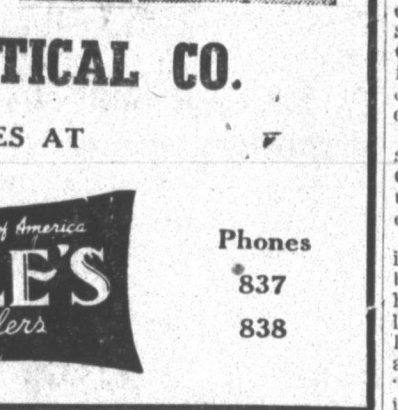

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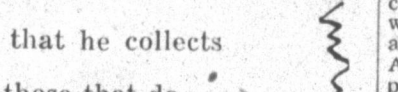

LIFEGUARD'S TIPS FOR SAFETY IN SWIMMING

WATER wings and inner tubes are dangerous accessories for the novice swimmer. That's the opinion of one of America's leading life guards, Michael Borodkin, dean of the Municipal Life Guard Training Course of the New York City Department of Parks.

Wait at least one hour after eating. Don't be a "channel swimmer"—avoid long distances. Don't dive unless you know the depth of the water. Don't leave children too long in cold water. Don't be an acrobat at the beach or pool. Don't duck others—it's dangerous fun. In surf bathing, don't dive over a wave—it may be a tallow on the other side. Never buck the current or tide. Swim diagonally to it. Swim parallel to the shore, not away from it. Keep away from piers and jetties. Deep water doesn't mean good swimming. The 1936 Olympic tryouts were held in four and one half feet of water. Don't rely on personal judgment. Ask a guard for information about the beach, currents, hidden rocks and holes. And as an extra precaution for those who like pools, Mr. Borodkin gives these "don't" rules: (1) Don't run on wet tile. (2) Don't take a running dive off the side of a pool. (3) Don't swim under diving boards.

Iott May Make Promise Good

DALLAS—(P)—Clarence Iott, who was credited with saying when sent to the minor leagues by the St. Louis Browns that "this is the first time I ever saw a major league club lose 23 games in one day," is moving them down for the San Antonio Missions these nights.

The left-hander had been in the Texas league just long enough to get into 11 games but he already has 80 strikeouts, an average of 1 1/5 per inning. Iott had won six and lost one through games of July 17 and was moving up on the "fan 'em out" king of the league, Port Worth's John Van Cuyk, who had struck out 119 in 19 games.

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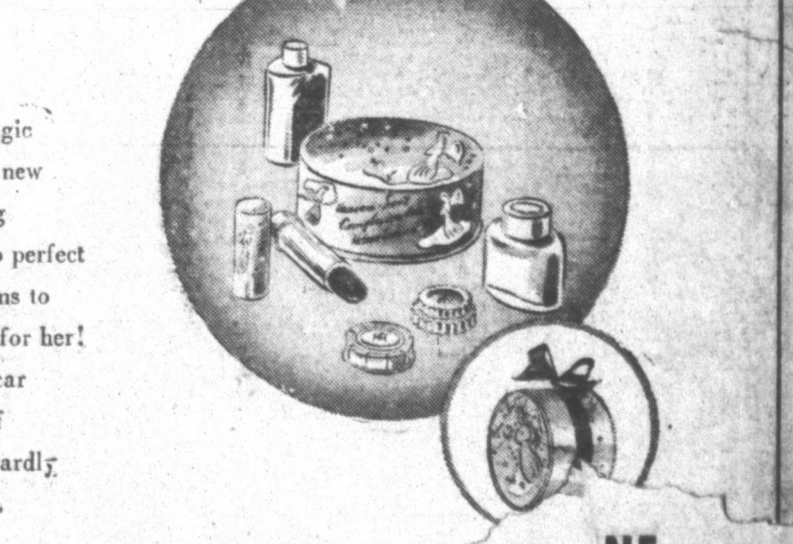

