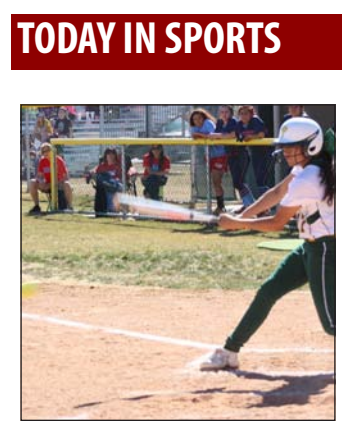

## Study: Some Texas pharmacies misinforming teens on contraception

Most Pampa pharmacies do not carry 'morning after' pills.

AUSTIN — It is supposed to be available over the counter for teen girls 17 and older, but research published in January found that many young women still face barriers to obtaining emergency contraception. Pediatrician Tracey Wilkinson, Children's Hospital, Los Angeles, is the lead author of the study. It posed a couple of simple questions to employees at more than 900 pharmacies in five cities across the country including Austin. "We asked, 'Do you have emergency contraception' and 'If I'm 17, can I get it?'" The most recent study discussed some of our conversations with the pharmacy staff and showed some real glaring problems with access for adolescents when it comes to this medication."

## Area postal workers sentenced

Neither to receive prison time for failing to deliver mail.

Two former postal workers accused of obstructing delivery of mail were sentenced Monday to serve probation by a federal court in Amarillo. Though unrelated, both cases were prosecuted by U.S. Assistant Attorney Jeffrey Haag in U.S. Magistrate Judge Clinton E. Averitte's courtroom. Lesa Marie Stark, a former Borger Postal Service employee, was sentenced to serve three years probation after she failed to deliver more than 30 pieces to customers. She also was ordered by Averitte to pay a \$3,000 fine and undergo counseling as part of her plea agreement. Charles Allen Tollett of Borger was sentenced to serve two years of probation after pleading guilty to failing to deliver hundreds of pieces of mail to customers in Dumas. Averitte

## Road at new energy center may be paved

During its regular meeting on Friday, the Gray County Court of Commissioners will consider paving County Road J west three quarters of a mile from the intersection with Farm to Market 2300. The road is adjacent to the Pampa Energy Center, an industrial development park off U.S. Highway 60 owned by the Pampa Economic Development Corp. The road is in Commissioner Gary Willoughby's precinct.

Wilkinson said. In the U.S., Plan B One-Step is available without age restrictions to women and men (check the family planning aisle). One-pill generics (My Way and Next Choice One Dose) will soon be available on the shelf for consumers aged 17 and older, but this change has not taken effect yet; women aged 16 and younger still need a prescription. Two-pill generics (Levonorgestrel Tablets) are still available only behind the counter without prescription if you are 17 or older. Younger women need a prescription. Some of the recurring misinformation included pharmacy staff saying a prescription was needed or a parent had to be along with a teen, Wilkinson explained, neither of which is true. In addition, some pharmacy workers said they didn't feel comfortable dispensing emergency contraception, citing personal beliefs. With the misinformation and barriers, Wilkinson advised all women of reproductive age to get the medication before they need it. Emergency contraception is birth control that prevents pregnancy after sex, which is why it is sometimes called "the morning after pill," "the day after pill," or "morning after contraception." You can use emergency contraception right away — or up

to five days after sex — if you think your birth control failed, you didn't use contraception, or you were made to have sex against your will. According to Princeton University's emergency contraception website, when used correctly Plan B One Step prevents fertilization and is 95 percent effective in preventing unintended pregnancies if taken within 24 hours of unprotected sex. Emergency contraceptives are not as effective as birth control that's used before or during sex, like the pill or condoms. So if you are sexually active or planning to be, don't use emergency contraception as your only protection against pregnancy, the Princeton University website recommends. Also, emergency contraception does not protect against sexually transmitted infections, like HIV (only condoms do). In Pampa, teenage pregnancy is an issue and many of the female students at the Pampa Learning Center are either pregnant or have small children. When contacted by The Pampa News, most pharmacies in Pampa said they didn't carry the Plan B emergency contraception. B&B and Keyes said they do not carry Plan B One-Step. Pharmacy employees at CVS said they weren't permitted to discuss it over the phone and gave the newspaper the toll-free number for the corporate customer care office. That number

