



Interested 4-H'ers will focus on typical foods in the Southwest when the Kinney County 4-H Food Show gets underway March 7th at the Brackettville High School Homemaking Cottage with 18 competing in senior, junior and preteen divisions.

Following the "Southwest Foods" theme, youth from the Kinney County 4-H Clubs will prepare main dishes, side dishes, breads and desserts, or snacks and beverages as they chose one of the four entry classes for competition.

pood Show contestants will set up displays between 5:00-5:30 p.m. The public is invited to attend the Awards Program which will begin at 6:30 followed by a Tasting Tea.

Youth ages 14-19 will compete in the Senior Division, while the Junior Division contest involves ages 11-13, and the Freteens are 9 and 10 year-olds.

"Because our foods program emphasizes nutrition, contestants will be asked to demonstrate knowledge of nutrition, meal planning, food buying and meal service as well as the ability to prepare food," Ms. Becky Rogers, Assistant County Extention Agent-at-Large explained. 4-H members have been studying foods and nutrition in project groups taught by volunteer adult and junior leaders.