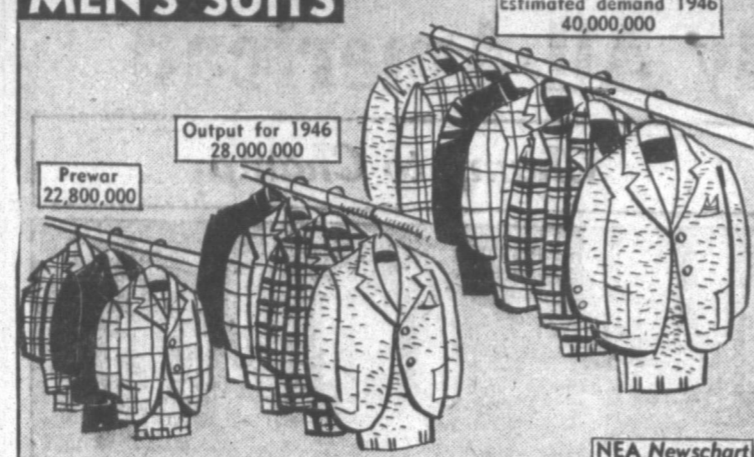

Vatican Said To Want Clemency for Greiser

WARSAW, (Delayed)—(AP)—The official Polish press agency asserted Friday that the Vatican had asked executive clemency for Arthur Greiser, former Nazi leader in Gdansk (Danzig) who has been sentenced to be hanged in Poznan for war crimes.

The press agency said Poles could find no sympathy for Greiser who "in a cold, mathematical way killed thousands" and that Poles were "amazed at the Vatican intervention."
 The agency continued that justice would be administered and that Greiser probably would be executed this weekend.

Army To Charge Two Principals in Theft

FRANKFURT, Germany—(AP)—U. S. army headquarters announced yesterday that charges probably would be filed early next week against WAC Capt. Kathleen Nash Durant and Maj. David F. Watson, two of the three principals in the \$1,500,000 Hesse family jewel theft.

The announcement did not mention Col. J. W. Durant, Capt. Durant's husband, also held in the investigation of the theft of the jewels from Kronberg castle.

French Seek Advance On \$2,000,000,000

SAIGON, Indochina—(AP)—Authoritative sources said yesterday that France had submitted an "approximate provision" estimate of reparations, totaling about \$2,000,000,000 which she claims from Japan for war damage in the Far East.

These sources said the French government submitted the claim in Washington to the Far Eastern commission and that it sought an immediate advance on the reparations, including shipment of railway transport and cotton goods, to revive the economy of Indochina.

Man Drowned While Attempting Rescue

BRISTOL—(AP)—A Bristol resident drowned in a canal here yesterday when he attempted to rescue his 41-year-old wife after she had plunged over a railing into the water.
 The wife later told the coroner "I did it to make my husband a little more reasonable. I wanted to frighten him."

Arms Carrying Order In Jerusalem Lifted

JERUSALEM—(AP)—The British army lifted yesterday its month-old order requiring all British soldiers to carry arms while outside of their barracks in Palestine.
 Officers still are required to wear sidearms.

Democratic Rank Is Split Over CIO

WASHINGTON—(AP)—Ranks of house democrats were split anew yesterday over what role the CIO's Political Action Committee should play in election campaigns.
 Specifically at issue this time is who shall be the chairman and members of a special house committee created to investigate this year's congressional elections.

The house approved establishment of the group Friday, and a behind-the-scenes battle started immediately over the committee's make-up.
 Speaker Rayburn (D-Texas) holds the trump cards, since he names the members.

The committee's make-up, of course, will determine to a large degree the nature of its inquiry.
 P. Donagheux (D-La) was author of the resolution which created the committee. If precedent is followed Rayburn will name him chairman. Indications are Donagheux would look particularly into CIO participation into the race already over in Georgia and the one underway in Missouri.

