

Election Unnecessary to Show Commie Opposition

The boomerang which Stalin received in the supposedly "rigged" election in Eastern Germany is another sign that enslaved populations loathe their Russian overlords.

The "single party" list of hand-picked candidates, presented to Iron Curtain voters under the spying eyes of the Soviet MVD, usually is rubber-stamped by the intimidated. But a substantial minority of plucky Germans dared to cast their ballots against the Reds, knowing that hereafter they will be tagged for revenge.

Communist elections always have been fakes. The announced results never have been accurate measurements of the peoples' attitude toward their merciless masters.

The most crooked was the Lithuanian election in 1940, which this anti-Communist nation, a few days after invasion by 300,000 Soviet troops, was forced at bayonet-point to appear to vote itself into the Soviet Union.

The people refused to sell themselves into servitude. But the Father of Lies in the Kremlin announced that they had "voluntarily" given up their independence.

RESULTS
The "official" figures on the voting were tabulated in Moscow on the eve of the balloting and called to London where they were published next day. On the morning, however, not enough people had been herded into the voting booths so the local commissars extended the time into the following day.

But someone forgot to tip off the communist news bureau in London. As a result, the election figures were announced 24 hours in advance of the election.

The reign of terror continues in the Baltic. Mass deportations are not so common. But in some ways the individual arrests are more nerve-shattering as they go on night by night. No one can ever feel secure.

Lithuanian patriots are still hounded and thrown into prison on the word of spies. The jails are emptied twice a month, their occupants sent to the concentration camps in Central Asia. No news of their ultimate fate ever reaches their families.

Elections are not necessary to reveal the opposition to communism under the Hammer and Sickle. The "no" crosses are marked on the hearts of millions of miserable victims.

Med Men Will Not Compromise On Health Plan
ATLANTIC CITY (AP) — The American Medical Association is open to suggestion for alterations in its own program to meet the nation's health problems — but will not compromise on its stand against compulsory health insurance.

This was made clear Thursday in a statement by the AMA's Board of Trustees and a subsequent interview with the organization's new president, Dr. Ernest Irons of Chicago.

The board announced its intention to call a conference of "interested groups" — such as labor and farm organizations — to consider the AMA's official stand on the "advance of medicine and public health."

No matter what develops at the projected conference, the AMA will steadfastly hold out against any yielding on the real hot-potato issue of the national health insurance.

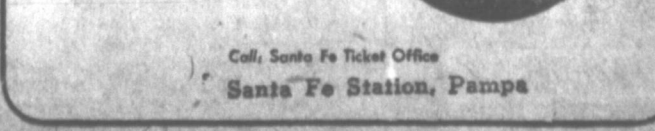
