Mrs. Pierce was a member of the First United Methodist Church and of the Order of the Eastern Star. Memphis High's James Beck is the only county athlete to win a State Championship. Beck set a new school record with a 49.2 440-yd. dash to win the event, edging out Council Patton of Timpon at the tape. James said, "I was in lane two, with Eddie Johnson of Knox City in lane three and Patton in lane one. Patton caught me at the 220 mark but I had caught Johnson so I knew I could edge him. "At the 330 (only 100 yards to go) I knew I had to finish strong for I was three or four yards back from Patton. Then I just looked at the finish line and tried to get there as fast as I could," he said. Beck stretched at the tape to edge Patton. "It was my personal goal to win state in the 440. I'm glad I set a new school record but I wanted to run in the 48 figures. Maybe if I had run the first 220 a little faster I could have done that," Beck said. Also setting a new school record was the 440-yd. Relay team which came in third, running a 43.2. Schulenburg had a 42.5 for first place and Karmack had a 43.2 time edging Memphis at the finish line. Fred Alexander, Charles Bryley, Rickie Sprull and James Beck will have their names listed in the permanent school record book as being the best sprint relay team in the school's history. Rickie Sprull, in the 100-yd. dash finished out of the places. Coach George Berry said, "We were very pleased to place two on the winners' stand at Austin."

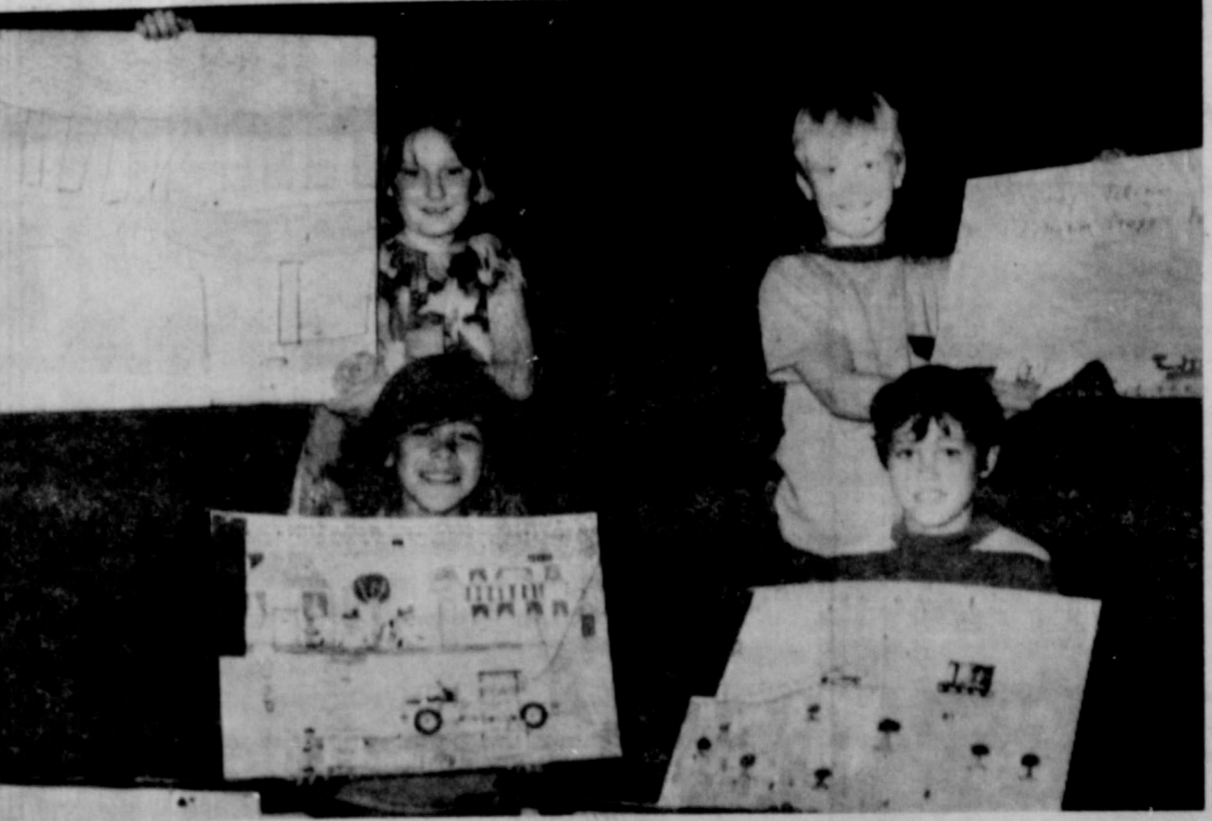

## EDITORIAL

### Graduation, 1975!

Congratulations graduates, for you have reached the cross-road of your life, the point where you have completed your required schooling and a point where society and the state determine you are an adult.

You will soon be taking your place in the adult world, either by going to college, serving in a military position, entering the labor force, or just drifting around.

Unfortunately, there is no "big, wide, wonderful world" awaiting for you out there; rather, there is the same old world there has always been, full of the same old troubles and injustices. However, many before you have made for themselves a place in this world whereby they can live a happy and useful life, and chances are that you can also if you but try.

You are graduating during a period of time when your country is not at war, but this does not mean you will be spared the heartache of the effects of warfare.