Donagheux has been a frequent critic of the CIO, and he told a reporter he had received several reports of activities by the organization which he thought needed looking into.
 Donagheux is a close friend of Rep. Slaughter (D-Mo), whom President Truman has marked for defeat. Slaughter also is opposed by the CIO, as is another Missouri democrat, Rep. Bell.

Mascol's Estate Left To Paralysis Fund

PHOENIX, Ariz.—(AP)—Molly Goodyear, beloved four-year-old gray cat who became the pet and mascot at the Arizona division of Goodyear Aircraft corporation near here, is dead.

Molly's estate, consisting of three \$25 war bonds purchased for her during the war by employees at the now deactivated plant, was held in trust by the late President Roosevelt and now reverts to the National Infantile Paralysis Fund.
 Every time Molly became a mother—and she gave birth to a total of 75 kittens—a collection was taken. The cash—all but \$125 which was set aside for her food—was converted into bonds made out in her name with the National Infantile Paralysis Fund as beneficiary.

Truman Will Receive 60-Pound Cherry Pie

NORTH EAST, Pa.—(AP)—President Truman's habit better like cherry pie—he's going to get a big one Monday.
 Growers in this lush Erie county cherry producing area today disclosed plans to send the pie—360 feet in diameter and to weigh 60 lbs.—to the President.

Attlee Claims Churchill Is 'Just A Stunt Man'


DURHAM, England—(AP)—Prime Minister Attlee attacked Winston Churchill and the conservative party yesterday, declaring the war-time prime minister has ceased to be a statesman and has become rather like some of our brighter and cheaper newspaper editors.

The prime minister spoke to a crowd of nearly 200,000 people attending Durham miners' festival.
 Reporting on his governments achievements after a year, Attlee declared Churchill "goes in for a series of stunts."
 "As soon as one falls, he goes in for another," Attlee said. "He is trying to make party capital out of national necessity."

Q. What are approximate weights of dairy calves at birth?
 A. Brown Swiss } 100 lbs.
 Holstein } 85 lbs.
 Ayrshire } 75 lbs.
 Jersey } 65 lbs.

Q. How much feeder space do growing pullets need?
 A. About 3 in. per bird. Thus a 5-ft. feeder will care for 40 growing pullets.

Q. Is the self feeding of the sow and her litter practical?
 A. Yes. Records over a number of years at the Research Farm of the Ralston Purina Company show the following results of self feeding:
 1. Larger and more uniform pigs at weaning time.
 2. Saving in labor.
 3. Feed used more effectively.
 4. Health, vigor, and breeding efficiency of the sow protected, resulting in larger litters.
 5. Less danger to pigs from crowding, resulting in less loss from injury and crippling.

Q. What is proper age for marketing New Zealand fryer rabbits?
 A. Fryers should be marketed when they weigh approximately 4 to 4½ pounds (live weight) at about 8 to 10 weeks of age.

