



charged, and will cover all runs by that entry.

Entries must have helmet, all lugs, no hub caps, radiator overflow, battery hold-down, no excessive leaking, and seat belts. Contestants under age 18 must have a parent or guardian on site.

Spectators will be charged \$1. Sponsor of the event is the High

Plains Cruisers.

Volunteer fire departments

The Dodge Jones Foundation has once again stepped up to help volunteer fire departments, this time those affected by the March wildfires that burned nearly 1 million acres in the Texas Panhandle. Texas Forest Service recently finished working with 125 fire departments from 41 Panhandle counties that will each receive a \$2,500 emergency grant from the foundation.

"Many of the departments have used the Dodge Jones grant and the Rural Fire Department Assistance Program through Texas Forest Service to purchase wildland personal protective equipment, such as Nomex shirts and pants," said Bill Webb, who is administering the grant for Texas Forest Service (TFS). "They've also purchased essentials such as hoses and nozzles and paid for general repair work to trucks

damaged while fighting the fires."

The \$312,500 comes at a crucial time for fire departments. Most have already surpassed their normal call volume for wildfire responses, and many have also suffered significant equipment losses due to the recent wildfire siege. The foundation also gave \$2,500 grants to more than 100 Big Country fire departments after January and February fires ravaged that region. Another anonymous foundation recently provided \$25,000 to go to 25 of the hardest hit departments in the Big Country.

"The Dodge Jones Foundation has been an incredible friend of the fire service for years, and this is the second time this year they have come forward to help the volun-

Atmos takes steps to help customers

"We are already working on improving our ability to handle more customer calls at our call centers. We are close to our goal of answering all customer calls within two

"Although we have no real control over the cost of the natural gas that we pass through to our customers, we can and will make sure that we maintain high customer service levels this coming heating season."

The company is also making it easier for customers to help their less fortunate neighbors by instituting a new feature to its 'Sharing the Warmth' program that will allow customers to "round-up" their payment to the next highest dollar amount with the difference going directly to the program. The new feature will be available this fall.



Bush supports marriage amendment

WASHINGTON (AP) President Bush on Saturday backed a resolution to amend the Constitution to define marriage as a union between a man and a woman even though the idea has little chance of being passed in the

"Ages of experience have taught us that the commitment of a husband and a wife to love and to serve one another promotes the welfare of children and the stability of society," Bush said in his Saturday radio address. "Marriage cannot be cut off from its cultural, religious and natural roots without weakening this good influence on society.

Democrats say Senate floor time is being wasted on issue, and accuse Republicans of making a premidterm election appeal to social conservatives whose votes were key to Bush's re-

This November, initiatives banning same-sex marriages are expected to be on the ballot in Idaho, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Virginia and Wisconsin.

"Sadly, President Bush is playing election-year politics with this divisive issue," the Rev. Barry W. Lynn, executive director of Americans United for Separation of Church and State, said Friday. "He is shamelessly using this ploy to energize his right-wing base. We should never rewrite the Constitution to enshrine intolerance.'

The White House said Bush did not devote his radio address to the issue or decide to host a presidential event Monday to again endorse the amendment because it is politically expedient, but

because there's a vote on it scheduled next week in the Senate.

"On Monday, I will meet with a coalition of community leaders, constitutional scholars, family and civic organizations and religious leaders," Bush said in urging Congress to pass the amendment and send it to the states for ratification. "They're Republicans, Democrats and independents who've come together to support this amendment."

The amendment would prohibit states from recognizing same-sex marriages. To become law, the proposal

would need two-thirds support in the Senate and House, and then would have to be ratified by at least 38 state legislatures.

Bush said the amendment would fully protect marriage from being redefined, while leaving state legislatures free to make their own choices in defining legal arrangements other than marriage.

It stands little chance of passing the 100-member Senate, where proponents are struggling to get even 50 votes. Several Republicans oppose the measure, and so far only one Democrat -Sen. Ben Nelson of Nebraska

 has said he will vote for it. Acknowledging that emotions often run hot in this debate, Bush urged calm.

