Jaycee-Ettes Hear Scoggins Talk on 'Great Pyramid'

Ruffert; "Miracle of the Ages" by Worth Smith; and "New Revelation of the Great Pyramid" by Adam Rutherford.

"This miraculous pyramid, which took 30 years to build, was completed in 284 B.C., and is a perfect engineering feat. Modern man with all his equipment cannot build anything so near perfect," the speaker stated.

Mr. Scoggins, through the use of a chart, pointed out to his audience the marks in the passages and chambers of the

pyramid, which authorities have come to believe are symbols forecasting the future of the world, beginning with the date of the flood and ending with the date 1994. This latter date will be the beginning of 1000 years of peace on earth.

The lecturer told of many odd facts concerning this pyramid, many of which correlate with the Bible and Christian history.


LaRosa Sorority Gives Rush Party


