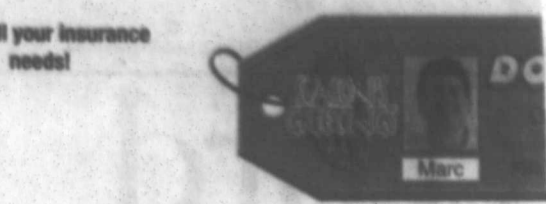

City set to close on aquatic park land

Despite the threat of winter's chill, Shane Stokes is working hard on an aquatic park for Pampa's summers when temperatures will approach the century mark.

Stokes, assistant city manager for the City of Pampa, told the Pampa Economic Development Corporation board of directors Thursday that the city's aquatic park is moving ahead, though there have been changes in the design of the park since it was first proposed.

"A lot of the changes have been made for practical purposes," Stokes said.

Located at Sumner and Randy Matson Avenue in Inez Carter Park, the Family Aquatic Center will feature a lap pool, beach, various water spray equipment, water slides, a winding 211-foot river, waterfall, pavilions and walking trail.

"Our water will come in from Randy Matson Avenue," Stokes said.

PRMC donates to "Ride for the Refugee"

Pampa Regional Medical Center has graciously donated three pulse-oximeters to the "Ride for the Refugee" program sponsored by the First Christian Churches (Disciples of Christ) of Pampa and Amarillo.

The pulse-oximeter units measure the level of oxygen in the blood. The units will be a valued asset to the medical clinic across the border in Matamoros, Mexico. Dr. Nancy Ramirez operates the clinic. She has the barest of essentials that can medically help the needy in Matamoros and surrounding area.

"PRMC received new pulse oximeters that are more technological-

ly advanced," said Mike Geisler, coordinator of Respiratory Services. He said, "There is nothing wrong with the donated units, so someone might as well get use out of them." Doctors without Borders in Kenya will receive the rest of the units.

Cindy Harper, a respiratory therapist with PRMC, is a member of the "Ride for the Refugee" program. She observed the conditions at the clinic in Matamoros.

Harper will be accompanying the units to South Texas in October of 2010 when "Ride for the Refugee" makes its sixth annual journey.

Pampa family receives gifts from secret Santa

A Memphis-area family is spreading holiday cheer to Texas transplant patient Reynaldo Wilson and his family.

The family, who wishes to remain anonymous, was inspired by a Colorado family's generosity in 2008. in their footsteps to provide Christmas gifts for patients and their families.

With the help of the National Foundation for Transplants, the Memphis family chose to assist Wilson's family.

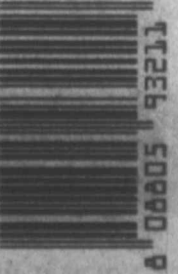

"We will run a water line all the way to Harvester."

He said a walking trail has been added to the park since the PEDC last reviewed the plans. There will be 123 parking spaces in the parking lot.

While the water facilities will be fenced in, there will be a playground area on the north end of the park with large playground equipment and a picnic pavilion.

Stokes said the city is supposed to close on Dec. 31, for the purchase of the additional land for the park.

One-time capacity of the water park will be between 550 and 600 people. Allowing for turnover, Stokes said he expects to serve some 1,000 to 1,500 people a day at the water

park. Both the park pool and the lap pool will be heated.

"They'll be two separate bodies of water," he said. "They will be drained in the winter."

Stokes said that originally the city had considered heating the pools during the winter, but it was too expensive.

He said the playground area of the water park would have a tot slide and bubblers for smaller swimmers. There's a shaded deck area around the tot area for parents.

While the number of trees in the park is still under discussion, Stokes said they're planning on increasing the budget for trees.

"I can guarantee you," he told the board, "there will

be a lot more trees than there are now."

Presently, the park is little more than bare ground.

Stokes said that he is also putting together an online advisory committee with regard to the water park.

"That has worked out very well," he said.

Stokes said he has gotten some valuable feedback from the committee.

He said the projects admission price to the water park would be five to seven dollars.

Although the hours of operation haven't been set, Stokes said they will problems be from about 8 or 9 a.m. to 9 or 10 p.m. Part of that time may be set aside for swim lessons or private parties.

his right kidney. Wilson's liver condition is so severe that he cannot undergo treatment for the cancer until his liver is treated. Doctors say he needs to be evaluated for a liver transplant as soon as possible.

