## New kind of shootin' in Gray County

Independent film  
"Texas and Me"  
shot near Pampa

"Do you want me to fall down this time?" Tom Harrison asked.

"Not until I shoot you," replied Keith Burrows.

Moments later Harrison lay in the dust, his Sharps rifle beside him.

"He came all the way from Kansas just to get shot," Gene Jones of Pampa said quietly as Burrows and T. Brett Folmar moved the cameras for a shot from a different angle.

Harrison had driven down from his home in Colby, Kan., for this scene in the movie "Texas and Me," being shot at Delbert Trew's ranch near Alanreed.

Folmar, a 1986 Pampa High School graduate, had come up from Seabrook, near Houston, to be in the independent film that Pampa's Jay Riley is making here.

Trew said it takes six to ten hours of video to make an 88-minute movie.

"A television movie," Trew said, "is 88 minutes. The rest is commercials."

Folmar, Riley's stepson and co-star, will edit the digital video down to the 88 minutes and on a computer add the flash and sound of gunfire.

Once the project is finished, Trew said, they'll take it to film festivals.

Burrows, the director and cameraman in addition to being bad guy Lou Casner, said the buildings photograph well and the sound is good.

Burrows, who lives off a boat in the Pacific -- he said he refuses to claim California -- just finished shooting a horror movie on the West Coast.

"We didn't kill as many people as we have in this movie," he said in a voice hoarse with West Texas dust.

Burrows got shot after lunch. In the morning, however, he confronted Marshal Ransom Riley in the Red Dog Saloon.

## Project a first for Trew's ranch

It was down in Bull Canyon where the shooting took place.

The shooting was with video cameras, but there were a lot of firearms being pointed. The thunder and lightning of the pistols and rifles would be added later by computer in post-production after the scenes have been shot on the movie set at Delbert Trew's ranch.

Trew began building the small town in the canyon on his ranch with the idea of using it as a movie set, but the town's grown over the years.

The town is located down in Bull Canyon, a picturesque box canyon where the springs feed a small creek and water the cottonwoods.

The canyon got its name from a time when cattle rustlers kept stolen bulls penned up here, but that was long before Trew's family bought the place in 1947, from Charles McMurtry, Larry McMurtry's uncle. Larry McMurtry being the author of "Lonesome Dove" and a number of other tomes reflecting the history of the area.

"We've had family reunions here since about 1980," Trew said of the box canyon.

Little by little, over the years, buildings were added along the creek. Susan Oldham, Trew's daughter-in-law, said that when the family gathers here, tents still dot the flat below the town.

"We have my family reunion one year," Trew said, "and my wife's family reunion the next. We'll have 80 to 100 people here on Labor Day for the weekend."

Today, north of the campground, there's Bert's Hotel, the mercantile and stage stop and the Red Dog Saloon.

The saloon at the north end of town, started out as a gathering place for the kids at the reunions, Oldham said.

The adults camped at the south end of town, wanted to sleep while the children wanted to stay up late. Now, she laughed, those same kids are grown and

## High winds, dry conditions fuel Texas grass fires

HOUSTON (AP) — High winds and dry weather combined to fuel grass fires that left thousands of acres of Texas blackened this weekend.

"We're critically dry across the state," Nick Harrison, a spokesman for the Texas Forest Service, said Saturday.

Winter frost that has killed grass and lack of rain has left the landscape receptive to burning.

"We get a frontal passage through. Lots of times it's dry, we experience low humidity, extremely high winds and the last couple of days we've had unseasonably warm days," Harrison said.

No injuries were reported Saturday.

Officials warned conditions across South Central Texas and the Hill Country also were favorable for fires Saturday with winds up to 25 mph and humidity dropping as a cold front was blowing through from the north.

Many areas of the state had readings into the 80s on Friday — Fort Worth was 80 degrees and Waco 84. On Saturday, temperatures there were likely to reach only the low 40s, forecasters said. Highs in Abilene reached 82 on Friday but temperatures were in the mid-20s there during the late morning Saturday.

**Texas mom pleads guilty to injuring child**

BROWNSVILLE, Texas (AP) — A woman whose newborn daughter was found dead and stuffed in a suitcase has pleaded guilty to a charge of injury to a child.

Jacqueline Reich, 24, of Laguna Vista, entered the guilty plea Friday in the September 2005 death of her newborn, named Ava.

Reich will remain in jail pending a Feb. 12 sentencing hearing, according to Friday's online edition of The (McAllen) Monitor.

Reich's family discovered the newborn's body in a suitcase in the bathroom and alerted police.

Authorities believe the baby had been dead for at least two weeks before it was discovered, but attorneys on both sides of the case dispute whether the child was born alive or a stillborn. Cameron County District Attorney Armando Villalobos said pathologists who performed autopsies on the child had conflicting opinions.

"It would have been a difficult case to try, but one we're prepared to try," he said.

Reich faces five to 99 years in prison — the same prison sentence for murder, Villalobos said. She also would be eligible for probation.

Reich's attorney, Ed Cyganiewicz, did not immediately return a phone call late Friday from The Associated Press.

want to go to sleep early. Trew says what's been labeled as the mercantile store for the movie was built for shade. There's a fire pit there where they cook out.

"We serve under it," he says of the open area that's covered with a roof for shade.

For a movie, Trew moved in some iron-wheeled luggage carts from his broad antique collection so the site could also serve as the town's stage stop.

"We put all this up as movie props," he said.

There's also a laundry, an undertaker's parlor and the marshal's office.

"This is an old-timey laundry," Trew said, pausing next to a building with a large washtub. "You've got your wash pan and your mirror."

He says water could be heated so people could take baths there.

"We've got the livery stable here," Trew said as he walked down the dusty street.

Next-door is the undertaker's with wooden coffins on display out front.

"If you die," he drawled, "let me know. I'll get you a coffin."

Trew made all the coffins as well as the buildings.

"I used to have a ranch shop," Trew quipped. "I now have a production studio."

