the United States to Soviet aims.

Senators Brewster (R-Me), Russell (D-Ga) and Cain (R-Wash) agreed with Connally in separate interviews.

Most lawmakers expressed belief that the communist action will smooth the way for both European stop-gap and the longer-range Marshall Plan in Congress.

"The nations of Europe will not calmly allow nine countries to force down their throats the doctrine of communism," Connally said.

### The Element Of Distance Shrinks

British sources have announced that a

robot model plane attained speeds estimated above 900 miles per hour, probably exceeding sonic barriers. At the same time, U. S. sources indicate that this country has sent robot planes through the skies at the terrific speed of 1,700 miles per hour.

Of course these are experimental flights and have not yet progressed to the stage of actual construction of planes carrying human pilots. Many factors have yet to be analyzed and translated into performance before test pilots take over the job to prove that man can fly faster than sound.

However, the fact that model planes

are being propelled at speeds which stag-ger the imagination should be ample reason to accept the possibility of sonic flight being right around the corner.

At 1,700 miles an hour distances, which have shrivelled amazingly in the past decade, will shrink to mere nothing. It means . that the Atlantic can be spanned in less time than it once took to go aboard a boat and get comfortable for the trip. It means that the barrier of distance is rapidly disappearing. It means that the world, in the measuring stick of time, is shrinking to the size of a large county or a small state in this day of automobile travel. It means new emphasis ought to be put on efforts to attain human understanding for peaceful existence on this globe.

# Justice Not Always Served Best

One of the celebrated criminal cases of West Texas brought about a double murder as an alternative for facing the rap on theft charges. The defendants probably guessed well, for they received prison terms-one escaped and one eventually was pardoned.

Which goes to prove that it may be easier to beat a charge of murder than serious crime of less severe nature.

Now that's one we can't lay on the courts, for when it comes to a contested capital case, 12 men tried and true must sit in the jury box and seek to reach a verdict. They must hear the testimony, receive instructions from the court and retire to weigh evidence and return a verdict. It sounds simple, aside from the fact that testimony can be confusing. Still most men are apt to reach a decision as to what they believe to be established, even in the face of the skillful handling of cases by attornevs who are putting up the best possible prosecution or defense.

Where the rub comes in is the human failing to project one's self into the position of another. The temptation is to say with the English statesman that "here, except for the Grace of God, am I." When that line of thinking creeps into minds, impartial weighing of evidence is made difficult. In courts, it is not necessarily a question of the milk of human knidness, but of justice; and justice is not always served by vacarious considerations.

WASHINGTON. - There was a day when a visit of a high French official caused the capital of the United States to turn handsprings-as, for instance, the pilgrimage of the late Pierre Laval, then prime minister of France.

When Laval was entertained by Herbert Hoover back in the good old days when foreign visitors were a novelty, white ties and cutaways were trotted out, ornate state dinners were thrown, and the capital stopped most of its other work to welcome the premier of France.

Last week, however, the capital bestirred itself hardly at all when Georges Bidault, foreign minister of France, arrived for a far more important visit. For, today, France is the pivotal country in western Europe, in combatting communism. As France goes, so goes the rest of Europe. And the rosy-cheeked, slightly worried, energetic little man who visited Truman in the White House can help swing the balance in French politics.

No communiques were issued after Bidault's visit, as was the case after the Laval-Hoover conferences. Nevertheless, it can be revealed that Bidault made one particularly significant suggestion to the President: namely, that France might act as mediator in the everwidening dispute between Washington and Moscow. Bidault warned that the battle between Russia an dthe United States is hurting world recovery, suggested that France might be able to ease the tension.

Albert S. Goss, master of the National Grange, the nation's biggest farm organization, is a mild-appearing, be-spectacled, little man you might mistake for a professor on leave from an Ivy League college.

However, Goss does some unprofessorial slugging on issues that interest him, and although he represents the farmer he also strongly believes in feeding Europe. Calling on President Truman the other day, Goss urged drastic steps to deal with the food crisis.

"This is an emergency, comparable to a wartime emergency," the farm leader told the President. "So we all must plich in, tighten our belts and treat it as such.

"Until it is over, everybodybusiness, labor and the farmers -will have to be satisfied with a smaller margin of profit. I am sure you will find the farmers only too willing to do their part.'

The grange leader showed Truman a colored slide of a picture of one week's food rations in the American occupation zone in Germany, taken when Goss was in Frankfort during a European tour last spring. It was enough to cover a good sized dinner plate, plus a small loaf of bread-a full week's supply for one person.

"That's typical of the countries now asking us for help," explained Goss. "Let me remind you that this picture was taken last spring. The people over there will get even less next spring unless we do something.

"You know what that means, Mr. President. Unless we meet our responsibility, the door will be opened to communist insurrections and a Red sweep of Europe.'

Truman said he was aware of this. He looked hard for some time at the colored slide and the meager amount of food on the plate.