"As this debate goes forward, we must remember every American deserves to be treated with tolerance, respect and dignity," he said. "All of us have a duty to conduct this discussion with civility and decency toward one another, and all people deserve to have their voices heard."

Marine barracks in Beirut, Lebanon. The group's Saudi wing, in coordination with larger Lebanese the Hezbollah, is blamed for the Khobar Towers bombing in Saudi Arabia in 1996 that killed hundreds of American servicemen.

Tensions between Iran and the U.S. and its allies have grown over Iran's expanding nuclear program. Iran insists its aims are peaceful; leading U.S. officials say they are convinced the Iranians intend to develop a nuclear weapon within the next decade.

John Negroponte, head of

the U.S. intelligence network, suggested in an interview aired Friday by the British Broadcasting Corp. that an Iranian bomb could be a fact in as little as four years away, although he admitted, "We don't have clear-cut knowledge."

The U.S. and five other world powers agreed Thursday on a plan designed to persuade Iran to give up its nuclear ambitions. Iran's president, without directly mentioning the proposal, pledged Friday that the West would not deprive his country of nuclear technology.



Coronor: Mix-up could have been avoided

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — The coroner who misidentified a college student killed in a van crash said Friday the "entire disaster" could have been avoided if a deputy coroner had not urged a relative to avoid looking at the

The office initially identified the victim as Whitney Cerak, and Cerak's family took the victim's body home to Gaylord, Mich., and buried her.

They learned a month later that they had buried the wrong girl — their daughter was alive but severely injured, and the parents of the crash victim they had buried had been keeping a bedside vigil over Cerak not realizing who she was.

Grant County Coroner Ron Mowery said the "entire disaster" could have been avoided if Cerak's sister moments after she was told Cerak was dead — had not been advised not to look at what was actually the body of Taylor University classmate Laura VanRyn.

"It was out of concern for how she would handle the shock of that," Mowery said. "We reflect now that perhaps that would have negated this entire disaster."

Mowery said that the victim's body was seriously had not been heavily wound-

Cerak, who strongly resembled VanRyn, was in a coma and had a swollen face and broken bones, cuts and bruises and brain damage from the April 26 crash.

Only in recent days, as she regained consciousness, did she start saying things that didn't make sense to the VanRyn family. She replied "Whitney" several times after VanRyn's parents addressed her as "Laura," Spectrum Health spokeswoman Anne Veltema said.

During a recent therapy session, staff members asked her to write her name, and she scrawled "Whitney Cerak."

Taylor spokesman Jim Garringer said there was an earlier hint of the mix-up – VanRyn's roommate had questioned two weeks ago whether the seriously injured young woman recuperating at a Michigan hospital was actually VanRyn. He said the school requested official reports about the crash from accident investigators and the Grant County coroner's office but took no other steps to avoid upsetting the fami-

Mowery has said that wallets and purses were strewn on the ground at the accident damaged but that her head scene. Based on information

from emergency workers, Taylor staff and friends of the victims, rescuers mistakenly identified the body of VanRyn, 22, as Cerak, then


The misidentification has led to scrutiny of local coroners, many of whom lack formal medical training yet are required to identify victims in chaotic conditions.

teer fire departments," said Bobby Young, associate director of Texas Forest Service. "Donations like these are key to helping fire departments get their equipment back in service and their firefighters outfitted with the proper protective equipment.

"Our volunteer firefighters are the backbone of the fire service in Texas," he added. "They operate on very small budgets, so they appreciate any donation of any size."

In addition to handling the foundation grants, Texas Forest Service delivered 20 trucks made available through the Federal **Excess Property Program to** Panhandle fire departments. After surveying all 128 volunteer fire departments for their needs, Texas Forest

Service worked to get the trucks, mostly former military trucks, to departments that had trucks out of service after the fires. TFS also provided 400 tires, as well as grants for repair work to get equipment operational

"We had a team in place to assess the fire department needs within a week of the large fires in the Panhandle," said Charles "Boo" Walker, TFS incident commander for VFD assistance team sent to the Panhandle. "We made contact with all 128 volunteer fire departments in the Panhandle. Then obtained and delivered the needed parts, material, and equipment or training."

