Hampton Inn team aces the test

January has been a busy month for Pampa native Mike Ward.

Ward opened Hampton Inn and celebrated the arrival of a new grandson this month, just one day after his 60th birthday.

"We had to meet certain training criteria," Ward said of the new hotel.

He explained that if the hotel and its staff didn't pass those criteria, the hotel wouldn't open.

"They came in and tested us," he said. "We passed with flying colors"

The passing grade for the front desk staff and housekeeping staff was 80 on a scale of 100.

"Everybody made in the 90s," Ward said. "The person with Hilton (the parent company) told me it was unheard of for a whole team to pass like that."

Another Hilton executive came in a few days later and walked the property to make sure all the rooms were in order.

"We were about 85 percent complete," Ward said. "We had a couple of rooms that weren't not quite ready."

U Texas planning 5 percent budget cut

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — The University of Texas is putting together a proposal for a 5 percent cut that could trim about \$29 million from the state-funded portion of its budget.

Gov. Rick Perry, Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst and House Speaker Joe Straus last week told state agencies, including higher education institutions, to submit budget-reduction plans

by Feb. 15. "It's a sizable amount of money," UT President William Powers Jr. said Monday during a meeting of the Faculty Council. "This is not good news."

A public forum was scheduled Tuesday in Austin to discuss a proposed tuition increase of nearly 4 percent in each of the next two school years. "We understand the economic climate. The system has been a leader in looking at organizational efficiencies. So we're going to look at this and work diligently with our campuses on how we navigate this course right now," said UT System spokesman Anthony de Bruyn.

Sgts. Kimberly Munley and Mark Todd will watch President Barack Obama's address with Michelle Obama in a gallery overlooking the House floor. On Nov. 5, the officers opened fire on Army Maj. Nidal Malik Hasan, who is accused of

killing 13 people in the worst mass murder on a U.S. military base. Munley was wounded in the incident.

Storm watch

The National Weather Service has issued a winter storm watch from late Wednesday night through late Thursday night for all of the Texas and Oklahoma panhandles.

The NWS states that a wintry mix of precipitation could begin as early as Wednesday night. The precipitation is expected to change over to all snow Thursday morning into Thursday afternoon.

The main impact of the storm is expected to be moderate to heavy snow accumulations. Snow accumulations of seven to 11 inches are possible for our area. Snow, sleet, or ice accumulations could affect travel.

In addition to the precipitation, winds of 20 to 25 mph are possible for Thursday. This could result in areas of blowing snow, reducing visibility. For locations that have freezing rain and ice on Wednesday night, the conditions could lead to power outages.

Residents are advised to monitor the latest forecasts and be aware of road conditions.

Pampa Emergency Management Coordinator Fred Courtney said he's monitoring the path of the storm. He's got conference calls today and tomorrow with the National Weather Service. Depending upon the path the winter storm takes, he may be on the phone **STORM** cont. on page 3

Ed Turner, superintendent of the city's street and parks department, said they're planning on spending Wednesday preparing a forecast snow.

Turner said of the equipment is already prepared along with a stockpile of dry sand.

Courtney said that the Pampa Red Cross office may be opened as a warming station. If the weather gets really bad, he said, emergency shelters could

be opened at First Baptist Church or at M.K. Brown Auditorium.

Forecasts right now, Turner said, call for snow to about midnight Wednesday and last through Thursday. The storm system is supposed to blow out of the area Friday.

priations, federal research grants, tuition, gifts and other items, rose 2.8 percent to \$2.1 billion for the fiscal year that began Sept. 1.

But after covering higher health insurance charges, increased student financial aid and other costs, UT had just \$6.7 million more than the previous fiscal year for academic purposes, the Austin American-Statesman reported Tuesday.

Powers has led an effort to free up millions of dollars for retaining and

recruiting top faculty members. Some staff members have been dismissed, and more layoffs could be in the works. About 36 percent of faculty members got raises this year.

Power said it was not clear whether the UT System's 15 campuses might each have to trim 5 percent of the portion of their budgets funded by general state revenue or whether strategic reductions were possible.

"I wish I had more definitive information," he said.

The junior varsity will compete in a tournament at Borger Friday and Saturday. May said the team will start working on strategy.

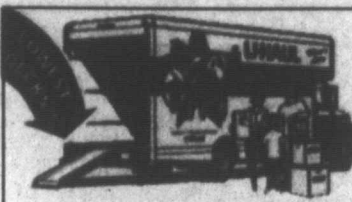
"We're really working on using the entire field to our advantage," May said. "Transitioning a lot better from attack to defense."

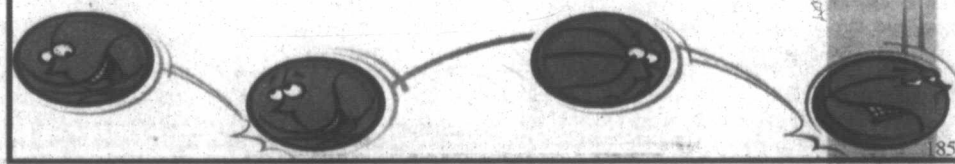
