



## Rain forces closing of schools in Aransas County

ROCKPORT, Texas (AP) — Heavy rain in southeast Texas led to the closure of public schools in Aransas County.

A statement on the Aransas County Independent School District Web said schools were closed Friday "due to weather conditions."

The National Weather Service said parts of Aransas County received nearly a foot of rain.

Flash flood warnings were in effect early Friday for Aransas, Kleberg, San Patricio and Nueces counties.

Aransas County ISD serves a 486-square-mile area with enrollment of more than 3,300 students.

## Electrical fire knocks KXAS-TV off the air

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — An electrical fire forced evacuation of KXAS during a newscast and knocked the state's longest-serving TV station off the air.

Fort Worth Fire Department spokesman Tim Hardeman said Friday that no one was injured in the blaze reported at 10:09 p.m. Thursday.

Hardeman says dry chemicals were used to put out the fire in an electrical vault. Hardeman says the damage estimate was \$405,000.

KXAS vice president of programming Brian Hocker says the fire at the NBC network-owned station also forced its Telemundo affiliate, KXTX, off the air.

Hocker says about 50 people were in the building when the fire alarm sounded. The stations were back on the air by 2 a.m. Friday.

KXAS was the first television station in Texas, as WBAP, in 1948. The building is listed with the Texas Historical Commission.

get into the school before classes start in the fall.

## Alert from the Chamber

From time to time, promoters of certain products (maps, magnets, etc) contact local businesses, seeking advertisers for those products. Often, they claim to be representing the chamber.

Currently, at least two companies, are calling Pampa businesses selling advertising space on maps. These companies DO NOT represent the Chamber of Commerce. (The Chamber is consider-

ing the possibility of distributing a map later next year, but is NOT involved with these companies.)

Joe Weaver, Executive Director of the Pampa Chamber of Commerce reminds businesses that "advertising dollars spent with these companies DO NOT help support any local organizations, and we encourage support of local business."

## Fort Lewis soldier from Texas dies in Afghanistan

FORT LEWIS, Wash. (AP) — The Defense Department says a Fort Lewis soldier was killed Tuesday by a roadside bomb in Kandahar, Afghanistan.

Twenty-six-year-old Spc. Joseph M. Lewis of Terrell, Texas, was a member of the 5th Stryker brigade.

The News Tribune of Tacoma reports he was the 29th member of the brigade to die since it deployed in July.

Lewis previously served a 12-month tour in Korea and was on his first deployment to Afghanistan.

Lewis leaves behind a wife, Theresa, and an infant daughter, Abigail, according to the Terrell Tribune.

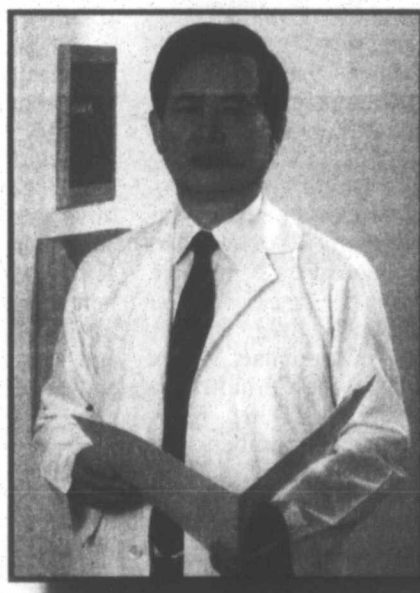

## Today in History

Today is Friday, November 20, the 324th day of 2009. There are 41 days left in the year.

Highlights in history on this date:

