## School board will hear admin building update

■ May suspend policy to incorporate state test score as part of a student's grade.

The Pampa Independent School Board will meet Thursday to hear an update on plans

for the district's new central administration facility and to consider suspending a policy that would incorporate a state standardized test to count as 15 percent of a student's overall grade.

James Hicks, President of Wiley Hicks Construction, who the board selected for the project last month, will present the initial round of cost estimates for Pampa ISD's future home in the rebranded and redesigned Las

Pampas Square.

On Nov. 30, Commissioner of Education Michael Williams announced that, for the 2012-13 school year, school districts may defer the requirement of an end-of-course assessment to count as 15 percent of a student's final course grade.

This is the second consecutive year that the state Board of Education has deferred the requirement.

Superintendent Dr. David Young is not in favor of the state's policy and said he would support the board's decision to suspend it, if they choose to do so.

"It's a bad idea to co-mingle standardized test results with class performance as a class grade," Young said. "We are electing, along with most school districts in the state, to temporarily waive this requirement."

Young said he expects the State Legislature to strike down the measure.

"We have every indication that is going to happen."

Young then explained how the idea to include standardized test scores with class grades originated. He said students would take the test as freshmen, sophomores and juniors, but the juniors' scores were the only ones

Lt. Terry Cox, spokesman for the Gray County Sheriff's Office, said Rigo was transferred from the Carson County Jail to Gray County on Jan. 4 and is being held on a \$1 million dollar bond.

Rigo, 28, and another Amarillo man, Steve Preston Dean, 47, were arrested in Slatten's stolen truck near Panhandle on New Year's Day after

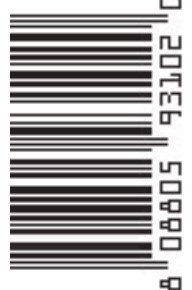

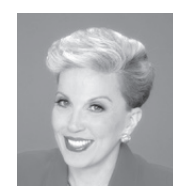
## Police arrest intoxicated zombie shouter

## Dear Abby...

DEAR ABBY: I am 21 and I have an anger problem. Sometimes when my friends, roommates or my boyfriend do something that annoys me, I feel so mad that I can't concentrate on anything I have to get done.

I'm having that problem right now because one of my roommates was mean to me tonight. I think I'm owed an

apology, but I know I won't be getting one. I can't talk to her. I know if I do I'll just feel worse and we won't get anywhere. I can't even concentrate on writing my paper because I'm so ticked off!

Is it normal to get this mad? How can I control my anger better? Taking a deep breath and counting to 10 just makes me feel angrier. I'd feel bet-

ter if I punched the wall, but the last time I did that I bruised my fist. Do you have any guidelines? — CONSUMED BY ANGER IN HERNDON, VA.

DEAR CONSUMED BY ANGER: Anger is a normal emotion. Everyone has experienced it at one time or another. Most people have been trained to suppress anger from early childhood. But it's even more important to learn to express anger in ways that are constructive rather than destructive. Punching a wall falls into the latter category and can result in injury to you and possibly the wall, as you found out.

If it is channeled in the right direction, anger can be a positive emotion. Uncontrolled, or suppressed, it can be extremely harmful and even a killer. The challenge that everyone faces is how not to deny the feeling but to express the anger — or diffuse it — in ways that are productive.

In a situation like yours, saying out loud in a controlled manner that something has made you angry can be like releasing steam from a pressure cooker. It's certainly more productive than making a bullying gesture; hitting a wall with your fist implies that the next punch might land on the person who pushed your buttons. In my booklet "The Anger in All of Us and How to Deal With It," I offer many suggestions that can help you manage your emotions in a more

Please understand how important it is that you learn to manage and channel your emotions more constructively than you currently do.

Step one in managing your anger is to recognize that the emotion is building before you lose control or become so angry that you can't concentrate on what is most important right now — and that is your academic studies. I know that if you learn to manage and control your anger, you will benefit greatly as you move forward in life. I have faith in you!

DEAR ABBY: If a couple has been dating for a long time and are sexually active, do you think he has a right to have sex with her while she's sleeping? My sister and I disagree about this. I feel it's abuse. My sister isn't quite sure what to think. — CATHY IN KINGSTON, N.Y.

DEAR CATHY: If someone has sex with you without your consent, it isn't abuse. It is rape.

P.S. If the boyfriend in question is so inept at lovemaking that his partner snores right through it, then it seems to me that only the boyfriend is sexually "active."

that counted in getting students across the stage for graduation. Therefore, the freshmen and sophomores often wouldn't take the testing seriously and their scores reflected

that mentality, Young said. The state Board of Education felt including standardized test results into class grades would serve to motivate the students. However, PISD and similar-minded school systems don't agree with the policy. "You can talk to all of the 1,200 school districts in Texas and get different versions of the same answer,"

Slatten was found strangled in her Lefors home by GCSO deputies. Dean was arrested on unrelated charges and both men were taken to

the Carson County Jail in Panhandle. Cox and a spokeswoman for the Gray County District Attorney's Office did not know when the grand jury hearing would be held. Rigo was arrested by the Texas Rangers for murder, first-degree felony. If con-

victed he could face up to 99 years or life in prison. Dean, who was riding as a passenger when he and Rigo were stopped by authorities, has bonded out from the Carson County Jail, said Sheriff Tam Terry of Carson County. Terry said Dean was charged with unauthorized

use of a motor vehicle. The Texas Rangers and the GCSO are investigating the case and will present their evidence to a grand jury. Whether Rigo is formally charged will be determined by the evidence presented to the court.

## Horse rider seeks forgiveness at church

LIBERTY, Ky. (AP) — Harold Goode's most recent visit to a Casey County church was more humble than his first. WLEX-TV reported Goode stood before the congregation of Ellisburg Baptist Church on Sunday to ask for forgiveness. In 2010, Goode rode into the church on horseback in the middle of a sermon, armed with a gun and drunk.

The pastor called police and Goode was arrested. On Sunday, Goode told church members he asked the Lord for forgiveness and pleaded for theirs as well. The pastor said church members accepted Goode's apology and he believes Goode might join the congregation. **Thieves thwarted by cash register**