Young said every department was affected in some manner, so it was important for Texas Forest Service to help in any way possible to make sure the fire departments were fully functional again.

New Orleans rushes to fix damaged roofs

blue tarps still cover countless damaged houses, and homeowners are racing to fix their roofs before the summer rains and the hurricane season that began Thursday bring more misery.

Roof repairs have been held up by insurance disputes and other bureaucratic delays, as well as a critical shortage of roofers, who have more business they can

"There's only so many roofers and companies and individual roofers and supplies available," said Ken Naguin, executive director of the Louisiana Associated General Contractors.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency issued 81,241 blue roof tarps across Louisiana after Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, said spokesman Aaron Walker. But the number of damaged roofs was far greater because FEMA does not install tarps on certain kinds of roofs for safety and other reasons.

No one knows how many roofs still need repairs. But "obviously, it's not all going to get done," Naquin said.

Homes with tarps will be particularly vulnerable this hurricane season. The tarps are waterproof and are fastened in place, but they are no match for hurricane-force winds and offer little protection against tree limbs and other flying debris.

contract in October to have the blown-off slate roof on her century-old home in the city's Carrollton section replaced with metal sheeting, but the work is still not done.

It took months more before roofers even showed up. "They're all completely overwhelmed," she said. Then, two separate crews started work and failed to finish the job.

In the meantime, Calvit and her husband are staying in a downstairs bedroom and have not repaired the rainsoaked upstairs. Even a rainstorm — never mind a tropical storm or hurricane — is enough to make Calvit fret.

"Every time it would rain, it was like, 'OK, we're not sleeping tonight. We're moving buckets in the attic.' It's stressful," she said.

When an April storm dumped water on her halfrepaired roof, water got through the tarp-covered half, dumping so much water upstairs it began to leak onto the first floor. Calvit and her husband spent the next morning bailing, mopping and drying out books.

"People keep asking, 'How's your roof?' I say, 'Don't ask," she said.



The Dallas Morning News on the war in Iraq:

If you are looking for a timetable to get all the U.S. troops out of Iraq, think again. The situation remains so volatile that only a wild-eyed dreamer would think Iraq has turned the corner. Insurgents keep bombing. Radicals keep posturing. Factions keep demanding. Even President Bush and British Prime Minister Tony Blair owned up to the problems in their prime-time news conference last week.

But the situation doesn't preclude thinking that some troop reductions could occur sooner than later.

First, new Iraqi Prime Minister Nuri al-Maliki claimed last week that the Iraqi militia could take control of large parts of Iraq outside of Baghdad by year's end. We've heard some of that song-and-dance before, so maybe it won't pan out. But this much is true: As many as 250,000 Iraqi troops and police are being trained to secure the country. They should know how to do something right.

Second, Iraq's government continues to come together in fits and spurts. It's far from a perfect cabinet some cronies have gotten jobs and the head of the horrid interior ministry was rewarded with the finance post.

But Mr. Maliki insists the interior and defense ministries must get their acts together. No more of the death squads and goons, whom he seems personally committed to stopping. If he succeeds, and success certainly would be in his best interest as a politician, the need for as many U.S, British and other forces would diminish.

Third, talk about troop withdrawals could help tilt the balance of opinion among the Shia who don't want to fight a long civil war without American support. "They could start getting serious about negotiating with moderate Sunnis," says Council on Foreign Relations senior fellow Walter Russell Mead.

There are a lot of ifs in this equation. And we'd be the first to admit it's impossible to predict anything about Iraq. But neither is it entirely out of the question for some troops to come

Wouldn't that be a glorious moment?



Texas Railroad Commission sets monthly allowables

AUSTIN — The Texas average rig count as of May 19 was 735, representing about 52 percent of all active land rigs in the United States.

In the last 12 months, total Texas reported production was 314 million barrels of oil and 5.7 trillion cubic feet of natural gas.

Texas natural gas production represents approximately 29 percent of total U.S. natural gas demand.

The Texas Railroad Commission's estimated final production for March 2006 is 29,931,296 barrels of crude oil and 449,105,557 Mcf of gas well gas.

