Christians, it seems, can take nothing for granted, not even the tenure of a longstanding granite statue dedicated to promoting 10 basic virtues.

For his temerity, Moore was relieve f his job as chief justice this past week y a state judicial ethics panel and opponents want him permanently disbarred. Moore, however, vows to continue to fight.
According to The Associated Press, Moore's attorneys are considering taking the matter up with the Alabama Supreme Court. The deadline to appeal, the AP aid, is 30 days.
