According to a telephone survey of 12 ginning points in Hall County, there have been 23,905 bales hauled into the gins as of this morning. This is an increase of about 7,000 over a week ago, showing the harvest is pretty much into full swing.

Depending upon what the total harvest figure will be, this 23,905 bales could represent as much as fifty percent of the total 1974 crop

As has been the practice in the past, if fair weather continues through Christmas holidays, cotton industries will be busy right. through the holidays again this year, as farmers will not take time to enjoy the holidays.

Classing Report Cotton harvest was halted in mid. week last week by light rain over the Memphis, Texas area, according to W. E. Cain, In Charge of the USDA, Agricultural Marketing Service Office. "Clear, dry weather allowed harvest to resume late as Thursday and gin-





Born the daughter of a farmer and Civil War fighter near Carthage in deep East Texas, Florence Pearl Hooker grew up as one of six children in the household of the Hooker family. Two brothers and three sisters have since pass ed away. Her father was a member of Hood's Brigade in the Civil War who returned to toil in thes soil of Fanola County.

Raised and attending school in Carthage, the county seat, Miss Hooker met a young merchant, C Baldwin, and married September 1894. The marriage spanned 76 years before Mr. Baldwin expired in 1971 at the age of 97.

Florence Pearl and C. Baldwin moved to Clarendon to open up a dry goods store soon after the turn of the century. They moved to Dawson County in 1925 to es. tablish Baldwin's Store, still one of Lamesa's leading dry goods stores, and still in the family under the management of a grand-


