





# Supreme Court Has Its Own Procedure

 WASHINGTON — (AP) — Since the U. S. Supreme Court is about ready to recess for the summer, this is a good time to see how the nine justices do their work the rest of the year.

There's nothing mysterious about the way they work although it is always strange to see how the nine men, with the same set of facts and law books, can disagree so often on their conclusions.

While the court is the final authority on cases involving the Constitution and the meaning of federal laws, it acts only when appealed to, and then only in some cases, not all.

With few exceptions, all cases reach the Supreme Court only through the lower courts, either state or federal.

Saturdays and Mondays are the big days for the justices. They usually meet on Saturday to make their decisions, which they do by voting, and assign among themselves the job of writing opinions which explain how they reached their decisions.

And on Mondays they announce their decisions and make public, in printed form, whatever opinions they wrote. Here is an example of a case.

Tom Jones, convicted of murder in a state court, appealed to his state court of appeals to throw out the verdict against him. Losing there, he appealed to his state supreme court. He lost there, too.

Then he appeals to the Supreme Court here. But he doesn't have the right to appeal here simply

because he happened to be convicted of some offense in a state court. A constitutional question must be involved.

Jones says there is one in his case. He says the police third-degree him into a confession, used at his trial, and that this police brutality deprived him of "due process" of law, guaranteed everyone by the Constitution.

So, through his attorney, Jones files an appeal with the court, asking that his conviction be thrown out. This appeal is only a first step; it really only asks the court for a full hearing after which, he hopes, the court will decide he's right and overturn his conviction. Meanwhile, the state attorney files a brief, or statement, explaining why he thinks Jones isn't entitled to a hearing at all.

Each judge takes Jones' appeal back to his chambers where he examines it, looking up the points of law on such a problem, and studying previous court opinions in cases similar to Jones'.

(The judges get a lot of help in this research from their law clerks who are honor graduates of law schools and usually are allowed to work for the judges for one year only.)

Having now examined Jones' case, the judges meet on a Saturday to decide whether (1) they should drop the case right here and refuse a hearing or (2) they should go on with it, giving him the full treatment, including a hearing and a decision on the rightness of his conviction.

If they refuse a hearing, that is it for Jones unless his lawyer can think up some other constitutional point on which to appeal for a hearing to get his conviction thrown out.)

Suppose the judges decide on the full treatment. On a Monday they announce they'll give him a hearing. Then Jones' lawyer and the state attorney file more briefs, explaining their views further.

After that, on a specified day, both attorneys are permitted to come into open court and argue their case orally, each side getting one hour. This gives the judges a chance to quiz them closely.

By this time the judges are fully informed on Jones' case; the facts, arguments, and points of law. So on another Saturday they meet to reach a decision, for or against him, and figure out what their opinion shall be.

When they vote on the decision, the majority vote, of course, is the decisive one. Sometimes, though, the judges end up in a tie — 4-4 or 3-3 — because one or more of them, for one reason or another, didn't take part in the case or vote on it.

Such a tie vote is a vote against Jones. He loses. When there is a tie, the court gives no written opinion. Even when there's a clear majority vote the court

# Tyrone Power Explains Reasons For Suspension

 HOLLYWOOD — (AP) — The filmtown got a jolt last week when it learned that Tyrone Power had been suspended by his studio.

"I've had enough costume pictures," he continued. "I've done five in a row — 'The Prince of Foxes,' 'The Black Rose,' 'Rawhide,' 'American Girl in The Philippines,' and 'The House on The Square.' That's too much for one actor. I think it's time

doesn't always hand down an explanatory opinion. But most of the time it does.

The other justices on the majority side and those on the minority side can write opinions of their own, showing why they agree or disagree with the majority opinion.

These opinions are kept highly secret until they are distributed in court on Monday, but not one second before the judges begin to announce their decision from the bench.

