Let me express my deep gratitude to the people of Texas for electing me Governor of the greatest state in America.

For fourteen years we the people have placed our trust in a man I am humbled to succeed. Along with his wife, Anita, he has been a faithful steward of the miracle that is Texas. And I thank Rick Perry for his unwavering leadership.

The path that brought me here I could not have traveled alone. I share today with so many, starting with a woman of genuine warmth and character: My beautiful wife, Cecilia.

Texas has been the blending of cultures from across the globe even before we became our own nation. My wife represents that as she now has made Texas history as the first Hispanic First Lady in the history of our great state.

Cecilia and I share this day with our precious

daughter, Audrey. Through your eyes we see the promise of the next generation of Texans.

Pampa Tire and Glass recently opened its doors to the public. Although with its new title, some may assume that this is a new business in town, and in some ways it is. It is also a combination and expansion of Cell Autoglass, owned by Chris Phillips, which has been in business for 10 years in Pampa.

Business partners Kevin Carlson and Phillips recently decided to fill a void in not only Pampa, but as far as they are aware, in the entire Texas Panhandle. The men consider their business a one-stop shop for all auto needs.

Carlson has a background in retail, also owning Lineage LLC in Pampa, and he says his latest endeavor has been a good fit for him.

Services Pampa Tire and Glass provides include windshields, tires, oil changes, brakes and alignment.

"You'll be able to get your vehicle completely serviced in one location instead of having to make four different appointments," Carlson said.

"There's not a shop that does glass with everything else around," Phillips said. "There's not even one in Amarillo."

The men have also renovated the building in which the business made its new home. The shop is located at 125 N. Somerville, and those

## Hunting class to be offered on Jan. 31

Those hoping to become hunter-safety certified will have an opportunity to come Saturday, Jan. 31.

Game warden for Gray and Roberts County Logan Hudson will be instructing the course.

"The new hunter education class is a one-day course between five and six hours long," Hudson said. "It's required for anyone that wants to hunt and is born after Sept. 2, 1971."

A person can hunt up until the age of 17 as long as they are accompanied by someone who is licensed.

If they are over the age of 17 they have to complete a hunter's education course regardless of whether or not they are accompanied by a licensed hunter.

The course is designed firearm safety and handling and hunter ethics.

"We would teach people how to look at a situation and decide No. 1 if this is a shot that is safe to take," Hudson said. "And if it's ethical. So there might be an instance where your target is beyond your effective range that you're capable of shooting and we are going to talk about how to make those decisions about whether you're capable of

taking a clean quick shot and to kill in the most effective manner without causing any additional harm. Or if you are going to just wound the animal, we want to avoid those shots."

Hudson said hunters want to take the animals in the most humane way possible because hunters are the one animal population factors that can be controlled.

"They (animals) are controlled by disease, food population and those kind of things," Hudson said. "You add the hunters in there we are able to help control the populations before they get to disease and starvation. Another aspect of

• 7 a.m. Today - Expected to begin in the north-west portion of the Panhandle. This band will spread east and southeast throughout the day.

• 4 p.m. Today - Expected to begin and cover most of the northern two-thirds of the Panhandle.

• 7 p.m. - 11 p.m. Today - Widespread coverage across the entire Panhandles.

• 7 a.m. to Noon Thursday- Snow ending across the Panhandles from the northwest to southeast.

Snow is expected to reach the Highway 60 corridor between Amarillo and Pampa by 5 p.m. today. All of the Panhandle should be covered by 9 p.m.

Lindley said they have a very high confidence in the precipitation chances. They have a high confidence in the timing and precipitation type. They just have a moderate confidence in the snowfall



passing by recently pay have noticed the splash of new paint on the outside as well as new signs denoting its services provided.

Carlson also said that they have added a total of five lifts, including two big lifts to be able to accommodate larger trucks. "The only thing we can't do now is semis," Phillips said.

Pampa Tire and Glass also has a fully certified staff. Though the business has been open for two weeks, this has mainly

been a trial period during which the workers have been being trained into their new positions.

