### City sprays for pesky mosquitoes

PAMPA — Employees with the city of Pampa will be spraying residential areas for mosquitos as needed, it was announced Friday.

"This is just a reminder," Ed Turner with the city's Parks and Streets department said in a Friday release. "If you do not want your property sprayed, please call 669-5760, extension 3.

The chemical Mosquito Mist 1 is dispersed through an ultra low volume sprayer. The product Razor Pro is being applied to kill grass and weeds on streets.

"You are encouraged to keep your grass cut and empty any containers of water around your property," Turner wrote.

He added that stagnant water tends to collect in old tires, children's wading and swimming pools, and, generally, any container that will hold water.

Plus, you add that to the fact that high grass and weed areas are where mosquitoes tend to breed, and you have some real danger areas — speaking in terms of itching and scratching.

Staying vigilant is the best way to stay safe, officials agree.

## Pampa ISD board votes to terminate architectural contract

PAMPA — The Pampa ISD school board this week fired the architectural firm contracted to redesign a former Albertsons into the district's new office building.

In February, the the board approved its contract with architectural firm Dekker, Perich, and Sabatini, of Amarillo, for the redesign.

Initially, it was said the firm expects designs to be completed in six weeks with a remodel completed in a year.

But on Wednesday at a 5:30 p.m. special meeting, the school board — after a lengthy, 45-minute discussion — determined that the firm had not held up its end of the contract and unanimously voted to terminate it.

"The action that came out of that meeting was our board authorized me to terminate our contract with the architect — just for reasons of not being able to produce a product at the appropriate level of funding," said PISD Superintendent Dr. David Young.

The appropriate level of budget funding, the superintendent said, would have been \$3 million and the district was getting estimates in the neighborhood of \$5.8 or \$5.9 million.

"Without suggestions or options to reduce the cost, the board decided without suggestions or options to reduce the cost the board decided to go in a different direction," Dr. Young said. "This was after numerous meetings between district administrators and the architecture firm to make sure we were on schedule and budget."

Either party can terminate the contract with seven days written notice, an option the board chose to exercise since both parties were not in the same place with the project.

Dr. Young said early Friday he intended to hand-delivered the notice to the firm that same day. The contract will, therefore, officially be terminated by next Friday.

At this point, the board can go to the next step with the project, whatever that might be, he said.

## Bill O'Reilly: Obama's going down

In addition, nearly half of American households are now receiving government benefits, but if you want to control entitlements, you are anti-poor. Almost 50 million folks are receiving food stamps, and a record amount of workers are filing for disability payments.

The federal colossus in Washington is reaching into every area of American life even as Obama has increased the debt by more than \$5 trillion in less than four years. This is liberal nirvana: a big-spending central government dispensing "social justice" and calling many shots in the free marketplace. Soon the feds will con-

rol the health care industry.

Of course, the results of the left-wing blitz have been disastrous. The economy is moribund, with banks refusing to lend capital for expansion because they fear business failure. Our currency is tottering because the USA has to borrow billions of dollars every day in order to service debt. And employers are loath to hire because they don't know how Obamacare will affect their bottom line.

You would think the left would take a look at the chaos in Europe and slow down a bit. Not happening. If you watched the Democratic convention coverage, you heard some incredible stuff. Sandra Fluke and her crew not only want you to pay for female birth control; they also want you to pay for "transgender medical needs." That means if Harry meets Sally, and they want to switch genders through expensive surgical procedures, the American taxpayer gets the bill. And if you oppose that, you are

a bigot.

I believe most Americans are uneasy with the liberal direction even if they are not fully convinced it is at stage three. But it is. The USA is on the verge of becoming a combination of Greece and Sweden, where almost anything goes and fiscal responsibility is a joke. If the president wins reelection, this country will continue to undergo a radical social and economic upheaval.

But if Obama loses, the liberal movement in America will be dealt a crushing blow. That's what's at stake on November 6th.

## Moving speech is a moving target

(An editorial from the New Bern Sun Journal.)

President Obama has opponents who have legitimate, serious concerns about real issues and the direction in which his administration is taking our nation.

He also has antagonists who just don't like him personally and pin dark motives on everything he does or doesn't do. Those folks quickly lose sight of the issues in a fog of birth certificates, patriotic decorum and, now, football stadiums.

In case you haven't heard, the president's Democratic nomination acceptance speech Thursday in Charlotte was moved from Bank of America Stadium, with outdoor seating for about 80,000, to Time Warner Cable Arena, with seating for about 20,000.

The Democrats publicly had cited the potential for dangerous thunderstorms, something we have seen a lot of in North Carolina in the past few weeks.

The Republicans -- and Obama's opportunistic antagonists -- see a different kind of cloud in the making. They believe the Democrats were having real problems drawing the size of crowd that would look good on TV, so they cut their losses and moved the whole shebang to a venue they are sure to fill.

A "speech downgrade" is the way the Republican National Committee described it, according to the Politico website.