Whatever thoughts for the future are buzzing around in the heads of our graduates this month will shape, for the most part, the future course of their lives. Many of the older generation can still remember the days of their own graduation, and many of the decisions made at that time.

Many young men and women have set out upon a road in life, only to see road blocks and detours. Failures and set backs do occur in life and the most important aspect of these is not that they occur, but rather how quickly a person can bounce back to try again.

## ACROSS THE DESK

### What Other Editors Say

#### KEEPING COSTS DOWN

Hard times are forcing Congress and the Ford administration to take a new look at some of the wasteful practices in American economic life.

The reappraisal is good for the country — and good for the consumer, who needs all the economic help he can get.

One example of the new cost-cutting spirit is the move in Congress to repeal federal "fair trade" laws that permit manufacturers to fix retail prices on cosmetics, shoes, hardware, books and hundreds of other consumer products.

Such laws are costing consumers as much as \$2 billion a year in the 35 "fair trade" states, where retail prices on some items tend to be artificially high.

Also under congressional scrutiny is something called the Davis-Bacon Act, which forces contractors on federal projects to pay the "prevailing wage" to construction workers.

The "prevailing wage" usually is interpreted to mean the highest union wage rate in the area, which adds millions of dollars to the cost of everything built with federal money.

For his part, President Ford is trying to cut costs by requiring that every federal agency figure out the hidden expense (to the consumer) in every rule, regulation or piece of legislation it proposes.

Ford has called a special meeting of 10 major regulatory agencies in an effort to stimulate more competition and eliminate excess

#### DEATH TAXES

If people want to write their Congressman and Senator about an issue that may be important to them, they might consider writing in support of HR 1793, introduced by Texan Rep. Omar Burleson.

This bill would, at long last, take some of the sting out of estate taxes.

It would increase the federal estate tax exemption to \$200,000 from the present \$60,000 which was written into law back in 1942.

Since that time, inflation and changing circumstances have eroded the value of the \$60,000 exemption, moving estates into higher and higher tax brackets.

Owners of farm and ranch land have found that estate taxes are higher and higher because of this. Land that has been in the same family for generations is being sold to pay estate taxes.

Right now the chances of this bill becoming law look pretty good and if lawmakers get some encouragement they might enact it. Rep. Al Ullman, chairman of the Ways and Means Committee is in favor of it, and there are about 40 co-sponsors for the bill.

The purchasing power of the dollar in December, 1974, was about equal to 31 cents in 1942. Divide \$60,000 by 31 cents and you get \$193,548, not much less than the terms of the bill.

It doesn't take much of an estate these days to reach the \$60,000 figure, in a time of \$35,000 houses and \$6,000 automobiles, a personal estate can easily hit the \$60,000 mark now for what must be considered an average person.

Just a few years ago \$60,000 was a fortune considered out of reach except for the rich.

Marital deductions would be more generous under the measure, and it would lighten the death tax load all the way around. We have never been able to see what claim the government has on any estate, but as long as there is going to be an estate tax, it ought to be a fair one.

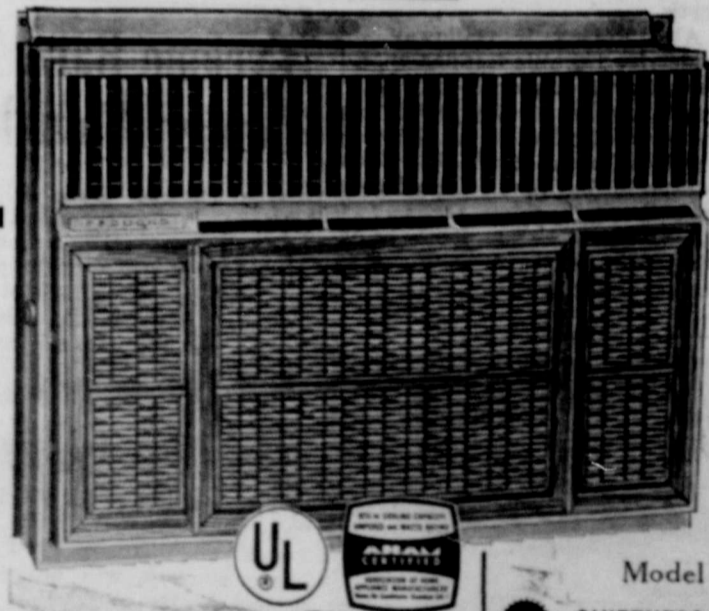

The club will not present a scholarship this year because no applications were submitted.

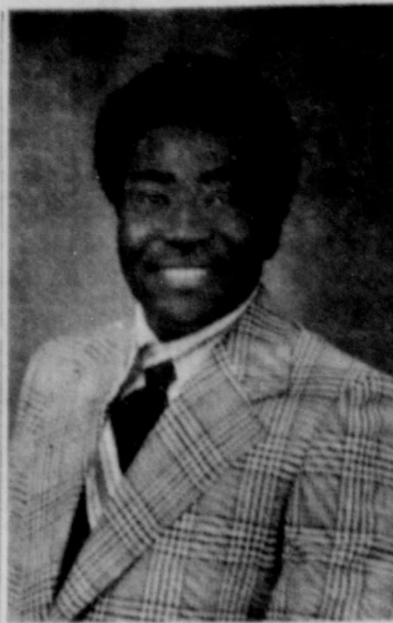
