be very effective.

This would seem to be a shrewd move on the part of the big three. It not only strengthens the general defenses of western Europe, but it may be expected to give a fillip to the morale of the Germans. They are a proud folk who would resent bitterly being utterly dependent on their conquerors for protection.

This same point about morale

also applies to the allied decision that Western Germany shall be allowed to handle her own foreign relations, which thus far have been dealt with by the occupying powers.
One of the most important al-

lied decisions is to foster the rebuilding of the German economy and-integrate it with that of Western Europe. This means, among other things, that produc-tion in the great Ruhr steel center will be speeded up to bolster western military defenses.

The agreement with Germany takes the place of the peace treaty which should, and could, have been signed long ago if the west-ern powers and Russia could have come to terms. Even now the big three foreign ministers have little hope of an early agreement with Moscow on a treaty.

To carry the publisher's thought a little further, suppose we say that two people can't dictators at one and the same time in any given nation.

That way is simply-"to hell with America, with American principles, the Declaration, the rights of man and individual independence. We admit you are right, you have the principles, the morality, but WE HAVE THE FORCE." By that very statement or attitude these people demonstrate their total un-Americanism and the fact that all they really want is to use brute force to make other people protect their immorality.

Thus, they initiate or sirt force—the force or conscription and involuntary servitude, whether to a small degree or to the extent of total mobilization. The degree doesn't matter, the principle itself is all wrong. They have no right or moral authority to do that. Even the U. S. Constitution says that no free American may be subjected to involuntary servitude. Thus, the force starters and conscriptors, by their flagrant denial of our form of government, place themselves right on a par with the Stalins and Hitlers they would force others to protect them from. It is simply the case of grabbing a woman or child and throwing them in front of onesself as a shield when some gangster fires a pistol. The sort of stuff the Baruch wolf pack believes in is dictatorship, pure and simple. Any fool should know that if you can conscript an army (the first wrong) it is logical that the next step would be to conscript everybody (adding to the first wrong instead of correcting it). But not quite EVERYBODY. Obv anyone having the power to conscript someone else has dictatorial power, and, by the same token, anyone conscripted is not volunteering, has no power of choice, and is therefore dictated to.

Now that seems quite proper to those who do the dictating. For example, people on the home front who, through their representatives, start force to seize the lives and persons of men and women for the armed forces. In such a case you have a lot of dictators carefully planned by the Baruchs and their ilk. The home front those who start this force. But still everybody isn't mobilized. You CAN'T conscript EVERY-BODY, and no one should know that better than the planners. If most people are regimented there must still be someone to do the regimenting. If