To be fair, the critics make a few good points in assessing the situation. The weather forecast for Thursday night wasn't much different than for any other late-summer evening in North Carolina. The Democrats should have known that weather could be a huge factor.

And the forecast would not prevent other events -- a Panthers NFL game, for example -- from proceeding.

While some of the haranguing is acceptable, on Tuesday and Wednesday it began to cross over into the lunatic fringe that the rock group Red Rider once sang about.

Conservatives sensed a weakness and made a rhetorical stab at the jugular -- referencing the "empty chairs" that actor Clint Eastwood made famous or pointing to a divine intervention that surely answered the prayers of the president's panicky handlers.

Some of that would be mildly entertaining if what passes for political discourse these days ever could find its way past such histrionics. Sadly, it doesn't. Day after day, the discussion focuses on a verbal gaff, an embarrassing moment, a spouse's wardrobe or some other here-today-gone-tomorrow trivial pursuit.

Most people cared less about the size of the crowd Thursday than the substance of the speech. Elections are determined by who goes to the polls, not who passes through the turnstiles.

This whole exchange has the feel of an athletic rivalry -- with the respective fan bases arguing over who has the most loyal supporters and therefore has reached a higher level of righteousness.

Such gamesmanship diminishes the gravity of the decision facing Americans. It makes people turn away from politics and political conventions.

If loudmouths and boors insist on using traditional and social media to turn politics into some sort of sport, why shouldn't Americans turn the TV over to Thursday Night Football and watch the real pros at work?

## Phyllis Schlafly: Questions about pro-amnesty immigration

After a genuinely grassroots Republican platform committee produced a principled document on a plethora of issues, including immigration, some people who were not part of the process are promoting pro-amnesty proposals. Writing this week in The Wall Street Journal, Jon Huntsman suggested that President Obama's executive order offering work permits to 1.6 million illegal immigrants doesn't go far enough.

The facts do not support the pie-in-the-sky views of those, such as Jon Huntsman, who say they want to increase immigration because it will boost our sagging economy. A new study by the Center for Immigration Studies reports that the economic progress made by all immigrants -- legal, illegal and their U.S.-born children under age 18 -- lags far behind native-born Americans and nearly half remain below the poverty line.

The 2010-2011 census data found that 43 percent of immigrants who have been in the United States at least 20 years are receiving welfare benefits. That figure is nearly twice as

high as welfare given to native-born Americans.

Immigrant children account for 1 in 5 public school students, and 1 in 4 public school students speaks a language other than English at home. The expensive boondoggle called bilingual education keeps children speaking their native language year after year, instead of using the successful early 20th-century immersion system of teaching the kids only in English, who then went home and taught English to their parents.

Immigrant households account for half of all overcrowded households. Only 2 percent of native Americans live in overcrowded households, compared to 13 percent of immigrant households.

Only seven percent of adult native Americans have not finished high school, but that's true of 28 percent of adult immigrants. That is a major reason for their low economic status and prospects.

One of the great myths about immigrants is that they are doing jobs that Americans will not do. The truth is that native Americans are the majority of workers in all the jobs where immigrants are reputed to be especially needed, such as janitors, maids, construction laborers, butchers and meat processors.

Legal and illegal immigration over the last 10 years has caused 80 percent of our total

population growth, but it is a big myth that this has increased our economic wealth. Even after immigrants have been in the United States for 20 years, they are still well behind native Americans in economic well-being.

Highly paid lobbyists are continually pressuring Congress to expand immigration for foreigners to fill science and engineering jobs, using a variety of visas, especially H-1Bs. Their propaganda often includes labeling these young foreigners "the best and the brightest."

The notion that foreigners are better and brighter than Americans is nonsense. And we have enough unemployed and underemployed engineers to fill vacancies, if there are any.

The big businesses like to employ foreigners because they can be paid less than Americans and are given fewer benefits. Visa employees are subject to carrot-and-stick control: the offer of a path to citizenship and the threat of deportation if they try to transfer to another company.

The question we should ask all candidates this year is, with jobs and unemployment being our No. 1 problem, why did we tolerate the decade from 2000 to 2010 becoming the highest decade of immigration to America in history? It's clear that the Obama administration has betrayed

its own constituency of African-Americans, as well as citizens of all races who desperately need entry-level jobs.

Despite the low level of job creation in the so-called recovery, the Center for Immigration Studies calculates that more than half of net new jobs in the last five years have gone to recent immigrants. The share of immigrant men holding a job is now higher than the percentage of native-born men who are employed.

Our government used to obey a federal law that denied visas to potential immigrants who were unable to support themselves and might become a "public charge." Somehow, that whole concept seems to have disappeared.

Just this month, some Republican senators wrote to Homeland Security and the State Department asking why they don't consider whether potential immigrants would use some of our nearly 80 federal welfare programs when they evaluate visa applications. We're still waiting for an answer to the senators' letter.
