He also hand-makes all of the leather goods sold in the shop and saddles are 100 percent made in-house as well. He also does consignment sales out of the shop.

He runs the business with the help of his wife, Flor.

"She handles more of the customers while I'm in the back doing repairs," Gonzalez said.

When asked about what his favorite part of doing business in Pampa is, Gonzalez said he enjoys the fact that he is able to give back to the community in which he was born and raised.

"I want to help keep the downtown business alive," he

Gonzalez not only provides his services to the city of Pampa. He says he has experienced a lot of success by helping out people from surrounding towns who do not want to drive all the way to Amarillo for their repair needs.










I once told Roger that he and I probably disagree about everything except our love for our country, our commitment to our children and our belief in loyalty — what matters

Full disclosure: I've

I'm a Democrat. I'm a strong supporter of Hillary Clinton and have been for decades. I would love to see the Republicans nominate Romney again and watch Hillary clean his clock. But really, is Romney the best the Republicans can do?

From all I know, Romney is a fine man, a dedicated husband and father, and an extremely successful businessman. But being a fine man does not make you a fine candidate. Success in politics requires more than that. It requires the ability to communicate effectively with people who don't have friends who own NASCAR teams (one of Romney's famous misstatements). It requires the ability to address complex issues in ways that are not only consistent (Romney was well known for his total flip-flops on abortion and gay rights issues), but also sensible, something Romney's proposed answer to the immigration issue — "self-deportation" — was definitely

John Kennedy made a failed attempt to get on the ticket in 1956 before winning the top spot in 1960. Ronald Reagan was defeated by Gerald Ford the first time he sought the nomination of his party, but of course came back to get elected

After Mitt: A GOP message of incentives, sound money and growth

Mitt Romney showed once again that he is truly a class act. In his announcement that he will not be

running for president in 2016, he stated, "I believe that one of our next generation of Republican leaders, one who may not be as well known as I am today, one who has not yet taken their message across the country, one who is just getting started, may well emerge as being better

able to defeat the Democrat nominee.' This was unusual political humility. But let me highlight this specific

phrase: "one who has not yet taken their message across the country." Message.

If there's anything the GOP needs - besides a winner — it's a confident, incentive-based, pro-growth message. The party didn't have one last year, but it won the midterms thanks to President Obama's ineptness. That won't be enough in 2016.

The fourth-quarter GDP report, just out, illustrates the importance of a growth message. GDP came in at a disappointing 2.6 percent, way

below expectations. For the year, only 2.5 percent growth.

For the 22 quarters of so-called economic recovery, real GDP has increased by a meager 2.3 percent annually. Historically, since World War II, we've grown by nearly 3.5 percent yearly. And according to experts, alarmingly low labor-force participation and sinking productivity has reduced America's potential to grow to well below 2 percent. This must be fixed.

All is not lost. The job numbers are better and there's welcome relief from crumbling energy prices and a strong dollar. Consumer confidence has improved. Our resilient freemarket economy is trying to plow ahead.

But my guess is this: If the economy were unshackled of rising taxes and regulations, and if there was a new long-run commitment to sound money and free trade, we could unleash a new American prosperity. Negativism would turn into optimism, and America's global leadership position would be restored.

Unfortunately, while Romney was great at rescuing companies, he ran a poor political campaign. There was no clear growth message. As John Tamny reminds in a recent column,

Obamacare was modeled on Romneycare; Romney talked of a trade war with China, throwing off strong signals of a weaker dollar; Romney never made clear how he would limit government spending; and while he had a reasonably good taxcut plan, he rarely discussed it.

Ultimately, Romney's highly flawed message was unpersuasive to voters. Now, the 2016 GOP candidate must have a strong growth

Somebody on the campaign trail should also talk about money. New York Sun editor Seth Lipsky points out that the GOP platform last time around called for a monetary commission to look at a metallic standard, yet Romney never mentioned sound money.

The Fed ran completely amok with its QE program. It ballooned its balance sheet by more than \$4 trillion, yet there was no sustainable pickup in real or nominal GDP. Actually, this monetarist failure was a good thing: If the turnover, or velocity, of money had been stable, instead of crashing, today's inflation rate would be 15 percent rather than practically zero.

So the next Republican candidate

S.-Russia clash in Ukraii

Among Cold War presidents, from Truman to Bush I, there was an

unwritten rule: Do not challenge Moscow in its Central and Eastern Europe sphere of

influence. In crises over Berlin

in 1948 and 1961, the Hungarian Revolution in 1956 and the Warsaw Pact invasion of Prague in 1968, U.S. forces in Europe staved in their barracks.

