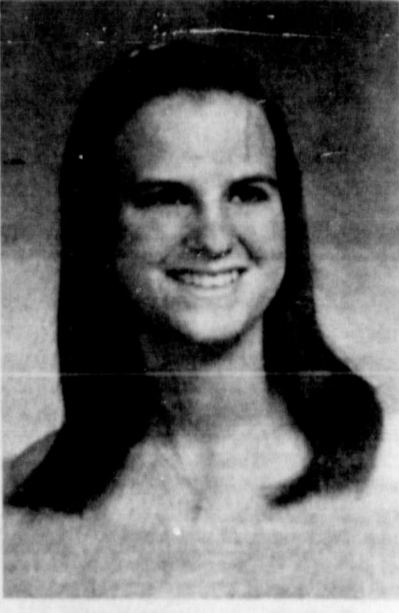

An engineer with a bachelor and master's degree from the University of Texas at Austin, he was owner of Texas Chemical Co. in Houston at the time of his death.

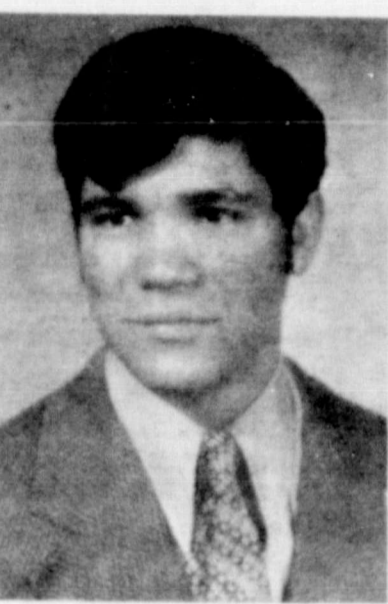

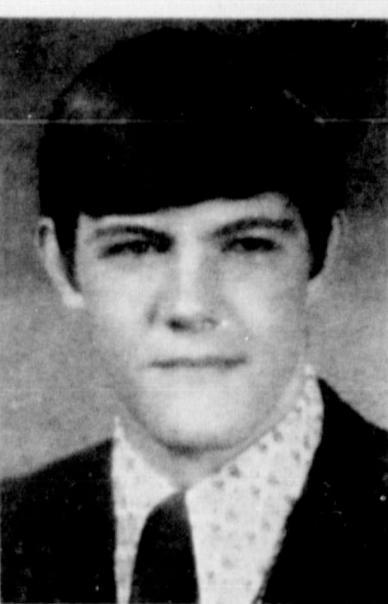

## EDITORIAL

### Its Graduation Time Again!

To the graduates of 1973, we extend our congratulations and wish for you a lifetime of continuing success on whatever pathway life may lead you in the coming years.

To our college graduates, we would encourage them to become worthwhile citizens in whatever area, community or city they may choose to reside.

To our high school graduates, we would encourage continued efforts to round out their scholastic lives, either with continued formal education or in some specialized field of endeavor.

This editorial of The Memphis Democrat is one of a continuing string of editorials this publication has run, year after year, over the decades, saluting the graduating classes of Lakeview, Estelline and Memphis. Lakeview seniors graduate next Tuesday, Estelline and Memphis seniors graduate tomorrow night.

Graduation night is always a special time in the life of an individual. It is like reaching a long awaited point in time and space, or opening a door to a new life.

Life takes on a different meaning, with different responsibilities. As is so true in all aspects of human existence, some students, upon graduation, thrive in the new atmosphere, while others still need the guiding reins of home environment, discipline of strict teachers, or of society, in order to accomplish constructive endeavors.

But in the final analysis, it is up to each and every individual to seek and find his place in life. We are not given a crystal ball to gaze into to see how our lives will come out. Decisions made during the ages of 18 and 23 have a decided effect upon the life of each of us. Today, the decision is not so clear cut. Inflation has cut deeply into all things and unless an individual chooses wisely of a profession, employment may be hard to find.

