

Harvesters Begin Preparations Golden Sandies Clash

Sports Scribes Start Early Game Watch

DESCRIBED by the Associated Press sports editor as a team playing mediocre ball, Pampa Harvesters today resume their preparation for the annual Amarillo Golden Sandies grid classic, scheduled for play at Amarillo Saturday.

The game, to be played on Saturday afternoon instead of Friday night as was originally planned, is a resumption of a grid battle that has been waged for a period of 14 years, with Pampa being victor in only three of the clashes.

Amarillo is under the impression they have what it takes to stop the Harvesters Saturday, but the Harvesters are hard at work to improve their spurring defense that they have been slack with, and are planning to give Amarillo one of the greatest times they have seen this season.

Similar to an Army-Navy clash, the grid meet will be the most outstanding on schoolboy schedules this week. Already scribes and big officials are eyeing the past performances of each team, with Amarillo having a margin as far as weight and about everything else is concerned. Only one year, 1940, has seen a high score as result of the game and even this score did not get completely out of bounds for the final tally was 32 to 7.

This year the Harvesters will face many of their old rivals on the grid field. Still there have been a number of newcomers added to the list. Pampa will have to watch the entire Sandies' squad composed of such members as:

Captain Dale Collins, 190-pound backfielder, who has been out of the last three games as far as his maximum strength is concerned. Collins played against the Norman, Okla., team but he was there only to do his faking and breaking, and the Sandies' coach wishes now that he had not put him in the game at all because it did a bad ankle no good. Collins should be in tip-top shape for the Harvesters clash though.

Maurice Essary, 160-pound back, is a first stringer and can run low

like a jackrabbit. He's had a difficult time getting away this season, but if he ever does the opposing team has little chance of catching him.

Bill Attebury, 150-pound back, has been working in Dale Collins' place long enough to become an experienced back. He knows all the tactics of Lynch's T-formation and fits well into the lateral that has done quite a bit of ground gaining for the Golden Sandies. Quarterback Paul Miller to Attebury to Richard Mixon with Mixon going around right or left end for a first down or the touch, every time so far this season.

Guard Jim Tomberlin is a tall, sandy-haired kid and is a squadman with one more year to play for Coach Lynch. He has been playing the center position, the story going something like this: John Bob Watts, senior pivot man, got his right leg hurt. His understudy, Don Mulky, was put in but Mulky did the job rather weakly so Lynch threw Tomberlin in the center position as a sub. He did the job to perfection and is a bigger boy than Mulky.

Harold Collins fills the roles at 197 and is the little brother of big Dale Collins, 190-pounder who is the breakout in Lynch's T-formation. Harold Collins has played a part of every ball game, is a good passer and a hard tackler.

S. L. Storseth, 148-pound guard, is another of the Storch boys. Amarillo has always had one on the team and although he weighs only 148 pounds is considered good and has been playing quite a bit of ball since Guard Joe Frank Robinson was injured. He's hard to handle.