A liver transplant costs more than \$500,000. When Wilson, 34, began receiving Social Security disability, Medicaid canceled his coverage, stating his disability income was too high to qualify for Medicaid. Wilson and his wife have four children, ranging in age from 2 to 14 years old. His declining health prevents him from working, and the disability income is barely enough for his family to make ends meet.

Without coverage, Wilson cannot afford the

evaluation to determine if a transplant is an option, leaving his family feeling hopeless. Because these medical expenses are so extensive, Wilson and his wife, Griselda, did not have the means to provide Christmas gifts for their children.

"On behalf of Rey and our entire family, I just want to thank this family for their support," said Griselda. "This has been such a rough year, and it means so much to us that people want to help. When I asked Rey what he would like for Christmas, he said, 'I just want to spend the remaining time I have happy—and have a happy ending.'"

To overcome their financial challenges, the Wilson family turned to the

National Foundation for Transplants for assistance. NFT is a nonprofit organization that helps patients raise funds to pay for transplant-related expenses.

"We are so touched by this family's generosity," said Jackie Hancock, NFT president. "It is especially inspiring that one family's thoughtfulness has snowballed into several families helping transplant patients during the holiday season. What a wonderful example of kindness and compassion."

Wrap-up bill clears Senate hurdle

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate headed for a Saturday morning vote on a package that funds the Pentagon and keeps other key programs, including benefits for the unemployed and highway spending, from expiring. It's the third straight weekend on the job as the Senate struggles to wrap up its work for the year.

The defense bill cleared a crucial hurdle early Friday with a vote to end a Republican effort to prolong debate. Still remaining on the agenda are health care and legislation to raise the federal debt limit so the Treasury can continue to borrow.

Anchored by a \$626 billion Pentagon funding bill, the measure also carries short-term extensions of unemployment benefits, highway and transit funding, key pieces of the anti-terrorism Patriot Act and a measure to save doctors from shouldering a 21 percent cut in Medicare payments.

The timing of the 63-33

post-midnight tally — which blocked GOP stalling tactics and forced a final vote to clear the bill for Obama no later than Saturday — was governed more by the brawl over health care than significant opposition to the defense measure or its additional baggage.

For a time, Republicans are using every avenue available to them to try to delay or kill the health care legislation, including stretching out debate on the defense measure. The bill passed the House Wednesday by an overwhelming 395-34 vote. A key Republican, Thad Cochran of Mississippi,

was expected to vote to advance the measure but succumbed to pressure from GOP leaders to try to sustain the filibuster. That forced Democrats to get all 60 of their members, including anti-war Sen. Russ Feingold, D-Wis., to defeat the filibuster and try to keep the Senate on track to pass the health care bill by Christmas.

After Feingold fell in line and the vote was assured, three Republicans joined the Democrats to end debate — Kay Bailey Hutchison of Texas and Olympia Snowe and Susan Collins, both of Maine.

1992 - Taiwan holds its first full legislative elections after retiring hundreds of lawmakers who were elected in China in 1949 and stayed in office.

1994 - Russian helicopters and airplanes bomb Grozny, capital of the breakaway Chechnya region.

1995 - The first Russian soldiers arrive in Bosnia for a NATO-led peacekeeping mission.

1996 - Former Indian Prime Minister Narasimha Rao steps down from his last government post after corruption charges.

1998 - As U.S. forces bomb Iraq, the U.S. House of Representatives impeaches President Bill Clinton for obstructing justice and lying under oath about his affair with Monica Lewinsky.

1999 - Survivors wander through streets covered with rocks and mud as the death toll from massive mudslides and flooding in Venezuela surpasses 5,000.

2001 - Jobless Argentines unleash their anger over a deep economic tailspin in a burst of looting and violence that targets supermarkets and shops on the fringes of Buenos Aires.

2002 - U.S. Secretary of State Colin Powell says Iraq is in "material breach" of U.N. Security Council resolutions for alleged omissions in a declaration of its weapons programs.

2003 - Libya agrees to abandon its programs pursuing internationally banned weapons, including chemical, biological and nuclear weapons as well as long-range missiles. It agrees to respect the Nuclear Nonproliferation Treaty.

2004 - Car bombs rock Iraq's two holiest Shiite cities, killing at least 62 people and wounding more than 120, while in downtown Baghdad dozens of gunmen carry out a brazen ambush, pulling out three election officials and executing them on the pavement in the middle of morning traffic.

2005 - Uganda's main opposition leader pleads not guilty to treason charges in a trial supporters claim is being staged to keep him out of 2006 presidential elections.

