

A Pampa woman was killed in an accident around 11:30 a.m. Friday when the car she was driving was struck by a BNSF train.

According to Texas
Department of Public Safety
Trooper Chad Brooks,
Annette Louise Adkism, 45,
of Pampa died at the scene
of the accident.

DPS, Pampa Fire Department and Gray

Sheriff's Deputies were called to the scene.

"Adkism was traveling west on Highway 60 when she turned north to enter the property of National Oilwell," said Brooks. "As she was crossing the railway tracks, a train that was traveling east stuck the car she was driving."

Brooks, who is the lead investigator of the accident, said the crash is still under investigation.





116 S. Cuyler.


Jeff Indeck, curator of archeology at Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum in Canyon, will be the speaker. Admission is free and the program is open to the

## School bus safety week aims to protect children

School bus safety week is today through Saturday across the United States and it is a good time to remind drivers to be aware of school buses and the children either getting on or off of them. This year's safety week theme, "Stop on Red, Kids Ahead," reminds drivers to obey the law regarding

school buses. For most students, the most dangerous part of their journey to and from school is crossing the street to board a school bus or after exiting one. According to a report issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety, no students were killed during this critical part of their journey to and from school during the 2006-2007 school year, but passing motorists pose the greatest danger to

these students.

Texas state law requires

drivers to stop for school buses that are stopped and have activated their flashing red light. Drivers should not proceed until the school bus resumes motion, the bus driver signals the other driver to proceed or the flashing lights go off.

"Motorists who do not stop are endangering our most precious resource, which is our children," said DPS Director Col. Thomas A. Davis Jr. "These reckless drivers will face fines of up to \$1,000 plus court costs if they are convicted."

If a road is divided only by a left-turning lane, drivers on both sides of the roadway must stop for school buses with alternating red flashing lights activated. If the lanes are separated by an intervening space or physical barrier, only motorists going in the same direction as the bus are

## Disaster preparedness takes a turn up

AUSTIN - State agencies and local governments throughout Texas will be better prepared for emergencies thanks to \$2.6 million recently awarded to the national Council of State Archivists (CoSA) by the Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The funding for the national initiative will enable the Texas State Library and Archives Commission to provide critical training and services to state and local government agencies throughout Texas.

When state and local governments are faced with natural or manmade disasters, certain records help them respond to and recover from emergency. Intergovernmental Preparedness for Essential Records (IPER) project will develop workshops nationwide designed to teach state and local government officials and employees how to identify and protect their most essential records and recover those damaged by

According to Vicki Walch, Executive Director of CoSA, the need for such a program became apparent in 2005, during the organization's response to Hurricane Katrina.

"Archivists discovered that records were not identified as an asset of government in the National Response Plan," Walch said. "We knew from experience that whether a disaster is a localized fire or a widespread terrorist attack, the governments that have good records management in place are best prepared to respond to and recover from an emergency."

The benefit to Texas will be immense, according to Dr. Michael Heskett, Texas state records administrator and director of the State and Local Records Management division of the State Library and Archives.

"Texas is prone to hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, wildfires, and much else, and any one of these threaten lives and can destroy the history of a community," Heskett said. "Texas communities are in great need of training to plan and prepare for disasters that would threaten their vital records. A post-Rita survey of East and Southeast Texas indicated state and local levels. that half of the government entities surveyed did not have a Disaster Recovery and Preparedness Plan in

place when the storm hit." The IPER initiative will develop a national curriculum and create Web-based seminars, which will be customized to meet specific needs and concerns at the

A team from Texas will add guidance and resources specific to the state and then deliver the training to state and local government agencies statewide. The Texas State Library and Archives Commission will coordinate the Texas team, which will include various representatives from state agencies.

## \$10 million available for delivering meals

Agriculture Commissioner Todd Staples has reminded agencies and non-profit organizations that Nov. 1 is the postmark deadline for submitting a grant application to receive funding from the Texas Department of Agriculture's Texans Feeding Texans: Home-Delivered Meal Grant Program.

The program, which was created during the 80th legislative session, helps defray the cost of home-delivered meals not fully paid for by the Texas Department of Aging and Disability Services (DADS) or the Area Agencies on Aging (AAA). The Legislature appropriated \$20 million to fund the grant program for the next two years.

"This grant program will make a tremendous difference in the lives of those homebound Texans who use and need this service," Staples said. "It will significantly reduce or even eliminate the waiting lists many agencies and non-profit organizations have of elderly Texans or those with disabilities who depend on home-delivered meals for their well-being."