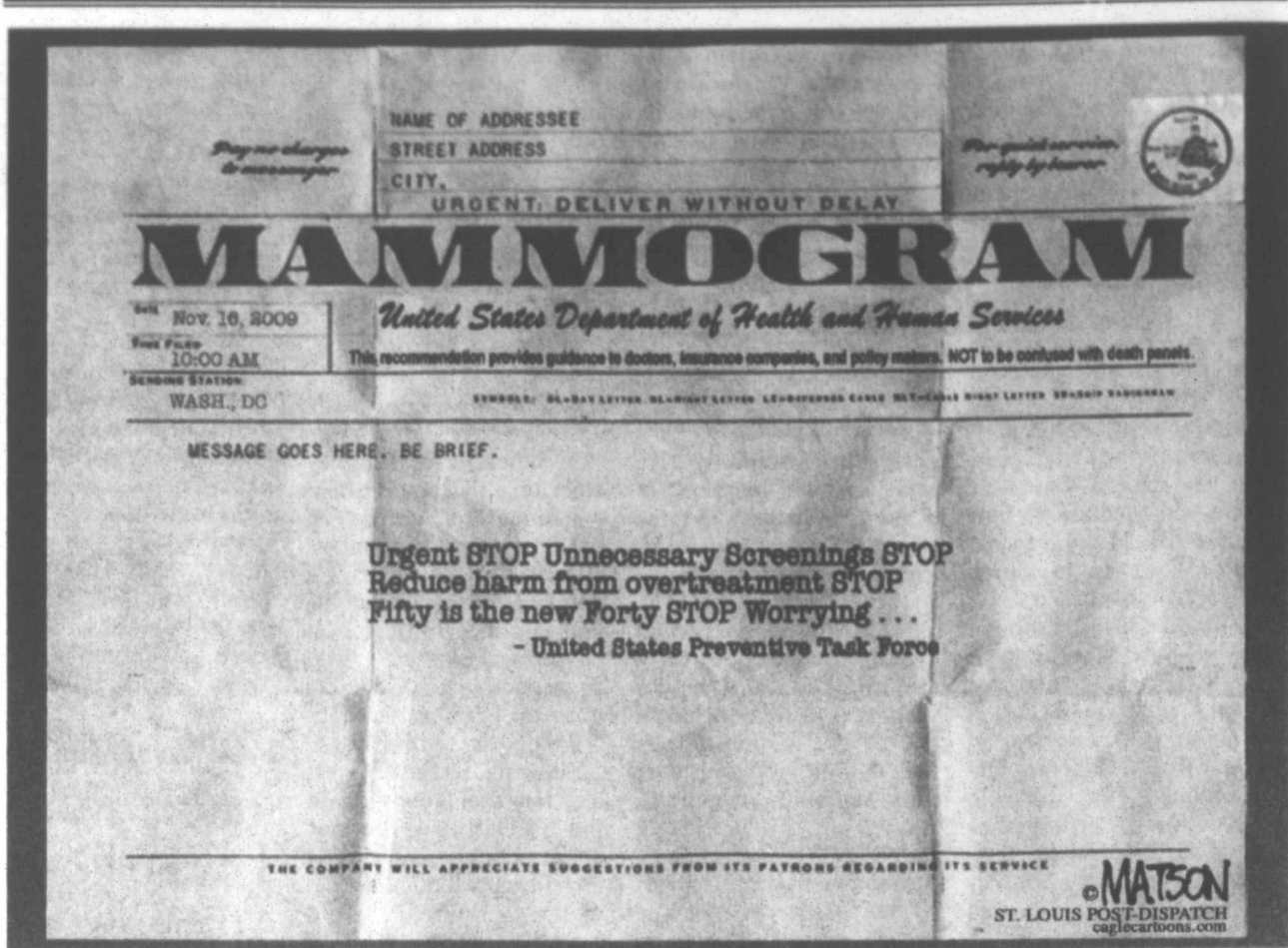
- 1616 - Cardinal Richelieu becomes France's minister of state for foreign affairs and war.
- 1637 - Peter Minuit and the first Swedish settlers to the New World set sail for Delaware.
- 1789 - New Jersey becomes the first U.S. state to ratify the Constitution's Bill of Rights.
- 1818 - Simon Bolivar formally declares Venezuela independent of Spain.
- 1873 - Rival cities of Buda and Pest are united to form the capital of Hungary.
- 1901 - Second Hay-Pauncefote Treaty provides for construction of the Panama Canal by the United States.
- 1910 - Revolution breaks out in Mexico, led by Francisco I. Madero.
- 1917 - The Ukrainian Republic is proclaimed.
- 1924 - Kurdish Revolt in Turkey is crushed.
- 1929 - Spanish artist Salvador Dali has his first one-man show.
- 1945 - International War Crimes Tribunal begins as 24 accused Nazi World War II criminals go on trial in Nuremberg, Germany.
- 1947 - England's Princess Elizabeth and Lieutenant Philip Mountbatten are married in London's Westminster Abbey.
- 1959 - Britain, Norway, Portugal, Switzerland, Austria, Denmark and Sweden meet to form European Free Trade Association.
- 1969 - The Nixon administration in United States announces a halt to residential use of the pesticide DDT as part of a total phase-out.
- 1975 - General Francisco Franco dies. Two days later Alfonso XIII's grandson, Juan Carlos, becomes King of Spain.
- 1977 - Egypt's President Anwar Sadat becomes the first Arab leader to speak before the Israeli Parliament, telling them Egypt seeks peace.
- 1980 - A special tribunal begins the two-month trial of "the Gang of Four," led by Jiang Qing, Chairman Mao Tse-tung's wife, for masterminding the 1966-1976 Cultural Revolution in China.
- 1984 - South Africa announces it will begin negotiations with Angola on the withdrawal of South African forces from Angola's south.
- 1990 - Saddam Hussein orders another 250,000 Iraqi troops into Kuwait.
- 1992 - A fire at Windsor Castle destroys one of Britain's biggest attractions, but a team of rescuers help save the castle's art treasures.
- 1993 - Macedonian jetliner carrying 116 people crashes into mountain, only one person survives.
- 1994 - Angola's government and rebels sign a peace accord.
- 1995 - Polish President Lech Walesa loses to Aleksander Kwasniewski in the presidential runoff; the Hubble Space telescope photographs the birth of the star, Eagle Nebula.
- 1996 - Flames roar through a high-rise in Hong Kong, killing 39 people and injuring at least 81.
- 1997 - Twenty-nine industrialized nations of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development agree to outlaw bribing of foreign officials.
- 1998 - Israeli occupation forces pull back from 9 percent of the Palestinian West Bank in the first of a three-tiered redeployment outlined in the Wye Memorandum, an interim agreement signed by Israel and the PLO in late October.
- 1999 - Anti-U.S. protests rock Greece as U.S. President Bill Clinton is due to arrive for a visit. He says the United States was wrong to back the military junta that took control in 1967.
- 2000 - Leaders of Japan's governing party reach a last-minute compromise to avert the removal of Prime Minister Yoshiro Mori in a no-confidence vote and ward off a protracted internal power struggle.
- 2001 - Colleagues identify the bodies of four international journalists forced from their cars by armed men and killed in an ambush on the road to the Afghan capital, Kabul.
- 2002 - Turkey's broadcasting authority authorizes state radio and television to air limited programs in the once-banned Kurdish language, a step toward meeting EU membership requirements.
- 2003 - Car bombs explode outside the British consulate and the offices of London-based bank HSBC in Istanbul, Turkey, killing 27 people and wounding nearly 450.
- 2004 - President Chandrika Kumaratunga declares that Sri Lanka will lift a 28-year moratorium on the death penalty after a High Court judge was gunned down at his home.
- 2005 - Widespread violence mars the second round of Egypt's parliamentary vote as clashes break out nationwide between Muslim Brotherhood supporters, ruling party supporters and police. At least one person is killed.
- 2006 - Armed men force their way into the offices of a Nigerian aid group in the southern oil hub of Port Harcourt, killing two people and wounding two others.

