

MUNITIONS MEN ACCUSED OF 'SCUTTLE' ARMS CONTROL

WASHINGTON, Dec. 1 (AP)—The chairman of the senate's munitions inquiry said today it had uncovered evidence that European munitions makers deliberately "scuttled" a Geneva plan to control world trade in implements of war.

Senator Nye (R., N. D.) who heads the investigation which already has produced repercussions abroad, said the evidence would be revealed in a new series of committee hearings opening today.

Arms manufacturers, he said, sat at the elbows of some official delegates to an international conference held at Geneva in 1925, and influenced them in writing an agreement so innocuous as to be "hopeless."

The European group of arms men, he asserted, also appealed to American manufacturers for assistance and got it. Munitions officials knew who the American delegates were three weeks before the list was made public, he said.

While these assertions were being made, it became known that the state department has taken a new step to expedite international action on America's recent proposal to control the manufacture and sale of munitions.

But Suppose the Birds Get Used To The Clatter

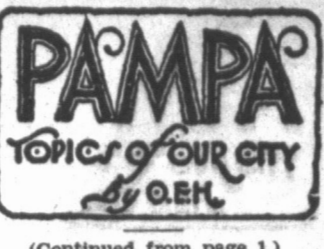
WASHINGTON, Dec. 4 (AP)—Fifty men will start work tonight on the capital's strangest job. Their task is to keep the birds awake.

Pension Plans To Be Explained Here Wednesday

The program of the Texas Association for Old-Age Pensions will be explained here tomorrow evening at an open meeting in the district court room at 7:30 o'clock.

The speaker will be John R. Smith of Borger, West Texas member of the executive committee.

No fantastic and impossible plan will be promoted by the association, according to its literature, which says, in part:

"The association was organized for the purpose of aiding the aged people of this state to get, through organized action, the help and assistance that so far they have been unable to get through individual action. It has members from the ages of 21 to 85.

The best figures available indicate that there are about 360,000 persons in Texas over 60 years of age. Many are not self-sustaining. The association will gather data and statistics from other states and nations that have adopted some form of aid to the aged, and will investigate the fairness and justice of the various plans."

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MERCHANTS DRESSING UP DISPLAY WINDOWS FOR SANTA DAY

STREETS WILL PRESENT GALA XMAS PICTURE

STORES FILLED WITH PRESENTS FOR CHRISTMAS

All the excitement, mystery and color of a Santa Day in Pampa will be re-enacted here tomorrow when the Junior chamber of commerce and business men produce their fourth annual Christmas festival. Everything will be in readiness, Santa Claus will arrive tomorrow morning, and that's the big thing as far as the youngsters are concerned. The children of this territory are anxiously awaiting the day to arrive. Papas and mamas have answered a hundred and one questions concerning the ancient old fellow. It would be hard to keep the kids off the street, even if the parents wanted to.

The floats will be ready to "make the main drag" at 2 o'clock. The parade will start on South Cuyler exactly at 2:30 o'clock. Not a minute later, said Joe Burrow, chairman of the parade committee. There will be from 10 to 15 floats, according to H. L. Polley, chairman of the float committee.

The Christmas spirit appeared before one's eyes yesterday throughout the city. Many merchants had already started decorating their display windows. Scores of these windows were dressed up by closing time. Many merchants worked overtime last night to add the Christmas touch to their fronts.

Santa Claus will ride in the parade. He will distribute a fourth of a ton of candies to the yelling, happy mob of children that are sure to be on hand. The event has been widely advertised and an unprecedented crowd is expected to be in the city.

Christmas stocks fill the stores. Merchants have been locking forward to the occasion and have filled their shelves with Christmas goods. School children will sit restless in their seats until the teacher gives the word that they may leave to attend the celebration.

Never before, has Santa Day been as much of a children's affair as it will be tomorrow. All the school bands in the city, uniformed and musical, will play in the parade. All the schools in the city will enter a float. Civic clubs, churches, and other organizations will enter floats which have been under construction for two days.

CAPITOL CHATTER

AUSTIN, Dec. 4. (P)—Representative-Elect Jap Lucas of Athens plans to be a little more active than most new members when the regular session of the Texas legislature opens in January.

Lucas has been in Austin for several weeks studying house rules of procedure so that he will be sure of his ground when he goes into action for or against certain legislation. He also has been preparing, with the aid of an assistant attorney general, some legislation he would like to see enacted.

"For a greenhorn I probably will make myself very obnoxious," he commented. "Some of the things I shall propose or favor doubtless will prove highly distasteful to many of the members. I realize a policy of this kind will make me highly unpopular with many but I believe it will be worth it if results are obtained."

One of the propositions Lucas said he would attempt to put over is reduction of the mileage allowed members to and from their places of residence. Legislators now receive ten cents a mile coming and going. Lucas would cut the mileage to no more than five cents each way.

"A dime a mile is an outrage," he said. "It costs much less than that to travel and most of them ride on passes, besides."

Lucas has adopted a sort of "devil-may-care" attitude toward his status as a member of the legislature and doesn't appear to "give a hang" about his political fences as long as he stands by his convictions.