He also has a working blacksmith shop. His stepson, Mike Oldham from Lefors, is a blacksmith and a gunsmith.

"We have most of the old ranch blacksmith tools," Trew said.

He said they can fire up the forge and pound iron into just about anything.

"We can do just about anything you want to do," Trew said.

He said the marshal's office looks fine from outside, but the inside isn't finished yet.

"We're still fixing things

up," Trew said.

The overhead electric lines that provided power from a generator have been taken down.

Trew said that since there may be some more movies shot here, he's planning on some improvements and possibly expanding the town.

"They tell us there's nowhere where they can get this kind of scenery," Trew said. He said Palo Duro Canyon is too full of mesquite.

"You can't get around (in the brush of Palo Duro Canyon)," Trew said.

"Where were you when my brother was killed?" demanded Lou Casner.

"I was in New Mexico," said U.S. Marshal Ransom Riley with a steely gaze. Then he added, "Probably getting drunk."

At that the cast broke up and Burrows, director, cameraman and actor, just hung his head.

"It wouldn't take so long if we'd get serious about it," drawled Jay Riley, who played Marshal Ransom Riley.

Ransom Riley, he said, was his great grandfather, but he had been a rancher, not a U.S. Marshal.

Riley said the movie revolves around his character who leaves Bastrop to fight Indians with Charles Goodnight, an early Texas Panhandle rancher and former Texas Ranger.

"Goodnight's always been my hero," Riley said.

While Riley's character is gone from his homestead, Comanches raid it and his character is told his wife and daughter have been killed, but his grown daughter turns up later.

The reunion scene, Riley said, was so emotional that he had no trouble producing tears for the camera.

Riley wrote the story and the screenplay, and while it is serious, Riley's ad-libs kept the crew laughing, not to mention some of the situations that the crew found themselves in.

A few days before Gene Jones of Pampa was ambushed down the creek.

"I was one of the bad guys," Jones said, standing outside the saloon. "I got shot and fell in the sticker patch."

As directors do, the scene was shot over and over until it was just right.

"Every time I got shot,"

Jones complained, "I fell in the sticker patch."

Jones said he was glad when that scene was finished.

"We play music together," Jones said of Riley.

The duo has played together for about 15 years, he said.

"He wanted me in his movie," Jones said.

Riley cast his friend and musical partner as the storekeeper, undertaker and preacher.

"I told him I wanted to run the house of ill repute," Jones said, "but he said we didn't have one of those in the movie."

But they did have a saloon, and as they prepared to shoot the saloon scene with Burrows as Lou Casner first confronting Riley, Burrows as the director set up the scene with Mike Oldham of Lefors as the town blacksmith and Farrah

McCuiston of Pampa as the saloon girl sitting at a table.

Outside wrangler Jimmy Northcutt of Miami held one of his horses, waiting for the shot of Burrows making his escape.

Explaining to Oldham and McCuiston that one of the cameras would shoot across them at Riley and Folmar standing at the bar, Burrows told the two that he just wanted them sitting there talking quietly.

"What do you want us to talk about?" asked Oldham.

Pausing for a minute, Burrows looked at him and said, "You're sitting here in a saloon with a woman in a red dress and your wife is outside, what do you think I want you to talk about!"

Shooting concluded Friday. No release date has been set.

## Fort Worth police couple adopt 9

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — They were motivated by the problems that their badges couldn't fix.

Marie Ornelas witnessed the struggles many children face in her job as a school liaison officer, later as a detective and now as sergeant of the Fort Worth Police Department's crimes against children unit.

"It was a feeling of helplessness dealing with abused and neglected and really just forgotten kids who had been put out like they were trash or something," she said.

Her husband, John Ornelas, lasted only one year as a school liaison officer before requesting reassignment. He said questions he often fielded from children — like "Why is Dad on drugs?" and "Why does Mom sleep around?" — weighed heavily on him.

"We're police officers. We're supposed to be able to go to the home and fix it, and I couldn't do it," said John, now a detective on the north side.

"Emotionally, it was just tearing me down, and I couldn't deal with it."

Both wanted to do more.

"You start asking God, 'What was I supposed to do?'" John said. "The answer we got was, 'I'm going to give you some children, and you take care of them.'"

In June 2005, the Ornelases, who had three grown children, became licensed as foster/adoptive parents.

Three years later, they have adopted nine children removed by the state from their original homes because of abuse or neglect.

"People ask us, 'Why would we do that? That must be such a pain and so hard. How do you give them baths? How do you get homework done? How do you get them fed?'" John said.

"The reward is in the hugs and the smiles."

"You can't put a number on it"

Once the couple were licensed, caseworkers

pressed them to decide how many children they were willing to take in.

Enter five siblings — Makayla, Jordan, Makenzie, Madelyn and Madison — at the time ranging in age from 8 to 2.

The children had been removed from their parents years before because of severe neglect. Some showed signs of malnutrition, like Madelyn, who had few teeth. They'd bounced from foster home to foster home, separated so often that a few barely knew each other.

"A child knows that they're not permanent ... (that) this isn't forever," John said. "In the adoption

On Friday, a 53-year-old man died of burns suffered in a morning fire near several homeless camps in a wooded area of southeast Austin. The man, burned over 90 percent of his body, was taken to Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio where he died.

Friday night, crews were summoned to a rural area in Montague County, west of Wichita Falls and just south of the Oklahoma-Texas state line, to contain a 1,000-acre blaze that appeared to have started on the side of a road.

"The fire is in cleanup stages," Wendy Davis of the Montague County Sheriff's Department said Saturday.

No structures were threatened and no evacuations were ordered, she said.

In Jones County, about 25 miles northwest of Abilene in West Texas, a fire that torched 2,500 acres beginning Thursday no longer was active and was being monitored locally, Harrison said.

Fifteen departments and at least 200 volunteers responded to the blaze that destroyed, six homes, five hunting cabins, 20 outbuildings and 10 vehicles.

Another blaze near the Shackelford and Throckmorton county line about 60 miles north of Abilene was estimated to have burned more than 1,000 acres, destroyed two outbuildings and threatened six other structures.