We saw the Elbe as Moscow's red line, and they saw it as ours.

While Reagan sent weapons to anti-Communist rebels in Angola, Nicaragua and Afghanistan, to the heroic Poles of Gdansk he sent only mimeograph machines.

That Cold War caution and prudence may be at an end.

For President Obama is being goaded by Congress and the liberal interventionists in his party to send lethal weaponry to Kiev in its civil war with pro-Russian rebels in Donetsk and Luhansk.

That war has already cost 5,000 lives — soldiers, rebels, civilians. September's cease-fire in Minsk has broken down. The rebels have lately seized 200 added square miles, and directed artillery fire at Mariupol, a Black Sea port between Donetsk and

Luhansk and Crimea.

Late last year, Congress sent Obama a bill authorizing lethal aid to Kiev. He signed it. Now the New York Times reports that NATO Commander Gen. Philip Breedlove favors military aid to Ukraine, as does Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel. John Kerry and Gen. Martin Dempsey of the joint chiefs are said

to be open to the idea. A panel of eight former national security officials, chaired by Michele Flournoy, a potential Defense Secretary in a Hillary Clinton administration, has called for the U.S. to provide \$3 billion in military aid to Ukraine, including anti-tank missiles, reconnaissance drones, Humvees, and radar to locate the sources of artillery and missile fire.

Such an arms package would guarantee an escalation of the war, put the United States squarely in the middle, and force Vladimir Putin's hand.

Thus far, despite evidence of Russian advisers in Ukraine and claims of Russian tank presence, Putin denies that he has intervened. But if U.S. cargo planes start arriving in Kiev with Javelin anti-tank missiles, Putin would face several choices.

He could back down, abandon the rebels, and be seen as a bully who, despite his bluster, does not stand up for Russians everywhere.

More in character, he could take U.S. intervention as a challenge and send in armor and artillery to enable the rebels to consolidate their gains, then warn Kiev that, rather than see the rebels routed, Moscow will intervene militarily.

Or Putin could order in the Russian army before U.S. weapons arrive, capture Mariupol, establish a land bridge to Crimea, and then tell Kiev he is ready to negotiate.

What would we do then? Send U.S. advisers to fight alongside the Ukrainians, as the war escalates and the casualties mount? Send U.S. warships into the Black Sea?

Have we thought this through, as we did not think through what would happen if we brought down Saddam, Gadhafi and Mubarak?

America has never had a vital interest in Crimea or the Donbass worth risking a military clash with Russia. And we do not have the military ability to intervene and drive out the Russian army, unless we are prepared for a larger war and the potential devastation of the Ukraine.

What would Eisenhower, Kennedy, Nixon or Reagan think of an American president willing to risk military conflict with a nuclear-armed Russia over two provinces in southeastern Ukraine that Moscow had ruled from the time of Catherine the Great?

What is happening in Ukraine is a tragedy and a disaster. And we are in part responsible, having egged on the Maidan coup that overthrew the elected pro-Russian government.

But a greater disaster looms if we get ourselves embroiled in Ukraine's civil war. We would face, first, the near certainty of defeat for our allies, if not ourselves. Second, we would push Moscow further outside Europe and the West, leaving her with no alternative but to deepen ties to a rising China.

Given the economic crisis in Russia and the basket case Ukraine is already, how do we think a larger and wider war would leave both nations?

Alarmists say we cannot let Putin's annexation of Crimea stand. We cannot let Luhansk and Donetsk become a pro-Russian enclave in Ukraine, like Abkhazia, South Ossetia or the Transdniester republic.

But no one ever thought these enclaves that emerged from the ethnic decomposition of the Soviet Union were worth a conflict with Russia. When did Luhansk and Donetsk

become so? Rather than becoming a co-belligerent in this civil war that is not our war, why not have the United States assume the role of the honest broker who brings it to an end. Isn't that how real peace prizes are won?

(the senior) lost to Reagan in the 1980 nominating contest, but came back in 1988 to win one term.

Running for president is a lot harder than it looks, and many candidates have a tough time of it in their first go-round (think Al Gore in 1988).

But Romney hasn't had just one chance. If he runs again, it will be his third effort at the top spot. If the first run is the rehearsal for the big show, and then you fall flat in the big show, what is it that makes you more qualified or more electable the third time around? Write to me and tell me if I'm wrong, but I'm having a hard time thinking of any candidate, at least in modern times, who succeeded on the third go-round.