required the caller to go through an endless series of voice prompts, so the newspaper did a Google search and found that Plan B One-Step can be ordered online from CVS for \$49.99. Walmart said they carry One-Step for about \$50 but require women to be 18 or older to purchase it. The pharmacy at United Supermarkets in Pampa doesn't carry it, but will refer customers to other pharmacies that do including their Borger store. The Borger pharmacy confirmed it does carry Plan B. An employee there said a 17-year-old can purchase the drug if she has an ID. The store does not require parental permission or a prescription. Eddie Owens, a spokesman for United Supermarkets in Lubbock, said the company has no official policy regarding the sale of One Step. "We leave that up to the professional judgment of each pharmacist," he said. He said even in the same pharmacy, there be one pharmacist who is comfortable with selling the drug and another who is not. "It's an individual decision among pharmacy staff," he said. also ordered Tollett to pay a \$1,000 fine and attend credit counseling. Neither Stark nor Tollett received prison time. On April 30, 2013, Stark's supervisor discovered her lunch cooler inside a post office vehicle and searched the cooler for a missing key. The supervisor discovered

an open prescription mailer inside and 40 pieces of undelivered mail. Investigators were put on Tollett's trail on April 18 when a postal customer and retired U.S. Postal Service employee contacted the postmaster in Dumas to report that he discovered undelivered mail in a trash bin behind his home in Dumas. On May 10, another customer contacted the postmaster to report that he had found undelivered mail in a trash receptacle behind his Dumas residence. Investigators discovered 437 pieces of undelivered mail at the two locations.

session at in the Pampa Regional Medical Center cafeteria at 10 a.m. titled, "Knowing Everything You Should (KEYS) About Breast Cancer." Attendees will be able to learn the risk factors of breast cancer, what you can do if you are diagnosed, and the three most common breast problems. The program will also feature a question and answer session led by Janine Pettiford, M.D. for those who attend. The specialty care clinic is an outreach

program that includes an initial screening to save Pampa women a drive to Amarillo, said Justin Patterson with TTUHSC in Amarillo. He said the clinics started with a soft launch in December and have been held the second Friday of every month since December at PRMC. # I-40 head-on results in 2 deaths

Two drivers were killed Saturday night in a head-on collision that occurred Saturday night on Interstate 40, 2.3 miles east of Amarillo. Griselda Garcia, 47, of Amarillo, and Gary Schweitzer, of Bushland, were both pronounced dead at the scene, according to the Texas Department of Public Safety. Around 8:05 p.m., a 2000 Toyota passenger car driven by Garcia was

traveling east in the westbound lanes of I-40 and struck head on the 2008 Lexus passenger car driven by Schweitzer. The Toyota came to rest in the median between the westbound and eastbound lanes of I-40 while the Lexus came to rest between the westbound and north service road of the interstate, the crash report stated. The report did not state whether the deceased drivers were wearing seatbelts.

# TxDOT teams up with Texas music favorites in anti-litter campaign

AUSTIN — The Texas Department of Transportation is tuning up one of its greatest hits as it partners with top-notch Texas musicians for a brand-new rendition of Don't mess with Texas. portance of not littering. Researchers estimate nearly half-a-billion pieces of visible litter accumulate annually along state-maintained highways. In 2013, a study found that visible trash along more than 80,000 miles of state-maintained roadways was down 34 percent from 2009. Additionally, about one-third of Texans — particularly young adults between the ages of 16 and 34 — admit to littering. Some of the most

common litter found during roadside cleanups includes fast-food packaging, cigarette butts, candy wrappers and plastic bags. "TxDOT wants to reduce litter and save taxpayers money," said Margo Richards, director, Travel Information Division. "Our estimates show litter clean-up, on average, costs taxpayers more than \$40 million annually. As our state's population grows by 1,000 people each day, it's important to continue reminding Texans and Texas visitors that littering isn't just unsightly, it's also against the law." In Texas, fines for littering can be as high as \$500 for the first offense. Repeat offenders can face fines up to \$2,000 and 180 days in jail. ### Museum Musings

## The history of The Pampa News

The Pampa News began as a “one man paper” in April, 1906. Known then as the Pampa Crony, it was

L.H. Greene was the first of the 250 subscribers who paid \$1.00 each for a year’s subscription. Because a newspaper was a “novelty” then, Ladd was able to fill the newspaper with a large percentage of advertising.

