

Crew **Awaits** Blastoff

While the men of Apollo 11 relaxed in confident anticipation, their countdown sailed ahead of schedule today toward Wednesday's start of . man's great voyage to a landing on the moon.

Neil A. Armstrong, Michael Collins and Edwin E. Aldrinwere reported "just taking it easy" in their moonport quarters, reviewing flight plans and check lists for a half million mile roundup unequalled in the annals of space explor-

Former President Lyndon B. Johnson, Vice President Spiro T. Agnew and 200 congressmen were flying to the space center today to join thousands of VIPs, space company representatives and just plain "birdwatching" tourists already on hand for the spectacle.

President Nixon was remainng in Washington, and the astronauts' families were staying at home in Houston to The space agency reported that the countdown was running. ahead of schedule with all major operations completed for the start of an 11-hour rest period in the afternoon and night. The count was called the smoothest ever run for an Apollo mission.

Armstrong, the civilian commander of the \$350 million mission, told the nation 36 hours before blastoff that "we're willing and ready to attempt to achieve our national
