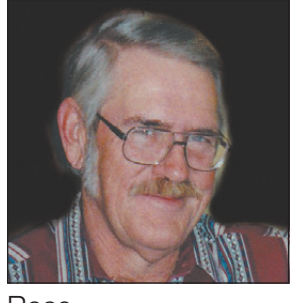

## Chuck Norris: The UN Gun Control Treaty is bad for gun owners

The UN Gun Control Treaty is bad for gun owners everywhere.

Last time I checked, Americans were responsible for making our own laws. We do not invite foreign nations to have a say in how we govern ourselves within our own borders. Yet if you follow what's been going on with the United Nations this year, you know that the USA came perilously close to having other countries dictate our gun laws. And the fight isn't over yet.

The United Nations has been debating an arms trade treaty for nearly a decade now. Though the treaty is ostensibly focused on military arms, it has long been clear that the majority of U.N. delegates consider our personal firearms to be crying out for international regulation, as well. The focus of the treaty would be a demand that governments regulate the sale and possession of firearms worldwide -- all of them, including yours and mine.

Though I believe that firearms should not be in the wrong hands, the proposed terms of this global gun control treaty would overreach wildly into regulating the sale of firearms to law-abiding citizens. In

other words, the proposed treaty is a mechanism for Iran and other tyrannical powers to have a say in your gun ownership.

The George W. Bush administration wisely opposed this concept, asserting that any agreement to regulate private gun ownership would represent a threat to our Second Amendment freedoms. This proclamation was the death knell for the first U.N. gun control treaty conference more than 10 years ago.

But bad ideas at the U.N. never go away; they just fade until the political climate changes. Treaty discussions went underground for several years -- until the Obama administration announced a willingness to consider a new treaty, as long as the parties operated under "consensus."

The debate reached a fever pitch during a monthlong marathon negotiation session in July. The goal was to disgorge a treaty in time for the Obama administration to sign it before Election Day. The draft treaty was odious on its face. Among other things, it would have required the United States to "maintain records of all imports and shipments of arms," register the identity of the "end user" of those firearms and then report the user's information to a U.N.-based gun registry. In several drafts, the treaty would have mandated that every round of ammunition be tracked globally.

What's really ironic here is that the United

States already has the most comprehensive system in the world for regulating international arms transfers. Other nations could achieve the stated goals of the treaty process by simply emulating our protocols. But the reality is that the treaty was actually intended as a mechanism to submit our unique Second Amendment guarantees to international inspection -- and condemnation.

As I have mentioned, the treaty negotiations broke down this summer, and that is a good thing. But that doesn't mean the U.N. is giving up the fight. It's just reducing it into smaller pieces. In fact, in late August, an umbrella organization of 23 separate U.N. agencies, known as the Coordinating Action on Small Arms, adopted the first portion of International Small Arms Control Standards. The ISACS text is made up of 33 separate modules, some 800 pages in total. And they're just getting started.

What can we do? We can ensure that we have a president who will not support the treaty and a Senate that will not ratify it. That's not a one-time commitment. Remember that once a treaty is enacted, it can be picked up at any time by a president and Senate. There are smaller gun control treaties that have been floating around the Senate for ratification since 1998.

What can you do? You can make sure that you and every freedom-loving American you know

is registered to vote. I'm proud to serve as the honorary chairman of Trigger The Vote, the National Rifle Association's non-partisan campaign to register voters who support the Second Amendment. We've made it easy on our website; all the tools to register are there, at <http://www.TriggerTheVote.org>. If you're already registered, you probably know someone who isn't. Share the stakes with that person, and urge him or her to join the rolls of informed voters.

Throughout my life, I've been committed to preserving our freedom from threats, both foreign and domestic. This proposed U.N. global gun control treaty may not be an "invasion" in the classic sense of the word, but believe me; over time, it represents the potential for encroachment of the greatest kind. Protect your rights by registering to vote today.

### Learn fast, Mitt, if you want to win

After anti-American protests erupted last week in the Middle East, presidential candidate Mitt Romney wasted no time criticizing President Obama's handling of the crisis. And then he wasted no time moving on. The very next day, he had exited the foreign-policy swamp and was back on familiar ground, slamming Obama for the economy.

One can hardly blame him. He didn't want to fall into the John McCain trap.

Four years ago, Arizona Sen. McCain was the GOP's nominee, running a tight race against Barack Obama. McCain was the foreign-policy guy, an ex-POW and war hero. He admitted that fiscal issues weren't his strong suit. He figured they didn't have to be -- everybody was talking about the war in Iraq, not Wall Street.

Then the bottom fell out of the economy.

Sen. McCain made a show of suspending his campaign and rushing back to Washington, to little avail. His foreign-policy muscle suddenly didn't count for much.