## Keeping Americans connected in the digital age

Recently, I outlined my goals for keeping Texas and the United States connected through our national highway system and commercial and passenger air transportation. As the Senior Republican on the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science & Transportation, I am also focused on another kind of connectivity: telecommunications. Over the past several decades, America has seen a rapid advancement in communication technologies. While most citizens enjoy its benefits, we have not kept pace with other nations and the advantages of connectivity have not reached all our citizens. We must find ways to leverage new innovations to expand their reach and improve the lives of all Americans.

Perhaps the most pressing priority facing us this year is the Digital Television (DTV) Transition, during which broadcasters nationwide will switch from an analog format to digital broadcasting. Congress mandated the transition to digital broadcasting in 2006 to free up broadcast spectrum for important public safety activities that will increase the nation's ability to respond to terrorist attacks and national disasters.

For more than a year, the federal government and the broadcasting industry have worked to inform the public about the transition and to help consumers prepare. The transition date had previously been scheduled for February 17. However, in

January, a senior official in the Obama administration called for postponement of the transition, citing dwindling funds for the federal Coupon Program, which helps consumers buy converter boxes at a discounted rate.

Initially, I had serious concerns about shifting the digital television transition without a sound plan to inform consumers and resolve the converter box coupon shortage. But Commerce Committee Chairman Jay Rockefeller has worked with me to address many of my reservations with the initial proposals to move the date. Once legislation is enacted to reschedule the transition, the changes I worked to secure will help consumers whose coupons have expired to apply for new coupons. Other modifications to early delay proposals will allow prepared TV stations to move forward without the added costs of operating multiple broadcast facilities. Moreover, I have received assurances that there will be no further postponement, and that we will bring the transition to a conclusion this year. Significant challenges remain, however, and I will continue working with my colleagues in Congress to ensure a smooth changeover to digital television for all Americans.

Another telecommunications issue that begs the Senate's thoughtful consideration is access to the high-speed communication service known as broadband. Most in Congress agree that the widespread availability of

high-speed Internet will create jobs. Moreover, in heavily rural states, like Texas, broadband deployment will

expand educational opportunities through distance learning and improve the delivery of medical services and information through telehealth programs.

Where lawmakers tend to disagree, however, is on how to deploy broadband. Some in Congress would like high-speed Internet access in the U.S. to match that of urban centers like Hong Kong and are ready to spend hundreds of billions of dollars to that end. There are two problems with that approach. First, the U.S. is geographically and demographically diverse — what makes sense for New York City might not work in the Texas Panhandle. Second, it isn't cost-efficient. Even if the federal government builds a nationwide fiber-optic network, there is no guarantee that all consumers would subscribe to it. Instead, I am hopeful we will adopt incentives for investment by individuals and companies through changes in tax treatment, enhanced bonding authorities for broadband construction and targeted grant programs. This will allow the marketplace to determine what technology is appropriate for a community and how best to deploy it. In the meantime, broadband mapping efforts, which collect data on internet use, will help