The following article preceded a listing of various tracts of land for sale by Lard and Wynne:

“Our town ‘Pampa’ is located on the plains on the Southern Kansas Railroad, 40 miles west of the Oklahoma line, between the South Canadian and the North Fork of Red River in Gray County, Texas, and has grown from a section house to 400 population in the last two years. Level country, covered with a thick coat of buffalo grass. Our soil runs from deep black on the plains to sandy loam as we approach the rivers. The altitude is 3,200 feet, which gives us an ideal climate. Our rainfall is 24.09 inches average the last 10 years.

Fifteen or twenty miles towards the rivers the country becomes broken, with pretty running streams, kept running by springs the year round. Water being soft and clear. Creeks have plenty of timber, cottonwood, hackberry, china-oak, wild grapes,

currents and plums grow in abundance. The valleys along the creeks are used for hay meadows and alfalfa (which does well all over the country). Rough land is used for grazing purposes and is covered with all kinds of grasses. The depth of water ranges here from 0 to 300 feet. Any kinds of crops can be grown here that can be grown anywhere (except tropical). Corn, oats, barley, wheat, flax, cotton, kaffir corn, milo maize, broom corn, sorghum, millet, and vegetables of all kinds. For the last nine years we have had an average of 18 bushels of wheat and 30 bushels of corn per acre. This year, ‘1907,’ wheat ranged from 9 to 14 bushels on sod and 14 to 20 on old ground. The estimate on corn ranges from 20 to 50 bushels per acre. Oats 30 to 40 bushels. The price of this land ranges from \$3.50 to \$25 per acre, according to the amount of improvements and distance from town. We have a good school here, also good churches and a good class of people.”

In 1907 Ladd sold the Crony to pharmacist Joe Smith who renamed it The Pampa News. Smith, who learned the newspaper business from his brother in Indiana, came to Texas two years after the Civil War and operated a newspaper and a drugstore in Bonham before moving to Pampa. He moved the newspaper office to the east end of the First National Bank building. Later the office was moved to the rear of Perkins Pharmacy and then to 123 W. Foster Ave. and to 322 W. Foster Ave. before it was moved in the early 1950s to 403 W. Atchison Ave.

Smith’s son, Joe Jr., joined him in 1917. The younger Smith learned the newspaper trade from his father and could set type while still in grammar school. He worked for papers in Iowa and Illinois before settling in Pampa, where he shipped in the first Linotype to be located between Amarillo and Wichita, Kansas.

The two Smiths operated the paper until 1926 when it was sold to J.L. Nunn and David Warren. This was a time of extraordinary growth for Pampa, and Nunn and Warren changed the Pampa News from a weekly to a semi-weekly format. In 1927 they created the Pampa Daily News. The name has since reverted to The Pampa News.

The Nunn-Warren partnership was dissolved in 1934. Nunn and his son Gilmore operated the paper until 1936, when R.C. Hoiles, a publisher from Santa Ana, California, bought the News and added it to his chain of newspapers.

One of the major changes in the “backshop” was the conversion from the Linotype or “hot” type to offset printing in November 1970. During the fall of 1978, a complete system was installed to speed up the type-setting process. The Harris system enabled reporters and editors to type news stories directly instead of typing them and having them set by a typesetter.

In 1980 Louise Fletcher became publisher after serving as business manager. She was the only woman publisher in the 31-paper Freedom chain of newspapers at the time. David Bowser became managing editor in 1993.

