WASHINGTON - (AP) President Truman said today that if Russia continues to block Italian membership in the United Nations, "other ways must be found" to enable Italy to play "a full and equal part" in upholding UN principles.

The President reaffirmed Amercan intentions to try to restore Italy's rights as a free nation by seeking to ease the Italian peace

treaty. The United States, Britain and France were moving to relax treaty restrictions imposed Italy. They proposed to do it by renouncing some clauses, especially a provision limiting



serve as a partial splint.

If the fracture is in the bone moving. The moving itself should be done with great care, treating the broken bone almost as if it were a separate body.

If the fracture is in the spina cord or head it almost always best to wait for professional help.

There are many kinds of frac tures varying all the way from a small crack with the bones still which some of the bone is destroy ed and comes all the way through the skin. The treatment depends on the location and nature of the fractures.

In determining what should done, the X-ray is of extraordi-nary value. Indeed bones are nary often set under this machine so that the doctor can tell when the broken fragments are in the best position to heal. SPLINT IS NECESSARY

Once the bone fragments are put together in the right position they need to be held there and they need time to grow together or kinkt.
