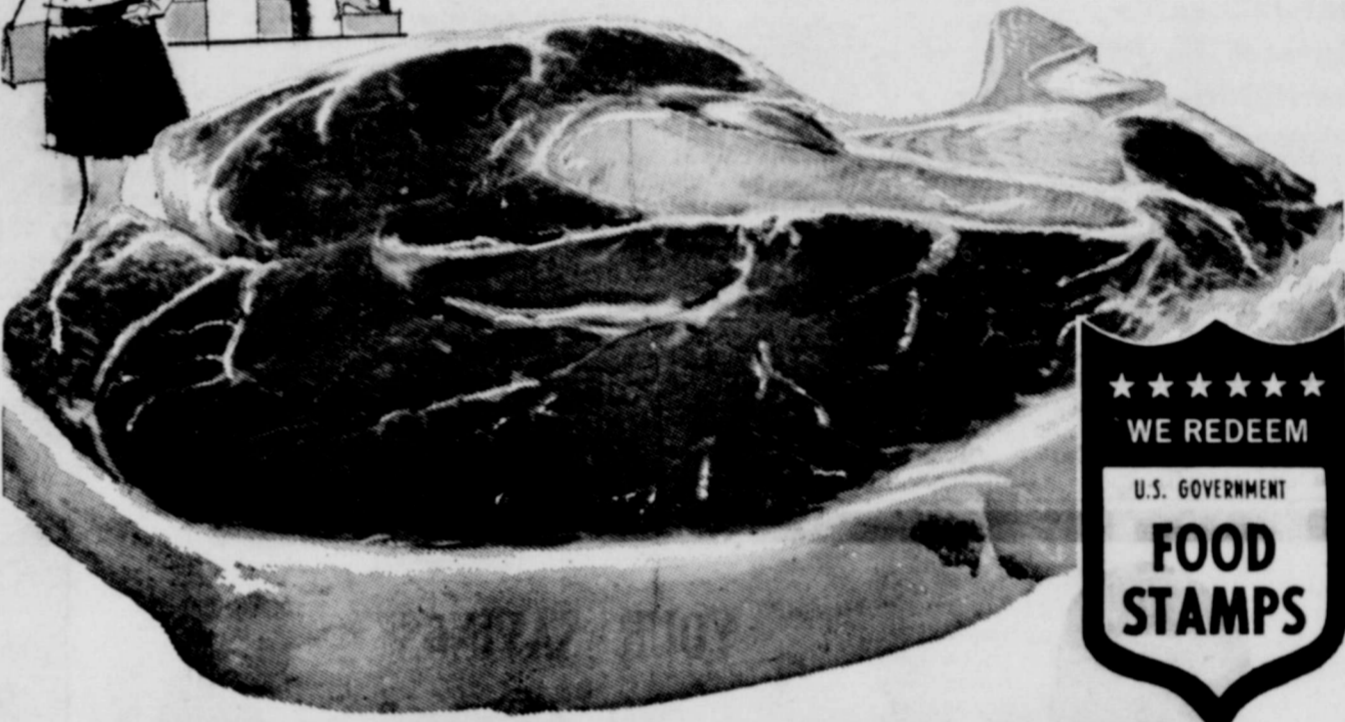

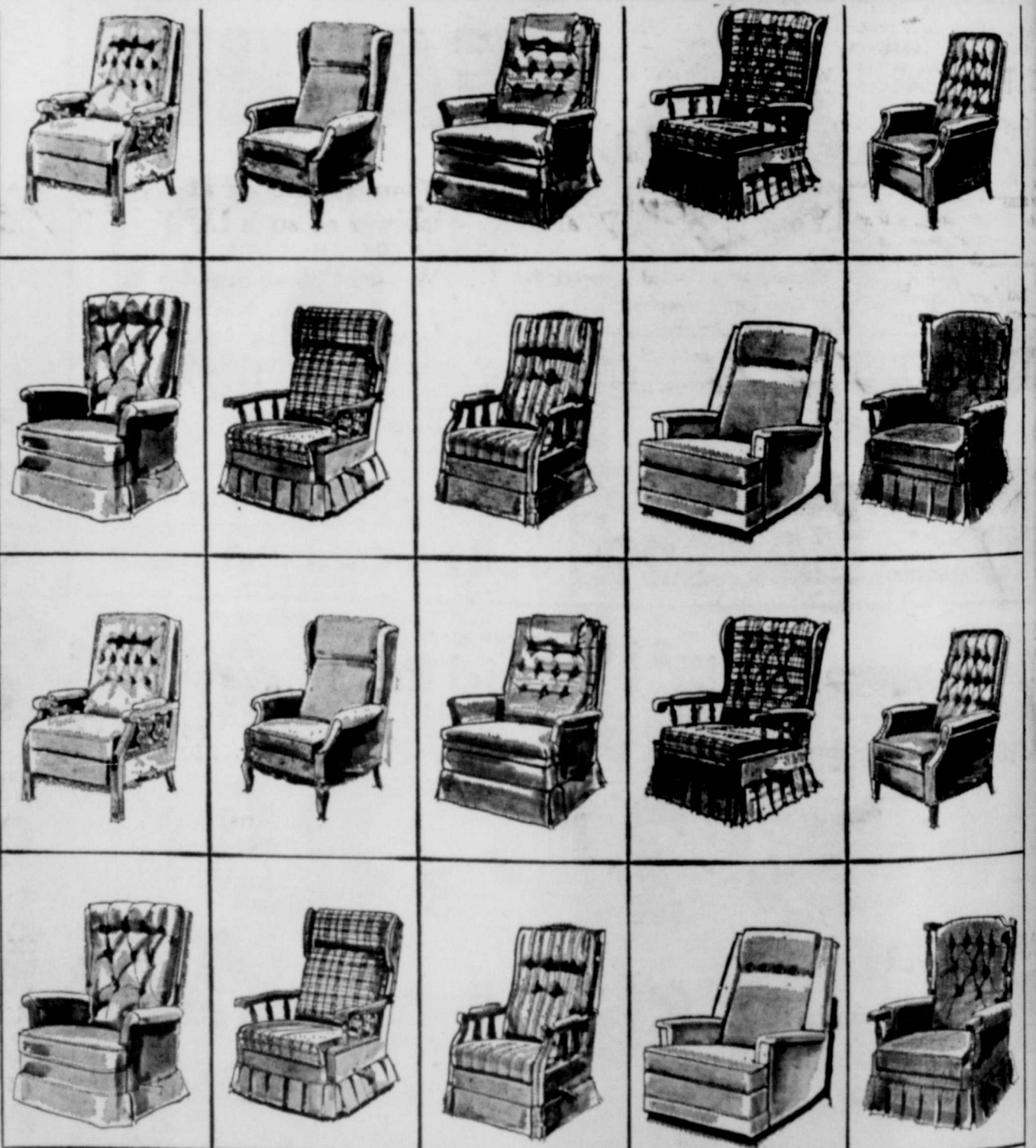

Highway Dept. Lets Contract For Area Work

CHILDRESS — Highway construction contracts let in May by the Texas Highway Commission include Childress area work, announced District Engineer Lewis H. White of Childress.

A contract was awarded to High Plains Pavers, Inc. of Plainview. Low bid was \$230,881.80.

The contract is for approximately 21.5 miles of seal coat as follows:

U. S. Highway 287, from the East City Limit of Clarendon to 0.4 Mi. East of Hedley, in Donley County;

U. S. Highway 287, from the Red River Bridge north of Estelline, to the Childress County Line, in Hall County; and, on F.M. Road 268, from U. S. 287 north and east a distance of 4.0 miles, in Childress County.

The project, which will require an estimated 100 working days, will be under the Highway Department supervision of Everett H. Monroe of Clarendon.

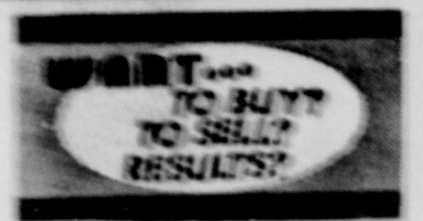