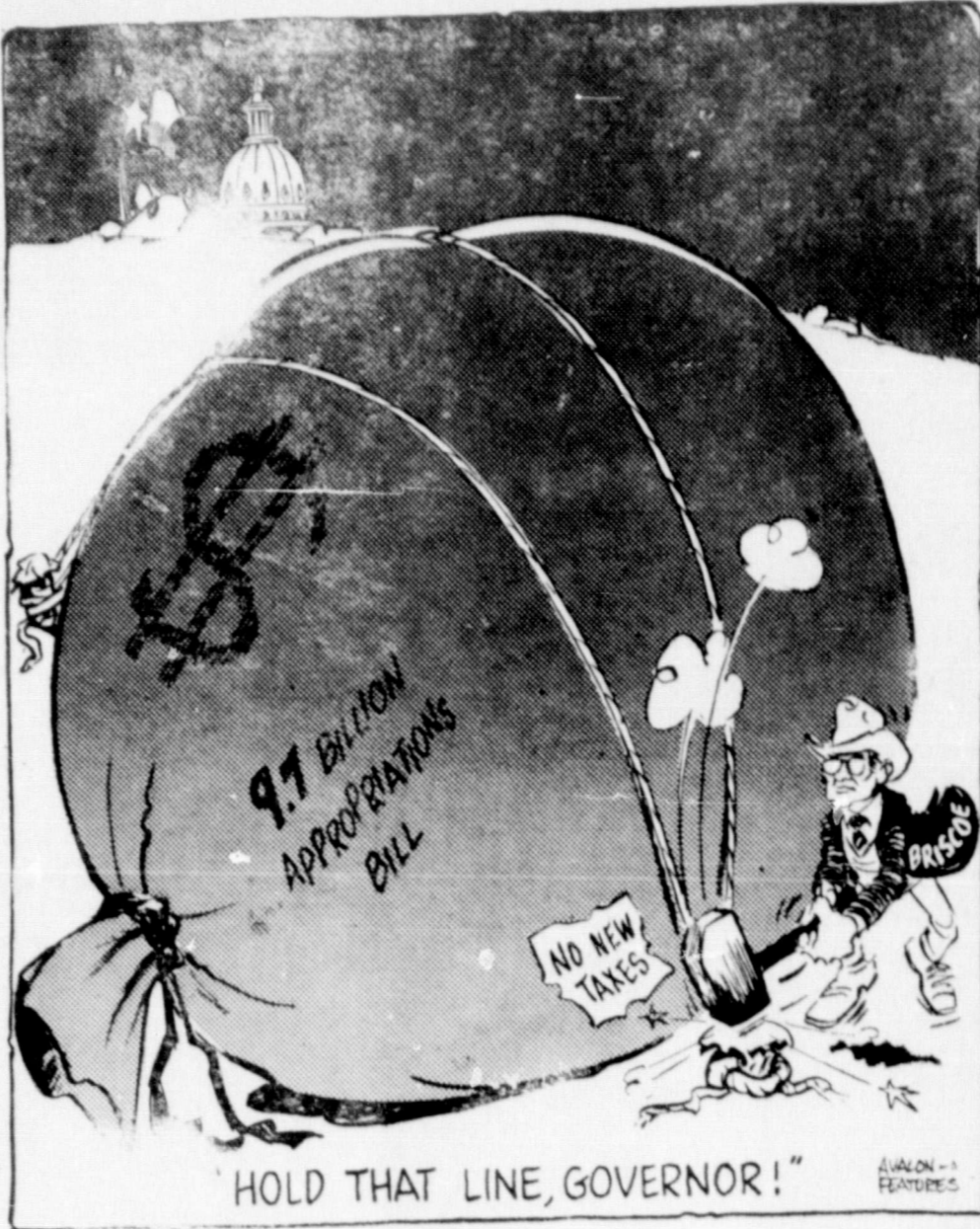
There are certain principles necessary for anyone to follow to become successful in life. It may appear that these are old fashioned, not applicable in this modern era, or just "establishment" ideas society tries to force on young people to make them conform to a set pattern.

**Sad Commentary**  
It is a sad commentary that crime has replaced militant protests as the No. 1 problem on U. S. campuses. While nobody outside the university cared much for protests, it was easier to understand academic unrest than downright crime.  
Even if the students try to dignify theft by calling it a "rip-off," the fact remains that the problem of people taking property that does not belong to them is rising on most college campuses.  
Not only thievery, but assault and other types of crime are a problem to campus officials and police.  
Wichita State University has battled a growing crime rate for years. Thefts of cameras, clothes,

stereos and books top the crime list, but burglary, assault and auto theft are also fairly common.  
At the University of Texas in Austin, campus police have waged war against campus crime and for a while last year were warning coed students to avoid walking across the campus at night for fear of rape.

Closer to home at West Texas State University, there have been incidences of theft, including the well publicized theft of mail and checks from the campus Post Office, as well as a number of motel thefts in nearby Amarillo, involving WT students.  
The trend of crime on the campus reflects both the growing crime rate nationally and the changing attitude of the public toward educational institutions. It hasn't been many years since colleges were primarily viewed as austere places of intellectual discipline and certainly not a gathering ground for people with criminal tendencies.  
Most universities have a campus police force that is armed, uniformed and trained. A far cry from the lonely night watchman of a generation or so ago.  
A person has to wonder at the values being taught when every car parked on the typical college

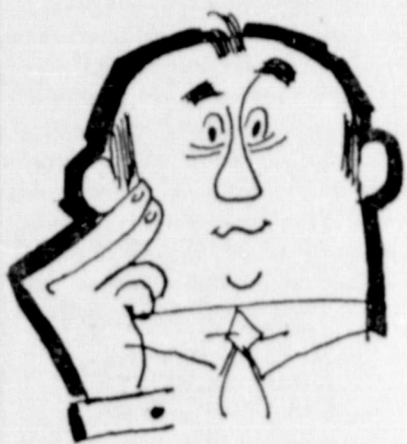

**"Let's Talk Memphis"**



By FRANK B. FOXHALL

One of the greatest assets a town or community can have is an adequate water supply. Memphis is fortunate to have such a water supply with rates lower than any other town in the Panhandle. Our water is approved by the State Health Dept. and requires treatment at a very low level. Our water is supplied by 20 wells, some of which are original hand dug and still flowing. Five are considered deep wells. We have one half million gallon storage. The water is brought from the nearby well field in Donley County to Memphis by one ten inch and one six inch line. The consumption level periodically reaches one million gallons per day. There are 1370 meters operating as of April 1973.

