

The new estimate for May re- Legal Records flected a two percent rise from April, and a 20 percent recovery from the low mark (161) of last July, the trough of the 1949 'recession.

Gains in May and early June were produced by a further up-surge in production of durable goods, plus a marked recovery in output of such minerals as iron ore and oil.

There also was a small gain in production of nondurable goods notably textiles, paper, rubber and chemical products.

In the durable field, production of steel and of passenger cars was booming at new record heights, while output of building materials, furniture and household appliances was going strong at advanced levels.

Further increases in production also were noted for trucks industrial machinery and other "producers equipment," which covers the making of machines and tools that will be used in turning out more consumer goods.