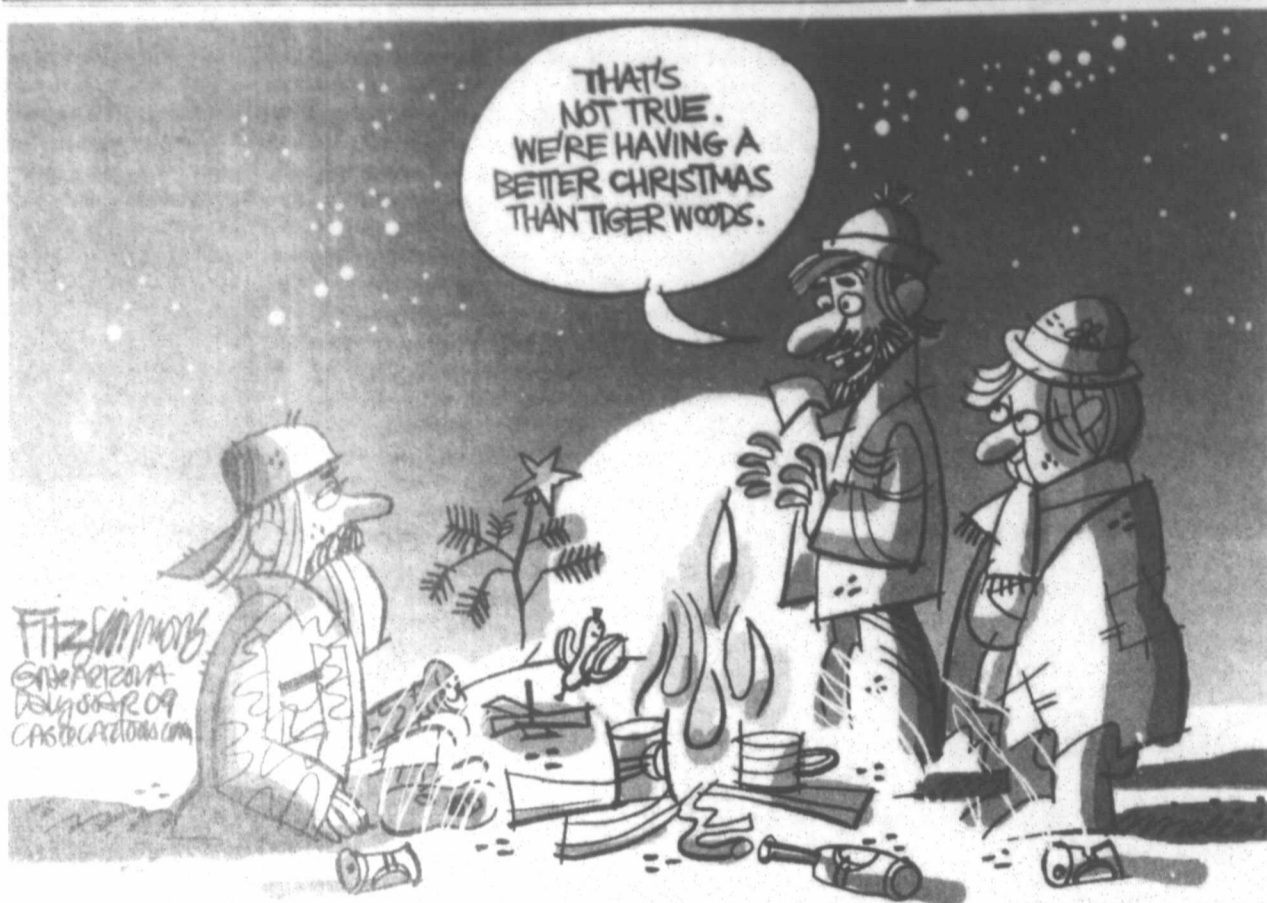
2006 - A Libyan court convicts five Bulgarian nurses and a Palestinian doctor and condemns them to death for infecting 400 children with HIV. Nearly seven months later, they are allowed to return to Bulgaria.

2007 - Former Hyundai CEO Lee Myung-bak claims victory Wednesday in South Korea's presidential election, as voters overlook fraud allegations in hopes he will revive the economy.

2008 - The Pentagon formally approves war crimes charges against Abd al-Rahim al-Nashiri, a Guantanamo detainee accused of masterminding the 2000 bombing of the USS Cole.