For Mitt Romney, the situation is reversed. His strong suit is the economy. For months, he has hammered away at high unemployment, the huge deficit and Washington's habit of pouring money into "stimulus" programs that fail to stimulate.

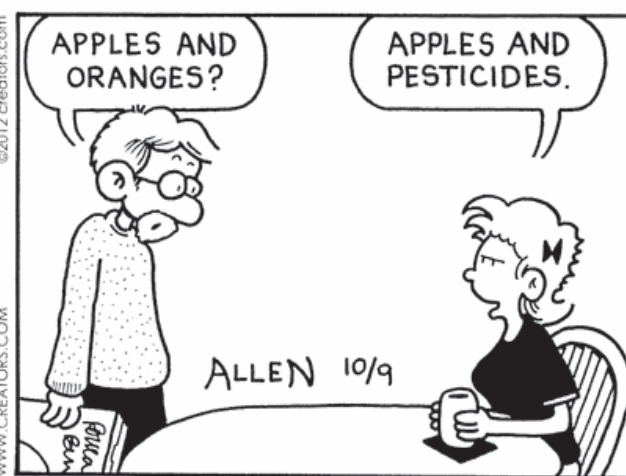
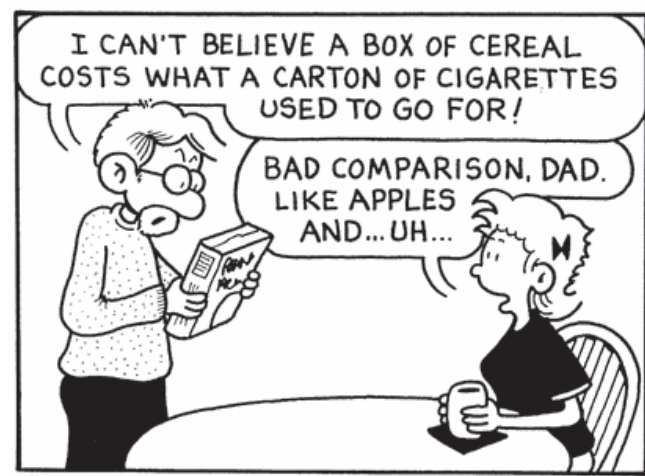
But he tends to stumble in the foreign-policy arena.

When he gave his acceptance speech in Tampa, he didn't mention the war in Afghanistan or the broader war on terror. When he responded to the attacks on U.S. diplomatic missions in Egypt and Libya, he got the timeline wrong and charged that the president sympathizes with terrorists. Members of his own party scrambled to clarify his remarks.

So Romney quickly went back to stumping on the economy and left it to his surrogates to heap scorn on Obama for perceived Middle East missteps.

But Romney can't just ignore foreign policy. He had better learn to talk about it with skill and not just in bumper-sticker terms ("Republicans strong, Democrats weak," etc.). Sen. McCain never became convincing when he talked about economics, and look what happened to him.

especially children, from career criminals and predators like Davis. He had come to the San Francisco Chronicle with other opponents of Proposition 34, the ballot measure that would end California's death penalty and resentment California's 700-plus death row inmates to life without parole.

Klaas' answer may surprise you. He sadly shook his head and answered, "Is it going to bring any closure to me? No."

But, Klaas added, Davis "will no longer be able to run his website." Young girls no longer will write to him.

It turns out the Canadian

Coalition Against the Death Penalty hosts a Richard Allen Davis home page, on which the convicted killer displays "hand-painted wood hobby craft items," which he made, and posts photos of himself. Davis also wonders whether there's anyone out there who wants to know who he really is, and he asks, "For someone like myself, can one ever fall back in love with life again?"

Davis invites interested parties to write to him at San Quentin.

Klaas wants to see Davis executed, he told me later, because the man who killed his daughter should

have no influence in this world. That, he emphasized, is "what's supposed to stop."

Good luck with that. Thanks to a highly successful defense lobby and federal judges who have stalled the enforcement of California law, only 13 of the state's death row inmates have been executed since 1992.

So now the folks behind Proposition 34 argue that California's death penalty is "too costly" and "broken beyond repair." End the death penalty, they say, and Californians will save money on sentencing trials, costly appeals and "special death row hous-

ing." The nonpartisan Legislative Analyst's

# E-bills will help save time and money

Paying your bills online is only the first half of the personal finance billing revolution. The long-delayed second half of the technology has now arrived at almost every bank website. It will save you time and energy — and it will save millions of trees. But it will cost more jobs in the postal system.

I'm talking about "electronic bill presentation," or eBills. This goes beyond just viewing and paying your bill at the biller's website. You can already do that at the sites of insurance companies, utilities and department stores.