Carlson's and Phillips' favorite part of the new business so far has been building it to make it what it is now. Phillips has particularly enjoyed the remodeling process.

Pampa Tire and Glass is open from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturdays.

"We wanted to accommodate the working class," Carlson said about the decision made on operating hours.

The business will be holding its grand opening on Monday, Jan. 26,

which is the start date for all services to be provided.

hunter ethics is what you are doing is legal and is it right as far as trespassing, shooting hours and those gray areas where there might not be a law against it but is it the right thing to do."

Anyone from age nine years old and up can take the course. Hudson said that with someone the age of nine though, they will definitely "have to know what they are doing" to become certified.

The certification is lifetime and is generally honored by all other states.

"We have a portion of the class set for wildlife identification," Hudson said. "It's kind of set with the hunter ethics part, being able to tell the difference of a white-tailed deer and a mule deer. We talk a lot about turkeys and quail. We have a fair number of animals you can hunt right here in the Panhandle. But you may to Colorado or other parts and be able to hunt bear. These are all the things that would affect those areas."

The course is \$15 and Hudson tries to teach the course twice a year, once before and once after hunting season. Those over the age of 17 can take the course online, but Hudson suggests taking it in person to interact with other hunters.

The course is from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday, Jan. 31 at the Remax office located at 2211 Perryton Parkway next to Chicken Express.

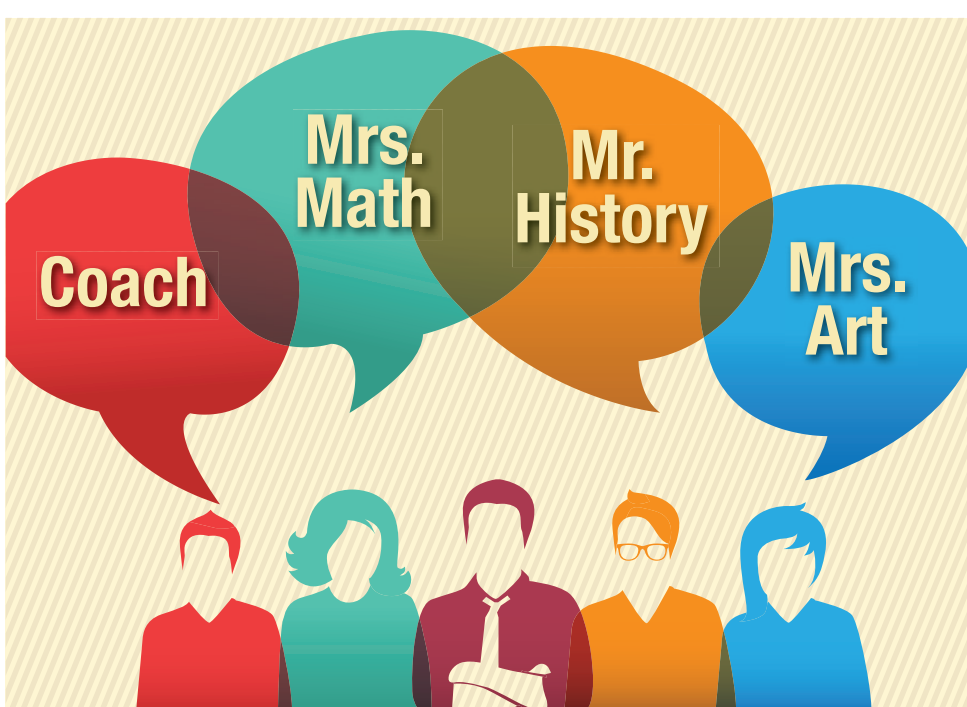

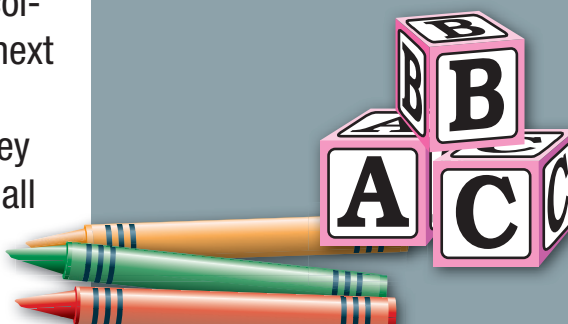

## Museum Musings Charles Wesley Dodd

Charles Wesley Dodd came from Kansas to Pampa in 1908 and went into business with his son, Chester Charles Dodd. The Dodd Grain and Produce at 403 W. Atchison supplied farmers and ranchers between Amarillo and Canadian.

