NEW ORLEANS, Feb. 18.—(AP)—Byron Nelson is still a bit ahead of Ben Hogan in a 20-year rivalry which started in a contest for a cadet championship and developed into a duel for top place in American golf.

The latest incident is Nelson's stretch drive which brought him a five-stroke victory in the \$7,500 New Orleans open tournament Sunday, after he had trailed Hogan by two strokes for the first three rounds.

Nelson's 33-33-66, six under par and one off the City park course record which he holds jointly with Henry Picard, apparently took the heart out of Ben Hogan, who has a reputation on his own for gallant finisher.

Nelson's total was 277. Hogan had 282. Hogan, still on the links when Nelson finished, went five over par on the last nine, losing three of the strokes on the last four holes. Ben's round was 35-38-73, one above par for the 6539 yard course. The victory was Nelson's third in four starts this year, and the \$1500 prize brought his total winnings to \$6,000, only \$10 behind Hogan who has won two out of seven. Ben got \$1,000 yesterday.

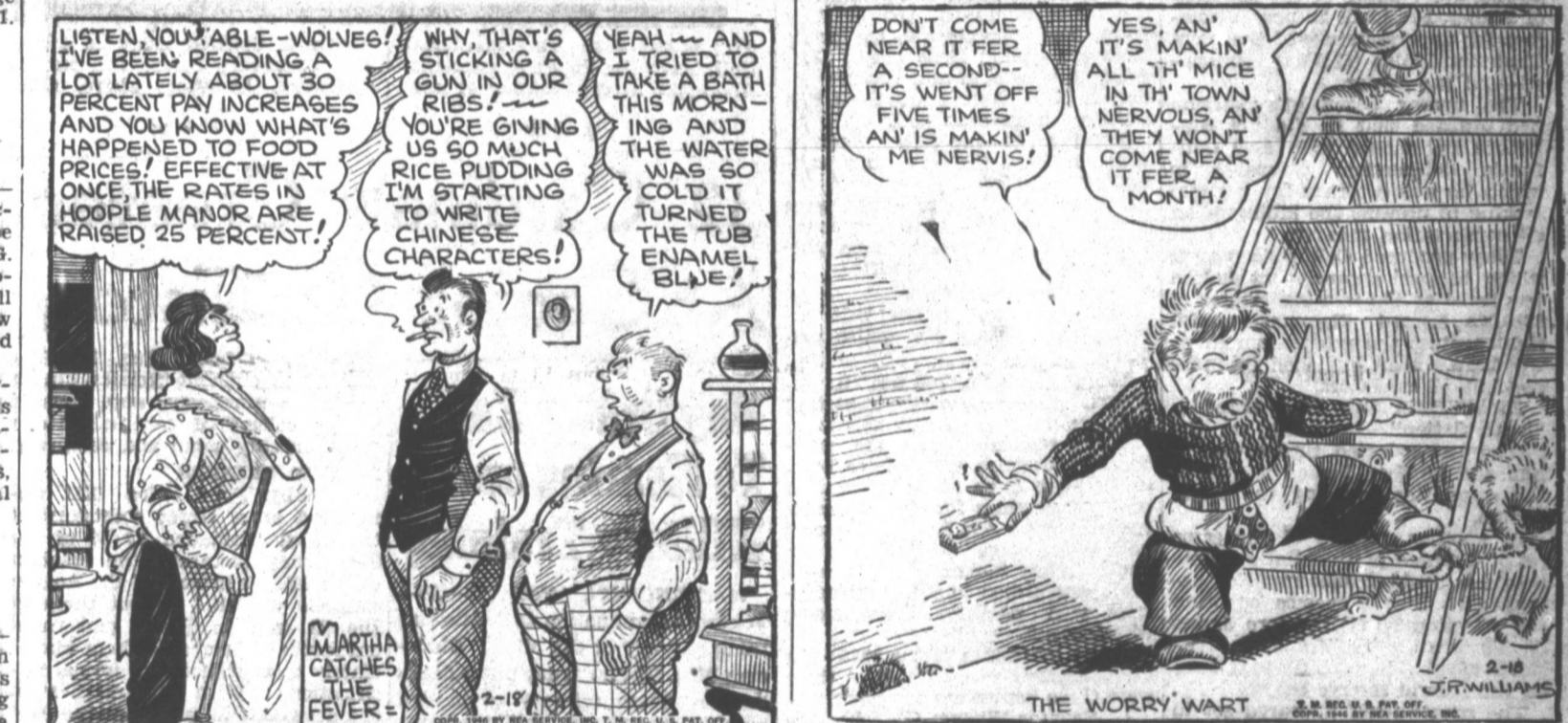

Needing just one game to claim the Southwest conference basketball title for the first time in 14 years, Baylor wants an impressive loop schedule by taking on the next-to-last-place Cadets from College Station.

