## Former Pampan Killed in Freak Auto Collision

Life of Kitty Simms O'Keefe, 16 year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. Earl O'Keefe, formerly of Pampa now of Amarillo, was taken in what first appeared to be a fender-bumping accident yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock in Amarillo.

The high school student died of internal injuries a few minutes after being admitted to the hospital. Funeral services will be conducted at 4 o'clock Tuesday afternoon in the Amarillo First Baptist church, with Dr. A. D. Foreman, Jr., officiating. Burial will be in Llano cemetery under the direction of Boxwell Brothers funeral home.

The girl was riding in the car driven by Josephine Catterson, 16 years old daughter of Mrs. Phil Carlson of Amarillo at the time of the accident. Mr. Carlson, the girl's lifelong friends, having been playmates together here before moving to Amarillo.

The other car involved, driven by Paul A. Glover, was going north on Jackson when it struck the rear of the Carlson car, which was proceeding east on Twenty-eighth St. The Glover car turned completely around and the Carlson car swung first to the north, then the car whipped around until it was facing north.

Damage to the Carlson car was a smashed right rear fender, two flat tires, bent door and a broken windshield, apparently struck by Miss O'Keefe's head. The Glover car had a dented right fender, broken right and bent left fender.

Miss O'Keefe was born in Pampa and moved to Amarillo with her parents, who had resided in Pampa since 1927. Her father is the president of the Security Federal Savings and Loan Assn., and president and treasurer of the Southwestern Investment Co.

"Tinka," as the girl was called by Pampans, attended school in Pampa at Sam Houston. She was a member of the junior class of Amarillo high school, assistant Sandie cheerleader and numerous other school organizations.

Survivors are the parents, a sister, Waine, 11 years old; a brother, Jay, 18 years old; grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. R. C. O'Keefe of Pampa; and grandfather, George Simms of Panhandle.