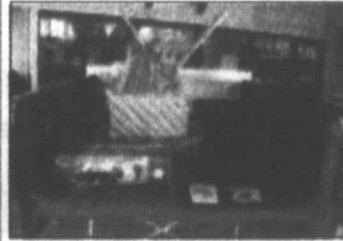

Pirates shoot down the Warriors

 The Lefors Pirates, for the third consecutive game, played a six-man football school in basketball. For the third straight time, the Pirates were victorious defeating the Miami Warriors 52-40 Friday in Miami.

Head Coach Joey Czubinski aka "Coach Ski" said he expected a physical game with Miami.

"It was in their gym before Christmas," Coach Ski said. "A little grudge match."

Estacado Lady Matadors rip Lady Harvesters

The Pampa Lady Harvesters scored a combined total of only four points in the second and fourth quarters and lost their third straight game 55-42 to the Lubbock Estacado Lady Matadors. The game was played Friday at the McNeely Fieldhouse.

Head Coach Gene Valentine said their lack of scoring in the second and fourth quarter and having less free throw attempts than Estacado cost them the game.

"We weren't taking bad shots, we just couldn't get them to go in," Valentine said. "We got as good of shots as they did we just didn't get them to go in. They shot 31 free throws and we shot 16. That was probably most frustrating."

The first quarter was very competitive. The largest lead for the Lady Matadors was four at 14-10. Pampa's largest lead was four at 20-16 which was the score at the end of the first quarter. The Lady Harvesters fortunes would change in the second quarter.

Pampa missed 13 shots and three free throws. Cori Cook scored the Lady Harvesters only point of the quarter making a free throw with 1:38 left in the second ending a scoring drought that lasted six and a half minutes. During that time the Matadors went on a 10-0 run to take a 26-20 lead. Estacado led 31-21 at halftime.

At the beginning of the third quarter, the Lady Matadors maintained their advantage not allowing Pampa to get closer than nine. The Lady Harvesters would get within seven but turnovers and missed shots kept them from getting closer. Estacado led 47-39 at the end of the third.

In the final quarter, the closest the Lady Harvesters would get was seven. Lubbock Estacado outscored Pampa 8-3. Ashlee Holland made a two-point field goal and Taryn Eubank made a free throw to score Pampa's only points in the fourth. Eubank led the team in scoring with 12 points, Shelbie Watson had seven, and Kirsten Kuhn and Holland each had six.

