One year ago: In the first prime-time speech of
his term, President Barack Obama appeared before his term, President Barack Obama appeared before then broadened quickly to include a stable credit system, better schools, health care reform, reliable domestic sources of energy and an end to the war in Iraq. Earlier in the day, Obama held an 80-minute
private talk with Japanese Prime Minister Taro Aso.

## Analysis: Brown revives GOP moderates' pivot role

\T ${ }_{\text {Republican Sen }}^{\text {ASHINGTON }}$ (AP) - Massachusetts from a compromise measure unveiled earlier this month Republican Sen. Scott Brown may have crushed Democrats' spirits in winning a special election last month, but he's also helped revive them by providing critical momentum to advance a bipartisan jobs bilt that had become entangled in familiar partisan
wrangling. Brangling.
Brown's win means that Democrats don't possess a ictory resembles the majority. The new formula for England Republican moderates, as well as old-timers who occasionally buck their leadership.

For Brown, joining a GOP filibuster over a parliamentary procedural squabble clearly wasn't the best vote for a new senator from an overwhelmingly Democratic state politics. "I came to Washington to be an independent voice, to "I came to Washington ore an independent voice, to "elp create jobs for Massachusetts families," said Brown, whose election last month gave Republicans the 41 st vote perfect ... but I yoted for it because it contains measures hat will help put people back to work.