The Bears clinched at least a tie for the conference flag Saturday night when they went to Fort Worth and trimmed Texas Christian, 54-40. Last Thursday they shoved the Aggies around at College Station, 54-18.

But fans can disregard previous Baylor wins, for the Aggies would like nothing better than to upset predictions by taking the Bears to a cleaning.

Although the Cadets have been none too impressive in conference play, they knocked Texas into the umbric two weeks ago in a ride upset.

What title hopes Arkansas had are now vanished. The best the Razorbacks from Fayetteville hope for is a tie with Baylor for the top spot—and the Porkers must take A. and M. twice next week to do that.

As for the other teams, the picture is this:

Texas T. C. U., Southern Methodist and Rice have finished the conference race. Texas clinched third place last week with a pair of wins, downing Rice 60-48 and S. M. U., 41-35. The Frogs ended up in fourth place by winning over the Mustangs 42-34, although dropping one to Baylor.

The Owls found themselves in fifth place and will stay there unless the Aggies win their three remaining games.

The Wholes Porkers lead 12th conference game to hold down the cellar for good.

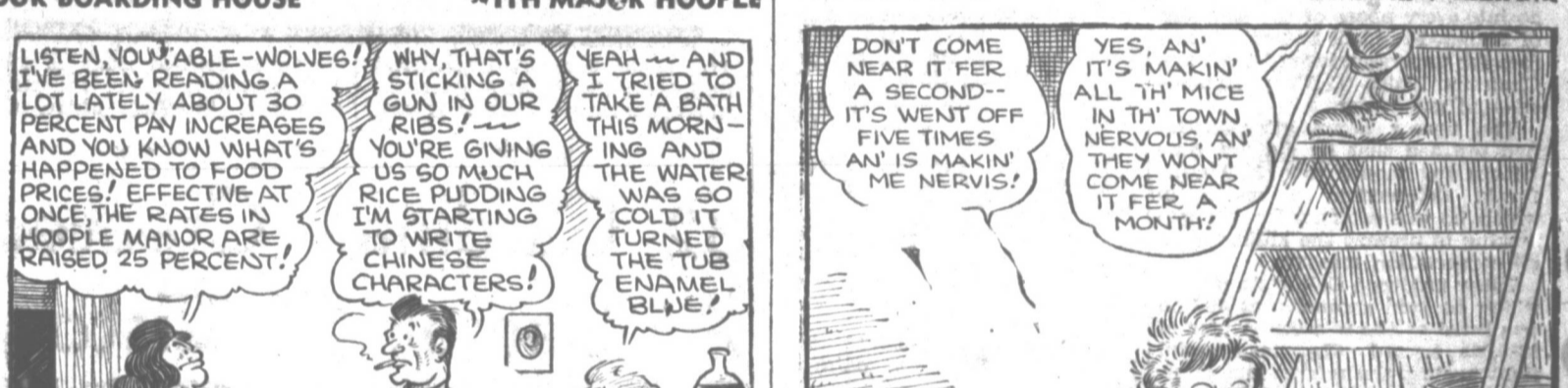

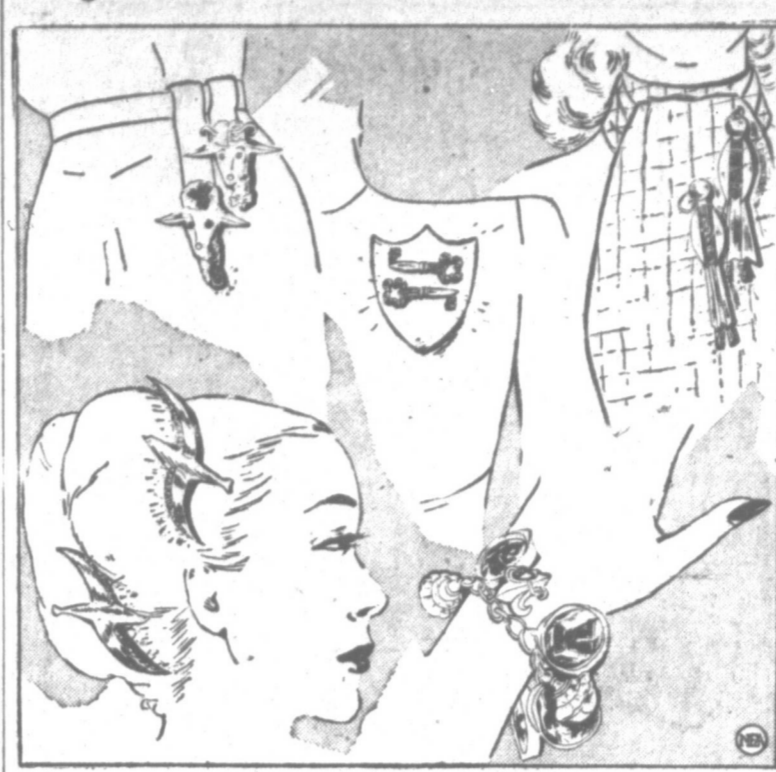
COUPLES' CLASS PARTY

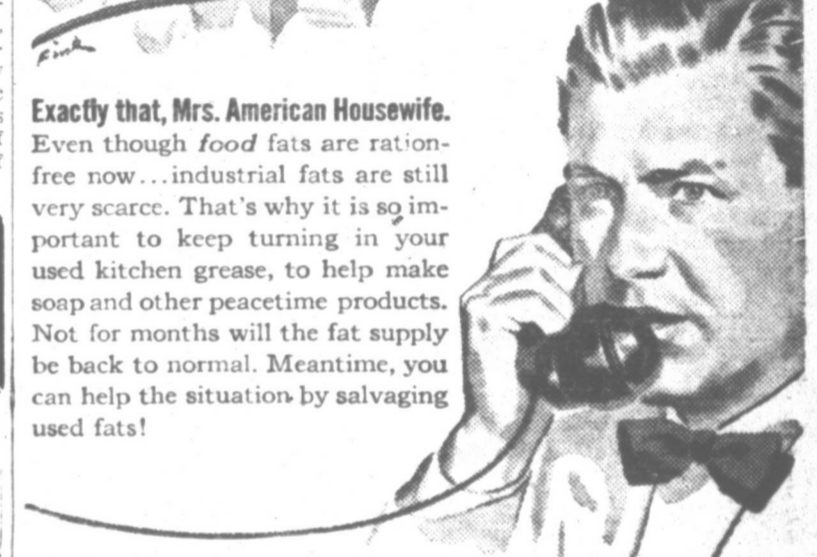

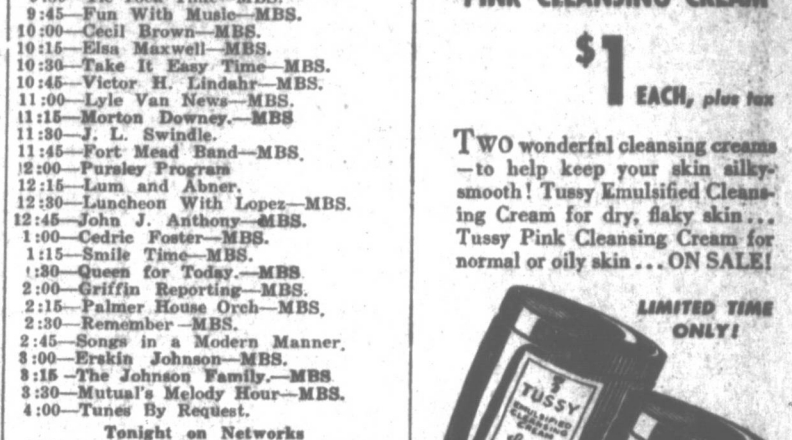
