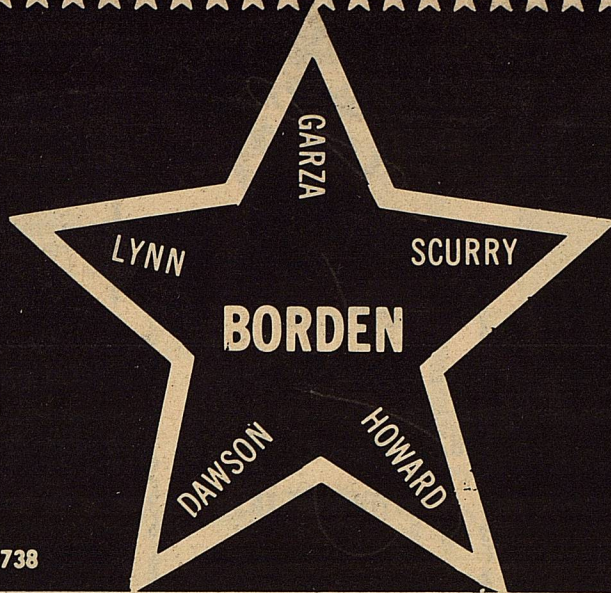

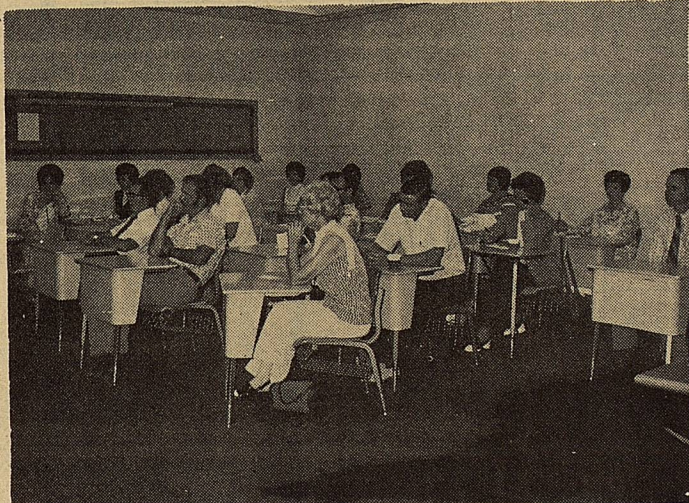
Patty Peugh, 17, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Peugh of Knott was runnerup.

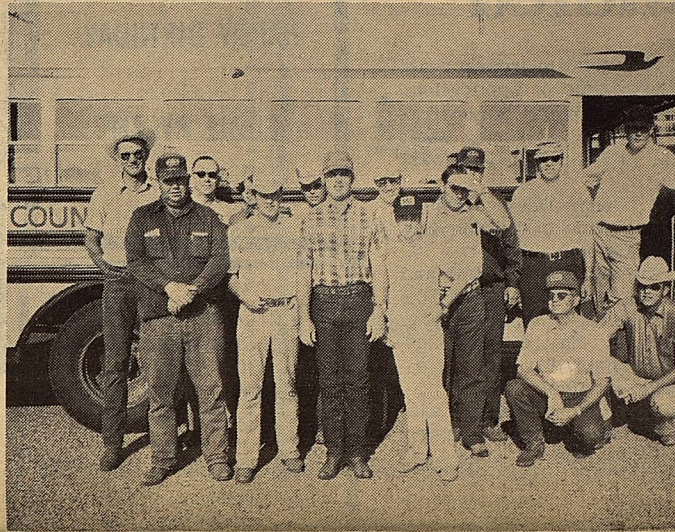
Borden County Teachers attended 5 Workshops this week.

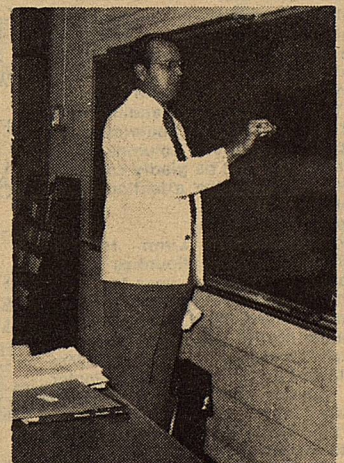

Weed & Brush Control Studied

An evaluation of the Brush and Weed Control Result Demonstrations was taken Monday and Tuesday by Dr. Tommy Welch, Area Range and Brush Control Specialist from Texas Agricultural Research and Extension Center in Vernon, and Earnest Kiker, Borden County Extension Agent.