## Pampa Education Foundation supports teachers, students

Many changes have occurred in the Pampa Independent School District since I took office in May of 2005.

To anyone who considers running for the school board, know that it is not just the students who are continually learning.

As a school board member, we are required to attend meetings to learn about legislative updates, how to build pride in our schools or a selection of many other topics.

A couple of years ago, I chose to attend a session on starting an Education Foundation. Education foundations are designed to provide private support to public schools for items not budgeted by the district.

Many communities in Texas are turning to the concept of the education foundation as a source for student aid because school budgets simply cannot meet the increasing needs of students in today's schools.

The Pampa Education Foundation is led by President, Bob Ericson, Treasurer, Orbin Lesly, Secretary, Sherry McCavit, Vice President of Development, Glennette Goode, Vice President of Programs and Allocations, Dr. David Hampton, and Vice President of Community Relations, Dr. Jay Johnson. Committee members are Martha Campbell, Greg Brown, Doug Carmichael, Jack Reeve, Dona Cornutt, Kay Harvey, and Doug Ware. Ex Officio members are Barry Haenisch, Mark McVay and Dana Terry.

We want to strive to promote community awareness in education and

the foundation and ensure the perpetuity of the foundation with an endowment fund.

Our ten year goal is to reach an endowment of \$1 million which should provide vital assistance for our students for generations to come.

We received our start up funds from some generous local citizens, foundations, and memorials.

I am pleased to announce that the Pampa Education Foundation was able to gift almost \$10,000 to Pampa educators through the teacher grant application process in 2008.