But this next generation of e-billing now means your monthly bill will show up at your bank's website — ready for you to view, decide how much to pay and schedule the payment. You still have the same control over your bills — but you don't have the chore of piling them up on your desk, opening them and throwing out the return envelope and statement stuffers, and then going to your bank website to make the payment.

Major companies, ranging from telephone, wireless, department stores, utilities, credit cards and mortgage companies are now participating in eBills. And more than 3,800 financial institutions (including many credit unions, smaller community banks and brokerage firms like Schwab), are already offering eBills. The moment has arrived!

When your bank agrees to provide eBills, it will put an eBill icon on your bill pay page, next to each of your payees that has agreed to offer eBills. Click on that icon, and acknowledge that you want your bills to be presented electronically. They already have your account number and banking info, so the process is easy. (And if you're skeptical, most banks will offer a 90-day trial, during which you'll receive both eBills and paper bills so you can see if you like it!)

your bill to the bank website. And you'll receive an email notification that the bill has arrived at your online bill pay account. The email will include a link to your online bill pay, where you'll sign in as usual to securely access your bank account.

Once there, you can click on the bill to review it. You'll see the date it is due, the minimum required payment and the details of this month's statement. Then you can decide how much to pay and when. Schedule that payment with a click of your mouse.

If you've forgotten to make the payment, you'll receive another notification five days before the bill is due. Paying on time will help improve your credit score and your money-management skills.

And you still have a "paper trail" if you need the information for future reference. Most banks store your bills securely online for at least a year. And if you're still hooked on real paper, you can always print out your eBill and store it in a file folder. Plus, if you're using Quicken, you can still download all that information into your budgeting program.

As you can see, this is not an automatic bill pay system. Many people already set up automatic monthly payments for bills that require the same amount to be paid every month, such as on your mortgage, rent or car loan.

But eBill presentation is designed for those bills that vary in amount every month,

or may come less frequently. Those are the bills you want to review, and decide the amount and timing of what to pay based on your bank balance and money available. It's exactly how you handle your current paper bills — but you don't have to go through the hassle of opening them and piling them up!

And, you have an extra degree of flexibility. If you're traveling or on vacation, you don't have to wait until you get home, and possibly miss a payment deadline. When you receive the email that your bill has "arrived" at your bank, you can simply log in and then click and pay securely from your laptop or tablet.

Even better, recognizing that mobile apps are the next new thing, many banks are starting to offer the ability to view and pay your bills from your smart phone or tablet, through a secure link to your online banking account. That will be the next generation of click, view and pay.

Of course, eBills are secure. Perhaps even more secure than the paper bills now landing in your mailbox. No one can click on your email to see your bill, unless they have your online banking password and pin.

I remember that just a decade ago, many people were sceptical about online bill payment, wondering if it was safe. Now more than 70 million American house-



holds are paying bills online, delighted at the ease, time saving, organization and the fact that they don't have to buy postage! So let's complete the process by receiving our bills online, too.

If you want to be green — and have more green in your wallet — this is the next step. And that's The Savage Truth.

savings could amount to \$100 million annually in the first few years.

There's a caveat with that number. The Legislative Analyst's Office also noted that it cannot compute the financial effect that might follow if murderers stopped pleading guilty and making plea bargains that enable them to avoid death row.

As Klaas sees it, the anti-death penalty lobby is asking California to disarm themselves unilaterally.

He cited cases like that

of John Gardner. After the convicted sex offender was arrested for the murder of 17-year-old Chelsea King in 2010, Gardner went for a deal. He admitted to killing King and also to the 2009 murder and attempted rape of 14-year-old Amber Dubois. Gardner even led authorities to Amber's bones.

Parents Brent and Kelly King agreed to the plea bargain because, they said in a statement covered by CBS News, their family had been through "unthinkable hell" for 14 months. "We couldn't imagine the confession to Amber's murder never seeing the light of day, leaving an eternal

question mark," they said.

"You take the death penalty off the table," Klaas told the Chronicle, and communities will be held hostage to the fear and uncertainty that follow when a young person goes missing. "Crimes will not be solved. Victims will not be recovered."

Without the death penalty, it is doubtful that Jared Lee Loughner would have pleaded guilty to a 2011 shooting in Tucson, Ariz., during which he killed six and wounded then-Rep. Gabrielle Giffords. Given his history of mental illness, it's not clear whether Loughner would have been found guilty.

Even when it doesn't work, the death penalty victims' families need not worry about an offender's getting off, because the defendant has no grounds for appeals. All of the outcomes that the anti-death penalty lobby extols -- cheaper, faster and more certain -- exist only because of the death penalty.