In 1913, at Wichita, Kan., C.C. Dodd was married to Myo McSkimming by her father, the Rev. D.D. McSkimming. Since their house in Pampa was not ready for occupancy, they stayed in the Liberty Hotel (owned by M.E. Fletcher), 121 E. Atchison, until their house was completed.

The two-story house at 211 N. Frost (now at 2300 W. Kentucky) was a Sears home built from a kit hauled by train and wagon and

erected on the site. It was west of the block where there were hitching posts, a large tank for horses to drink and a place for wagons and carriages to park. The hitching posts were located where the Gray County Courthouse now stands.

Dorothy Dodd Peacock Brown, mother of Ivan Owen, Bob Wesley and Charles D. Peacock, was born in the Dodd home at 211 N. Frost. About 1917-18 the Dodds exchanged property with A.H. Doucette, whose farm was one and a half miles southeast of Pampa.

In 1926 C.C. Dodd started Dodd's Produce and Hatchery at 115 S. Ballard and became known as poultry judge for county fairs. During the Depression of the 1930s, he closed his business in town and managed it from his farm.

A few years later his family

moved to 504 E. Browning and Dodd worked for Pampa Office Supply until the U.S. Army hired him to have control of Army supplies during WW II at the Army Air Base east of Pampa.

In 1953 the Dodds sold the property on Browning Street to the Central Baptist Church and moved to 1418 N. Russell. Dodd was then in charge of supplies for the City of Pampa and helped establish the Pampa City Credit Union. He wrote the "Clearing House" articles for the Pampa News.

Dodd died in 1972 while visiting his daughter, Dorothy, in Burbank, Calif.

## Why the violent extremists welcome attacks on Islam

Whenever an act of horrific terror enrages the West, a predictable second act ensues. Furious commentators and activists on the right erupt with blanket denunciations of Islam, Muslims

and their supposed plots to enslave us all under Shariah, urging that we ban the religion, stigmatize its faithful and restore the Judeo-Christian exclusivity of America. Sometimes a few even seek retribution in attacks on mosques, individual Muslims and anyone unfortunate enough to "look Muslim."

Violent or merely loud, these are the useful idiots whose divisive blundering underscores the propaganda of al-Qaida, the Islamic State group and imitators around the world. They represent precisely the opposite of what we must do and say if we are to defeat Islamist extremism in all its manifestations.

Look behind the delusional murderers who actually carry out such crimes as the massacres at Charlie Hebdo and the Paris kosher market. What is their strategic objective? Not a military victory over the French army or even an atmosphere of fear in Paris. They seek to provoke a harsh crackdown on innocent Muslims, especially the young and unemployed, along with expressions of bigotry and discrimination — to highlight the simmering communal conflicts they hope to inflame into a "war of civilizations."

So the extremists can only be grateful when anti-Muslim propaganda, repeated constantly in right-wing publications and broadcasts, casts them as the defenders of Islam rather than its defilers. Every time Islam is publicly defined as a religion of violence, the jihadis gain prestige. Their appeals become more persuasive to oppressed young Muslims — especially if no alternative is apparent.

Yet the narrative of endless conflict and implacable distrust is not only untrue — as we saw last week when Parisians of all faiths rallied together — but deeply destructive to traditional democratic values and strategically stupid. Yes, we must protect the

right to speak freely, including when the speech is offensive to religions and even to ethnic groups, without fear of violent responses. We must also protect the rights of religious and ethnic minorities — including the right to protest peacefully against offensive speech. That requires swift action against those who will conspire to maim, murder and terrorize — and the capacity, whenever possible, to neutralize those criminals before they act.