In 1985 the newspaper staff consisted of 42 people, including seven advertising representatives, four editors, three reporters and a photographer. Also, there were 51 independent carriers.

The circulation in 1985 was 8,500 daily and 9,500 to 11 area towns, including Miami, McLean, Mobeetie, White Deer, Groom, Skellytown, Wheeler and Canadian.

## The silence of the tax lamb

Former IRS official Lois Lerner invoked her Fifth Amendment right Wednesday not to incriminate herself when she testified before the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee hearing on the IRS targeting of tea party groups.

Oddly, the news media and Democratic leaders don’t think it’s a big deal when a federal official — Lerner was the head of the unit that deals with tax-exempt organizations when she first invoked the Fifth last May — won’t answer questions about her actions as a federal official, but they are in a huff because the committee’s chairman, Darrell Issa, abruptly called an end to the hearing and shut off the microphone.

Ranking Democrat Elijah Cummings said he wanted to ask “a procedural question.” Then, as Cummings instead engaged in a rant in defense of Lerner, Issa again shut off the mic. Within a minute, it was back on, and Cummings continued to rail against what he sees as a one-sided investigation.

House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi later tweeted that Issa’s “decision to silence a fellow Member of Congress was outrageous & disrespectful.” The Washington Post’s Dana Milbank denounced Issa for falling below “today’s low standard of civility in Congress.”

Issa exhibited shoddy manners. Worse, he lacked the discipline to not be baited by the crafty Cummings. Thus, Issa handed the left an excuse to make him the issue when the Internal Revenue Service’s practice of going after the tea party cries out for public scrutiny. Lerner’s refusal to answer questions, though it is the exercise of a constitutional right, should make all House members squirm.

Just what was Lerner doing on the taxpayer dime that she doesn’t want to share? Lerner’s silence is especially unsettling given that her attorney William Taylor III told reporters that she had given a full interview to the Department of Justice with no grant of immunity. Lerner’s lawyers, he said, have confidence that prosecutors, unlike Issa, are open-minded. The thing is that also unlike Issa, the Department of Justice is in a position to prosecute people.

professor George Thomas III told The Wall Street Journal. “One explanation is the one given by her lawyer. The other, darker explanation is that she and her lawyer think the DOJ is not interested in a serious investigation of the IRS treatment of these tax-exempt groups.”

Could it be that Lerner’s lawyers do not fear the often-terrifying Justice Department precisely because President Barack Obama already signaled there is no cause for concern because the IRS story is a “phony scandal”?

Similarly, the president signaled his disdain for conservative nonprofits during the 2010 and 2012 election seasons. Lo and behold, the IRS started to put conservative tax-exempt organizations on the slow track and under a microscope.

Last year, Lerner admitted that after the IRS saw an uptick in applications for social welfare organizations in 2010, staff began screening for groups that used terms such as “Tea Party” and “Patriots.” She even apologized. “That was wrong. That was absolutely incorrect, insensitive and inappropriate. That’s not how we go about selecting cases for further review,” Lerner said.

She also claimed that IRS staffers did not target tea party patriot types “because of any political bias. They did it because they were working together. This was a streamlined way for them to refer to the cases.”

That is, it was convenient.

I do not believe that claim. I don’t know many liberals who actually believe it, either. I do believe that if the Bush administration’s IRS had targeted social welfare groups that used terms such as “anti-war” and “torture,” the left would have wanted to investigate. They would have wanted to know whether the IRS policy had come from the White House. And they wouldn’t have given a pass to officials who took the Fifth.

Milbank is put out that Issa “forced” Lerner to invoke her right against self-incrimination “no fewer than 10 times.” Apparently, it would be the gentlemanly thing for Issa to allow Lerner to maintain a version of events that defies credulity without answering to the American public.

## Geology 101 at W.T.S.U.— faith under fire

It was the Fall of 1968 and I was a freshman at West Texas State University, standing in a registration line without a clue of what I was doing. So when the counselor asked me which classes I wanted to sign up for my reply was, "I don't know. Which ones do you think I should choose?" I picked Geology 101.

