



Several crew contests are planned. Awards will go to the seaman spotting the first polar bear, sighting first ice, winning the day's mileage run pool, and predicting the daily maximum and minimum temperature.

The crew has been asked to bring personal belongings for a three-month voyage. Humble will issue each man a specially designed parka, mittens and sunglasses. Only crew members and others aboard will receive the expedition patch, a tradition long established by past Polar explorers. The patch portrays the Humble "tiger" outfitted with earmuffs, now making him, as one crew member said, an "Arctic tiger."

Although Humble tanker masters never allow firearms on their ships, Captain Steward will be carrying high-powered rifles for this unusual voyage. Ice research parties, flown by helicopter out on the ice to take core samples, will need the weapons for protection from

One of Humble's Arctic consultants notes in the crew manual that "about the only training recommended for prolonged Arctic operations might properly be described as self-training, or better still, self-

Capitol press rooms were deluged with memoranda and bulletins from various insurance associations, giving background information, stating positions and generally pledging support and assistance to the commiltee.

First meeting of the committee produced little information, except a show of determination by its seven members to find a way to lower auto insurance rates or to present a 'concise and clear explanation" to Texas drivers as to why their rates are going up.

And this will take a lot of explaining. State Board of Insurance has agreed to a 30-day delay in its auto rate decision, usually made

on August 1. Board has proposed a minimum rate hike of 11.4 per cent. This increase would apply only to drivers of private passenger cars. Individual rates would fluctuate in keeping with the accident experience record in each area.

All For N.Y. Mets

NEW YORK (UPI)-It was the classic situation where something had to be said but nobody cared to say it.

If this were the Braves, Orlando Cepeda would stand up and say it because he has many times before. If this were the Cardinals, Tim McCarver most likely would do it, and if it were the Dodgers you could safely leave it to a guy like Maury Wills.

But this happened to be the Mets. The new Mets, not the old ones Leo Durocher keeps talking about, and here they had not only fallen on their faces for the third straight time before the ambitious Astros but had looked about as exciting to watch as the Paris peace talks.

The Mets, in a nutshell, were dragging. That third straight loss to Houston Thursday was their seventh in 11 games and suddenly they no more looked

like the pennant contender of two weeks ago than Gary Gentry looks like Bobbie

There is a precise word for how the Mets looked dropping those three straight 16-3 11-5 and 2-0 decisions to the Astros but it isn't used in mixed company

Rude Awakening Maybe the Mets needed a good swift jab where it would do the most good and maybe they didn't, but there was a much more important point.

Like who would undertake this delicate operation? The Mets haven't been in that many pennant fights that they had a ready-made candidate for the iob. They really had nobody.

But up stepped Ron Swoboda! Swoboda was hitting a tremendous .239 at the time and wasn't even playing regularly, but something had to be sound off and shake up the

said and somebody had to say it, so he did.

What he said was that the Mets' attitude reminded him of a cheese sandwich. One that maybe had been left standing in the sun too long.

"It could be we were a little stale," Swoboda said, looking back before Friday night's 54 win over the Braves. "I thought we weren't concentrating Thursday. I didn't think we started that game bearing down. I wasn't singling out anybody. If it sounded like criticism, it was directed at myself as much as anyone else. Yes. I said something because I felt things had gotten a little loose, and there was a lack of discipline we had had before. I. still think we can win. I don't want the boat to fall apart."

In a way it was ironic that Swoboda should be the one to Mets because there have been times during his career Gil Hodges had to talk with him and shake him up a bit.

Always A Clubhouse

"That's true." he says, "but it never was for anything I did on the field. When I go out on the field I think as hard, as I can and play as hard as I can. Off the field I just don't like to be regimented and that's what Gil talked to me about." The remarks Swoboda made
