OPEN LETTER TO CITIZENS OF BRACKETTVILLE, TEXAS

I do agree that Mr. Williams deserves a lot of credit for his city affiliated business. Although, as stated in this particular letter of March 4, 1977 at various times Mr. Williams has already received recognition, so he is not a likely candidate for the same awards.

I will admit that Mr. Williams is a hard worker, and has done a good job, but then to give him all the credit for running the city and leaving out the City Council & the Mayor and City Staff, in my opinion, this stands to be corrected.

This present city council in my opinion is a hard working council. You have good men doing their work and I (Mayor) say that they are as good as any previous city councilmen.

Credit due for city work done within the last three years (for Federal grants etc.) should also be given to Mrs. Elia Santos with the Middle Rio Grande Development Council, along with the Citizens Participation Committee, the concerned citizens that showed up for the public meetings and also to Elia Esparza, Clerk.

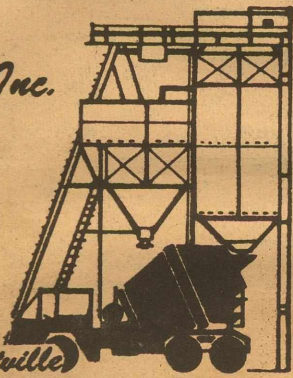

However, since you presented the City payroll schedule to this newspaper, it is my personal opinion that the pay schedules are ridiculously low. Mr. Mayor, where would you find someone to handle the funds of a half a million dollar business (which our city is) for this type of salary and please also advise me where you would find a Police Chief that would work for the present salary that is below a rookie cop of any adjacent city. And

how about your loyal employees that have been at the city several years that are receiving only minimum wage.

I know for a fact, that Mr. Williams supported you during the last election when I ran against you. Mr. Williams and I do not agree on a number of issues, but this has no bearing on the previous weeks column titled Outstanding Citizen.

I have never heard any complaints from Mr. Williams or any of the city staff about their salaries. 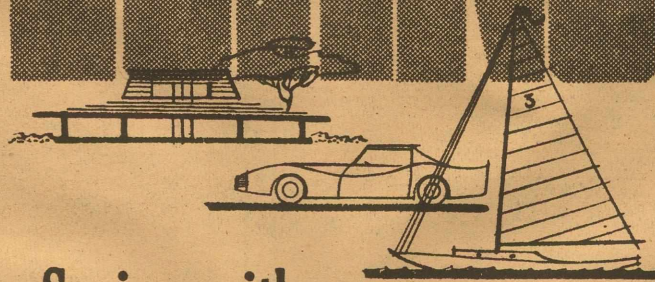

Home Garden Shortcourse

There will be a home gardening shortcourse for all interested people in Kinney County on Monday 21 at 1:30 p.m. at the Kinney County Courthouse. This shortcourse will include such items as preparing your garden for planting, important varieties to plant, proper planting, fertilizing, watering and harvesting techniques, disease and insect control and other important topics. Jerry Parsons District 13 Vegetable Horticulturist will present most of the program. Gardening time is near so this short-course should be most beneficial for all.

Sheep Field Day

The annual Sheep Field Day held at Sonora Experiment Station will be Thursday March 17. This field day is being held at the conclusion of ram test feeding period. All rams that have been tested will be available to look at and a sale of all certified rams will be held that afternoon.

TIPS FOR GREEN THUMBS

If you have not trimmed your trees you should do so immediately. Any low hanging limbs or sprouts at the base if the trunk should be removed. The more you trim off of the tree, the more abundant growth you will have in the remainder of the tree. With a root system enough to feed the entire tree, when you trim off part of it the remainder of the tree will get full benefit of the root system thus a fuller, healthier tree will be forthcoming.

It is full late to be planting most trees. To insure growth it is good to dig your hole large enough and deep enough so the tree can be at about the same depth as before it was dug. Fill the hole with water to which has been added some root stimulator. Then place the tree and fill the hole. If the soil is tight it is best to add some mulch to the soil before filling the hole.

When buying trees don't pay much attention to the height of the tree. A tree can be tall and of poor quality. The best way to buy a tree is by the caliper of the trunk. This means the thickness or diameter of the trunk. A tree not properly grown can be very tall and have a low caliper. This tree will not be what you want in a tree. When you are planting the tree, trim off about the top one-third of the tree. This will give you a better tree and a healthier one. Plant your trees now-- there's barely time for most of them.
