# ack Hope for Masters Tournament

NEW YORK - (NEA) Whether he likes it or not, Charlie Sifford is the Black Hope for the Masters Tournament this spring. All he has to do now is get invited.

Sifford brought it on himself. He doesn't especially like the idea of being a Black Hope. But he is. People bug him about it all the time.

Back in mid-January when the PGA tour began in Los Angeles, Charlie put aside one of his trademarks-cigars- and won himself a golf tournament. Trouble was, he could not put

aside his other trademark. Black skin does not come off in ball washes.

The victory, then, set off a chain reaction of speculation: Would Sifford become the first Negro to play in the staid old Masters?

At best, the prospect was doubtful. The top six players on the PGA point system are invited. (The points list consists of tour players not eligible for automatic invitations—former champs, Open winners, etc. Points are awarded from the end of one Masters to the next for final positions in each PGA

tournament. Charlie was eighth. Former Masters champions cast ballots to select one atlarge guest. If sifford is to play in the 1969 Masters, this would seem his best bet. Charlie points out, however, that "most of those winners come from

Texas or the Deep South." Still, the idea intrigued him. Sifford had, he said, thought a lot about the Masters. In fact, he created a few waves several months ago when he charged the tournament with discrinination.

"It's the only tournament Negroes have never played in,"

he said, "but I feel that when I finish 25th on the money list or win the Hartford or finish third in the Canadian Open, I am entitled to some consideration."

(Masters chairman Clifford Roberts replied that Sifford had never met the qualifications but that if he did, he would certainly be invited.)

Now, however, Sifford appears to have tired of the subject. "I don't want to mess with

the Masters," he says. "You know how those people down there are. I just don't want to say anything about it. If they inviet me, I'll play. If they don't, I won't. That's all."

Not quite all, Charlie. Three years ago, an Augusta National caddy tugged at his white overalls, adjusted his green cap and hoisted a golf bag.

"No suh," he said, "the only way a colored man ever gonna get on this here course is with a bag on his shoulder. Why, we ain't even allowed to take our caps off on the course."

Now, at 46, Charlie Sifford is as close as a Negro has ever come to playing in the Masters, but maybe not close enough. At any rate, he has learned not to be overly optimistic about this sort of thing.

"I'm not the only good Negro golf player," he says. "There are a lot of them. They just didn't want to go through everything, that's all."

Sifford, whose tour career was delayed until he was 38 years old because of a "Caucasians only" clause in the PGA rule book, has gone through everything.