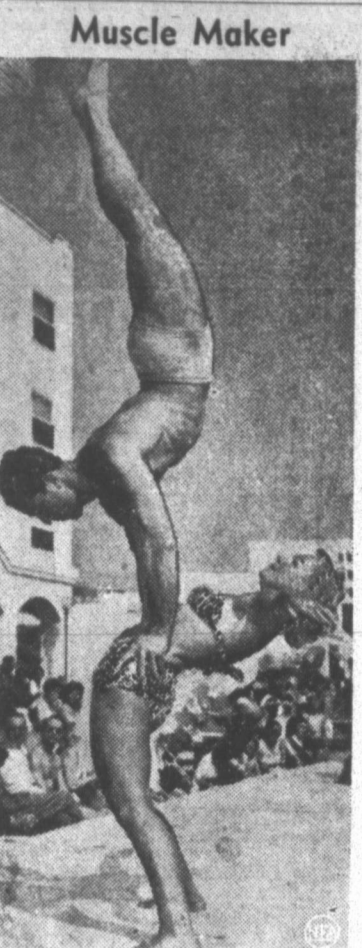

Boys in Soap Box Derby Worked Hard To Meet Rules Set By All-American

The activities of many weeks are brought to a climax for 18 of the 10 boys who entered the fourth annual All-American Soap Box Derby running in this county. Actually, when the boys go on the race track on the Old Miami Highway, north of Pampa, this afternoon at 3, they will feel as they have not felt before in this contest, the pride that prompts them to make as good a car as they could. It has not been an easy contest for the boys. Although all 19 of the boys who submitted cars to the inspection committee were finally passed, it was somewhat difficult for many of them. They had something wrong with their cars in most cases. When the boys signed up for this contest which could end in a national championship—and for four-year college education free—for one of them, they agreed to follow the rules as set forth by the national committee on the races, which are sponsored throughout the country by the Chevrolet division of General Motors. Those rules were not easy.

They called for certain types of materials in the construction of the car, which was to be made by the boy who planned to race it. He could get advice, but he was supposed to do the work. The parts of the vehicle had to measure up to a standard, as to length, height, and so on. Some of the boys had difficulty at the last moment, for they had overlooked some of the small items. All those items had to be met before the committee could pass that boy.

Palomino Show (Continued From Page 1) over 2500 members in PHB and have registered over 8000 horses in the five short years of the life of the association. The perfect Palomino color is that of a newly minted gold coin, but in registration purposes the animal may vary three shades lighter or darker. The animal must have a silver or ivory mane and tail containing not more than 15 percent off colored hair. He must have a dark skin and dark eyes. The Palomino horse is definitely a color and not a breed. The new registration rules require that, to be registered, a Palomino must have a registered sire or dam in some recognized breed registry, in addition to specifications mentioned above. Representatives of the Palomino association will be in Pampa all day Thursday, August 15, to inspect any horses which owners may wish registered. Entries for the show should be sent to Dr. Malcolm Brown no later than August 15. Entry fees are \$5 with all money going back as prize money. Ribbons and rosettes will also be awarded to the winners in each class.

OPA Bill (Continued From Page 1) and enforceable. The public interest will be served by such control. The compromise version of the bill, will go first to the house for its consideration. Previously, the house had voted a 20-day extension of the OPA authority which expires July 1 with President Truman's veto of an extension bill. The senate had passed a bill banning price controls for major food items such as meat, poultry, eggs, butter, milk, grain, and other commodities such as tobacco. The influential official, who declined to permit use of his name said the terms of the compromise proposal had been communicated to the President by OPA Administrator Paul Porter.

Pearl Harbor (Continued From Page 1) war. "Frank Knox—secretary of the navy. "George C. Marshall—general, chief of staff of the army. "Harold R. Stark—admiral, chief of naval operations. "Leonard T. Gerow—major general, assistant chief of staff of war plans division. Both the majority and minority reports agreed that Adm. Husband E. Kimmel and Lt. Gen. Walter C. Short, navy and army commanders in Hawaii, had not measured up to the responsibilities given them. Their commands were acknowledged not to have been on an all-out alert when Japanese bombers, winging from carriers at sea, roared over the Hawaiian base early Sunday, Dec. 7, 1941, knocked out eight battleships and 10 lesser craft of the Pacific fleet and killed 3,435 Americans. The majority reported, however, that "the errors made by the Hawaiian commands were errors of judgment and not derelictions of duty." The majority, in their conclusions, named no names of military men in Washington who in their opinion fell short in performance. But the report criticized the intelligence and war plans divisions of both the army and navy. Their report made these recommendations: 1. Immediate action to insure unity of command at all military and naval outposts. 2. "A complete integration of army and navy intelligence agencies in order to avoid the pitfalls of divided responsibility. 3. Effective steps "to insure that satisfactory or other restrictions do not operate to the benefit of any enemy or other forces inimical to the nation's security and to the handicap or our own intelligence agencies." Congress, it was added, should study changes in the espionage laws and in the communications act. The latter law prohibits wiretapping by military intelligence officers as well as by others. 4. That an appropriate senate or house committee investigate "the activities of Col. Theodore Wyman, Jr., while district engineer in the Hawaiian department." Wyman was in charge of defense and other army construction in Hawaii at the time of the Japanese attack. 5. That the war and navy departments consider adopting 25 "supervisory, administrative, and organizational principles" which were set forth.

