### Wall Street Chatter


NEW YORK (UPI)-Political factors constitute the major obstacle to another boost in the commerical bank price interest rate at the present time, Goodbody & Co. observes. Important banking legislation is pending in Congress and the banks are even now obtaining higher returns on loans through larger compensating balances and premiums for new loans, the firm says.

Current "sinking spells" in the stock market create opportunities for selective buying looking toward a period of yearend buoyancy, Bache & Co. says. The firm advised close adherence to pre-determined upside buying parameters, plus close scutiny of any premises behind inordinately high priceearnings multiples.

Diamond, Turk & Co. notes the market continues to maintain a comfortable cushion above the July-October lows despite a dearth of constructive news. There may be some downward bias, but the upward trend that began Oct. 9 will continue in force for some time to come, the firm says.

The market appears to be following a see-saw, zig-zag pattern of taking two cautious forward steps to one backward step, Hayden, Stone Inc. notes. Although the funds have been looking for under-valued situations, they also appear to be waiting to see if the chosen stocks will first dip to predetermined buying levels, the



## **Actress Claims** Privacy Invaded

LOS ANGELES UPI)-Actress Vikki Dougan settled her \$900,000 lawsuit. Wednesday against a magazine which bared more of her than did her famous gowns with the plunging backline.

Fawcett Publications, Inc., publisher of Cavalier, for invasion of privacy after 12 nude and seminude photos of her appeared in January, 1964.

Miss Dougan, 33, said she posed for photographer William Crespinel, who expected to sell them to Playboy. She later changed her mind, but she contended the photographer sold the pictures to Cavalier.

A spokesman for Miss Dougan said the settlement was for \$75,000. Fawcett said it was a much lower figure but declined to disclose the amount.