Where does that leave the race for president? With two candidates who enjoy widespread name recognition — Hillary Clinton and Jeb Bush and a slew of actual

or potential candidates whose biggest problem is not that no one has heard of them, but that when they do, they will be seen as hard-core ideologues (who tend to do well in primaries but not so well in general elections). It was only after losing in 1980,1984 and 1988 that Democrats, even the old ideologues like me, were willing to nominate a self-described moderate from Arkansas. Maybe the Republicans' problem is that they just haven't lost enough national elections to reexamine their own positions.

So who will be our candidates on Election Day in 2016? Two years is a lifetime in politics. Everything can change. But if I had to guess today, I'd say we may well be faced with a historic run between the wife of one president and the son and brother of another. Clinton v. Bush. Kind of makes me feel young again.

should state a desire for the Fed to return to a marketbased discipline using gold, commodities, dollarexchange value and bondmarket indicators. Contrary to conventional wisdom, the King Dollar comeback, along with falling energy prices, has not only delivered a tax-cut effect to consumers, it's reduced all business production costs, making the economy more competitive. GOP candidates should not be afraid to talk sound money. It's pro-growth.

They also must focus laser-like on the importance of incentives to grow the economy. For instance, rather than propose spending roughly \$1.6 trillion on child tax credits (according to the Tax Policy Center), Senator Marco Rubio, an otherwise sound thinker, would be better advised to propose a flattening of marginal tax rates to perhaps 15 and 28 percent. This would give everyone in the middle class larger tax savings and stronger incentives to keep more of the

extra dollar they earn.

We're about a year away from the first Republican primaries. The GOP has a solid bench. But the wannabes must get cracking on the central growth message of incentives, freedom of choice and sound money to unleash a new wave of American prosperity.

Pampa recordó a las llamadas de la estafa del IRS

INFORME DEL PERSONAL

A medida que los calendarios se vuelven a febrero, la temporada de impuestos está calentando a medida que las esperas en tu aumento preparador de impuestos preferido. Desafortunadamente esto también abre la puerta para que los estafadores para llamar y tratar de engañar a los contribuyentes a pagar más de lo que deberían.

Los residentes locales han recibido llamadas personificando Servicio de Impuestos Internos. Las llamadas telefónicas son en realidad un mensaje generado por ordenador. El mensaje que le dice que usted le debe al IRS, pero no le dice cuánto. Luego piden que llame a 207-291-2911 y pagar el monto adeudado con una tarjeta de crédito.

De acuerdo con un contador local, el IRS se comunicará con usted por correo si usted le debe dinero. Si usted no responde en 30 días a continuación, recibirá una carta certi-

ficada. Si después de 30 días adicionales no muestra en su puerta para entregar el cheque. cosa que usted necesita para enviar un cable responde entonces alguien de una oficina del IRS vendrá a su casa. El IRS no hace contacto con alguien por teléfono o exigir el pago inmediato con tarieta de crédito.

Departamento de Policía de Pampa sólo tiene conocimiento de una llamada IRS recientemente, pero es consciente de múltiples estafas en los últimos meses.

"La primera es una estafa Publishers Clearing House. En éste, la persona que llama dice que están en la ciudad y están dispuestos a entregar su cheque por varios millones de dólares. Incluso te ofrecen una descripción de su casa y los coches, que se cree que se han obtenido de Google Maps, para hacerle creer la historia. A continuación, se le pedirá a la transferencia de alambre alrededor de \$ 800 a ellos para cubrir los impuestos y tasas, que se tiene que hacer antes de que se les mos que se mantenga alejado de cualquier

La próxima estafa consiste en una llamada de alguien que dice ser con el IRS, que indica que usted debe dinero en impuestos atrasados. A continuación, te exigen para la transferencia de dinero de forma inmediata o se enfrentan a ser arrestado.

Y la última estafa es un cheque por varios miles de dólares que llega a usted de forma inesperada en el correo. El cheque viene con instrucciones para hacerlo efectivo, mantener una cierta cantidad, y luego enviar la balanza a otra persona a través de transferencia bancaria ", dijo el Departamento de Policía de Pampa en un comunicado de prensa.

En cada uno de ellos, se verá una cosa en común. 'Transferencia bancaria'. Cuando se trata de determinar si una llamada o pieza de correo es una estafa o no, que le recomenda-

de transferencia a otra. Si bien hay razones legítimas para usar este método de envío de dinero, la falta de poder rastrear la transferencia hace muy propensos a actividades delictivas como estafas. También te recordamos que si algo parece demasiado bueno para ser verdad, entonces lo más probable es algo que usted no quiere ninguna parte. 