To be eligible, an organization must be a non-profit or a governmental agency that is a direct provider of home-delivered meals. The entity also must receive a grant of 25 cents or less from a county where it is delivering meals for each person 60 years old or older. If the non-profit organization or agency serves multiple counties, it must submit a grant application for each

On average, home-delivered meals usually cost between \$3 and \$6 for food and transportation. Under the grant program, TDA will be able to refund \$1 per meal served during the last state fiscal year that was not supported by DADS or AAA funding.

For fiscal year 2008, \$10 million will be distributed by Feb. 1, 2008, after all valid applications are processed. If the amount of qualifying grants exceeds the amount available, funds will be distributed on a pro rata basis. The \$10 million for fiscal year 2009 will be paid out by Feb. 1, 2009.



In 1959, the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum in New York opened to the public.


In 1960, Democrat John F. Kennedy and Republican Richard M. Nixon clashed in their fourth and final presiden-

As members of the Gray County Airport Advisory Board, we would like to respond to Mr. Calvin Lacy's letter to the editor in the Oct. 7, 2007, Pampa News. The members of our board serve on a voluntary basis and work with the county judge and commissioners to set priorities and work on annual budgets for the Perry Lefors and McLean airports.

Airports are just like county roads, museums, highways, parks, municipal golf courses and libraries. Each is a vital part of the infrastructure which makes it possible for a vibrant, thriving community to exist.

A town the size of Pampa without an airport would be a dying town.

Are county roads, museums, etc., self supporting? No. We support and maintain them with taxes and the airports are no different. What you should know,

however, is that the current county court members, while recognizing the importance of well maintained airports, are cognizant of their obligation to spend the taxpayers' money wisely and with tight controls. We are keenly aware of this, as the commission often turns down some of our spending requests.

The Dallas Morning News on alter-

nate alternatives: There's no quarrel about this point: Americans need alternatives to gasoline if we're going to stem the flow of foreign oil and curb pollution in Dallas-

Fort Worth and other major urban/sub-

urban areas. But there's no reason Washington needs to bet so heavily on corn-based ethanol as that alternative. Not when reports show that the supply of ethanol is so great, believe it or not, that there's

a glut of it on the market. The most telling statistic shows the

average ethanol price plunging from about \$2.50 a gallon at the end of last year to about \$1.50 now.

There are numerous reasons for the supply-demand problem. One is the overproduction of corn. You can thank the handsome subsidies Washington pays farmers to grow corn for the fact that we are on track this year to yield the largest crop in U.S. history.

All that production has to go somewhere, and ethanol plants are a main

Actually, the glut presents a wonderful opening. Congress now has a clear and compelling reason to revisit its policies toward this cleaner-burning but energy-intensive-to-produce fuel.

The Senate Agriculture Committee can get things going by paring back

corn subsidies. The committee is preparing a five-year farm bill now. Some members won't want to change anything, but we hope committee Chairman Tom Harkin sticks to his convictions and takes a swing at government payments to grow corn.

That would be a nervy stance for an Iowa Democrat to take, but Mr. Harkin can draw strength from other farm-state senators like Dick Durbin, D-Ill., and Dick Lugar, R-Ind. who also want to overhaul ineffective subsidies.

Smaller, entrepreneurial companies would be at Mr. Harkin's side, too, if he tried to shift money from corn subsidies to incentives for growing, say, switchgrass.



As to landing fees: Gray County's airports are federally funded airports and must adhere to federal guidelines, which prohibit public airports from charging landing fees. Only privately owned and funded airports can charge landing fees.

Mr. Lacy's letter also leaves the impression that the county leases hangar space to "rich folks" at cheap, taxpayersubsidized rates. The hangars Mr. Lacy refers to are built, bought and paid for by the individuals or companies who own the aircraft in them. The only thing they lease from the county (under stringent usage contracts) is the ground they sit on. The hangar owners also pay property taxes on their hangars so the county receives additional income that way.

Another point to note is that capital improvement projects at the airport are funded 90 percent by federal and state monies and that most routine maintenance is funded 50 percent by state grants. The 90 percent federal money comes from the Airport and Airway Trust sale of aviation fuel and by airline ticket taxes. Aviation pays its way.

At an average of less than one percent of the total Gray County budget, we believe our airports are a great asset and a bargain for the community. The county judge and commissioners recognize and deserve our respect and support for the conscientious work they do.

earliest hints of "modern" living, humans found black mussels, small saltwater clams.

and hit the seashore for steaming mussels, new archaeological finds show.