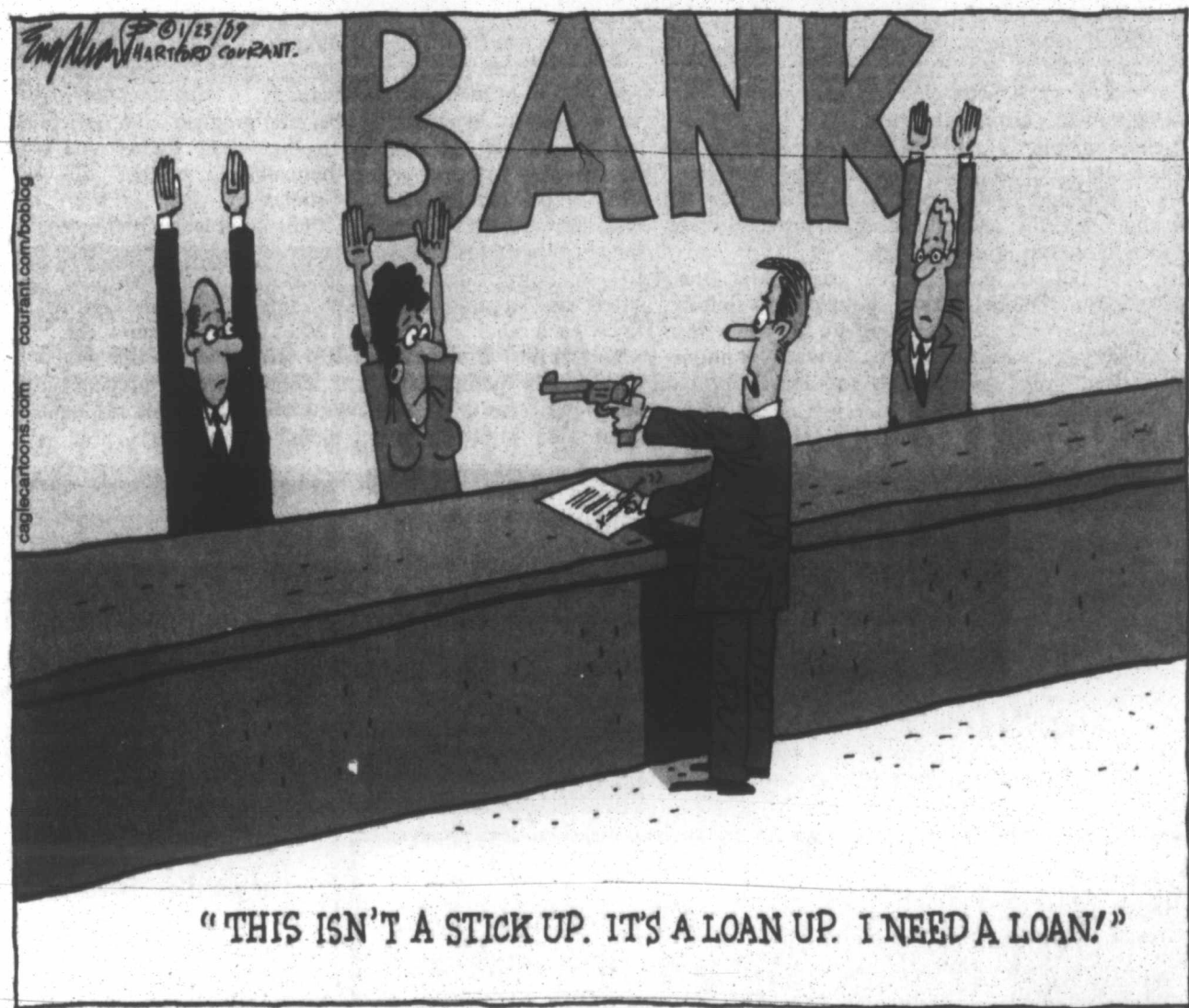


us better target our efforts.

Finally, just as Congress must support efforts to upgrade and expand telecommunications technology where we need it, we must limit it where it can do harm. In January, Rep. Kevin Brady and I introduced a bill to prevent prison inmates from using smuggled cellular phones, which are often used to orchestrate criminal enterprises and harass or threaten public officials from behind bars. In Texas, death row inmate Richard Tabler used a smuggled cell phone to intimidate a state senator. Current law prevents any kind of interference with wireless services. Our legislation provides a reasonable process for approval and use of jamming technology without compromising public access to 911 and emergency services or infringing on legitimate users' rights.

This year in the Senate Commerce Committee, I will work to advance sound, practicable policies that will keep Americans connected and allow our nation to keep up in the fast-moving digital age.

#### El Paso Times on closed-door meetings in the state Senate:

Some state senators are fooling no one by maintaining they need closed meetings so the public doesn't hear their trash talking.

There's a history of decorum in the Texas Senate, you know. So they go into these "Caucus of the Wholes" to do their wash.

They're hiding behind a glitch in the Texas Constitution. By law, the Senate is not subject to transparency statutes. Each chamber is allowed to create its own operating rules, according to the Texas Attorney General's Office.

When any group of elected officials meet, what they talk about should be open. It's called transparency in government. If there's brow-beating, let's see who's involved — which horn-butting elk wins the fight.

State Sen. Eliot Shapleigh, D-El Paso, has it right. "I believe all our business is the people's business and should be conducted on the Senate floor."

On the first day of the ongoing legislative session, the state's 31 senators held an hours-long conclave — doors shut in a back room — to air their gripes with each other's stances, perhaps to form alliances. We don't know what they hammered out — whose thinking was re-molded — because ... it's private.

The public should know where each elected official really stands. By holding secret meetings, it's only human nature to think that inside-deals are being made behind those closed doors.

If it's Texas business, it's public business.

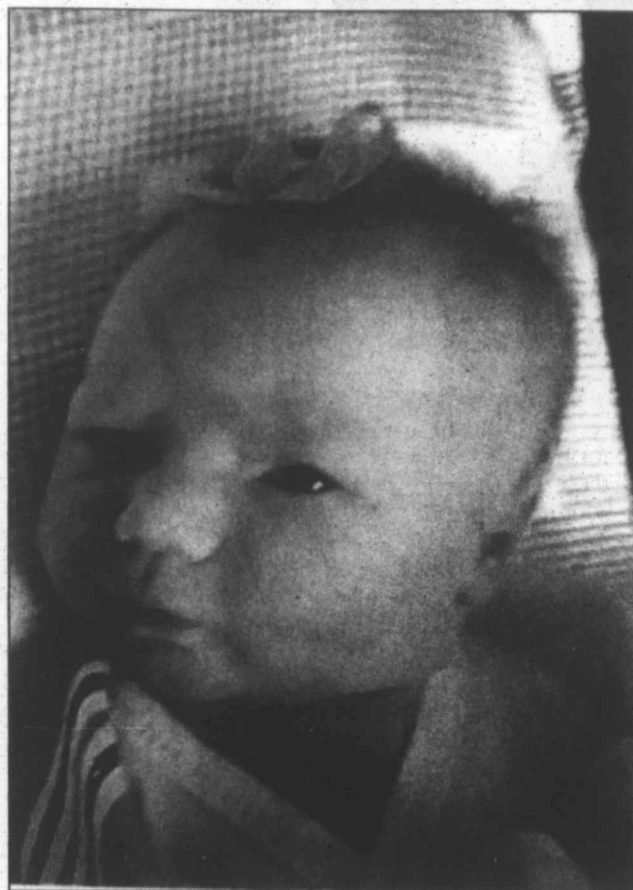

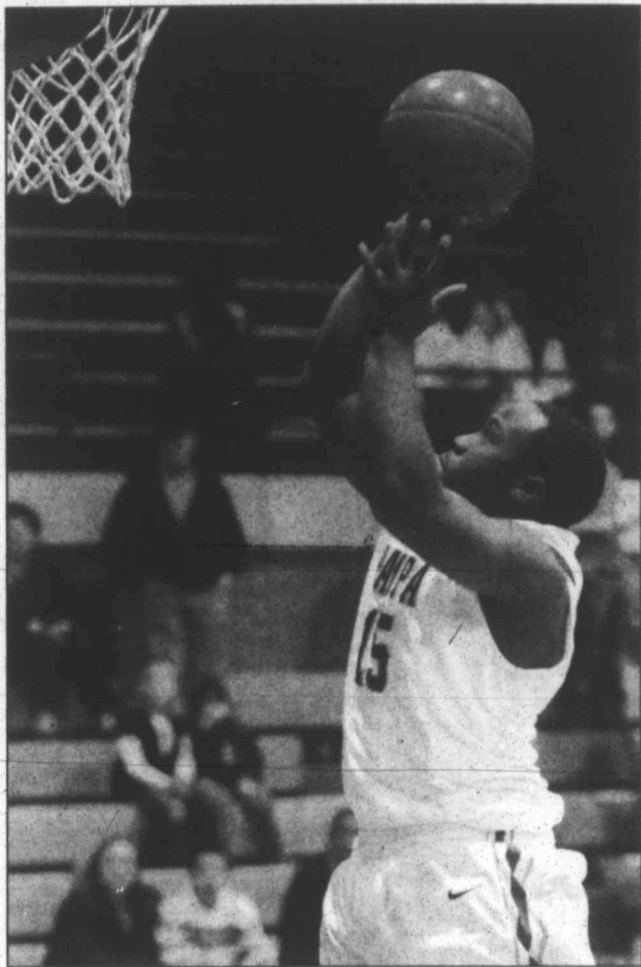
Sieck opened his game with a three pointer in the first quarter, but went scoreless in the second quarter. He sank a basket

