

\$100,000 FOR STREETS

BRACKETT GETS FEDERAL GRANT for STREET PAVING

U. S. Representative, "Chick" Kazen, informed the Brackettville City Hall late last Friday, that their grant for \$100,000.00 for Street Paving, had been approved by the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

City Secretary, Roland Williams, stated that he received conformation of the grant this Tuesday from H.U.D. He further stated: "That the City must file an Environmental Impact Statement and wait fifteen (15) days. If will take approximately 30 days before work can be started."

The tenative streets to be paved under the grant are: Beaumont St.; Brown; Sweeney; Fort; El Paso; Fulton; Edwards; and others depending on the costs incurred.




The Brackettville Little



COUNTY AGENT REPORT

Weather conditions continue favorable for the spread of the tenacious screwworm, and livestock producers in Kinney County should keep on the alert for possible cases in their herds, cautions Carl Esser, county agent with the Texas Agriculture Extension Service.

"Screwworm cases have been increasing by leaps and bounds in South and Southwest Texas," says Esser, "and the flies are continuing to move out to other areas of the state. So it's vital to check animals regularly, to treat all types of wounds and to submit all worm samples for identification."

Samples should be sent to the Screwworm Lab, Box 969, Mission, Texas, 78572. Containers for mailing samples are available at the County Extension Office and from local veterin-

At the end of June, 1,744 screwworm cases has been confirmed in Texas for 1975, well above the number recorded during the same period last year. To make matters worse, 1,164 of 1975 cases were recorded during June. Screwworms are popping up in some counties that have not recorded cases since

"This means that producers' had better prepare for an onslaught of screwworms unless cases are reported rapidly so that sterile flies can be dispersed over the areas where cases are confirmed," points out Esser. "Unless target areas are identified by virtue of sample submitted and identified the sterile fly program cannot function effectively."

Esser notes that a large number of the screwworm cases confirmed this yeat in Texas gave come from the navels of newborn calves. "Working" wounds such as those resulting from shearing docking, earmarking, branding, and castrating are also prime locations fro screwworm flies to lay their eggs.

"Any working of livestock should be delayed until this fall if at all possible," advises Esser. "If such work is absolutely necessary, a USDA-approved spray or dip should be applied to any and all wounds."

She is Matron of Nova Light Court #413, Secretary of The Seminole Indain Scout Association, Member of the Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce.


She has served on the Mayor's Communtiy Council, The American Cancer Society and is a member of the Women's Home Mission, St. John's Baptist Church.

THE GOOD KID


He doesn't smoke or partake of drink Or chase around with wild women. Never has he spent a night in the clink Of morality he is vivid speciman.