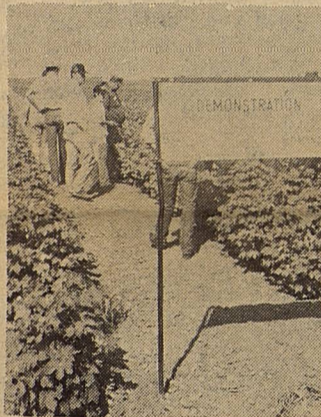
Dr. Welch stated that the Broom Weed Control plot had

poor result due to drought condition at time of application. The Broom Weed Demonstration was applied during May: 1/2 16. of 2-4-D per acre was applied.

The Cedar Demonstration had two rates of Tordon 10K pellets applied. The two 16. rate showed 80% top kill and one lb. rate showed 40-50% to kill these controls were applied in May of 1975 and the demonstration will be evaluated for five years.

Dr. Welch and Kiker also checked the Mesquite Control Plot located on the Isaac Ledbetter Ranch south of Gail. The plot was established in June, 1973 with the following rates 1/2 24ST, 1/4 24ST, plus 1/4 15. Dicambe, and 1/2 Tordon 225. Results of these demonstrations will be published in The 1975 Results Demonstration Handbook, published by County Extension Agent.

Our thanks goes out to Isaac Ledbetter, Kenny Hensley, Bob Beal, and Buster Taylor for allowing plots to be established on their land.

The A.J.R.A. Rodeo season is coming to a close this week with the finals to be held in Odessa, Texas August 12th-16th. There will be two go-rounds Tuesday through Friday where the members will still be competing for their points. The top four contestants of each event will compete for the championship on Saturday night.

Six A.J.R.A. members from Borden County will be competing in the Finals—Cindy Beaver, Keil Williams, Chuck Canon, Jim Renick, Becky Miller, and Matt Farmer. As of this date, looks as if three of these members, Cindy, Keil, and Chuck will be competing in the top four on Saturday night.

Borden County has had a good number of youth participating in the A.J.R.A. and Open rodeo's this summer. Others besides those named above are Tally Griffin, Gay Griffin, Glen Gray, Perry Smith, Gayla Newton, and Kelly Williams.

Below are the latest results from all their winnings recently.

In Sonora, Texas Jim Renick placed 5th in steer riding and Cindy Beaver placed 3rd in barrels.

At Junction, Texas, Cindy Beaver placed 3rd in the barrel race; Keil Williams, 1st in Break-away roping; Becky Miller placed 6th in pole bending.

At the Carlsbad, New Mexico Rodeo, Keil Williams placed 6th in both the boys barrels and Break-away roping, with Glen Gray placing 6th in the boys poles.

In the Hobbs, New Mexico Rodeo, Keil Williams placed 1st in Steer Riding, 3rd in Ribbon Roping and won the All Around Cowboy honors in the 12 yr. and under division. Jim Renick won 3rd in steer riding.

Becky Miller took 6th place in pole bending and Keil Williams placed 4th in Break-away roping at Farwell, Texas.

In Big Spring, Texas, Jim Renick placed 6th in Steer Riding; Cindy Beaver, 4th in Barrels; Gayla Newton, 2nd in Barrels; Becky Miller, 2nd in Poles; Keil Williams, 5th in Steer Riding and 6th in Flags.

In Abilene, Texas, Keil Williams placed 1st in Steer Riding and Cindy Beaver placed 2nd in Barrels, Gayla Newton placed 5th in Barrels.

In Rock Springs, Texas Cindy Beaver placed 2nd in Barrels, Becky Miller placed 1st in Poles and 5th in Barrels; Keil Williams placed 4th in Break-Away roping and 6th in Steer Riding.

In Midland Texas, Glenn Gray won 6th in Breakaway and Becky Miller placed 3rd, in Poles. (Results unknown at this time for Keil Williams, Matt Farmer and Jim Renick.)

There are some winnings we did not publish in the Borden Star in AJRA competition. They are Jim Renick-5th place in Steer Riding at Pecos, Texas; 5th. in Steer Riding at Monahans, Texas, and 4th at Steer Riding in O'Dessa, Texas. Matt Farmer split 6th in tie-down Roping at Van Horn, Texas.

Chuck Canon is going to the finals in the lead for optional racing. This includes Boys Barrel Race, pole bending and goat tying. We have failed to get Chuck's individual winnings listed but proud to say Chuck has placed in every rodeo this summer except Monahans. We wish Chuck all the Luck at the finals.

Also just in-- Gayla Newton won 1st in barrels at Gerard, Texas.

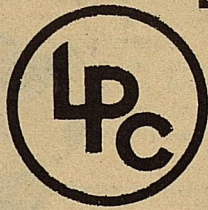

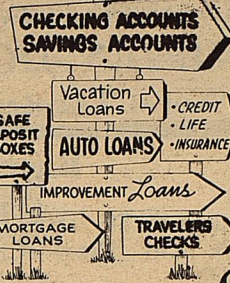
