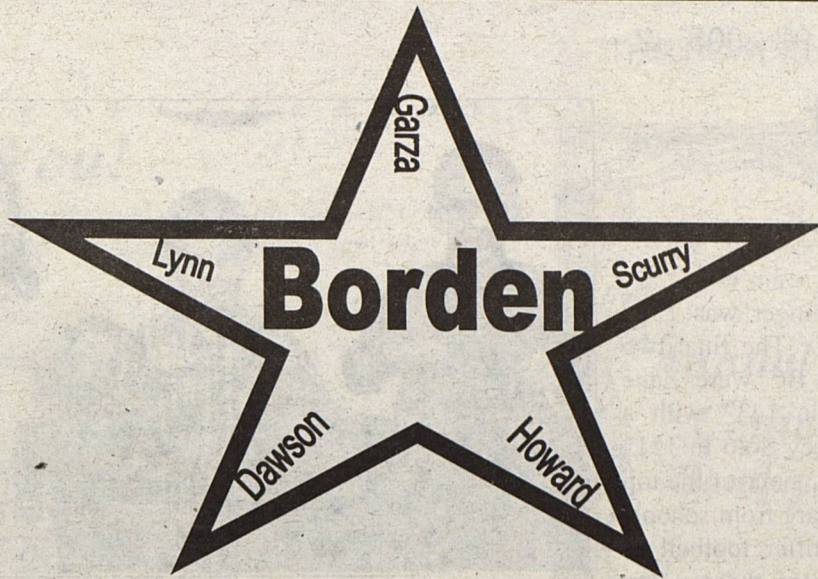

District 7 Runner-Up Borden County Coyotes

Bi-District Game at Klondike against Garden City

The Borden Coyotes defeated the Trent Gorillas last Friday in Trent by a score of 74 to 37. The win improves the Coyote's record to 8-2 on the season and 4-1 in district play. Since Highland defeated Westbrook Friday night that makes us the district runner-up.

The Coyotes took 40 to 0 lead with two minutes left in the first half. From that time on the Gorillas and the Coyotes just traded touchdowns for the rest of the game. The Coyotes suited out 13 as the JV season has come to a close and every one of the Coyotes saw plenty of playing time.

Michael Bullinger led the Coyotes offensively with 188 yards in 7 carries and scored 4 touchdowns. Bullinger had 8 tackles on defense.

Garrett Thomas carried the ball 7 times and had 3 touchdowns in 148 yards. Thomas recovered a fumble and had 4 tackles.

Quentin Shafer carried the ball 12 times for 90 yards and one touchdown. Shafer had 15 tackles on defense.

J.Ryan Gicklhorn caught a pass for 16 yards and a touchdown from Clint Chapman. Gicklhorn had 6 tackles and Chapman had 10 tackles and an interception.

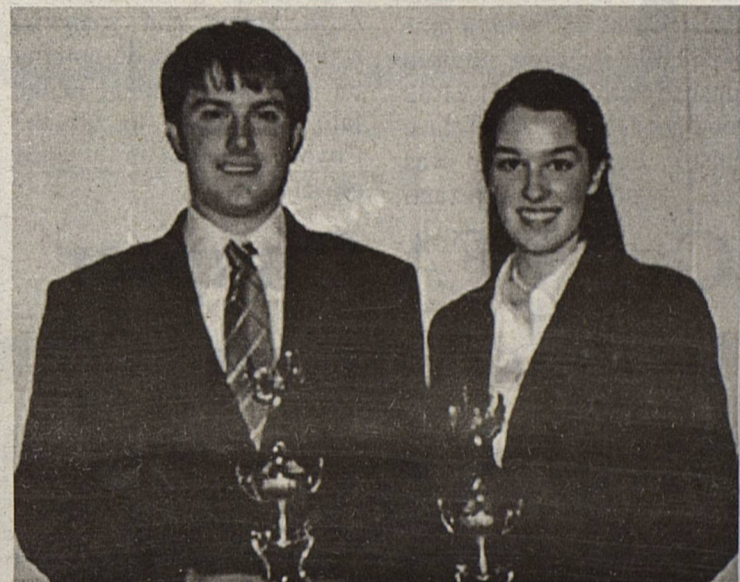
Dore Rodriguez caught a 5 yard pass for a touchdown

from Asa Rutherford. Rutherford completed a 25 yard pass to Jake Cooley and he caught an 8 yard pass from Shafer. Rodriguez had 14 tackles, Rutherford had 6 tackles and caused a fumble, and Cooley had 7 tackles.

Andrew Lamming had a tackle, Trey Soto had 10 tackles and a hurry, Logan Howard had 8 tackles and Miller Valentine had 6 tackles.

The Coyotes played a good sharp game looking forward to getting in the play-offs. The Varsity team looked good and did not make many mistakes and the JV team got

Borden High School claimed another tournament championship this past weekend, going 6-0 to win the Abilene Cooper Camelot Classic Speech Tournament in cross-examination debate.

Junior Rowdy Clary and sophomore Rachel Wilson defeated Snyder's Fran Leighton and Bryan Clifton on a 3-0 negative ballot to earn the first place trophy.

The two now have 10 points towards the TFA standings, which also qualify them for the State TFA tournament March 2-4 in Pharr, Texas.

Douglas debater Kate Wallace added two more wins to her record against one loss in the meet, just missing advancing to the quarterfinal round. She now has two points in TFA competition and needs six more to advance to state.

Lamming went 2-1 October 21 at the Mansfield Summit Invitational

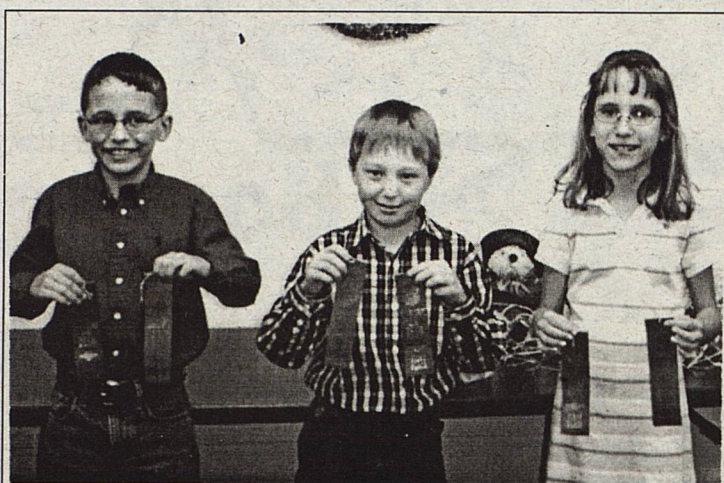
Speech students will compete again December 10 and 11 in Lubbock.

The Borden Coyote cross country team finished 15th at the Region 2 meet this past weekend in Arlington. Twenty-three teams comprised of 164 runners competed for three team and ten individual spots at the state meet in Round Rock. The top finisher for BC was sophomore Miller Valentine. Miller finished 31st with a time of 19:11. Austin Tarleton was 93rd with a time of 21:17. Aaron Pigford finished with a time of 21:32 good enough for a 104th place finish. Logan Howard was 122nd with a 22:16 and

Michael Bullinger was 139th with a 23:46. The final two finishers for BC were Zane Williamson in 143rd with a 24:10 and Trey Soto in 151st with a 25:22. Four of the top ten finishers are from schools that do not offer football as well as four of the top ten teams being from non-football schools. The boys competed well considering that they played football the night before and went up against boys who do nothing but run cross country in the fall. Congrats to all the Coyote runners on a great season.