I was not a committed student at the time and spent just enough energy studying that first semester to pass all of my classes, including Geology 101. At the time I didn't see any connection between what we were being force-fed and my Christian beliefs. Now I wasn't living as a committed Christian should, but thanks to my church upbringing I did know what beliefs a "real" Christian believed.

Second semester began as every class first semester had begun — checking the attendance roll. Then our professor, as he always did, asked, "So are there any questions about the chapter we are about to cover?" This was for those who had actually read the chapter in advance; I was not one of those students. After I uttered a loud "here" to mark my attendance, I opened my Geology book to the first page of the second half of the book. I was stunned to see the illustration known as "March of Progress," the famous "monkey to man" picture that had been drawn by Rudolph Zallinger for the "Early Man" volume in the 1965 Time-Life series of evolutionary books called the Life Nature Library.

Following our professors request for questions almost every student raised their hand. He then arrogantly stated, "I refuse to answer any questions related to that mythological book called the Bible. So unless your question is directly related to geology, put your hand down." Every hand dropped; every student crushed.

He then promptly began to use his uniformitarian philosophy to support his religion of naturalistic evolution and permitted no questions regarding the faith of his students. Now he didn't call his teaching "religion," but it surely was.

After a couple of weeks of pop tests and one major review test, I had had

Some of the most aggressive attacks on the Christian faith that any believer will ever personally experience will occur in a philosophy or science class in college.

So Christian parents, prepare your child well in their faith before you ship them off to the enemy's camp. Churches, be thorough in the faith grounding of the children who attend your classes/services. Take that job seriously. And remember that a "thorough grounding" usually won't be very entertaining. The Bible doesn't say "entertain a child in the way they should go and when they are older they will not depart." Rather it says, TRAIN-UP a child. Are you doing more entertaining than training? Or vis-versa?

Father God, forgive us for letting the enemy, Satan himself, take ownership of our colleges and universities and make them his institutions of humanistic indoctrination and brainwashing. Amen.

# Officials: Camper's stove starts Palo Duro fire

LUBBOCK (AP) — A backpacker's stove ignited a wildfire that has scorched about 15 acres and closed Palo Duro Canyon State Park in the Texas Panhandle, officials said Tuesday as emergency crews worked to put out the blaze.

No injuries were immediately reported after the fire began late Monday afternoon, and the park was closed Tuesday for safety reasons.

Park superintendent Cory Evans said the backpacker's stove used liquid fuel, which is permissible under the burn ban in place because of dry weather. Campfires or the use of fireplaces is prohibited during a ban.

"It was just an accident on his part," Evans said.

Randall County Sheriff's Department spokesman Danny Alexander said the fire — in a remote area of

the park that vehicles with firefighting equipment cannot reach — was contained but not controlled. Three crews on foot were working to dig fire lines by hand, Evans said.

Emergency personnel could face strong winds as they try to extinguish the blaze. The National Weather Service issued a high wind warning for the area until early Wednesday.

"We're not real confident

the fire lines will hold," Alexander said, noting wind gusts are forecast to reach 60 mph Tuesday afternoon.

With winds that strong, firefighting efforts from the air would also be difficult, Alexander said.

The Texas Parks & Wildlife Department says the park is scheduled to reopen Wednesday.

Park official Mark Hassell says about 80 campers departed Monday night from the state park, which is just outside the town of Canyon.

"She worked the zone really good today and was putting the ball where she needed to and we did a really good job setting up hitters today," Gill said. "She is a competitor and every time she steps on we know