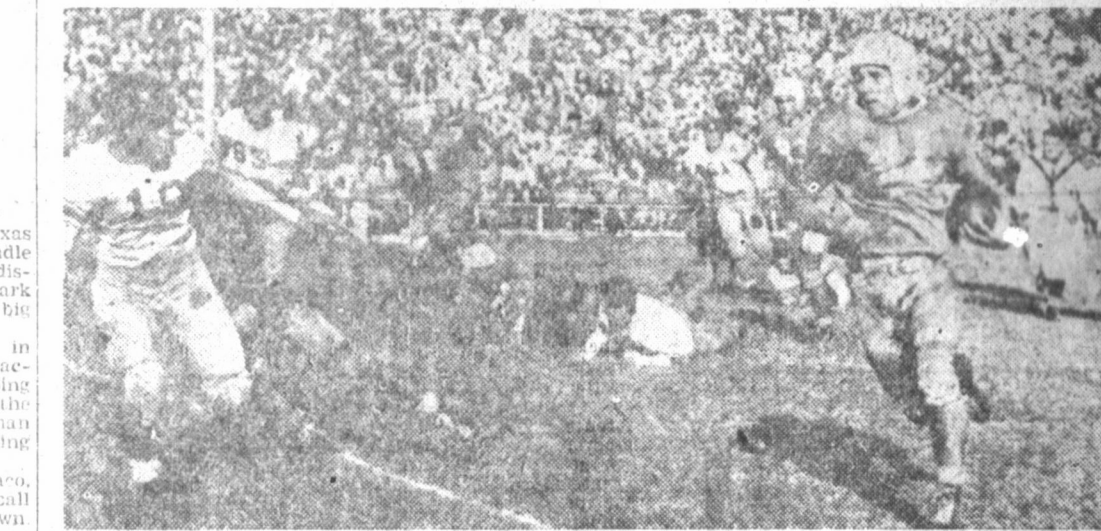

CITY IMPROVEMENT:

Chemical Content of City Water Sufficient to React on Pipes

(Editor's note: This is the fifth in a series of articles dealing with Consulting Engineer Joe E. Ward's study of the needs for repairs and renovations in Pampa's sewer system. The articles were prepared by Everett Bannister, member of The News staff.)

The department first made an analysis of water from the south side well Number 1, and then samples of hydrant water, which should be a composite sample of all wells in Pampa.

From these analyses it was determined that the city water supply carries a total of 293 parts per million magnesium and sodium sulphates, and that the South side well carried a total of 359 parts per million of magnesium and sodium sulphates.

Thus, according to the consulting engineer, it appears there was an ample supply of sulphates from which hydrogen sulphide-forming bacteria may produce the corrosive gas. It may be noted that the sulphates in the city water supply are the ones most readily broken down by the bacteria, consequently the formation of hydrogen sulphide must be expected in the sewers when the sewerage becomes old, unless preventative measures are taken.

Earth Pressure on Pipes From all appearances, the engineer pointed out, the high percentage of the failures that occur in deeply-laid sewers is easily explained. He said that it was due to the great pressure of the backfill material on the pipe. According to figures and tables evolved by Prof. Ernest W. Steel, consulting engineer of Texas A. and M. college, and from a formula developed by Prof. Anson Marston, of Iowa state college, the pressure on a 15-inch pipe laid at a depth of 20 feet is approximately 2,850 pounds per foot.

The standard crushing strength specifications for 15-inch non-reinforced concrete pipe required by standard federal specifications is 1,750 pounds per foot. Observations of actual sewer pipe failures bear out these figures in their entirety. Standard sewer construction specifications require selected earth to be carefully placed and tamped around the pipe. The tamped backfill supports the pipe and also carries part of the weight of the backfill. If the pipe is laid according to the usual requirement, and meets standard crushing strength specifications, there should be no trouble with crushing at a depth of 20 or 25 feet. However, where the pipe has been weakened from partial backfill segregation, it is expected to collapse unless the backfill forms a bridge and relieves the pipe from carrying the entire weight.

Reconstruction of Sewers In reconstructing the sewer pipe which is not subject to corrosion by sewer gases, should be selected. This would restrict the selection to vitrified tile pipe for general use, with cast iron for the above ground and under railroads. The engineer stated that even the cast iron should have a protective coating of asphalt or other substance not susceptible to the corrosive effect of the gas forming in the pipe.

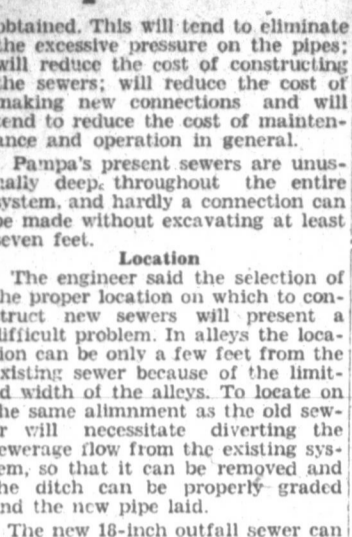
Ward pointed out that it generally appeared advisable to replace the existing concrete pipe with new pipe of the same size. He recommended, however, that the 15-inch outfall main be replaced with an 18-inch main below the junction with the final sewerage disposal plant and that the 12-inch north side main be replaced with a 15-inch main below the junction of the 10-inch main in the park. The south side main according to the report should be replaced with a 15-inch main up to Finley street and with a 12-inch main from Finley street to the alley between Reid and Barnes streets.

