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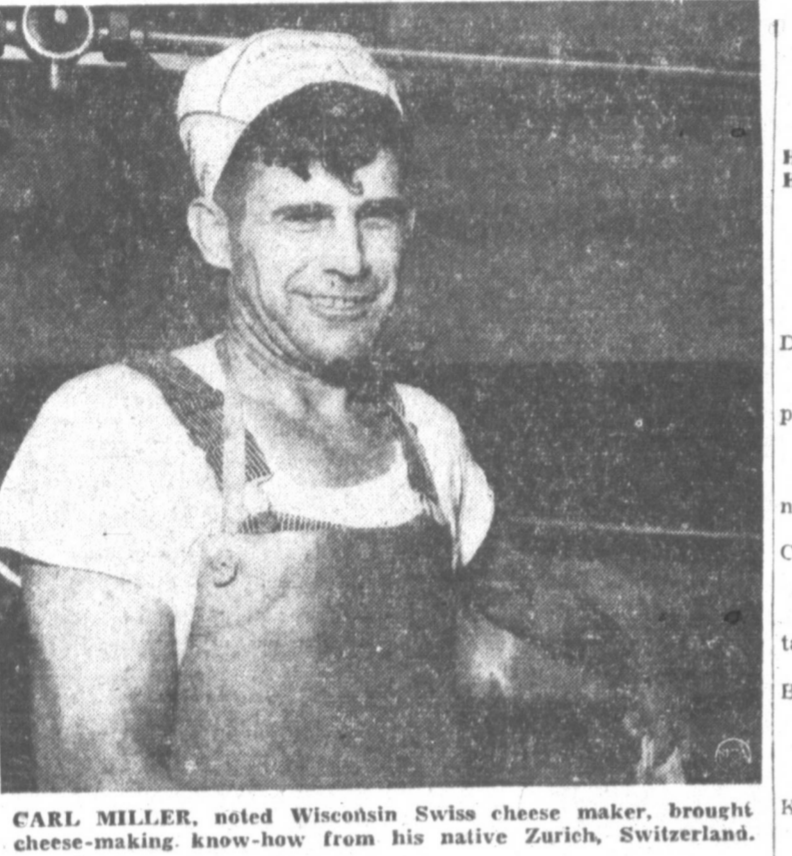

Wage Active War On Insects Before They Attack Homes

are nearly indispensable. Mr. Fix suggests that you use residual sprays that will stick on screens, garbage cans and porches.

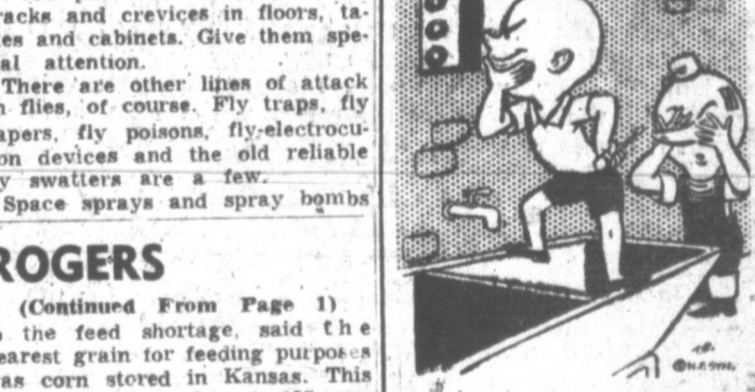
As for screens, 16-mesh-to-the-inch screens will keep out almost all insects. Fit screen doors to open outward.

Mosquito warfare takes a similar line. Your job is to hit their source of production, or reproduction in this case.

Mosquitoes breed in standing water. You can hit them where it hurts by not allowing water to accumulate in tin cans, eaves troughs and street-gutters. Put screen over open cisterns; cover cesspools, septic tanks and rain barrels; empty bird baths at least once a week, and treat standing water in pools or ponds with larvicides.

Sprays of 5 per cent DDT on porches and both sides of screen doors are effective artillery against mosquitoes.