The Commission derives final production numbers by multiplying the preliminary March 2006 production totals of 28,162,680 barrels of crude oil and 378,896,108 Mcf of gas well gas by a production adjustment factor of 1.0628 for crude oil and 1.1853 for gas well gas. (These production totals do not include casinghead gas or condensate.)

Texas natural gas storage reported by the Commission for April 2006 is 310,340,690 Mcf compared to 244,838,525 Mcf in April 2005. The May 2006

gas storage estimate is 325,855,746 Mcf. The Texas Railroad Commission's Oil and Gas





Modest weight gain may cause frequent heartburn in women

NEW YORK (AP) -Women who put on extra pounds raise their risk of getting frequent heartburn or making symptoms worse even if they aren't overweight, a new study found.

Compared to women whose weight didn't change, a moderate gain doubled the chances of heartburn and acid reflux. Shedding the pounds cut the risk by about 40 percent, according to the report in Thursday's New England Journal Medicine.

"I see this as one more good reason to try to lose weight if you've put on a few pounds," said the lead author of the study, Dr. Brian C. Jacobson of Boston University Medical Center.

A good example is Suzanne Hagerty of Salem, N.H. Although still overweight, Hagerty said dropping 25 pounds allowed her to stop taking the heartburn drug Prilosec.

"Since I've lost the weight, I have no problems sleeping and I have no issues with reflux," said the 45year-old human resources manager.

Persistent heartburn is the result of stomach acid backing up into the esophagus. It creates a burning pain in the chest or a bitter taste in the throat or mouth.

Hagerty's doctor at Boston University Medical Center said heartburn medi-







NBA PLAYOFFS

Whirlwind day for Wade ends in Heat celebration

MIAMI (AP) — As if getting to the NBA Finals wasn't reward enough, Dwyane Wade found another reason to take delight.

Not only did his Miami Heat silence a season of doubt by getting there, they did it at Detroit's expense - ending the Pistons' two-year reign atop the Eastern Conference.

Shaquille O'Neal had 28 points and 16 rebounds and Jason Williams, one of Miami's prized and numerous offseason additions, came up huge with 21 points on 10-for-12 shooting as the Heat won their first East title with a 95-78 victory over Detroit on Friday night.

Wade who spent seven hours in a hospital Friday, battling dehydration and other flu-like symptoms - had 10 of his 14 points in the third quarter, when

the Heat put the game away.

"Beating the Pistons makes it real,"

Wade said. "If it was any other matchup in the Eastern Conference finals, it wouldn't have been the same.

The historic triumph sent Heat coach Pat Riley to the Finals with his third franchise, put O'Neal in position for his fourth ring - and moved Wade four wins from being coated in the champagne

reserved for champions. And while the Heat celebrated, the Pistons - the NBA's best team all season, a 64-win juggernaut that even Riley tagged as the heavy favorite to win their second title since 2004 left frustrated. Richard Hamilton had 33 points in Game 6, but Detroit shot only

33 percent, spelling its doom. At the end of the day, if you don't win that ring, all what you did all season don't mean nothing," Hamilton

How much did this mean to the Heat? Plenty.

They'll get nearly a full week off, not playing again until facing Phoenix or Dallas when the NBA Finals open Thursday at the home of the Western Conference champions.

"Our guys came tonight and put the hammer down," Riley said. "Period." After an offseason of often-criticized changes Riley made to surround his superstars with more talent gone went Eddie Jones and Damon Jones, in came Williams, Antoine Walker, Gary Payton and James Posey - the Heat broke through to new heights and have no intention to stop climbing now.

"The job," O'Neal said, "is not done.' He and the Pistons met in the playoffs for the third straight year _ and for the first time, O'Neal won.

"I think we had a great year," Pistons coach Flip Saunders said. "But ultimately every team that comes in when you start October 3rd have one goal in mind. And ultimately there's failure for 29 teams and success for one team, and that's pretty much how you judge it."
Wade missed the morning

shootaround practice, then missed the first 2 1/2 minutes of the second half while more IVs were administered to keep him hydrated.



The researchers concluded there was a strong link between weight and frequent heartburn, with the risk rising along with body-mass index in both normal-weight and overweight women.