Recently the water dept. completed a six inch water line, 2,200 feet long in south Memphis to improve fire protection and increase volume.

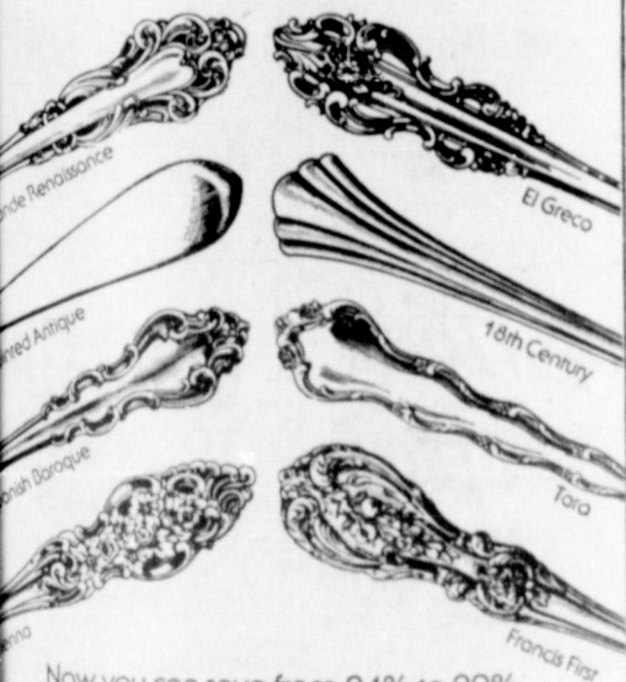

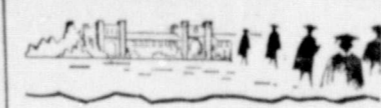

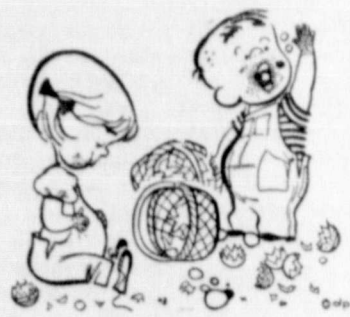
ing at Cameron College of Lawton, Okla. He is leaving next week for Africa where he will teach for a year. We wish George the best of everything in Africa.

## Arts & Crafts TID BITS

By Earldine Hudlow

Since almost every family has a relative or friend who at least dabbles in oil painting and has been good enough to share a painting or two I think it would well to consider the cleaning and preservation of an oil.

First, determine if a varnish or other finish has been applied after the painting was completed. If not and it has been three to six months since its completion it should be applied.

Two commercial finishes are available and maybe applied by the layman. They are a varnish (gloss) and matte (dull). It is extremely important that the painting be free of dust and grease film before anything is applied. This should be done by rubbing the surface gently with wads of absorbant cotton lightly moistened with turpentine followed immediately with dry cotton wads. The painting should be laid horizontally and the surface supported from behind. Continue the same position to apply the finish.

The finish is brushed on (thin coats) according to directions on the container.

As to the choice of finish, paintings done in darker colors usually prefer the gloss while the matte seems to compliment the lighter ones; however it is a matter of personal preference by the owner or the artist. Both emphasize colors in the paintings and give it that all important protective coating which can be cleaned without disturbing the paints.

Above all things, do not use soap and water to clean them. Any museum curator can tell you

## Farmland In Hall County Up In Price

NEW YORK, May 12—What price farmland in Hall County? How much have land values gone up, locally, in the last few years?

The competition for farm properties, as they become available, has become more intense than ever.

Farmers are bidding against one another in the desire to enlarge their acreage and attain better operating efficiency through the use of more sophisticated machinery.

Also, as pointed out by the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago in its recent Agricultural Letter, the large farms are able to achieve economies in the purchase of supplies and equipment and advantages in the marketings of their products.

It finds that the boom in farmland prices reached a peak, nationally, in the past year. They were 10 percent over the previous year. It was the largest year-to-year gain since 1951.

In Hall County, as elsewhere, the values have been zooming upward. Back in 1964, farm real estate in the local area averaged \$93 per acre, according to the Census of Agriculture taken that year. The figure represents the price of land plus the buildings on it.

Throughout the State of Texas, at the time, the average value of such property was \$106 per acre.

Now, nine years later, farm real estate has reached a record high \$170 per acre, the state-wide average as of November, 1972, according to the latest findings of the Department of