WHERE THERE'S FIRE KANSAS CITY, Kas.—(AP)—"Where's the fire," patrolman Walter Millstead asked Arthur Byress, Negro, as he pulled alongside the speeding automobile. "My house is burning down. Don't arrest me," pleaded the driver, who had been chased by Millstead for about a quarter of a mile. The officer, although somewhat skeptical, nevertheless led the way to Byress' home, where firemen had the blaze under control. Byress had been called from work by neighbors.

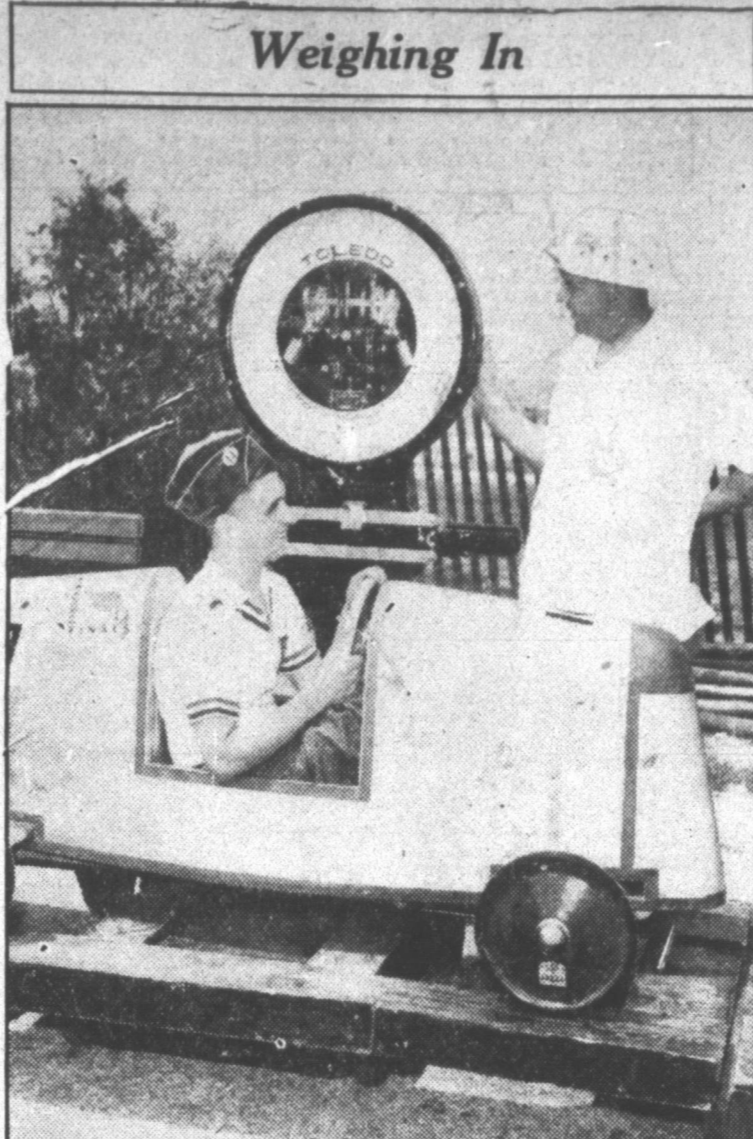

O'Dwyer Asks Help To Keep Prices Down

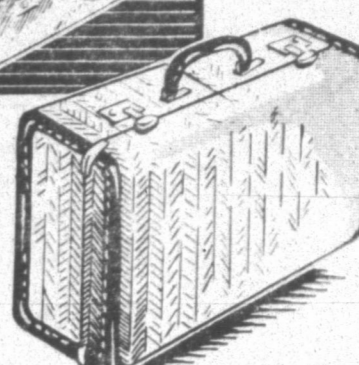

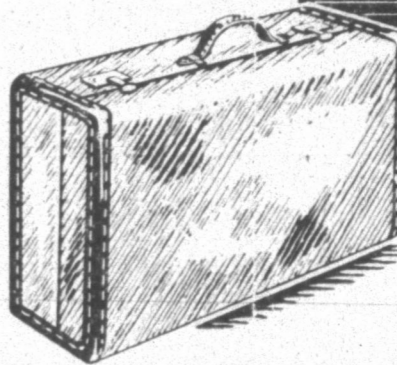

'Escalator Clause' To Be Asked by CIO Union

DALLAS—(AP)—The Dallas-Tarrant county industrial union council (CIO) voted Friday night to ask for an "escalator clause" to offset increased living costs in wage contracts covering approximately 10,000 CIO workers in the Dallas and Fort Worth areas.

The group also adopted resolutions calling for a buyers' strike by CIO members and consumer groups in

this area, holding of community conference of labor and consumer organizations to help prevent runaway inflation and an "expose program" to reveal any instances of goods hoarded for higher prices.

Soviet Command Rejects Theory

VIENNA—(AP)—An Austrian source said yesterday the Soviet command has rejected the western allies' definition of seizure German assets in eastern Austria and claimed as her own for reparations virtually everything which passed into German hands before or after the 1938 Anschluss.

Property which formerly belong to citizens of neutral or United Nations countries was included, this informant said.

The Soviet definition made exceptions for cases in which it could be proved by documentary evidence that the Germans had acquired property or assets by violence or without paying a reasonable price, it was added.

Life in U. S. Good, Brings 61 Relatives

NEW YORK—(AP)—Jose Rodriguez has found life in the United States to be good—so good that he's flying 61 of his relatives to Brooklyn to share it with him.

He brought 31 of the relatives, including his parents and grandmother, from Puerto Rico by chartered plane Thursday. Next week he's planning to go back for 30 more.

Savings from Jose's \$100-a-week salary as a shop foreman provided \$1,500 of the \$2,817 cost of the first plane trip, and the family supplied the rest. This airline has offered a plane free for the second trip.