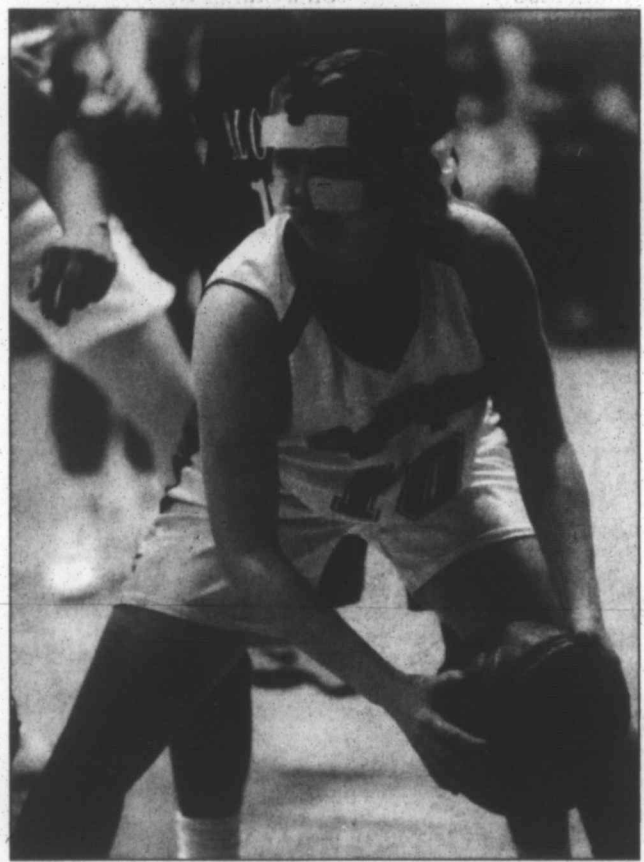
The Lady Harvesters ran

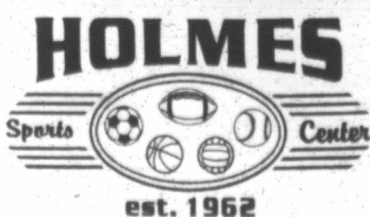

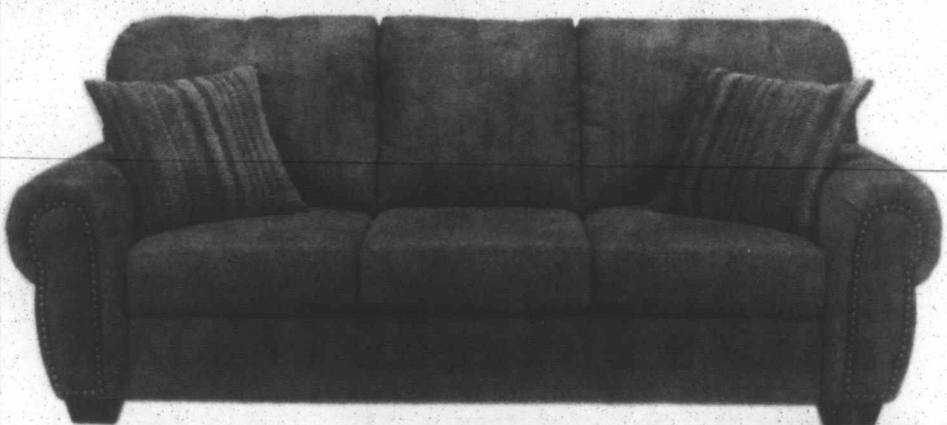

# Official says death row inmate attempts suicide

HOUSTON (AP) — A Texas death row inmate at the center of a months-long investigation of cell phone smuggling within the prison system has been moved to a psychiatric unit after apparently trying to kill himself a second time, an official said Friday.

Condemned murderer Richard Tabler was moved from death row earlier this week after cutting his arms, Texas Department of Criminal Justice spokeswoman Michelle Lyons said.

In an interview aired this week on Austin television station KEYE, Tabler accused an officer of smuggling the cell phone that was discovered in his prison cell in October after he made a threatening call to state Sen. John Whitmire. It was among some 2,800 calls records show were traced to the phone and prompted a lockdown of the nation's second-largest corrections system for weeks while officers combed 111 prisons for contraband.

More than 100 phones, 100 phone chargers and nearly 200 weapons were confiscated in the sweep. Other phones and phone components have been discovered since.

In the TV interview, Tabler complained officials were not trying to find officers he said were involved in smuggling operation.

John Moriarty, the inspector general for the 155,000-inmate prison system, denied that accusation Friday.

Moriarty said investigators were focusing on the families of inmates and inmate trustees as the source of the phones and the phone deliveries. Trustees do jobs around prisons like garbage collection, maintenance and laundry work and have greater freedom to move within the units.


The use of cell phones, prohibited in prisons, already had been under investigation in Texas and other corrections departments around the nation when Tabler's calls to Whitmire prompted Gov. Rick Perry to order the lockdown.

Moriarty said Friday that over the past 12 months, investigators have asked for 1,000 subpoenas for phone records to track the use of the phones in prison. He told the Temple Daily Telegram the investigation of Tabler's phone indicates Tabler borrowed the phone from another inmate.