For example, a 5-foot-6 woman who weighs 125 pounds and one who weighs 140 pounds are both in the normal-weight The slimmer woman has a BMI of about 20, while the heavier woman's is over 22.

Based on their findings, Jacobson said, the 140pound woman would be about 40 percent more likely to have heartburn symptoms than the 125-pound woman. Overweight or

New Jersey girl pockets first prime-time spelling bee title

By JOSEPH WHITE Associated Press Writer

WASHINGTON (AP) - The winner of the first national spelling bee on prime-time network television didn't display any made-for-reality-TV theatrics. She didn't write imaginary letters in the air, scream her letters into the microphone or punch her fist when she got a word right.

No, all 13-year-old Katharine Close did was spell big words with a nod of the head and her hands in her pockets, her left hand clutching an unseen pendant labeled "Angel in My Pocket."

"It was given to me by a family in my town," said the eighth-grader from H.W. Mountz School in Spring Lake, N.J. "And I always put it in my pocket during spelling bees. I think it brings good luck, for some reason."

Katharine's modest but disarming smile turned into a gasp of joy Thursday when she aced "ursprache" — which means a parent language — to claim the Scripps National Spelling Bee title. She is the first girl to take the top prize in seven years.

"I couldn't believe it. I knew I knew how to spell the word and I was just in shock," said Katharine, who won more than \$42,000 in

cash and prizes. "I couldn't kind of nerve-racking." believe I would win.'

Katharine, who has studied words an hour or two each day for years, acknowledged that luck played a part. She had studied "ursprache" but didn't know the words that eliminated the thirdand fourth-place finishers.

"I was relieved I didn't get those," Katharine said Friday on CBS' "The Early Show."

The ratings will determine whether Katharine's winning performance was worth two hours of prime-time programming on ABC, but there was little doubt that on a day when she was champion, TV ruled the show.

ESPN has broadcast the second day of the bee in the afternoon since 1994, but the contest's growing popularity prompted the prime-time move that would yield a larger viewing audience at the expense of the flow of the competition. There were interminable delays for commercials and upclose-and-personal profiles of the contestants, piling on the boredom for some — as evidenced by onstage yawns - and the anxiety for

Even one of the most charming moments of the evening — when the finalists spontaneously gathered in a huddle and chanted

"One-Two-Three-Spell!" - had to be repeated for the TV cameras.

"It does make the spelling bee a bit more show biz," said James Maguire, author of "American Bee, The National Spelling Bee and the Culture of Word Nerds."

"I realize it's a bit more stagemanaged than before," Maguire said. "We're living in a TV age. The spelling bee has been shaped by TV more than ever before."

At least the drama was compelling. Katharine and runner-up Finola Mei Hwa Hackett, a 14year-old Canadian, were the last two standing for seven rounds, both confidently spelling words such as "maieutic," "poiesis" and "tmesis."

Finally, Finola, from Edmonton, Alberta, stumbled on the intriguing word "weltschmerz," which essentially means a kind of sentimental pessimism.

Third-place went to Saryn Hooks, a 14-year-old from West Alexander Middle School in Taylorsville, N.C., who was disqualified earlier in the evening, then returned to competition after the judges corrected their mistake. Saryn eventually fumbled on "icteritious," an adjective describing a jaundiced color.

Katharine was appearing in the

bee for the fifth time, having tied for seventh-place last year. She studied by typing lists of words on her computer and hopes someday to be a journalist.

Asked what she'll remember most about the bee, she said: "Probably just hearing 'ursprache."'

The bee is enjoying popularity unrivaled in its 79-year history. "Akeelah and the Bee," a movie about a Los Angeles girl who overcomes adversity to win the national bee, opened nationwide in late April.

That followed last year's "Bee Season," about a man focused on his daughter's quest to become a spelling bee champ. It was based on the best-selling novel by Myla Goldberg.

Also last year, the Broadway musical, "The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee," won two Tony awards. And the 2002 documentary "Spellbound" followed eight teenagers during their quest to win the 1999 National Spelling Bee.

The Louisville Courier-Journal started the bee in 1925. The E.W. Scripps Co., a media conglomerate, assumed sponsorship in 1941.