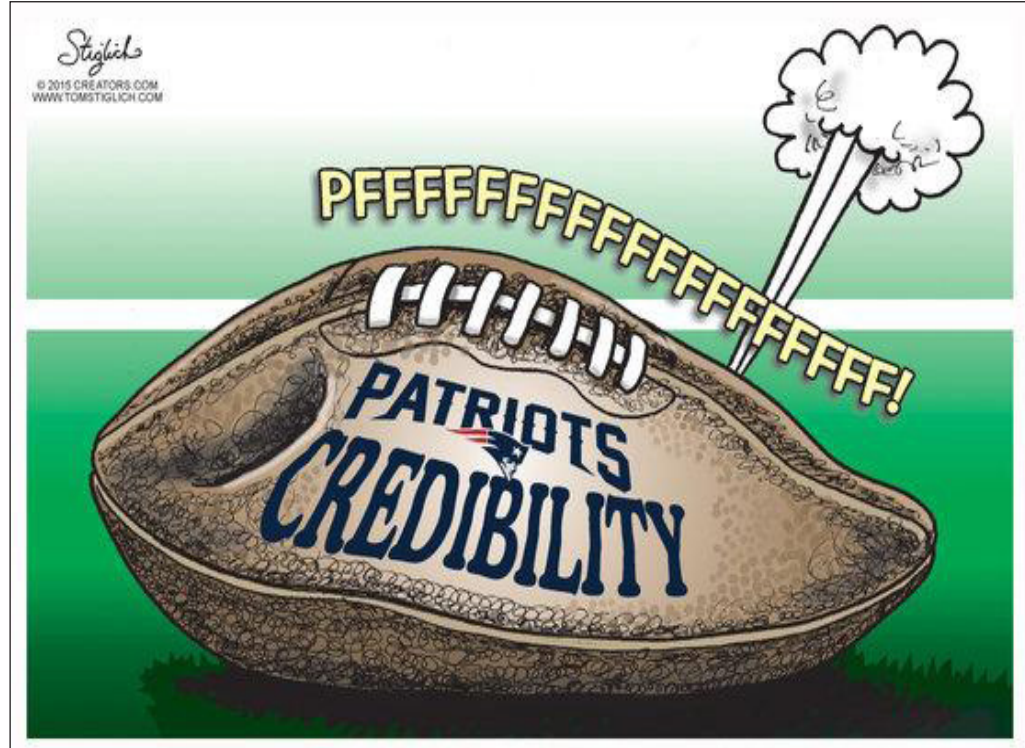
But Americans will need to do much more than surround ourselves with police, armies and intelligence services if we ever hope to overcome our extremist enemies. Effective counterterrorism demands a contrasting narrative of coexistence, respect, fairness and opportunity.

The elements of that political arsenal exist already — in the stories of Ahmed Merabet, the Muslim policeman who died heroically in Paris, and Lassana Bathily, the young Muslim employee who led Jews in the kosher market to safety; in the undeniable fact that the extremists murder hundreds of innocent civilians, overwhelmingly Muslim, every week; and in the secure, prosperous existence that millions of ordinary Muslim families have enjoyed in this country for decades, despite outbursts of prejudice and harassment.

We ought to note with pride that Muslims serve in the U.S. military and every branch of government, including two members of Congress, because the Constitution specifically bans any religious test for public office. (Certain figures on the religious right may need to be reminded, too.) Muslims should know that their holy days are routinely celebrated in the White House by presidents of both parties — even as all religions are subject to disbelief, criticism and even jeering satire in a free society.

The consensus among ordinary Muslims is well-known to pollsters of public opinion: By large majorities, here and abroad, they fear and disdain the violent extremists who have defamed their religion. Let's at least stop trying to change their minds.