Tabler was not available for interviews this week on death row at the Polunsky Unit outside Livingston because prison officials


considered him a security threat, then he was moved to the Jester psychiatric unit. Last October, after his phone was confiscated, he was taken to the same psychiatric hospital outside Houston after officers found he'd ripped a 3-foot piece of bedsheet, attached it to a light fixture in his death row cell and had red marks around his neck in an apparent attempt to hang himself.

Tabler, 29, from Killeen, was convicted in 2007 of fatally shooting Mohamed-Amine Rahmouni, 25, and Haitham Zayed, 28. He also confessed to killing Tiffany Dotson, 18, and Amber Benefield, 16. All four had ties to a Killeen strip club.

## Texas state unemployment rate shoots up to 6 percent

### But not in the Panhandle

AUSTIN (AP) — The Texas unemployment rate jumped to 6.0 percent in December and the state lost jobs for the third time in four months, the Texas Workforce Commission said Friday.

The unemployment rate was a sharp jump from 5.7 percent in November and 4.2 percent a year ago. It was the first time the state's jobless rate hit 6 percent since 2004, said commission labor representative Ronny Congleton.

The state lost 25,700 nonagricultural jobs in December, the second consecutive monthly drop after the commission revised November figures from a gain of 7,300 jobs to a loss of 11,300. The monthly job loss in September was the first in more than a year, according to the commission.

"Our state's economy has been fairly resilient during these months of economic uncertainty, but the national economic storm has reached Texas," commission chairman Tom Pauken said. "The challenge we face now is to minimize the impact of the national trends by continuing to promote our strong business climate and address the skills needs of Texas employers."

The job losses hit nearly every sector, with the biggest drops coming in trade, transportation and utilities (8,100 jobs) and manufacturing (8,000). The falling prices of oil and natural gas appeared to hit natural resources and mining, which lost 5,100 jobs. Construction dropped 3,300 jobs.

The only sector to gain jobs was leisure and hospitality, with a jump of 3,800. The catchall category — other services — gained 1,600 jobs.

Despite the widespread job losses, Texas still compared favorably to the national numbers. The unemployment rate remained below the U.S. average of 7.2 percent. According to commission figures, Texas has a net gain of 153,600 jobs over the past year compared with losses of 2.6 million jobs nationwide.

"Our state leaders have laid a strong foundation for Texas as a business-friendly state with low taxes and less regulation, and that foundation will be crucial in the months ahead," said Andres Alcantar, the commission's public representative.

The commission estimated that 711,800 people were actively looking for work in December, up from 676,000 in November.

Unemployment rates are adjusted for seasonal trends in hiring and firing, which most economists believe gives a better picture of the job market.

Without the seasonal adjustment, the Texas unemployment rate rose to 5.7 percent in December from 5.6 percent in November and 4.3 percent a year ago.

## Crowd control could cost \$1M at Bush's new home

DALLAS (AP) — The cost to provide police officers around the clock for one year at former President George W. Bush's new home in an affluent Dallas neighborhood could reach \$1 million, according to Police Chief David Kunkle.

The figure is based on the cost of providing two officers in a squad car on a 24-hour basis for 12 months.

"We have had officers out there frequently because of the crowds and traffic," Kunkle said in an online story Wednesday for The Dallas Morning News.

City Manager Mary Suhm said the city does not plan to ask the federal government to reimburse Dallas for police patrols of Bush's neighborhood.

"I don't believe that it'll be a massive expense," she said. Dallas "is going to take care of the president like we would take care of any of our citizens."

Ed Donovan, a Secret Service spokesman, said there is no "mechanism for the Secret Service to reimburse police departments for salaries, overtime or any associated costs."

"I don't know how long we will have to commit people," said Kunkle. He said he expects the interest of onlookers to wane over time. Kunkle declined to discuss the department's specific arrangements, citing security concerns.

Kunkle also said he does not expect that the department will provide motorcades for the former president. On those rare occasions when Bush needs escorts, police will provide them, officials said.

Last week, the Dallas City Council approved installation of a gate to block access to the former president's new 8,500-square-foot home in the Preston Hollow area. The house carries a market value of \$2.1 million.

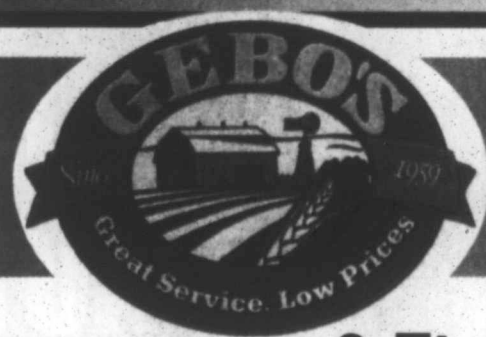

## Sculptor George Segal exhibit "Street Scenes" opens in Dallas

DALLAS (AP) — From a cluster of figures crossing a street, all lost in their own world, to a lone man replacing the lettering on a cinema marquee, American sculptor George Segal explored the human condition in an urban atmosphere.

There's plenty more city life in his latest exhibition, "George Segal: Street Scenes," which opens Saturday at Nasher Sculpture Center in Dallas.

It's the first Segal exhibition to focus on his street scenes and features 16 of his works from the early 1960s through the end of his career before his death in 2000.

"A lot of the scenes are scenes from everyday life

we tend to overlook," said Jed Morse, acting curator at the Nasher.

In the works, Segal's life-sized figures are doing the kinds of things so familiar to city life: eating at a diner, sitting on a bench, riding a bus. In some of the works, Segal incorporated salvaged architectural items. "The Diner," for instance, recreates an eating establishment down to a counter, a napkin holder and a waitress filling a cup of coffee.

Other works feature giant photographs as a backdrop. In "Dumpster," a figure walks past a photograph of an overflowing trash bin against a wall — both covered with graffiti.

The works — most in

plaster, some in bronze — are vignettes from the city, Morse said.

"He has kind of frozen them in time and created these poignant narratives of everyday life," Morse said.

