Three of the Panhandle area's best known criminals, ecnyicted bank robbers Rusty and Wanda Carver Huff and convicted rapist Tom R. Vessels, were either in Gray County jail today or expected to be soon.

Huff, who gave himself up Wednesday afternoon in Hereford after escaping from his jail cell in Miami early Tuesday morning, and Vessels, sentenced to death in the electric chair for the rape of a Pampa woman, are both locked up in Gray County jail here.



Liver. The largest one at the top is beef, then reading clockwise, the smallest one next to it is lamb: veat is next, and then pork, the second largest. Q. How are they identified?

By size primarly, as indicated above. How are they prepared? Beef and pork liver may be sliced and fried, braised or roasted whole. Veal and lamb liver may be broiled, panbroiled or fried. Peel or trim membrane on liver before cooking. Liver is sometimes precooked, then ground and mixed for loaves, patties or croquettes. To precook, slowly panfry in two to three tablespoons of lard or drippings for about five minutes. For braising, dredge in flour, brown slowly in fat, then add about one-fourth cup of liquid, cover tightly and cook slowly 20 to 30 minutes. For broiling, have liver sliced three-fourths of an inch thick or less. Dip in melted fat. Broil

After Each Visit Indecision Sets In Track, Golf

BELLAIRE, Ohio (NEA) - There was a time when the college recruiting of high school athletes was a simple process - offer the hotshot a free education, give him a train ticket and tell him where to report.

Not any more. College recruiting has become an elaborate - and expensive - ordeal. Untold thousands are spent behind the scenes to impress, and hopefully hook, top high school prospects. Assistant coaches and recruiters have been known to park themselves for weeks on the doorsteps of players they covet. Head coaches annually place hundreds of long-distance calls to chat informally with kids from towns they never knew existed.

Campus visits are arranged, summer jobs lined up and the social advantages of each college (coeds, of course) discreetly pointed out. Last year, one midwestern university spent over \$1,000 trying to land a basketball prospect (two roundtrip plane tickets, meals, phone calls, coaches' visits to his home) and lost him to a rival school.

A few years ago, one high school All-American basketball player made a dozen trips to campuses all over the country. Then, to the dismay of all concerned, announced he would attend a college 50 miles from his home. "The trips were great," he later said. "I got to see places I never thought I would see. All free, too."

at last count. He has been the weekend guest of four major colleges already - Michigan State, West Virginia, Alabama and Ohio State. He will visit North Carolina and UCLA in the near future and maybe jet down to the University of Miami before he makes up his mind. If there is time, he might visit Kentucky. Davidson, Tennessee and Houston; he's not sure yet.

To him, the recruiting race is fun, but there are times when the whole business leaves him perplexed.

"Everybody is so nice to me," he says, "I don't know what to do. When I visited Michigan State, I left impressed and thought I might go there. Then I went to Alabama, saw its new fieldhouse and changed my mind. Same thing happened after I visited Ohio State. Every time I make a trip, I come home all mixed up. Then another weekend comes, and another trip, and I come home again mixed up even more.'

Hornyak's weekends start at 5:15 a.m., when he leaves his Bellaire home and drives 62 miles to Pittsburgh to catch a plane to his destination. He's met upon arrival by an assistant coach and promptly taken on an auto tour of the campus, where points of interest are painstakingly brought to his attention.