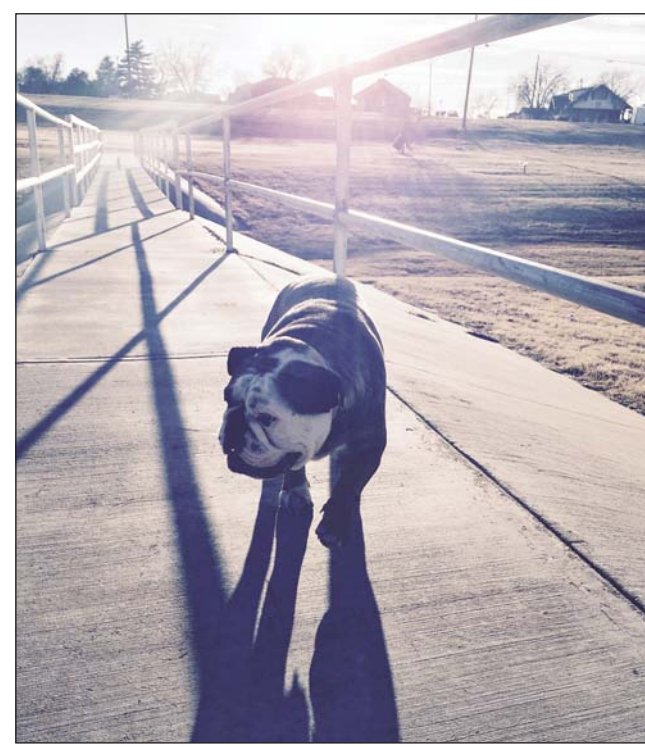

### Words to inspire

### The Bible study at the bar/pool hall

It was 1978 and Shari and I were living in a little town in northeastern Kansas called Sabetha, where I had been the minister at a small church for about two years. One of our ladies at church had a husband who was an unbeliever, in fact he owned the local bar and pool hall. She had asked me to reach out to him

and Jerry and I had even developed a friendly relationship. I had asked if I could talk to him about the Lord and had finally gotten him to agree to have a Bible study. But there was a catch: it had to be during the bar's operating hours and AT THE BAR. I told Jerry, "No problem."

The following Saturday night my wife and some of the other church women were hosting a wedding shower at my house. So I took the groom, Hugh, one of my good buddies, and we headed out to Jerry's bar/pool hall located smack dab in the middle of town on Main St. When Hugh and I walked into the bar, the looks on the faces of his customers weren't all that welcoming. One of the men asked me, "Well, what in the world are you doing in here, preacher?"

I replied, "Well, I'm here to find out if the owner of this establishment is a man of his word." Jerry pointed to the back of the large room and asked one his customers to watch the bar for a while. We walked to the back snooker table.

Jerry said, "So, I guess you're here to call my bluff, huh." I firmly replied, "I sure am. Now are you a man of your word or not?" Jerry nodded that he was. We spent the next hour or two looking at scriptures about sin, forgiveness, salvation and most importantly about JESUS! When we finished Jerry said, "Well, you've certainly given me something to think about." I thanked Jerry for keeping his word and Hugh and I left.

The next day at church one of the men came up to me and informed me that there was an unscheduled men's meeting after church that morning. I thought that was a little strange, but thanked him for letting me know.

When I walked into the room everyone's eyes were fixed on me, and not in the good way either. I sat down and one of the men informed me that the reason for the meeting was that he had received a call about me frequenting the local bar and pool hall and that the men of the congregation wanted an explanation.

I think they probably thought I would be scared, but I was IRATE! I quickly prayed for control of my temper. The Lord was faithful as He always is and kept me from exploding.

I began by telling the leader of the meeting that I would be glad to tell everyone why I had been at the bar, but only after he told me who called him. He said that he couldn't because it was a confidential matter. (LOL! when was the last time someone told you that in an attempt to cover up their own sin or that of a friend) "Oh, you're going to tell me, because that person flat out sinned by not calling me like Matthew 18:15 commands. This whole meeting could have been avoided if that person had just called me. Now who was it?"

I then explained, "I was having a Bible study with Jerry at the back snooker table at the bar. Now do you see why Jesus commanded that we go PRIVATELY first, before we talk to others? This whole stinking mess could have been avoided. Now we even have to make an announcement at church because some of the folks not in this room have probably heard something too. We need to learn a BIG lesson from this.

