White House faith-based director vowe to fight restrictive local government

FALMOUTH, Maine (AP) - The head of the White House Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives says he'll fight local governments that block federal funding of religious groups. "Sometimes you see local governments that bully
faith-based organizations and basically tell them that faith-based organizations and basically tell them that
they have to compromise their religious beliefs and tenets if they want to partner with government," said Jim Towey, who met last week with Catholic Charities of Maine.
"That may be their prerogative when it's state and local money," Towey said, "but when it's federal
money that raises a whole different money that raises a whole different set of issues." Portiand's domestic partnership ordinance restricts federal funding to the Roman Catholic nonprofit
because it provides no benefits to same-sex partners because it provides no benefits to same-sex partners
of employees or unmarried heterosexual partners of staff members. The charity responded by suing the

The share of men without a bachelor's degree before entering the seminary dropped from 30 percent to 22 percent, and the number with a degree cent in the same period.
The survey was conducted by Dean Hoge, a sociologist at the Catholic University of America who has studied the priesthood for three decades. He based his findings on interviews with 336 respondents from dioceses and religious orders.