Although the judges reach decisions on Saturday and announce them on Mondays, many months may elapse between the time an appeal is filed and the decision is announced.

For their work the judges get \$25,000 a year, except Chief Justice Vinson who receives \$25,500. Retirement isn't compulsory but anyone of them, like any other federal judge, can retire at full pay at 70 if he's been on the federal bench 10 years.

# Casualties For Ceiling Put On Intestines

HANOI, Indochina — (AP) — Pro-Communist Vietnamese forces have lost 1,600 killed; 2,700 wounded and 300 prisoners in the battle along the Day River, the French general staff has announced.

French losses were put at 180 killed, 200 wounded and 60 missing. Six French officers were killed and another six wounded.

The French said the estimates for the Vietnamese were a minimum, based on bodies actually found by the French. Another 2,000 casualties probably were inflicted by French planes, they estimated.

Strong French forces from the Ninh Binh stronghold—50 miles south of Hanoi — crossed the Day River at dawn Tues. With air and naval support they began a drive against the Vietminh positions on the south bank. The French said it was "developing favorably."

BERLIN — (AP) — Johannes Becher, poet laureate of East Germany, has written a new poem to eulogize the Soviet Union, and it seems to have been inspired by the Bible.

Becher's latest work is a 300-page-long tome dedicated to Stalin and entitled "Star of Never-Ending Glow."

It amounts to a parallel with the Star of Bethlehem. In an explanatory preface, Becher draws the comparison himself by suggesting that the Soviet Union has only one message for the world, and that is "peace on earth."

# U. S. Crude Output Rises To 11,400 Bbls.

One of the bidding problems of the good player is what to do with a good hand in which there is no clear-cut partnership fit. Ordinarily you have to bid such hands tentatively. You may bid a no-trump, and perhaps show a delayed preference for partner's suit.

When an opponent steps into the auction, the situation changes. You can't safely bid no-trump without strength in the opponent's suit. If you have that strength, however, why not double for penalties?

As a matter of fact, the penalty double may be in order even if you have very little in the opponent's suit. You may be able to take enough tricks in the side suits to make the enemy sorry they hadn't stayed at home.

The West cards of today's hand were held in a tournament some years ago by John C. Stabilein, of Seattle. His decision to double two diamonds was considered unusual at that time, but in recent years more and more experts have adopted this kind of double.

It is unusual because West has neither a trump trick at diamonds

# 'Interesting Public Hearing' Is Promised In Maceo Probe

AUSTIN — (AP) — The Legislative crime investigating committee promises a "very interesting public hearing" on the Maceo interests of Galveston.

It has been set tentatively for June 25 in Austin.

Rep. Fred Maridith of Terrell, chairman of the committee created by the House to investigate organized crime and gambling in Texas, said it had some "definite new leads" for the public session.

He said the committee had asked questions about possible tieups of the Maceo interests outside of Texas but the answers would be brought out in the public hearing.

The committee wound up three days of the main testimony on the Maceo interests Monday. All remained were the records from the man who said he furnished horse race information for Maceo and company. He is Felix J. Demary of Orange and Beaumont.

The committee excused the four men summoned from Galveston until the public hearing.

Some of the records brought from Galveston also were released.

A two-ton truck brought cartons and wooden barrels full of records to the capitol.

Sam Serio, a short, neatly-dressed man with graying hair and clipped mustache, came out of the last session, shook hands cordially with everyone around and lit a cigar.

He is general accountant for the Maceo interests and had been the principal witness since the hearings started Friday.

C. H. Cavness, state auditor, who had been studying the Maceo records, said that Serio "kept a good set of books."

"We have found no attempt to disguise anything," Cavness said.

He said the records indicated that Maceo and Co. covers generally the Maceo interests except real estate, which is concentrated in Gulf Properties, Inc. the other activities, such as the Ballroom, the Turl Club and the Marine Room in Galveston pay rent to Gulf Properties.