Another item of legislative expense would be trimmed if J. J. Olsen of Yoakum has his way. Olsen while in Austin on a business trip said he would endeavor to have the pay of members reduced from \$10 per day to \$5 per day, the old maximum before the constitution was changed.

Olsen believes there are too many laws on the books now and that the

'TRUE DEMOCRACY' IN AMERICA IS FORESEEN BY H. A. WALLACE

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4. (P)—Secretary Henry A. Wallace peered into the future today and saw the possibility of "true democracy" for America.

The agricultural secretary, whom new dealers hail as one of their top-notch thinkers and philosophers, pinned his hopes in part on the work of farmers in production control associations. These are local groups that take a hand in adjusting local problems as part of the A. A. A. "giant attempt to restore agriculture."

"In the long view of history," Wallace told the Associated Press, "things that are happening now on

the 6,000,000 farms of the country may be the beginning of a new epoch, in which democracy, embracing the economic as well as the political field, becomes for the first time a reality."

As far as agricultural adjustment is concerned, the secretary added: "I think there is a strong possibility that the local groups will one day take over all the work of agricultural adjustment except those of national decision which can be best made by a central organization correlating the needs and productivity of all groups."

Illustrating the point, he reiterated a statement from his book "New

Frontiers" which said: "A modern democracy, in my opinion, is essentially a graded hierarchy of New England town meetings with responsible, democratically selected people dealing with the hard facts at every step."

"Again and again the methods employed by county control associations in the AAA seem to me to point the way."

The secretary hopes that the people will respond to this movement. He acknowledged that the control associations which make necessary adjustments with individual farmers, had made mistakes—"thousands of them." A few of these were deliberate with intent to defraud, he said, "but most of them honestly developed the concept of justice for parts in terms of the whole."

SHAWNEE, Okla., Dec. 4. (P)—The nation's youngest university president wants college graduates to know that the world is not their oyster.

The advice of Dr. John W. Raley, 31-year-old head of Oklahoma Baptist university to students is:

"You are going out into what we term the world of life with a distinct knowledge that the world does not want you.

"There is no open door policy on the part of the world to the college graduate of today.

"I am calling attention to the fact that you must make your own place in the world—a world that has no particular concern for you and has no place in it in which to put

you to work."

Dr. Raley, busy with plans for "encouraging intellectual pioneering and vitalizing study," training for "leisure time as much as for working hours," and the financial responsibilities of directing a university, hasn't "had time to think about being the youngest university president."

"The time I can stop and think, there probably will be another youngest president, so it doesn't matter," he added with a smile.

PUBLIC BUYING MORE, PAYING BILLS FASTER IN THIS SEASON

Mr. and Mrs. Consumer were buying more from the retail stores—and they were paying their retail bills with more promptness than they were in October last year, according to the nation-wide survey of the Research Division of the National Retail Credit Association for October, just received by Carson Lotus of the Retail Merchants Association local branch of the National Retail Merchants Association.

Retail collections for October show an increase of 9.8 per cent and retail credit-sales an increase of 12 per cent over October last year. Translating dry statistics into human values, these increases are attributed to strengthened confidence on the part of the average consumer as well as better financial condition. In other words, the public is buying the necessities of life and paying as it goes instead of "hoarding" for a "rainy day."

Eighty-six per cent of the cities covered by the survey report increased collections, 8 per cent report decreases and 4 per cent "no change" over October, 1933, while 88 per cent show increases, 6 per cent decreases and 4 per cent "no change" in retail credit sales.

In the New England states, collections and credit-sales are reported as gradually coming back to normal, following the settlement of the textile strike. The shoe industry shows slight improvement and building lines an increase of 10 per cent over last year.

In the Pittsburgh area, October, which started slow ended with an increase in credit-sales. In this district Erie reported the greatest increase in collections as well as credit-sales, over last year.

In the Carolinas, merchants re-

port this October as the best month in the last four years (excepting, of course, the Christmas season). Sales are reported as exceptionally good in the tobacco belt due to the fact that prices for tobacco have almost tripled since last year.

West Virginia also reports a steady increase in credit-sales.

In the southern states collections and credit-sales continue upward although merchants in Arkansas report that unusually warm weather has slowed up sales of clothing.

In Missouri, especially in the Kansas City and St. Louis trade areas, the trend continues upward. Special sales had a tendency to sharply increase buying and collections continue to show improvement. The outlook is favorable for good Christmas business in this district. Iowa shows a healthy increase in credit-sales with the demand for credit above that in 1933.

Ohio is one of the bright spots with some sections reporting as high as 20 per cent increase in collections and 16 per cent increase in credit-sales. Michigan shows an healthy increase over October, 1933, but records a slight falling off in current collections and sales, due to automobile factories shut down in Detroit.

Collections and credit-sales are both reported good in Minnesota, while Nebraska reports collections fair and credit-sales good.

Cities throughout the southwest all report good increases in collections and all but one report a substantial increase in credit-sales. One city in this section reports an increase in credit-sales of 30 per cent over October, 1933.

In Wyoming, credit-sales while 10 per cent above last year, are reported as being temporarily slow, due to "out-of-season" warm weather and continued drought. On the other hand, governmental aid to farmers has helped them materially in paying up old accounts.

In California, collections and credit-sales are reported as good, both showing an increase over last year.