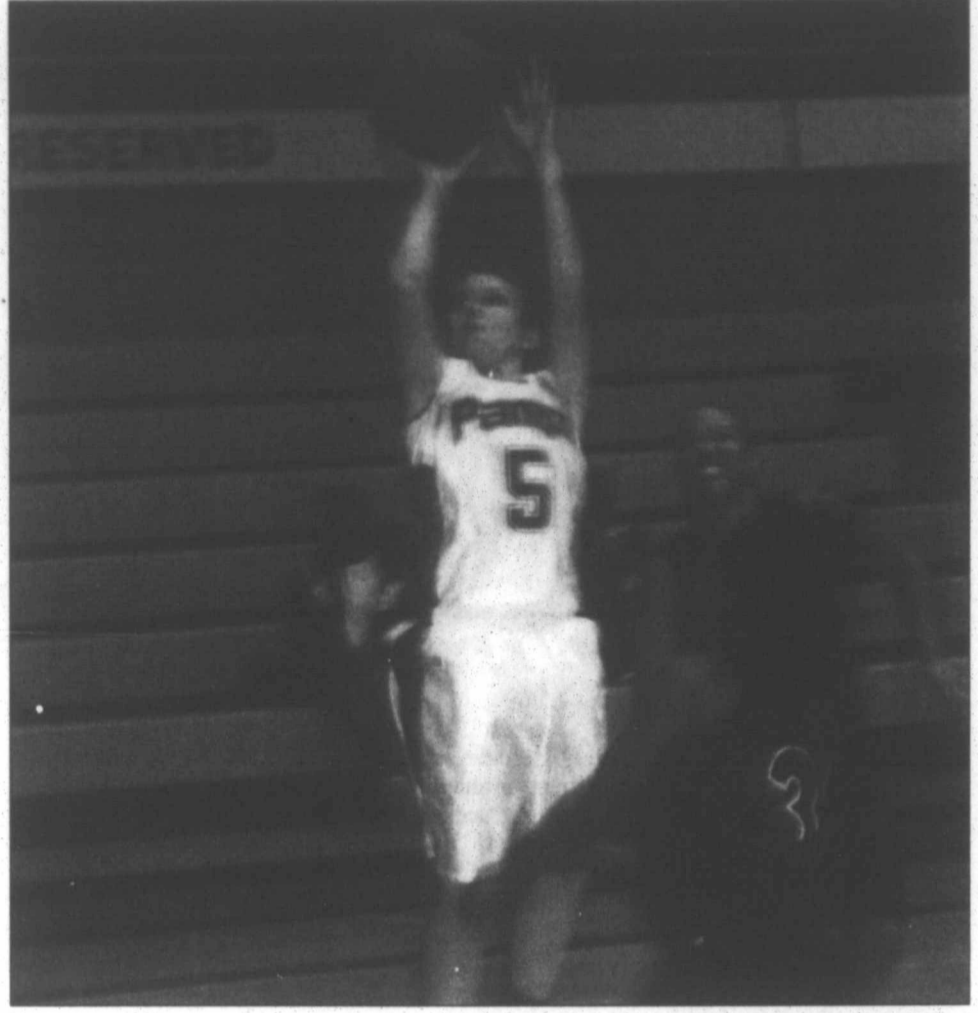
The Lady Harvesters

(5-10, 0-2) don't play until the Caprock Tournament in Lubbock December 28-30 to face their final non-district opponents of the season. Valentine said he was pleased with how the first half of the season went but thought the team could have won a couple more games.

"I'm pleased, our record is a little bit better," Valentine said. "I could think of four more wins we could have on top of that. But we still have a chance to go to the Caprock Tournament and play three non-district teams. We're sitting at 5-10, and we could come out of that tournament with 8 wins. I said before the season we could be close to .500 after non-district."

The junior varsity (7-9, 0-2) lost to Lubbock Estacado 49-47. Coach Forrest Harding said his team blew the game.

"We didn't play very good," Harding said. "I didn't coach good on some things. It's nothing that we can't fix. Once again we've got the lead in the last minute we just got to capitalize on it."

UW walk-ons excited about bowl

LARAMIE, Wyo. (AP) — They practice every day like everyone else.

They make tackles, run and catch the ball and sprint up and down the field like the other guys.

But usually they receive a lot more punishment than they dole out.

And their reward?

They get to do it all over again the next week.

That's life as a walk-on football player at the University of Wyoming and for most walk-ons at the college level.

Some end up earning a scholarship and playing time over their careers, while some never do.

Others give it a chance for a while, but eventually find more productive and less painful things to do during their college experience.

Two former Laramie County football student-athletes have endured the ups and downs of being freshmen walk-ons this season.

For 2008 Cheyenne Central graduate Nick Owen, he couldn't be happier with his decision.

Owen went to UW last year but just took classes. But something was missing.

"It sounds like a cliché, but I just missed the crap out of football," he said.

He called UW assistant coach Matt Rahl and asked if he could walk on. Two days before the start of fall camp in August, Owen learned he was on the team.

"To be a walk-on. I think about it all the time, and I just smile," he said. "It's a privilege and an honor to be on the team. I'm just excited to be playing football."

But playing football means going against the starting offensive unit during practice, and at 6-foot-1, 210 pounds, he is a grossly undersized defensive lineman.

That means he takes a pretty good beating.

When interviewed for this story Monday, Owen had a decent-sized cut on his right leg that had just stopped bleeding.

"You've got to put in to get stuff out," he said. "I keep telling myself that. Maybe I'll earn a scholar-

ship, maybe I won't. The main thing is I'm playing football, and that's what I want to do."

Owen was a good player at Central, but he wasn't a standout.

Burns' Duell Petsch was. He was a three-time Class 2A all-state selection and helped Burns win the 2008 state title. He also was a track standout.

Petsch is a freshman running back, and most of his days are spent on the scout team, emulating key players from the opposing team.

As UW prepares for Saturday's New Mexico Bowl against Fresno State, Petsch is Bulldogs speedy junior receiver Devon Wylie.

"I don't really pay attention to who I am supposed to mimic out there, I just try to do the best I can," Petsch said. "Most of the time none of us are really sure who we are supposed to be."

"Practice is tough, and it's hard to get looked at sometimes by the coaches. But it's definitely fun. It's good to see the work pay

off when we win. When we win, it seems like we (as walk-ons) get some satisfaction from that too."

UW left Wednesday for Albuquerque. There will be one practice and plenty of meetings before Saturday's game. But for the walk-ons, much of their work is done. Now they can enjoy some of the fruits of their labor.

"The name 'bowl' just sounds glamorous. It's so exciting to be a part of it," Owen said.

"We're all excited to go because we haven't been able to travel, and we all got to go to this bowl game," Petsch added. "We feel rewarded."

