H. Nelson, killed in Korea Feb. 15, will be held in the First Methodist church in Pampa at 2:30 p.m. Monday. Chaplain Capt. Clayton E. Day, Fort Sill, Okla., who was with Capt. Nelson in the 187th Airborne division in Korea, will conduct a military service. He will be assisted by Rev. Grady Adcock of Miami. Services are under the direction of Duenkel -Carmichael.

Captain Nelson, son of Harry A. Nelson and the late Mrs Nelson of Route 1, Miami, was Commander of Co. "F" of the 38th Infantry regiment, Second division. He lost his life leading an early morning attack on an enemy-held hill a few miles east of Wonju.

He was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross. Active pallbearers will be principally classmates of Capt. Nelson, of the June 1943 graduating class at the United States Military academy at West Point.

### **Phillips Pays Tax Without Protest**

AUSTIN -(A)- Phillips Petroleum Co. became the first major gas gathering firm to pay Texas' new tax on natural gas without protest, State Comptroller Robert S. Calvert's office has reported. Phillips Petroleum of Bartlesville, Okla., paid a gathering tax of \$13,127.31 for September. Phillips Natural Gas Co., an affiliate, paid \$1,476.70. Reports on both tax payments were filed by L. W. Plunket, assistant chief auditor for Phillips.

A number of companies have paid the tax of less than half a cent per thousand cubic feet of gas under protest. They have 90 days in which to bring suit to recover the money, which would be held in escrow pending setlement of litigation.

Thou shalt not make unto thee a graven imagine of the Chairman of the Board, nor the Governor of the State, nor shalt thou bow the knee before legislative committees who would limit or destroy that freedom of the mind without which all other freedoms are brutalized.

"Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord in vain, for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain; but thou shalt include religion and morals in what is studied and in what is

"Each semester shalt thou labor—thou, and thy faculty, and thy student body; thou shalt not make a carnival out of the works of the

"Thou shalt not covet a cham-pionship football team, nor the largest student body, nor the lar-gest stadium, nor to have the largest number of unused books in your library.

"Thou shalt not kill the intellec-tual curjosity of either student or teacher by substituting empty rou-tines for the excitement of learn-

There should be a list of com-

mandments for college trustees, as too many trustees are college trustees not because they are interested in education, but simply because it gives them prestige in their line of business. It also satisfies their ego and vanity.

I sent to all the trustees of the

University of Southern California editorials showing the kind of tëxtbooks used in their college. None of them had enough fight in them to get the textbooks out of the college. They were more interested in being trustees than they were in what was being taught their college.

In fact, most colleges have become adjuncts of the state by way of their ability to issue licenses for this and that.

There is nothing needed more than colleges that try to get their pupils to believe in fillidamental eternal principles as set forth in the Jewish and Christian religions and the Declaration of Independence. Then if they could get them anchored to these principles, and could get them to recognize a course of action that is compatble with these principles, then colleges could be of real service to

our nation. It is too bad that most of them are helping destroy the ideologies of our country father than instilling into the minds of the youth of the land the moral principles of the Ten Commandments and the Declaration of Independent

#### **Local Assignment All That Stands Between TV, Public**

WASHINGTON - (P) - The only thing now holding up additional television service for the country is the matter of making final local assignments of the available channels.

The distribution, to cities and towns throughout the United States, involves a stupendous engineering job if that bug-a-boo of all broadcasting - interference - is to be avoided.

The work should be completed by February. Then the Federal Communications commission (FCC) will be able to lift the three-year-old freeze on new station grants.


