Protecting Fish and Game

Lawmakers in a coastal state. worried about overfishing in tidal waters, passed a law forbidding the use of large nets. Fishermen duly challenged the law on the ground that there were "still plenty of fish in the

But the court held the las

No resource is inexhaustible," said the court. We think the protective hand of the state may be extended before the danger is imminent. The state is interested not merely in the preservation of specimens for museums but in perpetuating a constant sup-

Fish and game on public property belong to the public as a whole. To prevent a disorderly free-for-all, the state as trustee for the public -

has broad powers of regulation. For example, the state has wide discretion in imposing penalties. In one case a man arrested for illegal possession of 2,000 ducks drew a fine of \$20,000 - \$10 per duck.

"That big a fine is unconstitutional," he protested in appealing to a higher court. "It amounts to 'cruel and unusual' punishment."

But the court held that the state was merely making the punishment fit the crime. The judge said the severity of the sentence was "the fault not of the law but of the infractor."

Furthermore, in proving its case, the state does not necessarily have to catch a violator red-handed. Thus, it may make the mere possession of certain types of fishing and hunting. equipment "prima facie" evidence of illegal fishing or hunting, shifting onto the defendant the burden of proving his innocence.

Nevertheless, if the evidence is too flimsy, the court will situation:

Game wardens, halting a car near a lake, found four men with fishing licenses and a fifth man without. The four said they had indeed been fishing, but they all insisted the fifth man

Was his mere presence in the car enough to convict him of fishing without a license? The court said no, because that would be punishing him on the basis of highly circumstantial evidence.

In other words, the fisherman and the hunter must accept the law's restraints in the spirit of public inerest; but the law, in turn, must apply those restraints in the spirit of good sportsmanship.

The child must be under 13 physically or mentally inmean to a buyer that no bones capable of self-support. Where one child is involved the limitation on the deduction is the actual cost of the care or \$600, whichever is lesser. If two or more c hildren are being cared for under the age of 13 the limitation is hiked to \$900.

A man may claim the deduction if he is a widower. is legally divorced or separated from his wife, or if his wife is physically incapacitated or, institutionalized for at least 90 consecutive days or a shorter period if the stay in an institution is terminated by death. **EDUCATIONAL** 

Educational expenses incurred to maintain or improve the skills on your job or to meet your employer's specific job reregulations or by law or regulations to keep your status are deductible. So, too, is the cost, of education designed to enable you to get an advancement in your present job or to obtain a new position within your own profession, trade or

But such educational costs incurred to meet minimum requriements or initially to qualify you for a position or profession are not deductible.

Remember, as well, that fees paid any employment agency to help you obtain a new or better job are also deductible here.