Segal, who died at the age of 75, was born in New York City and grew up there. He then spent most of his adult life in the New Jersey countryside, returning to the city often for work, Morse said.

"He has that intimate connection with it, but also perspective from the outside," Morse said.

In "Bus Passengers," six figures are packed onto a bus — seemingly oblivious to each other.

"Again, you get that sense of urban density. People being close together but in their own worlds," he said.

Morse said that many of the works from the 1980s focus on tough economic times, including "The Homeless" from 1989, which has one figure lying over a grate and another crouching against the wall nearby.

The exhibit was organized by the Madison Museum of Contemporary Art in Madison, Wis.,

where it premiered. The exhibit ends April 5 at the Nasher and will then go to The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art in Kansas City from May 9 to Aug. 2, and the Norton Museum of Art in West Palm Beach, Fla., from Sept. 8 through Dec. 6.

"We really wanted an exhibition that would show a range of the work that he did based on city scenes," said Stephen Fleischman, director of the Madison Museum of Contemporary Art.

Fleischman, who organized the traveling show along with the museum's curator of exhibitions, said it seemed like a good time for a fresh look at Segal's works.

"He found a way of making these scenes universal," Fleischman said.

Fleischman said that there's a cohesiveness to the way Segal's works evolved over time.

"Really, he always kept his interest in the human figure: everyday people, everyday scenes," Fleischman said.

Morse said, "He really plumbs the psychological depths of what it means to be human in the city."

## Garland couple sentenced to prison for ID theft

DALLAS (AP) — A Garland man and woman are going to prison over identity theft involving people or banks in Texas, Michigan, North Carolina and South Carolina.

The U.S. Attorney's Office on Friday announced 66-year-old Levander Carlton McLean must serve five years in federal prison. His 45-year-old wife, Rita Murphy McLean, was sentenced Thursday to 51 months.

The couple also must make nearly \$209,000 in restitution.

The McLeans in September were convicted of conspiracy to unlawfully use identification documents. Their nephew, Robert McAllister, worked for the Texas Department of Public Safety as a driver's license technician.

Prosecutors say McAllister in 2006 pleaded guilty to unlawful production of an ID document. McAllister was sentenced to four years probation, ordered to do 100 hours of community service and was fined \$1,000.

DPS spokesman Tom Vinger says McAllister resigned in 2004.

## Southwest triggers late-winter fares sales

DALLAS (AP) — Major airlines moved Friday to match a fare sale started by Southwest Airlines Co., as the carriers worry about weak demand for travel during a recession.

Southwest said that through Monday it would sell seats to almost everywhere it flies starting at \$49 to \$99 each way. Tickets must be bought at least 14 days before flying, travel must be completed by March 11 and seats are limited, the airline said.

AMR Corp.'s American Airlines, Continental Airlines Inc., US Airways Group Inc. and JetBlue Airways Corp. matched the Southwest prices, officials at those carriers said. UAL Corp.'s United Airlines has its own fare sale that began on Jan. 16, said spokeswoman Robin Urbanski.

Delta Air Lines Inc. also appeared to match the Southwest move. Delta posted a systemwide fare sale on its Web site that runs through Monday — same as the Southwest sale. A three-day sale by AirTran ended Thursday night.

Representatives at Delta did not immediately return messages.

Dallas-based Southwest launched the sale shortly after announcing Thursday that it lost money in the fourth quarter, its second-straight losing quarter after 69 straight profitable ones.

Chief Executive Gary Kelly said Thursday that there was "notable softness" in February and March bookings. The day before, AMR Chief Financial Officer Thomas Horton said March looked particularly weak.

## Jazz musician David 'Fathead' Newman dies

KINGSTON, N.Y. (AP) — David "Fathead" Newman, a jazz musician who played with the Ray Charles Band and won fame as a tenor sax soloist, has died at age 75.

Manager Karen Nemman says the jazz musician died Tuesday of pancreatic cancer in a Kingston, N.Y., hospital.

He was nominated for a Grammy Award in 1990 for his work with Art Blakey and Dr. John.

The Dallas native spent 12 years with the Ray Charles Band beginning in 1954.

# Quiet border counties receive crime-fighting grant funds

EL PASO, Texas (AP) — Presidio County has never seen the kind of fictional carnage that was filmed there for the movie, "No Country for Old Men." But if it ever does, Sheriff Danny Dominguez now has the gear to fight it, thanks to millions of dollars in state and federal grants for his virtually crime-free turf and that of other sleepy Texas border counties.

The first batch of the \$16.2 million awarded, more than \$5 million, was given in 2005 to a loose coalition of sheriffs who split the take evenly, regardless of crime rates. The rest was given out in grants to several counties. And several million dollars more are in the pipeline.

Presidio County, whose sheriff and four deputies cover 3,856 square miles of West Texas and protect about 1,000 people, received \$336,875 to fight the one crime, an aggravated assault, that occurred in the county in 2006.

But in the Rio Grande Valley's urban Hidalgo County, across the river from the sites of several deadly Mexican shootouts, got about the same amount, spread over three years, for its more than 250 deputies to fight 7,160 violent crimes.

"I expressed my displeasure at the time," Sheriff Lupe Trevino said. "But that's the way it goes. We used the money the best way we could and you do what you have to."

The Associated Press obtained a county-by-county breakdown of the state spending on border crime in response to a Freedom of Information Act request.

According to spending records, several departments, including Presidio County, bought night vision goggles, radar units, and radios, along with heavy duty 4x4 trucks and other off-road vehicles.

They put some money in their overtime budgets.

Hudspeth County, with a population of about 3,300 and 41 crimes in 2006, spent \$22,300 on a Ford Mustang GT outfitted as a police car.

The sheriffs say they need the money to match the equipment and budgets of larger departments in the state. The state says the money will be used to prevent future crimes, and that even trespassing and vandalism in sleepy counties could be signs of Mexican organized crime seeping across the Rio Grande.

But critics say some of that money was misdirected.