Call it a beach party for early man.

But it's a beach party thrown by people who weren't supposed to be advanced enough for this type of behavior. What was found in a cave in South Africa may change how scientists believe Homo sapiens marched into modernity.

Instead of undergoing a revolution into modern living about 40,000 to 70,000 years ago, as commonly thought, man may have become modern in stuttering fits and starts, or through a long slow

march that began even earlier. At least that's the case being made in a study appearing in the journal Nature on Thursday.

Researchers found three hallmarks of modern life at Pinnacle Point overlooking the Indian Ocean near South Africa's Mossel Bay: harvested and cooked seafood, reddish pigment from ground rocks, and early tiny blade technology. Scientific optical dating techniques show that these hallmarks were from 164,000 years ago, plus or minus 12,000 years.

"Together as a package this looks like the archaeological record of a much later time period," said study author Curtis Marean, professor of anthropology at the Institute of Human Origins at Arizona State University.

This means humans were eating seafood about 40,000 years earlier than previously thought. And this is the earliest record of

humans eating something other than what they caught or gathered on the land, Marean said. Most of what Marean found were the WASHINGTON (AP) - In one of the remnants of brown mussels, but he also 164,000 years ago put on primitive makeup sea snails and even a barnacle that indicates

whale blubber or skin was

brought into the cave. Marean figured the early people, probably women, had to trudge two to three miles to where the mussels, clams and snails were harvested and to bring them back to the cave. Then they put them over hot rocks to cook. When the food was done, the shells popped open in a process similar to modern-day mussel-steaming, but without the pot.

Marean and colleagues tried out that ancient cooking technique in a kind of archaeological test kitchen. "We've prepped them the

same way," Marean said in telephone interview from South Africa. "They're a little less moist (than modern steamed mussels). They definitely lose some moisture."

Marean also found 57 pieces of ground-up rock that would have been reddish- or pinkish-brown. That would be used for self-decoration and sending social signals to other people, much the way makeup is used now, he said.

There have been reports of earlier but sporadic pigment use in Africa. The same goes with rocks that were fashioned into small pointy tools.

But having all three together shows a grouping of people that is almost modern, Marean said. Seafood harvesting, unlike other hunter-gatherer activities, encourages people to stay put, and that leads to more social interactions, he said.

"High school orchestras play such a vital role in the musical development of students, and our quartet has a vital interest in helping out where we can," Cotik said.





CANAVERAL, CAPE Fla. (AP) — A giant leap is about to be made for womankind.

When space shuttle Discovery blasts off Tuesday, a woman will be sitting in the commander's seat. And up at the international space station, a female skipper will be waiting to greet her.

It will be the first time in the 50-year history of spaceflight that two women are in charge of two spacecraft at the same time.

This is no public relations gimmick cooked up by NASA. It's coincidence, which pleases shuttle commander Pamela Melroy and station commander Peggy Whitson.

"To me, that's one of the best parts about it," said Melroy, a retired Air Force colonel who will be only the second woman to command a space shuttle flight. "This is not something that was the orbital outpost on a At least it wasn't a mop. planned or orchestrated in any way."

## Safe room program entering final round

AMARILLO — Panhandle Regional Planning Commission has announced the start of the third, and perhaps, final round of the Regional Residential Safe Room Program.

Funded by the FEMA, the program is designed to assist homeowners with costs of installing storm shelters, built to meet national safety standards, in their homes. The program provides participants with a rebate of up to \$2,500 to support those costs.

Over the past year and a half, FEMA has provided PRPC with nearly \$3.9 million to support this program. With the two previous rounds (held in October 2006 and April 2007), the PRPC has already awarded nearly 1,400 rebates. About 100 rebates are up for grabs in Round III.

"This program has been very good for the Panhandle," said John Kiehl, regional services director for the commission. "If you've lived in this area long enough, you know how vulnerable the Panhandle is to tornados. The twisters that hit Cactus and Tulia this past April sure reinforced that fact and a number of reliable sources now seem to think that that the frequency and intensity of tornados will be increasing in the future."

The program is open to all homeowners within the 26-county area of the Texas Panhandle. Round III applications will be accepted through Nov. 16.

The whip stayed behind on Earth.

Eleven years ago, just before Shannon Lucid rocketed to the Russian space station Mir, a Russian space official said during a live prime-time news conference that he was pleased she was going up because "we know that women love to clean."