In the construction of the sewer lines, or any sewer lines, the engineer said, it is believed the pipes should be laid as shallow as possible so long as satisfactory grades can be maintained.

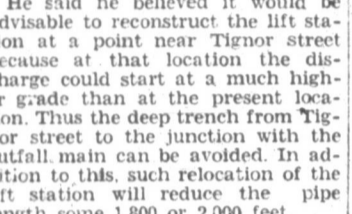

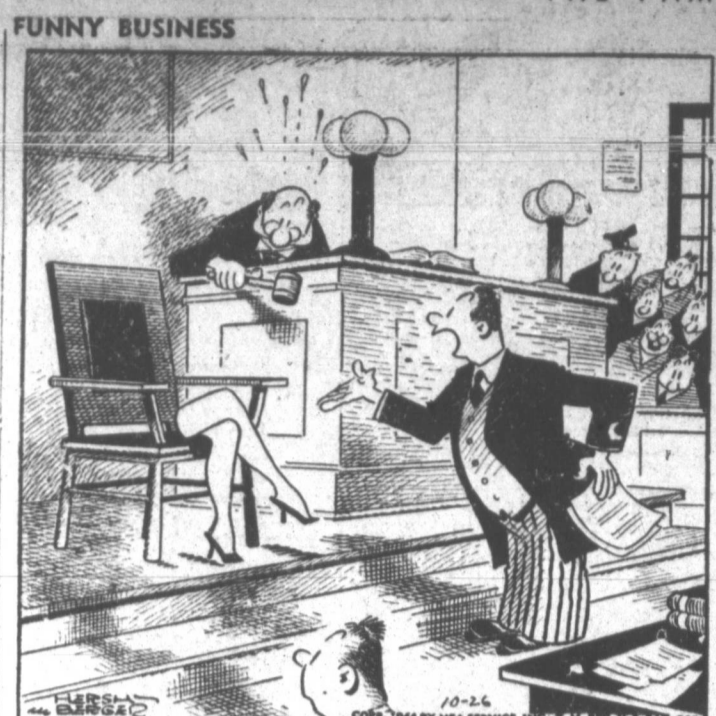

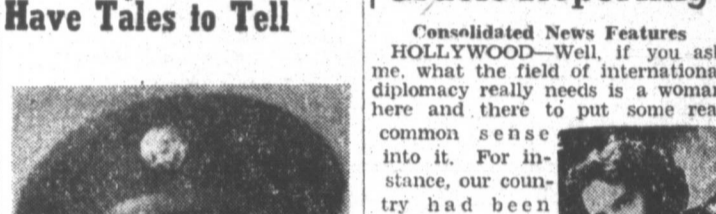

(Continued from Page 1) at least two towns from American troops, but doughboys aided by British artillery aid planes had apparently stabilized the front for the present. Patrols were active near the Aachen sector, and Allied planes over the weekend badly ripped German communications from south of Cologne to north of Aachen, forerunner of a possible new offensive.

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You can't see the crowd waiting for telephones... yet many people are waiting here in Pampa. When people crowd bus and railroad stations, it's easy to see that travel facilities are overburdened. If you could see the folks waiting for telephone service here, you'd know the telephone system is crowded, too. We wish we could put in telephone service immediately for everyone who is waiting, but we can't get the facilities to do it. Our telephone equipment factories still are working full speed to supply field equipment and electrical weapons for the army and navy. Facing such a condition we must first of all—as prescribed by the War Production Board—furnish the telephone service necessary to the war effort, public health, and security. Then others waiting for service are connected in order—those waiting longest are served first, just as at a cafeteria or theater. In general we are able to fill delayed orders only as fast as present users give up their telephone service. We immediately assign the wires, instruments, and central office equipment thus released to those nearest the top on the waiting list, who can be served by that equipment. To those of you who still are waiting, we say, "Thank you for your patience. We'll be glad to install a telephone for you as soon as we possibly can."