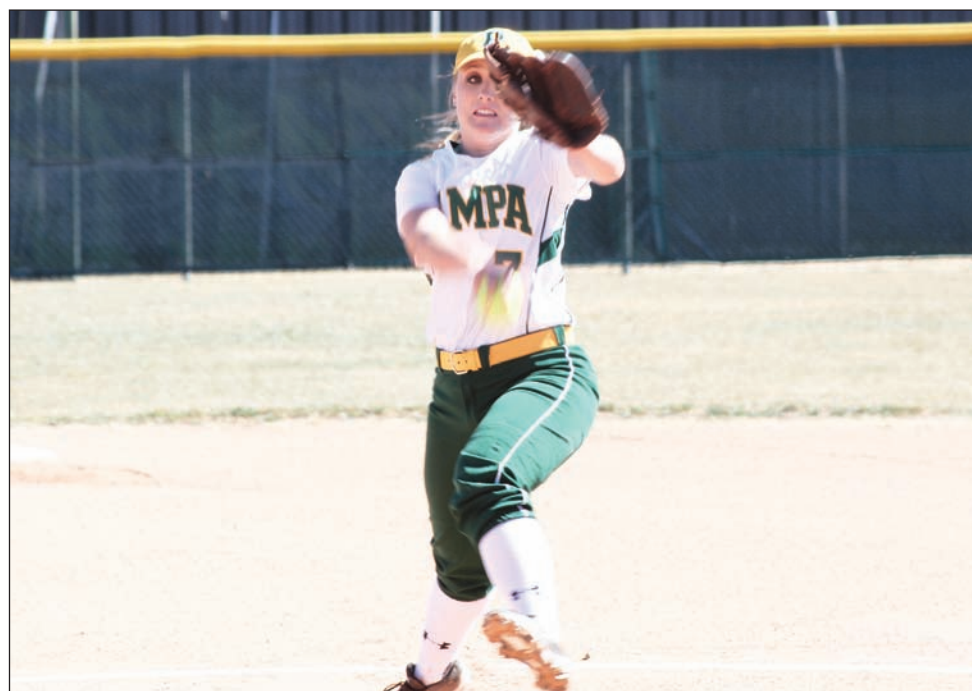

## End of an era in Dallas, Demarcus Ware released

It is the end of an era in Dallas as the Cowboys cut their long-time defensive end/outside linebacker and franchise-leader in sacks Demarcus Ware, according to ESPN NFL Insider Ed Werder and Adam Schefter. Ware, who piled up 111

sacks in his first eight seasons with America's Team, had an injury-riddled season in 2013 and only mustered up six sacks. The move creates \$7.4 million in salary cap space for the Cowboys, but also creates a need for a pass-rusher. The Cowboys were asking Ware to take a pay-cut to free up space on the cap.

The Dallas Cowboys already restructured quarterback Tony Romo's contract, which is now back-loaded, and were only around a million un-

der the salary cap. Ware, 31, wouldn't take the pay cut so owner Jerry Jones had to make the move.

"A decision like this, involving a man who is a cornerstone player in the history of your franchise, is extremely difficult," Jones said, according to ESPN Dallas.

The move will most certainly be unsettling to Cowboys' fans with a fanbase who is used to seeing their favorite players stick around for years such as Emmitt Smith, Michael Irvin and Jason Witten.

The Cowboys drafted Demarcus Ware in 2005, and Ware was productive regardless of the position or scheme he played in.

It will be interesting to see the direction this forces the Cowboys to take in the draft, as they hold the 16th pick in the draft. They could also turn to free agency, where Dwight Freeney and Osi Umenyiora are available at the time of this print.

Ware joins a rank of veteran cap casualties including Champ Bailey, Kevin Kolb, Julius Peppers and Darrelle Revis.

## Steelers cut veteran LB LaMarr Woodley

PITTSBURGH (AP) — The Pittsburgh Steelers released linebacker LaMarr Woodley on Tuesday, with a post-June 1 designation to save money under the salary cap.

By postponing the move until after June 1, the Steelers free up about \$8 million in salary cap space in 2014.

The money saved will likely go toward signing the team's selections in the NFL draft in May.

Woodley will, however, count \$8.5 million against the team's cap number in 2015.

Selected by the Steelers in the second round (46th overall) of the 2007 draft out of Michigan, Woodley signed a six-year, \$61.5 million contract in 2011, but has struggled to remain healthy.

He missed at least three games in each of the last three seasons as hamstring and other lower body issues kept him sidelined for long stretches.

The turning point came in a 25-17 win over New England on Oct. 30, 2011. Woodley sacked Tom Brady twice in that game but also left with a strained hamstring.