"I really haven't heard very much like that at all from the Russian perspective," Whitson said in an interview with Associated Press last week. "Russian cosmonauts are very professional and having

worked and trained with them for years before we get to this point, I think makes it better because then it doesn't seem unusual to thein either."

"So I think I'm luckier. Shannon was probably breaking more barriers in that way than I have been," added Whitson, who spent six months aboard the space station in 2002.

Melroy, 46, a former test pilot from Rochester, N.Y., and Whitson, 47, a biochemist with a Ph.D. who grew up on a hog farm near Beaconsfield, Iowa, are among 18 female astronauts at, NASA. Seventy-three astronauts are men.

What's more, Melroy is the only female shuttle pilot

left at NASA. Eileen Collins, who in 1999 became the first woman to command a shuttle, quit NASA last year. Susan Kilrain, who flew as a shuttle pilot but never as a commander, resigned in 2002. Both have children.

Melroy and Whitson are married to scientists, and neither has children.

This will be Melroy's third shuttle flight; her first two were as co-pilot. She became an astronaut in 1995, Whitson in 1996.

Their 1 1/2 weeks together in orbit will be extraordinarily busy and the work exceedingly complex. The shuttle is hauling up a pressurized compartment that will provide docking ports for the European and Japanese laboratories that will be launched over the next few months.

The 10 space fliers, seven new compartment, named Harmony, to the space station and move a girder and set of solar wings from one spot to another. Five spacewalks will be conducted, including one to test a repair technique on deliberately damaged shuttle thermal

tiles. Melroy and Whitson will oversee it all.





## Iowans cope with smell from hog farms; officials worry about business

By HENRY C. JACKSON Associated Press Writer

LORIMOR, Iowa (AP) — Mayor Kent Forbes has learned a hard truth about Sometimes it stinks.

That's not a figure of speech. His tiny southern Iowa town is surrounded by hog farms, where tons of manure fill the air with a biting ammonia smell.

new in a state that has long been a national leader in hog, corn and soybean production. But a steady proliferation of huge hog confinements - many with upward of 5,000 hogs - has drawn complaints from longtime Iowans and concerns that the odor could hinder efforts to attract businesses.

And all residents can do is stay indoors.

State legislators have placed minimal restrictions on the hog industry, and a federal court has ruled that small-town life in Iowa: confinements can't be sued under the Clean Air Act if they agree to pay a small fee and allow the Environmental Protection Agency to monitor their emissions.

"I don't think the (state) has been aggressive on this Farm odors are nothing at all," said Barb Kalbach, board president of Iowa Citizens for Community Improvement, a grass-roots group that helps rural residents fight the confinements. "And I don't think the state would tolerate this stuff from any other industry."

after the practice was popularized in North Carolina. By housing thousands of hogs in one area, managers can keep costs low and meet consumer demand for a consistent product.

The factory farms have mostly replaced smaller family operations, which were scattered enough to limit their unavoidable stench.

"Hogs have been in Iowa forever, but they were always far less concentrated " said Bruce Babcock, director of Iowa State University's Center for Agricultural and Rural Development. "Now, there are so many hogs on one site and it can really smell."

The operations typically set up shop near small, rural towns, where land is cheap and officials are eager for any new business that offers jobs and increased tax rev-

Johnson said the state is committed to regulating confinements, pointing to the first meeting later this month of a livestock odor study committee.

For many, though, the state's efforts have been mere platitudes, and word of a proposed hog farm causes panic.

"When you hear about one of these coming in you, you think you're going to have to move, that you've got to get away from it," Kalbach said. "But then you think, 'My goodness! Who will buy

Three years ago, developers proposed a 5,600-head hog farm about a mile from Kalbach's corn and soybean farm near Dexter, a town of 800 about 30 miles west of Des Moines.

The confinement won an initial permit, but activists appealed to the state's environmental commission, which ruled the operation would be too close to residents.

The ruling amounted to a

rare reprieve. In many cases, residents fail to organize an effective opposition, and proposed sites are often so remote that officials refuse to stop them.

Agriculture State Secretary Bill Northey, himself a corn and soybean farmer, is sympathetic to residents' complaints but defends Iowa's efforts to combat odors.

He said state and local officials have rejected some operations, and he noted the difficulty of quantifying something as ephemeral as smell.

"Odor is inherently a complicated kind of thing,' Northey said. "It's just like odor from a city or a factory plant. It's hard to measure and people are sensitive to it in different ways."