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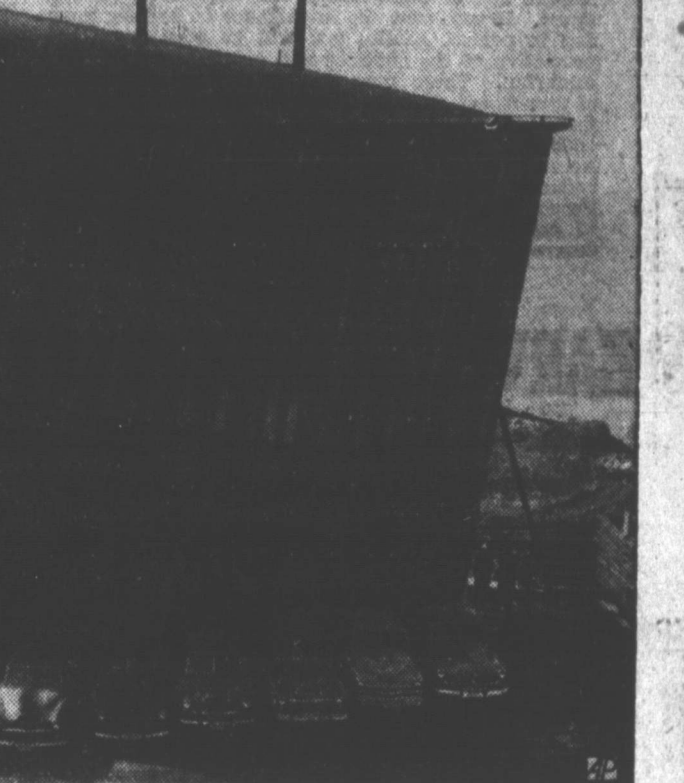

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### Accordion Reads Heart Pressures

DENVER — (AP) — A tiny electronic accordion to read blood pressures inside the heart was described at the University of Denver.

This heart gauge is smaller than an eraser on the end of a lead pencil. It goes directly into the heart.

This is done by placing the accordion in the top of a long, plastic tube, about as big around as a soda straw, which enters an arm vein and is pushed up through the arm, around the shoulder and finally into the heart. The tube technique is virtually painless and is used regularly in hospitals for getting direct samples of blood from the heart.

The accordion is one of the first gadgets to be sent into the heart at the end of the tube. The accordion has a hole through

its center, so that the tube gets its blood samples along with the readings of the accordion. These gauge readings come by electricity along a wire the length of the tube.

The accordion action is furnished by springs of wire so fine it is barely visible without a microscope. Any pressure inside the heart compresses these springs. This distorts the wires and changes their electrical resistance.

The accordion is an aid for surgeons in the new operations performed inside hearts and on the great artery leading outward. Faulty heart valves, and some other conditions, cause pressure changes inside the heart that cannot be read by other instruments. Pressures in one part of the heart may differ from those in another.

The agency did not identify the army. At full strength, each of Lin Piao's armies (corps) is about 25,000 men.

The same agency reported the Cominform — Communist Information Bureau — is training 240 persons at Peiping for fifth column work in Asia. Among them, it said were Communists from Burma, Indochina, Thailand, the Philippines, Malaya, Japan and India.

### Man Is Killed As Gym Class Watches

NEW YORK — (AP) — A man who intruded upon a girls' physical education class was shot and killed by a policeman yesterday as the stunned students watched.

Police said the victim, Carl Arch, 50, wandered into the gymnasium of Central Commercial High School, in mid-Manhattan.

Arch walked among the light-clad girls, talking incoherently and tapping several of them on the head with a vase he had picked up in a school office, police said.

One student slipped out of the room and summoned motorcycle patrolman Eugene Grace. The patrolman said he fired a single

shot after Arch struck him with the vase and lunged at him with a pen, which the officer thought was a knife. The shot struck Arch in the jaw.

About 35 girls and their teacher saw the killing.