Cowboys set to take on undefeated New Orleans

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — As far as Drew Brees can tell, the season of giving in New Orleans started about 14 weeks ago.

Brees and the Saints have given this football-mad city more tastes of victory than it has ever known in a single season. The fans have responded in their own way when the players drive home from games, windows down, to share in the excitement.

"I got some pralines thrown in (the car) the other day, T shirts, CDs," Brees began. "It's like Christmas. It is Christmas. ... I think it's great how excited people are. Everybody wants to be a part of this and everybody deserves to be a part of this, because so many fans have been waiting for this for a long time."

New Orleans has long been associated with Super Bowls, but not the Saints, who are one of five teams never to appear in the NFL's marquee game.

The Dallas Cowboys, on the other hand, solidified their reputation as America's Team by winning two Super Bowls in New Orleans, the second of those in the Louisiana Superdome, where they'll meet the 13-0 Saints on Saturday night in a game carrying postseason implications for both teams.

The urgency is greater for the Cowboys (8-5), who trail Philadelphia in the NFC East and could

miss the playoffs if they don't finish strong.

"We need this game," Cowboys quarterback Tony Romo said. "This is an important game for us and our season, where we are in the standings, so we're going to come out and hopefully play our best football game of the year."

"I know that guys are working their butt off and putting in the time," Romo said. "The preparation is there. We'll see what kind of team we've got."

New Orleans has clinched a first-round playoff bye, but has yet to wrap up what could be the franchise's first No. 1 overall seed in the NFC.

Then there's the matter of finishing the regular season undefeated, which may not count for much toward the ultimate goal of a championship (as the New England Patriots found out two seasons ago), but still seems important to the Saints.

"You don't have many opportunities like this, do you?" Brees said. "It's something to consider."

The Saints seemed all but invincible when they demolished New England on Monday Night Football 38-17 a few weeks ago. Lately, however, they've looked more vulnerable, nearly losing the chance to be the first NFC team to go 16-0 two weeks ago when they trailed late at Washington. New Orleans

stormed back to win in overtime after the Redskins missed a field goal that could have iced the game.

Last weekend, the Saints held off the struggling Atlanta Falcons 26-23. Again, the result begged the question of whether New Orleans, which won nine of its first 11 games by double digits, is wearing down.

Injuries have hurt the defense, which has dropped to 21st in the NFL in yards allowed per game (347.6). Starting cornerbacks Jabari Greer (sports hernia) and Tracy Porter (right knee sprain) both have been out for about a month. Starting linebacker Scott Fujita also has missed the past two games with an infection in his knee.

If defensive coordinator Gregg Williams is worried, he's not showing it.

"We've played well enough to win and the big thing is that we still do a good job of attacking the ball," Williams said. "You can measure a lot of things, but you can't really measure a person's will. Our guys' strength and resolve at the end of ball games have been really good. We've let a couple of big plays hit us here the last couple weeks. ... We have to minimize those shots down the field."

Dallas has to figure out how to play better in December.

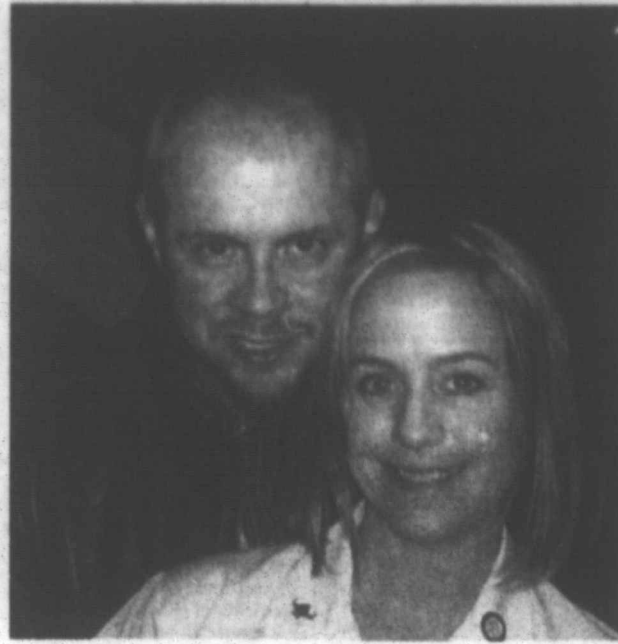
Those attending enjoyed a Dutch Treat Luncheon, ordering individually from the cafe menu. Holiday snacks of cookies and