Monaco's Prince Albert acknowledges daughter

PALM DESERT, Calif. (AP) This desert oasis that has long been home to presidents and movie stars now has a touch of royalty.

Her name is Jazmin Grace Grimaldi, and she is the 14-yearold out-of-wedlock daughter of Monaco's Prince Albert II and a California woman who reportedly worked as a waitress.

If it sounds like the plot of a Disney movie, it is — almost.

Unlike the fictional Mia of "The Princess Diaries," Jazmin won't face the painful decision of whether to take the throne of the 700-year-old dynasty. The royal family of the tiny principality recognized her Thursday but said she will not be in line to the throne. Monaco's constitution requires parents of heirs to the throne to be married.

Jazmin's life quickly took on the trappings of royalty - namely, the hordes of paparazzi after word came from Europe that Albert acknowledged that he was the teenager's father.

Photographers and reporters converged on Palm Desert and watched from across the street at St. Margaret's Episcopal School, where she has been an honor student, and the world media sought details about her and her mother, Tamara Rotolo, 44.

But Jazmin and her mother were nowhere in sight, and police warned a reporter and aphotographer they would be arrested if they set foot on school property. A bodyguard kept watch after classes began.

The community two hours east of Los Angeles also responded protectively. "Leave that poor girl alone!" a woman yelled from a car stopped at a traffic light.

At the end of the school day, a ponytailed blond girl in a school uniform was escorted to an armored sport utility vehicle registered to a Los Angeles security firm. The girl did not respond to reporters' shouted questions.

The same SUV was later seen leaving a gated country club and resort community with waterfalls and lush landscaping. A security guard turned away a reporter requesting to visit the family.

The area, which includes the towns of Palm Springs, Indian Wells and Rancho Mirage, has long been a playground or retirement area for the rich and heads of state, including former Presidents Eisenhower, Ford and Reagan. Frank Sinatra, Bob Hope and other stars used to golf or party in the area.

Confirmation that Albert was Jazmin's father followed years of rumors about a daughter, and Albert's acknowledgment last July that he fathered a boy out of wedlock by a former flight atten-

dant from Togo. never-married 48-year-old prince support.

had a fling with the girl's mother in 1991 when she vacationed on the Cote d'Azur in the south of France. The girl's March 4, 1992, Riverside County birth certificate identified the father as Albert Alexandre Louis Pierre Grimaldi of Monaco.

The French media reported that Tamara Rotolo is a former waitress. But she apparently now works in real estate. State records show that a Tamara Jean Rotolo is a salesperson at a realty office in Palm Desert.

Court records show Rotolo was married in 1987 to a man named David Shumaker and they separated two years later. A divorce was finalized in 1992.

Tidbits about Jazmin's life had already made the local paper five times in the years before she became a celebrity. The Desert Sun of Palm Springs reported she was a soloist in the school choir that performed with Barry Manilow. She was also an honor student, science fair winner and student of the month.

Paåtricia Rotolo, who identified herself as Tamara Rotolo's cousin, talked to the Desert Sun on Tuesday. "All's been handled really well for (the child's) sake," she said.

The prince, who is the son of Hollywood beauty Grace Kelly and has a personal fortune estimated at \$1 billion, made the public acknowledgment of the girl through his lawyer, Thierry Lacoste. Albert "officially recognizes a paternity that was legally established a few weeks ago,' Lacoste said in an interview published Thursday in France's Le Figaro.

Albert initially planned to keep his parentage of Jazmin secret until she reached adulthood, but "the situation had become untenable for her" in recent weeks amid increasing speculation about her father, Lacoste said.

Lacoste said Jazmin was welcome in Monaco but cannot take the throne, and the royal family does not recognize her use of the Grimaldi name.

Albert's other child, 3-year-old Alexandre, is not in line for the throne either.

Monaco's royal palace refused to comment on the "private affairs of the prince."

According to court records, Rotolo filed a paternity suit seeking child support from Albert in Riverside County, Calif., in 1991. A decade later sued her own lawyers, claiming they failed to tell her the suit had to have been filed in Monaco before 1994 to preserve her rights.






PJHS Awards Assembly