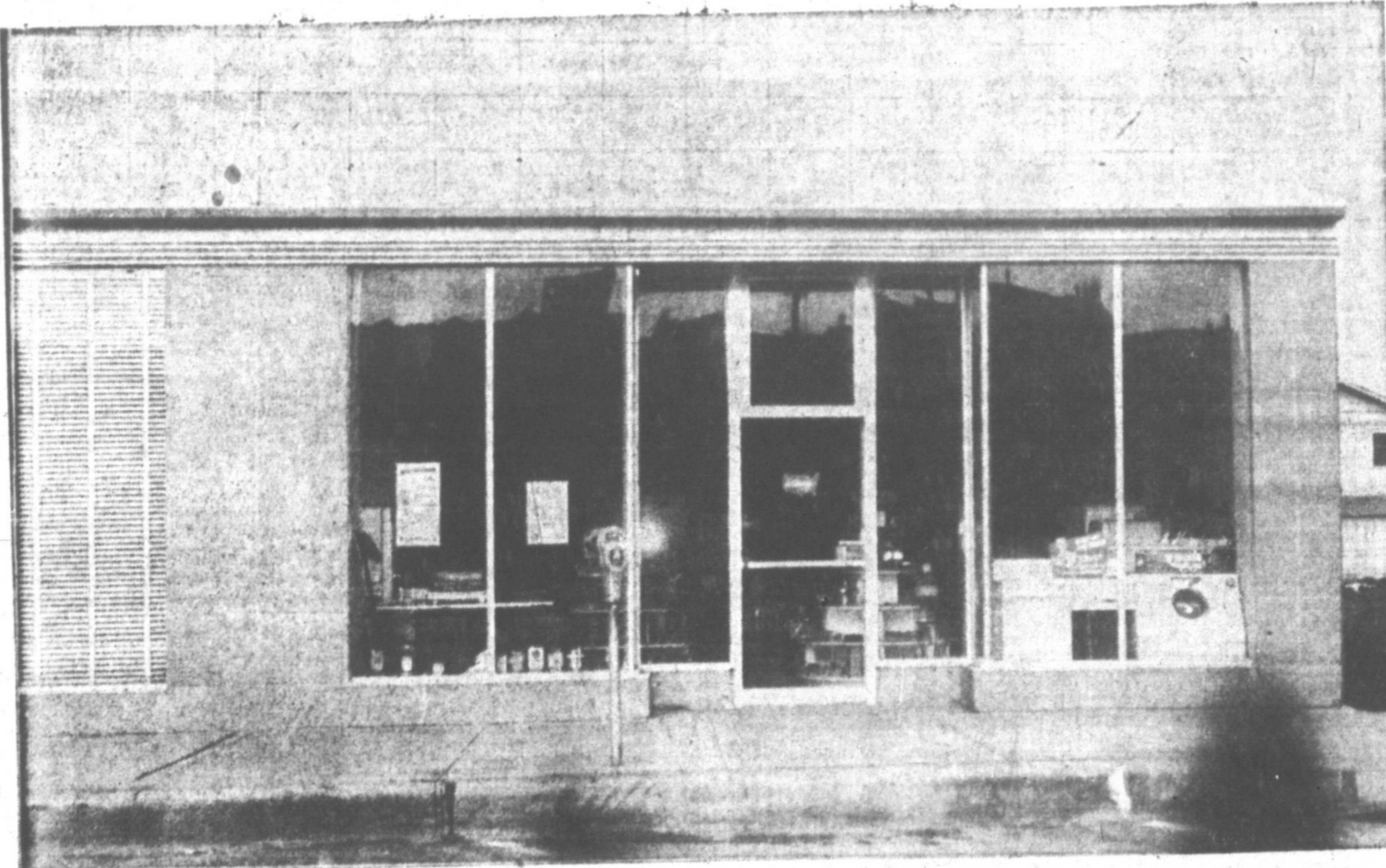
