

# Society's 'Dig' set **June 14-21**

PERRYTON — With Indiana Jones returning to the big screen this spring, what better way to spend the summer than at an archaeological dig?

There may not be the foreign intrigue of the Indiana Jones film genre, but Dr. Scott Brosowske said there will be plenty of prehistory and history at the Texas Archaeological Society Field School here June 14 through 21 in Ochiltree County.

"We are going to be hosting the annual Texas Archaeological Society Field School," said Brosowske, a research archeologist for Courson Archaeological Research.

It is the first time in 20 years that the panhandle has hosted the school.

The annual school, Brosowske said, moves to different locations around the state from year to year.

"It was down by Junction last summer," he said, "and out by Paris year before last. It's going to be up in the panhandle this year and next

The school will begin at 7 a.m., Saturday, June 14, and it runs through the following Saturday, June 21.

"It's eight days long," Brosowske said.

The school will be based

at Lake Fryer. 'We have the whole south side of the lake reserved,"

# Extension can advise on bees, but not eradicate

An attack last year on reported Africanized bees was one of many misconceptions attributed to bees in the last few years.

"They were just honey bees," Brandon McGinty of the Texas Agrilife Extension

Office said. Africanized or "killer" bees first came to Texas from South America in 1990. Since their introduction, they have been mating with European bees to form a cross that is more aggressive but according to McGinty


their dangerous reputation has been exaggerated.

"Bees are highly sensitive. They know when your heart is racing, when your adrena-Duncan Street in Pampa by line is peeked and they may feel you're a predator," McGinty said. "They're not going to come after you just to come after you."

The sting itself is not more potent in Africanized bees, according to McGinty, but when a bee stings, the stinger that is left behind gives off a pheromone that attracts other







Brosowske said.

For adults, there is a Texas Archaeological Society membership fee of \$40 per year, or \$50 per family. The fee for the field school, Brosowske said, will vary.

"Not everyone can be there for the entire eight days," Brosowske said. "For people that are going to be there for the entire field school, the entire eight days, it is \$100."

To sign up, Brosowske said potential participants can go to Texas Archaeological website, www.txarch.org.

"It has all the information on the field school, how to register," Brosowske said. "You can register on-line or print off forms and mail them in."

The website also has a list of equipment that will be needed, nance was reported inhibeed "They can take care of

everything right on the TAS website," Brosowske said.

The school will include

historic sites and historic Indian and military sites.

"Really," Brosowske said, "there will be something for everyone," Brosowske said.

The participants will be working on a number of different sites, he said.

"Typically, at the TAS field school, they work on a single site," Brosowske said, "but there's so much panhandle prehistory and history that we don't know anything about that we're going to split up and work on something like eight different

He said he is expecting some 400 to 500 people from around the State of Texas and surrounding states.

"For us," he said, "there's so much that we don't know, it's going to really provide us with some opportunities. It will really give us the opportunity to learn as much as we can in a relatively short period of time."

Brosowske said field laboraries are being set up where

the materials that are excavated will be washed and sorted.

"We'll be working each day out in the field and in the labs from 7 a.m. until 1 p.m.," Brosowske said.

Participants can relax in the afternoon, he said, and then in the evenings, there will be a series of programs that will include archeologists, stargazing, dinners and dances.

'Asleep at the Wheel' will perform on Friday night at a dance in the Perryton Exposition Center. The dinner that night will be catered by Dyer's Barbeque from Pampa.

John Erickson, author of the 'Hank, the Cow Dog' books, will provide entertainment one night.

That first Saturday night," Brosowske said, "we're having a live band and catered dinner."

"We would love to have as many local people as we can," Brosowske said. "This is their history and prehistory."

It's an opportunity for people to participate in an archeological dig, Brosowske said.

He said he'd like to see as much local involvement as possible. Originally from Minnesota,

"There have been few people that have looked into that," Brosowske said. "I've been working out here for about 15 years now." He had been living in

Norman, Okla., while he worked on his doctorate. "It was about a four or five

hour drive to get out here, and I was away from my family," Brosowske said. "When I finished up school, I'd been working part time for the Courson family and they made an offer for me to come up and move my family up here and live where I love to do research, so it's been a real blessing."

the ER immediately," McGinty said.

What won't work is jumping into a pond or lake with a straw for breathing.

"I've heard of them hovering over the person until they emerged. I've heard they've plugged straws ... I don't know if that's true but they are highly intelligent," McGinty said. To avoid getting stung,

McGinty added, people need to be conscious of where they're working and what they're around. Openings in houses, tires, vacant or abandoned buildings and cars or any other protected area that has gone undisturbed makes a good place for a beehive. Also recommended is to avoid heavy perfumes and bright colored clothing.

"Turn and walk away. Don't run. Don't mess with the hive," McGinty said. "Contact me or a beekeeper or pest control com-

To prevent bees from making a hive in your home, check for anything in your yard that might be turned over such as a trashcan, a flowerpot or even a birdhouse. According to Beekeeper Ron Ebel, any gaps in the concrete around your house or cracks in the eve of your house make good places for hives.