"This shouldn't be border socialism," said Steve Ellis of Taxpayers for Common Sense in Washington. "It has to be based on need."

State Sen. Eliot Shapleigh, an El Paso Democrat and longtime opponent of some of the coalition's security efforts, suggested the money should have a set purpose.

"Let's first find the issue," Shapleigh said. "Here on the front line the issue is violent international gangs, so how best to use state resources and leadership to stop cartels, jail leadership and forfeit assets. The sheriffs' program is a failure. Cartels operate along trade corridors. So resources need to go where cartels do crime."

Dominguez said the money allowed he and his four deputies — who are split into two offices in the county's two towns 50 miles apart — to buy all new equipment.

"We're a very poor county," Dominguez said.

Dominguez said his county's almost non-existent crime statistics don't reflect the need for prevention.

Sheriffs formed the Texas Border Sheriff's Coalition in 2005 to lobby for fund-

ing. The federal government refused a request for \$100,000, so the state quickly pledged several million dollars in state money and federal funds administered by the state.

Republican Gov. Rick Perry faced three opponents in his 2006 re-election campaign and focused heavily on border security at a time when violence threatened to spill over from Mexico into the United States.

Donald Reay, the coalition's executive director, said the money has made the border a safer place.

"We are making communities safer," said Reay, a retired federal agent. "Your chance of prevention increases if you have an increased presence."

Reay said several million dollars in new grants are currently being issued according to "threat levels," determined by the sheriffs.

Steve McCraw, Perry's director of Homeland Security, said crime data doesn't give a complete picture of crime in a given border area.

"We're focused on the threat, based on vulnerability. When you talk about vulnerability you're only as strong as your weakest link," McCraw said. "You can't just look at a threat... tied to (crime) data, you also have to look at it from a vulnerability perspective."

McCraw said "border incident reports" of trespassing, vandalism and other non-violent crimes could be evidence of "organized smuggling efforts."

Sheriff Oscar Carrillo, whose Culberson County department reported four non-violent or drug crimes in 2006 and received \$321,416 in crime-fighting grants — or about \$80,000 per crime — said the funding puts him on even foot-

ing with larger counties.

"When this whole thing started we had no capabilities, we had no off road equipment, next to no ballistic protection," said Carrillo, whose county of about 2,700 people covers about 3,800 square miles of desert and a stretch of

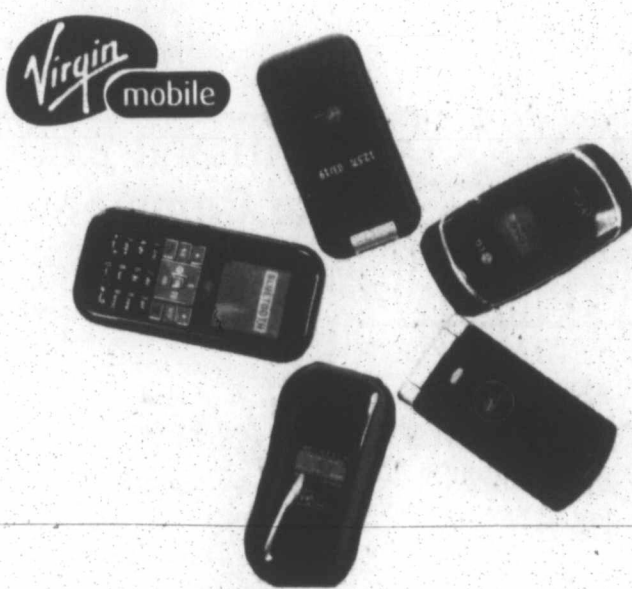
Interstate 10.

He and Dominguez said they won't apologize for applying for as much grant money as they can get.

"If it's out there, we are going to apply," Dominguez said.

## Texas jobless fund to face \$447M deficit

AUSTIN (AP) — Texas is projected to have a \$447 million shortfall in its unemployment compensation trust fund on Oct. 1 following the temporary suspension of the unemployment replenishment tax at the behest of Gov. Rick Perry, according to officials.

The unemployment fund, which pays jobless claims, was flush with \$90 million in savings nearly a year ago when Perry temporarily halted the replenishment tax, one part of the unemployment insurance tax.

The suspended tax was reinstated this month, but officials said it won't be enough to cover the shortfall between the \$414 million the state expects to be in the fund Oct. 1 and the \$861 million it's supposed to have.

Meanwhile, jobless claims have skyrocketed because people are having a hard time finding jobs.

Perry spokeswoman Allison Castle said the governor stands by his decision: "At the time, the fund had excessive balance and the right thing to do was to return that to the taxpayers," according to an online story Thursday for the Houston Chronicle and the San Antonio-Express News.

Ed Sills of the Texas AFL-CIO said of Perry's action: "I think what this goes to show is that the unemployment insurance system shouldn't be politicized."

By law, the fund must keep an amount equal to 1

percent of all taxable wages in Texas.

As a result of the deficit, the Texas Workforce Commission must consider raising the tax, review issuing bonds to meet the shortfall or wait to see if the state could use an interest-free federal loan, said commission Chairman Tom Pauken, a Perry appointee who took office after the tax was suspended by the commission last year.

Pauken said jobless claims will be paid, and that last year's suspension of the tax didn't cause the problem.

"We will have the money to pay for the claims," Pauken said. "Here would be my concern: You don't want to raise taxes substantially on employers at a time when it's really tough to keep the doors open and keep people employed."

If the October shortfall occurs as officials expect, bonds could be issued in 2010. The commission could raise the unemployment replenishment tax rate this year or wait until next year to levy a so-called deficit assessment on employers.

Last March, Perry directed the state to "bring that (replenishment) tax to a screeching halt for this year" when the fund stood at \$1.6 billion. By the end of 2008, the trust fund balance had fallen to \$1.3 billion, Pauken said.

There were 133,000 unemployment compensation claims — including

initial and continuing claims — as of Jan. 12, 2008. Not quite a year later, as of this Jan. 3, the total was 218,000, Pauken said.