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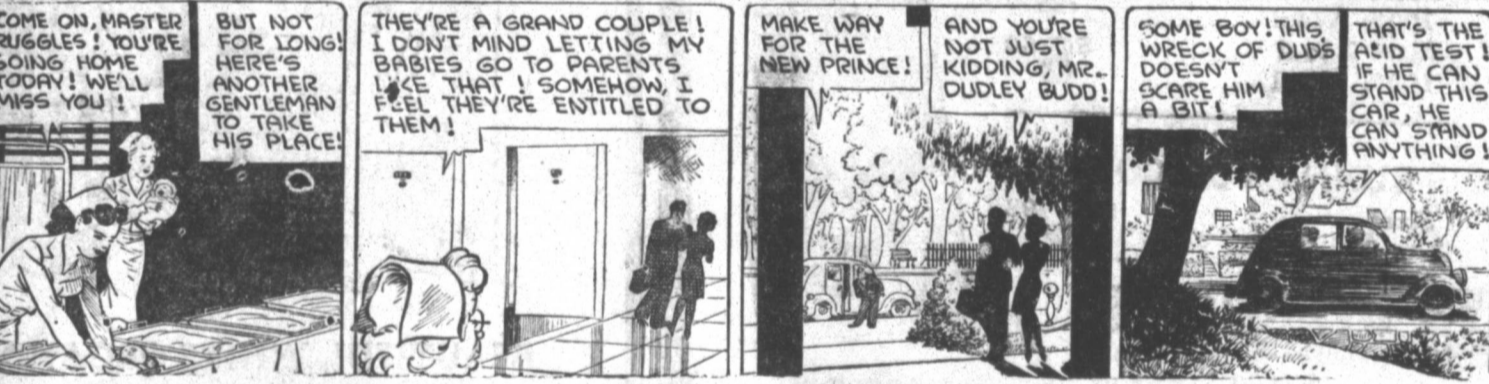
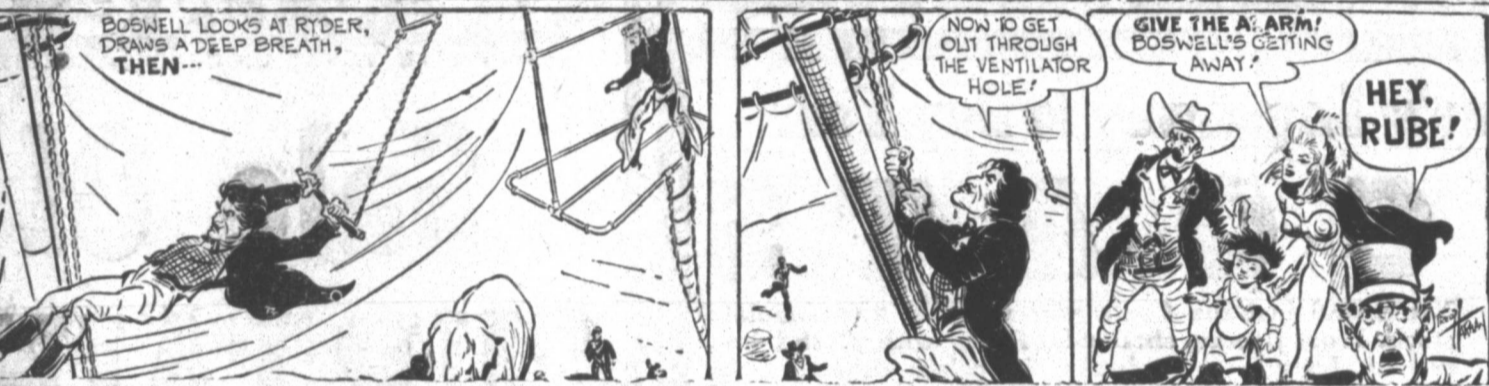

Scientist Who Would Prolong Life, Dies

MOSCOW—(AP)—Dr. Alexander Alexandrovich Bogomolets, Soviet scientist and politician who said that human beings normally should live to be 150 years old, died Friday night in Kiev. He was 64.

The Soviet council of ministers said that Bogomolets, who created a serum known as A. C. (anti-reticular cytotoxic) which he maintained would hold off age by slowing up deterioration of connective tissues, succumbed of a "grave disease."

In an interview six weeks ago, Bogomolets said that some of his assistants had taken doses of his serum, but said nothing about having taken it himself.

He told correspondents at that time that a heart condition made it uncertain whether he would accept an invitation to visit the United States next September.

Brigham Young, Mormon leader died in 1877, was survived by 17 wives and 47 children.

British Housewives Are 'Hoarding' Bread

LONDON—(AP)—British housewives besieged bake shops and rushed delivery trucks yesterday in a mad scramble to buy bread before it joins the list of rationed foods Monday.

In some bakeries the loaves were sold as they left the ovens and supplies were exhausted quickly by women who bought as many as ten loaves and piled market baskets high with cakes and cookies.

Sales of flour, also to be rationed, were more than trebled and some shops were drained of supplies well before noon.

"This reckless buying means that others are having to go without," said one baker. "Many women are buying double the quantity they need for the week-end."

The word furlong is derived from the Anglo-Saxon furh (furrow) and lang (long), and literally means furrow-long, or the length of a furrow.

Voluntary Inductions Above Expectations

WASHINGTON—(AP)—New enlistment figures kindled hope in congressional quarters yesterday that the army may be able to prolong its voluntary induction holiday.

Latest returns showed that during June there were 62,493 enlistments in the army, or more than 20,000 above what the war department regards as its average monthly needs.