"Generally, they're in the attic or eave of the home and you need to get in and dig them out," Ebel said. "More than likely it'll cause a bit of dam-

There's no way to tell if a bee is Africanized without testing them. That's where McGinty comes in. They send the bees to College Station to test wing vei measurement or DNA.

"We do not physically come remove the bees, or any other pest problems," McGinty said. 'We can help people get in contact with someone who can resolve their situation."

According to Ebel, if you see a ball of them they're not that aggressive because they don't yet have a hive, so they ball around the queen.

"Bees in the daytime are more aggressive so don't deal with them until after dark," Dean Wyman of Caveley's Pest Control added.

Ebel said he always replaces the queen when he removes a hive to reduce the possibility of Africanized bees. He even goes so far as to replace his own queens every two years, especially if they start showing some aggression.

"The bees get tired of living with the same old woman,

Out of 60 calls that Ebel took last year only one dealt with Africanized bees. According to McGinty, bees are here to stay and residents in Gray County must learn to live with them.

"We have to have them. Without bees, we couldn't grow crops. We need them to survive," McGinty said. "We can't just wipe them out because they're a nuisance."

Herman was later cleared. A French mint produced the first coins of Europe's single currency, the euro.

## Texas Thoughts.

May 2 The Dallas Morning News on rethinking ethanol policies:

The legislators negotiating a new farm bill evidently don't do their own grocery shopping.

Otherwise, they'd have seen the dramatic rise in food prices. And they'd have done more than trim only about \$400 million from the \$26 billion in direct payment subsidies they're planning for farmers. Nor would they have insisted on a new \$4 billion permanent disaster fund for ag producers.

Congress is working feverishly to finish this lousy bill, which we hope a

presidential veto deeply buries. President Bush rightly warned legislators this week about giving farmers big payments to grow crops such as corn, cotton, soybeans and rice.

The subsidies directly affect the prices you're paying at the grocery story. They're not the only effect, but a serious one.

Bread prices are rising because farmers make more money growing corn than wheat. Congress has mandated several billion gallons of ethanol by 2009, which means there's a huge market for corn; it's the main way ethanol gets produced here.

As a result of this shift, and global demand for corn, American farmers are growing fewer acres of wheat. Production is down 24 million acres

since the top year of 1981, reports The Washington Post.

Groceries, bakeries and restaurants experience that decline daily, as they

scramble to provide the bread, bagels and baked goods consumers love. Corn production also is driving up costs at Texas ranches, hog farms and

chicken plants because it makes up a lot of the food that cattle, pigs and chickens eat. Fortunately, Texas Gov. Rick Perry

and Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison are connecting the dots between Washington and the grocery and feed

The two Republicans are pushing Congress to ease off the federal man-


Along with replacing crop subsidies with better crop insurance, Washington should rethink those ethanol numbers at least, until other ways to produce the alternative fuel come online.



# Mother's Day

One word comes to mind as the inspiration for the creation of Mother's Day, and that is "Homesick." Anna Jarvis, who was born in Grafton, West Virginia in 1864 had moved to Philadelphia later as an adult and lived there most of her life. You know the cliche, "You can take the girl out of the country, but you can't take the country out of the girl" applies in this situation. Although she lived in a city, Anna longed for her West Virginia countryside, the mountains and the family and friends she'd grown up with.

Anna Jarvis' own mother was a role model of domestic nurturing and other household responsibilities. She gave birth to 11 children and endured through the death of 7 of them. In spite of all this tragedy, she never lost her faith in God. She kept caring for her children when they were ill, took care of her elderly husband and sacrificed her dream of a college education due to the poverty in her own life. When she died, Anna organized a special service at the church in Grafton, W. Va. to honor her mother and all that she had endured and done.

Eventually Anna decided that she wanted to honor her mother by honoring all mothers with their own special day on the second Sunday in May.

She did a letter-writing campaign that included politicians, newspaper editors and church leaders. She also organized a committee known as "The Mother's Day International Association" to promote this new holiday.

Already in existence as "Children's Day," the second Sunday in June, and Anna knew this being a church Sunday school teacher. Children's Day had been observed since 1870. She wanted Mother's Day to be closer to Memorial Day, so that people would remember the sacrifices their mothers had made for their families, just like people also remembered the sacrifices their sons had made for their country.


May, 1908 was the very first Mother's Day observance. President Wilson gave the day national recognition in 1914 and by the late 1920's Mother's Day became one of our countries most prominent holidays. But, Anna Jaris originally intended this holiday to be more of a church-related one, yet it slowly evolved between Christianity and commercialism.

The carnation was chosen as the symbol for Mother's Day because Anna Jarvis' mother had loved carnations. So she would wear one in honor of her own mother and encouraged others to wear one honoring their mothers. Some people wear a white carnation to honor mothers who have died. While others choose a pink or red carnations to honor their mothers who are still living.