In May, he wrote several officials with the Iowa Farm Bureau to tell them he planned to undertake an odor study, according to e-mails obtained by The Associated Press using Iowa's open records law.

## Pampa loses close match with Hereford

In perhaps one of the most evenly matched games of the season, the Harvesters were defeated Friday night by the Hereford Whitefaces, bringing their district records to 1-1 and 2-0, respectively.

Behind through almost the entire first half, Pampa not only survived what seemed to be selective negligence by the officials in Hereford's favor, but also surpassed the Herd's lead with seconds remaining in the second quarter.


Then, senior Wayne Parker received a 31-yard pass from junior quarterback Casey Trimble to give Pampa the first down on Hereford's 37-yard line.





IRVING, Texas (AP) — Suspended defensive tackle Tank Johnson practiced with the Dallas Cowboys for the first time Friday, disappointed but understanding that commissioner Roger Goodell didn't shorten his eight-game ban.

Johnson, signed by Dallas after getting cut by the Chicago Bears, can't play in a game until Nov. 11 against the New York Giants. He said he'd hoped Goodell would agree to shorten his suspension for violating probation on a gun charge to six games, but will settle for the three weeks of practice he was granted.

"Me and Roger, we're good friends, man," Johnson

said after the workout. "We talk a lot. It's actually very nice of him to allow me to practice because as far as the career goes, it's kind of important to get going first before you get out there full speed."

He was far from that Friday. After some stretching exercises, Johnson mostly watched during individual drills for the short time practice was open to the media.

The practices will serve as Johnson's own personal training camp because he was unemployed for the real thing. He was already suspended by the NFL when he was pulled over for speeding in June, and the Bears released him. The Cowboys

signed him last month.

Phillips was glad to have him out there, but he wasn't ready to give the Bears' second-round pick in 2004 firstteam repetitions. "We've got a program for

Willie B. Posey, Johnson's bodyguard, was shot and killed in an early-morning fight while he and Johnson were at a Chicago nightclub. Johnson was suspended by the Bears for one game for being at the club.

He pleaded guilty to a misdemeanor weapons charge stemming from the raid and spent two months in

The traffic stop came

about a month after his release, and he was arrested on suspicion of drunken driving. He was never charged, and tests showed he wasn't legally drunk.

"I learned a lot," Johnson "The maturation process is such an ongoing process. You learn every day. I had a lot of different things thrown at me."

Now those things are the wrinkles of Phillips' 3-4 defense. Although he's never played the 3-4, Johnson said Phillips shares an attacking philosophy with his old coach, Chicago's Lovie Smith. That means interior defensive linemen are coached to get as far into the backfield as possible on most plays.

But that's getting ahead of where Johnson is right now.

"I just want to get a good feel for being on the field," he said. "When you're coming out to get back into the game after not playing since the Super Bowl, you want to knock the rust off, get acclimated to the temperature, to the speed of the game, just

get back in a groove." Believe it or not, Johnson said the toughest part of the suspension was the preseason, just because of "all the buildup to the season."







# Figs, cheese make inspiring beginning

(NAPSA) — Figs and cheese are one of life's most flavorful pleasures. Sweet, moist golden Calimyrna and black Mission California figs pair well with a wide variety of delectable cheeses, ranging from crumbly, sharp blue cheese to soft Brie and Camembert to firm cheddar.

Whether it's a fruit and cheese platter put together as unexpected guests arrive or a dessert course served as the finale to an elegant supper with friends, the delicious combinations of figs and cheeses are limited only by one's imagination.

When serving figs and cheese, always allow time for the cheeses (except for fresh cheeses) to come to room temperature for full flavors-about one to three hours. For a cheese and fruit platter, try selecting a fresh cheese such as goat or cream cheese, perhaps sprinkled with chopped herbs; a soft or semisoft cheese such as Brie or Camembert; a blue cheese; and a firm cheese like cheddar or Spanish Manchego. Arrange cheeses on a platter starting with the mildest or sweetest cheese and ending with the strongest-flavored cheese. Both varieties of dried California figs, golden Calimyrnas and black Missions, go well

with most cheeses.

If you would like to add a wine, white wines will be easier to pair. Some red wines are good but because white wines lack tannins, they make better cheese and fruit companions. A good rule of thumb might be to match intensely flavored cheeses with bold, intensely flavored wines. A Brie, for example, goes well with Chardonnay and a blue cheese with a zinfandel.
