the State of Ilinois.
Whate college graduates can be summed up in figures of the nation's
gross national product, and the state of the national economy. First, this nation experienced a boom in technology, the
appliance boom with home appliances and electrical entertainment leading the way. The United States was the leading man-
ufacturing nation in the free world, after World War II, with afacturing nation in the free world, after world War 1 , winh
all American products being in world demand.
Today however, other nations not only compete with the U. S., but in many respects, produce items of equal quality
cheaper. This especially true in the business machines field, as typewriters, adding machines, calculators, etc., are manufa
tured out of the U. S. and shipped here for marketing For the time being, ocllege students appear to be shying
away from crowded fields, and are seeking schooling in fields promising employment.
The fact that the 185 companies surveyed by the Northwestern Placement Service had an ollege graguate last year is
for every position filled by a coll
lunt testimony reached as yet.
The reason technically trained students are finding employment more easily than college graduates, is obviously the pre-
ference of employers for employees with special skills to pull ference of employers for employees with special skils to puld
their own weight in various industrial or technically skilled
fields. Apparently the time has arrived when this nation needs
technicians more than it does intellectuals, repairmen more technicians more and in genere
than designers
than white collared workers.