And we did. I can honestly say that never again while I was there did things go public before they were discussed privately first. Thank You, Jesus, for Your words in Matthew 18. God bless. Mike

 Many thought that it was improbable that Texans would overcome total devastation at the Alamo. And yet the unyielding drive for independence that has always filled the hearts of Texans led to victory at the battle of San Jacinto. And thus began the legend that Texas has become.  
 To this day Texas has been filled with legends who started humbly and succeeded spectacularly.  
 Where a boy like Dan Duncan who grew up dirt poor in East Texas started a business with two trucks and \$10,000, but with hard work and true grit he went on to become one of the wealthiest Texans ever.  
 Where people like Colleen Barrett can climb the ladder

from executive assistant to being listed as one of the most powerful women in America as President of Southwest Airlines.  
 Where a 13-year-old daughter of immigrants from Mexico worked nights in a drapery factory but never gave up on her dreams. Now Eva Guzman is the first Latina to serve as a Justice on the Texas Supreme Court.  
 And where a mother from Wichita Falls who, like so many mothers, chose to stay at home with her children to raise them and instill in them the values she thought important.  
 Although she's now in Heaven with my Dad she's no doubt proud that her timeless love and devotion inspired her son to become the 48th Governor of Texas.

These stories are the promise of Texas. These stories are not the exception because our state truly is exceptional.  
 I am living proof that we live in a state where a young man's life can literally be broken in half and yet he can still rise up and be governor of this great state.  
 As governor I will ensure Texas remains the state that provides that brand of opportunity for every Texan.  
 Texas truly is the land of opportunity, the place where anyone can achieve anything. But as great as Texas is there's more we must do.  
 More for the families stuck in traffic.  
 More for parched towns thirsty for water.  
 More for parents who fear their child is falling behind in school.  
 More for employers searching for skilled workers.

Yet we know too many still live on the fringe of opportunity. For them there is no solace in number one rankings that fail to touch their lives. I speak about children living in broken homes and struggling in broken schools.  
 On this point we cannot be captive to partisan arguments. Our children transcend politics. If Texas is to remain the leader at creating jobs we must become the leader at educating our chil-

dren.  
 Countries sometimes excel because of their military might. States are different. We excel by our mental might. Texas should be the source of the greatest minds the country has ever known.  
 These great minds will not be molded by a cookie-cutter approach to teaching. Instead they will be the product of great teachers who recognize the value and uniqueness of each student.  
 We will cultivate those teachers to educate those students to fill the growing job markets that will keep Texas the economic engine of America.  
 With us today is one of those teachers, my English teacher at Duncanville High School, Nancy Nickel.  
 She taught me more than how to read and write. She taught me to reach for my dreams. Thank you, Mrs. Nickel, and thanks to all of our tremendous teachers.  
 There is no place like Texas. We will ensure that remains just as true for the next generation as it does for those here today.  
 So, take a moment. Look at where you're standing or sitting right now. The ground beneath your feet is more than just grass or pavement.  
 It's the soil that centuries ago bore the hopes and dreams of settlers who risked it all to come to a land that promised freedom and opportunity.  
 Scripture teaches us that tribulation produces perseverance, perseverance, character and character, hope.  
 Texans are filled with hope because our lives have been infused with the perseverance and character that sprang from the tribulations faced by those who came before us.  
 And we must make sure this hollowed ground stirs the hopes and dreams of those who come after us.  
 We must keep Texas on a path that ensures that years from now people will stand on this very ground as grateful to this generation as we are to past generations.  
 To do that we must do more than work to find common ground to solve our problems.  
 We must seek higher ground that will continue to elevate Texas, not just as a leader in this nation, but as a leader in this world. Because as goes Texas, so goes America, and as goes America, so goes the world.  
 So we must take the lead here in Texas — from Amarillo to McAllen, from El Paso to Beaumont. We must work together to ensure that even the future is bigger in Texas.  
 May God bless each and every of you, and may God forever bless the great State of Texas.