Some items gifted were science laboratory equipment, electronic generators, graphic calculators, computers, software, disability awareness curriculum and equipment, field trip funds, guest speakers and workshops, and books and other resource materi-

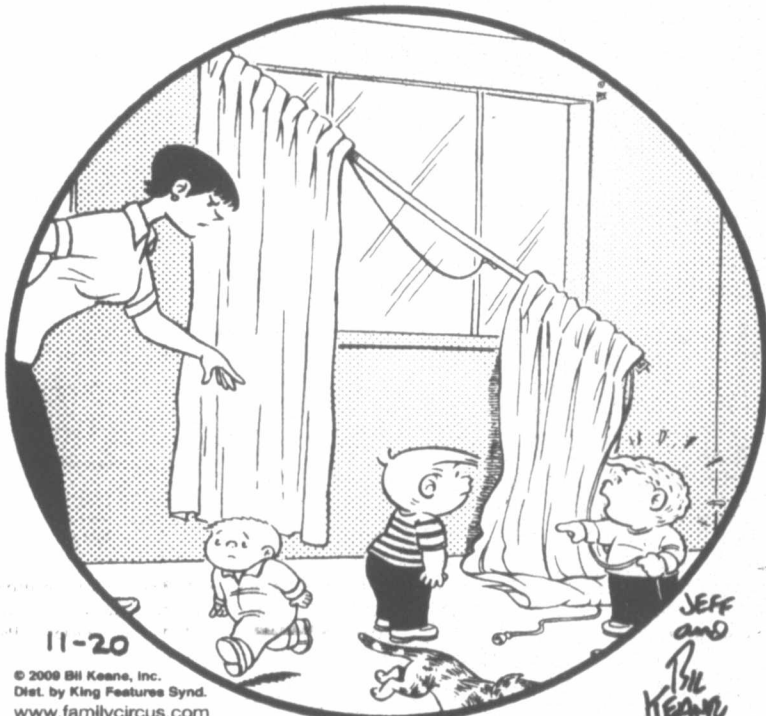

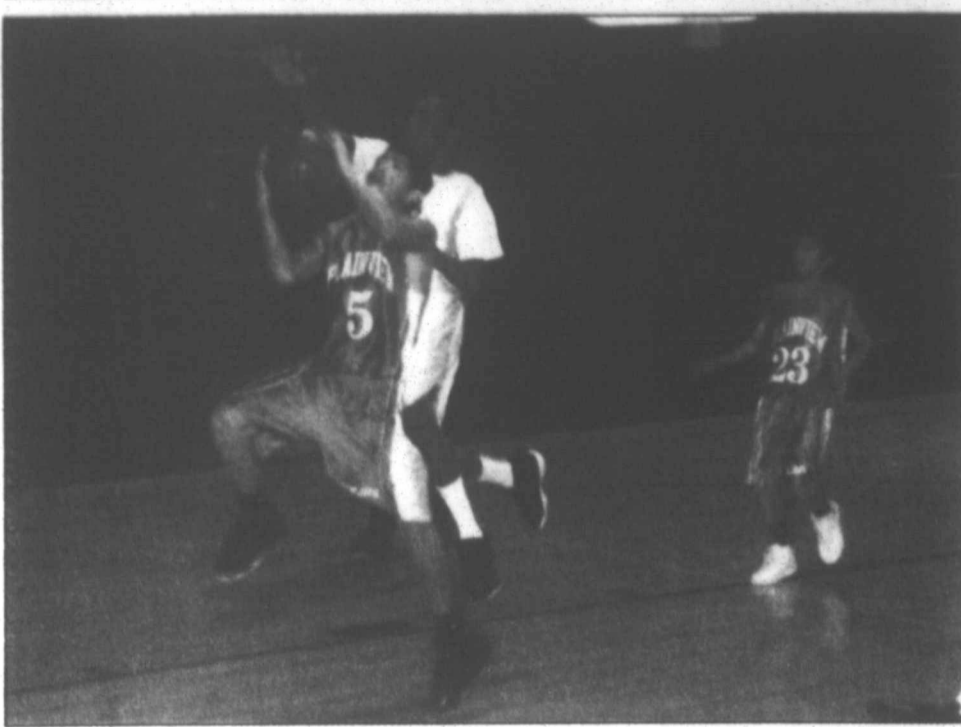
